Did You Know ?

QUEENSLAND BAND HISTORY

By J. R. Foster

This is a brief outline of the progress of the Brass Band Movement in Queensland. This State can be justly proud of its achievements in the establishment and maintenance of brass and military bands as one of the essential public amenities in the community.

Over seventy-five years ago, when England was busily engaged in the formation of its first "National Association of Amateur Bands", and after bands in Britain had been contesting regularly for over thirty years, the band movement in Queensland had scarcely taken root.

Band contesting in Queensland was then practically unknown. One of the earlier records of an Australian Band Contest (apart from purely local contests or competitions) was at Creswick in Victoria, in 1884.

The first band contest in Queensland was held in the Botanic Gardens, Brisbane, in August, 1887, and for that contest the Gympie Odd-fellows' Band travelled to Brisbane to meet the goliaths in the metropolis. That the other competitors withdrew was no fault of the Gympie champions, and their effort was certainly meritorious when it is taken into consideration that the band had to travel by any horse vehicle available to Tewantin, and then proceed by water to Brisbane per the old S.S. Noosa.

Those were the days when the Hallelujah Chorus was reckoned to be the piece de resistance; when bombardon encircled shoulders, and the valve trombone held sway. As a matter of fact, the bands were then prejudged by their ability to make a big noise, and the the drum and cymbals were the big half of the ensemble.

It was about twenty years after its very first contest that Queensland bands commenced to hold fairly regular band competitions. Even then contest committees were lucky to get five or more bands to grace the town with their presence. New Zealand was well advanced in band contesting before this time, and contesting flourished in both North and South islands in the eighties.

As in most of the other Australian Colonies, the band movement proper seriously began with the military and defence forces. In the latter part of the last century, Queensland possessed several bands which were supported in this way, and notable amongst these was the "Headquarters Band" of Brisbane, as it was then known. This was a full military (brass and reed) combination, modelled on the same lines as the military bands of the Mother Country. According to the old timers, it was a fine band indeed, and its concerts were most popular in the city. The late Harry Gubbins and the late Harry Daniel, very active members of the Q.B.A. were members of the Headquarters Band.

In addition, there was a fine band attached to the Artillery, and also to the Navy, but apart from these bands, little was known of band work in the metropolis between 1880 and 1890.

Towards the latter part of the nineties, an impetus was given to bands and the study of the cornet and band instruments generally by the arrival from England of a very fine performer in the person of George Bloomfield. He was in charge of the band of the local Naval Brigade, which later made the trip to Melbourne to play for the celebrations of the inauguration of the Commonwealth.

DID YOU KNOW? (Continued):

From this time private bands began to form here and there, in the city and in the country. The idea of organising band competitions may be said to have taken place at the Commencement of the new century. Notable amongst the enthusiasts in these days were Mr. J. Hendry Grice of Brisbane and Messrs. Percival and Snell of Gympie. Mr. Alf Hall of Maryborough, also gave much time and effort in the promotion of Queensland contests. To these gentlemen and many other prominent band musicians must be given the credit of commencing the idea which was to sweep the whole country from Cooktown to Stanthorpe, and Longreach to the coast, and cause the general public to look forward to yearly band contests.

Mr. Grice formed the Brisbane Municipal Concert Band which is still a fine combination, and the bands formed by Hall and Percival are amongst the oldest bands in the State to-day.

During the course of one of the Austral Society's contests in the year 1906, a meeting of bandsmen was called by the late Ebenezer Jackson with the idea of forming an association to govern contests and look after the interests of bands generally. The result of this meeting was the formation of the present Queensland Band Association. The Association flourished, and began to take a major part in the promotion and control of Queensland band contests, and on the decline of the Austral Society, the association took over the responsibility of arranging for annual contests to be held in the various centres throughout the State. These contests, as records show, have proceeded through the years (excepting the war years) without interruption with continuous marked success.

As the contests improved in organisation, so the number of bands formed in the State increased, and it soon became necessary to establish a system of grading of bands, which system is still in operation. To-day, there are no less than 84 bands actively operating in Queensland, which with the exception of their bandmasters, are purely amateur and receive no remuneration whatever. The majority of these bands are registered with the Q.B.A., and are graded for contesting purposes.

Solo competitions have, for many years, been the essential part of band contests in the Commonwealth, enabling individual players to become expert on their own particular instrument. There has been a process of evolution in solo and party playing as year succeeds year.

The practice of including solo contests is of material advantage to bands, and the appearance of soloists as artists on the contest stage, gives that encouragement to players to overcome nervousness when they compete with their band on the contest platform.

Competitions have been provided for the past forty years for all the main instruments in the band, and drummers are now given the opportunity to show their skill and technique on their instruments.

In passing, it is interesting to note the revolution in the style and quality of the music now played at band contests. Whereas old-timers were content with simple pieces. The bands of to-day delight their patrons with tone-perfect renditions of the most difficult and classical masterpieces.

Thanks to the experience of some of the best band trainers the world has known, and the sound advice given by world-renowned adjudicators, Queensland bands are able to bring their performances to near perfection and present to the public musical entertainment which is a delight to the ear and a credit to the amateur band movement.

Synopsis

A. No. 1: VARIATIONS FOR BRASS BAND

by Ralph Vaughan Williams

Duration approximately 10 minutes. Published Boosey & Hawkes. Was first published in 1957 and comprises eleven short variations with introduction as follows: Variation 1. Poco Tranquillo. 2. Tranquillo Cantabile. 3. Allegro. 4. Canon. 5. Moderato Sostenute. 6. Valse. 7. Arabesque. 8. Alla Pallaca. 9. Adagio. 10. Fugato and Chorale.

Ralph Vaughan Williams (b. 1872): English composer, studied at Trinity College Cambridge, at the Royal College of Music and in Berlin and Paris. From his earliest compositions he showed the understanding and appreciation of his native folk music, most noticeable in such compositions as "In the Feu Country" and "Norfolk Rhapsodies". The first of his bigger works was "Toward the Unknown Region," a setting of Walt Whitman's words for chorus and orchestra heard at the Leeds Festival in 1907.

The "Sea Symphony" (again to a Whitman text) was first given at Leeds in 1910. His best-known work, "A London Symphony" was given at the Queen's Hall in 1913. The "Pastoral Symphony" (1923), is perhaps his most beautiful production. His ballad opera, "Hugh the Drover", was produced in 1924 by the British National Opera Company.

The Ridings were a Norse arrangement for local administration, on which the Saxon origination of the Shire was imposed. The suite for Brass Band is arranged in three sections: 1. The East — "Where Headlands meet the North Sea, and small craft work and play." 2: The North — "Where pastures are green and tranquil are its ranges." 3: The West — "Where throbbing industry rules."


MR. G. J. ROYAL

Mr. Royal was a member of the Toowoomba Austral Band in 1906, under Bandmaster J. Emmerson, playing the BBb Bass. Later joined the Overseas Band in 1913, under Bandmaster J. Mutze, of Toowoomba, enlisted, and left for overseas, and on return from active service in 1918 joined the Toowoomba Municipal Band under Bandmaster Dad Compton, and later under his son, James Compton, attended contests from 1922 to 1925. He moved to Brisbane and joined the Brisbane Federal Band under Bandmaster Bill Davies. In 1922 again returned to Toowoomba, and rejoined Toowoomba Municipal Band, acting as Drum Major, for several contests as well as assisting many other bands in that capacity throughout Australia. The most outstanding in Mr. Royal's career was being Drum Major for three different Bands, in three grades, and winning all the Diagram Marches, during the 1924 contest in Toowoomba. The bands were: A Grade (Collingwood Citizens); B Grade (Toowoomba Municipal); and C Grade (Cessnock). Mr. Royal has come out of retirement to act as Band Marshall for the Centenary Contests in his home town of Toowoomba.







Band will fall in, in marching formation at AA and move off in Quick Time, playing Quickstep and march to point DD. On arriving at Point DD, Band will turn Left and march to point E, turn to the Right and Right Wheel, and march to point FF, and Halt with the front rank of the Band on the alignment FF and cease playing at the end of the strain. Drum-Major to be three paces in front of the centre of the Band.

Band will then move by the shortest way to point DD without playing, and Halt with the front rank on the alignment DD. Band will then move off from point DD on word of command, playing the Quickstep March, wheel to the Right and marching to point GG, wheeling to the Left between them and marching to point HH, wheeling to the Left between them and march to point HH, wheeling to the Left between them and march to point AA where the Band with Counter-march from front to rear, and from flank to flank; on completing the Counter-march, the Band will move to point DD where it will again Counter-march from front to rear and from flank to flank as before. Halt with the Front Rank of Band on the alignment CC, Drum-Major to be three paces in front of the centre of the Band and cease playing at the end of the strain. 



BAND HISTORY

DALBY AND DISTRICT SILVER BAND

This band is made up of all High School Boys with two veterans of the Band world Len Bierton and Noel Sankey. Assisting for this contest is outstanding personality of Middle East and Japan days, Alf Franklin. Bandmaster Dave Truman was winner of the Award of Merit this year for outstanding services. Also a member of the band is Lynal Goldsworthy, winner of the novice Eupho; both solo and junior champion in Mackay in 1959. This player is only 17, and is again a contender this year in Toowoomba. The band has only been reformed four years ago, and if the enthusiasm is any criterion, then Dalby will be proud of their band in years to come. Secretary is Mrs. W. R. Harding; bandmaster Mr. Dave Trueman; drum major Mr. J. Peters; managers H. C. Barlow and C. de Groot.



THE MACKAY CITY BAND

Since 1936 the Band has been known as the Mackay City Band, a brief history of the Band's achievements since that year are as follows—The Band attended the Band Contest under Bandmaster R. S. Sutton without any great success. They did not attend the 1937 Brisbane Contest although a number of Bandsmen went with the Mirani Band. No programmes can be found of the 1938 or 1939 Contest. Band Championships were cancelled during the War years. In 1946 a Victory Contest was held in Brisbane. Mr. W. R. Smith had only been appointed Bandmaster prior to contest, so decided not to take the band that year. In 1947 the Band went to Maryborough, winning B Grade and placed 3rd in A Grade. At Toowoomba in 1948 they won A Grade. In 1949 the Contest was held in Ipswich. The band attended without any success. Mr. Smith resigned on his return from this Contest. In 1950 a number of Bandsmen went to the Bundaberg Contest to play in solo items. At Townsville in 1951 Bandsmen R. Hope and C. Graham played for W. R. Smith in the Rockhampton City Band. In 1951 Mr. C. Graham was appointed Bandmaster. The band attended the 1952 Championships in Ipswich winning "D" Grade music aggregate. At Rockhampton in 1953 they won the Grand aggregate in "C" Grade. At Toowoomba in 1954 they won "C" Championship. At Mackay in 1955 the Band competed in B Grade and played at the 1956 Brisbane Contest, also in B Grade, without any great success. Mr. Graham resigned in 1956, and Mr. A. V. Trahair was appointed Bandmaster in February, 1957, only a few weeks from the Southport Contest which the Band attended winning C Grade Championship. In Cairns in 1958 they tied with Townsville Citizens Band for the B Grade Championship. At the Mackay Contest in 1959 they won the B Grade Championship. This year they will be competing in A Grade at the Toowoomba contest. An interesting feature of the Band is that they have won the Hymn Tune at almost every contest. In 1956 they were beaten by one point. Speaking to old Bandsmen they state that this is their only defeat in this event. Secretary, H. F. Weight, Esq.; Bandmaster, Arthur V. Trahair.



BAND HISTORY

SARINA & DISTRICT — — 1930-1960

The Sarina & District Band was formed in 1930 by Mr. J. Pirie, many players buying their own instruments and uniforms. The enthusiasm of the players far outweighed their musical ability and by sheer perseverance they gained a second place in the Country Grade championship in Mackay in 1931, and minor placing in Maryborough in 1932. Mr. Pirie resigned in 1935 and M. L. Avery took up the bandmasters' position until 1936.

The Band competed in Maryborough in 1936 under Mr. R. Sutton. 1937 saw Mr. Fred Teague reform the band with sixteen boys and ten senior members. This continued until 1939 when the war slowed everything down. Again in 1945 Mr. L. Avery brought the band out of recess and put it on a playing basis for a few years. Mr. Joe Zemek conducted the band at Toowoomba in 1948, gaining the Minor Grade Championship and the Grice Cup. In 1949 Mr. Zemek also conducted the band at Ipswich. Then in 1955 the Committee elected Mr. A. C. Taylor conductor with instructions to form a band and coach learners to fill the vacancies. The Bandmaster was given every assistance. Nearly all the instruments have been replaced with new ones and the Bass end will be renewed in the near future.

The Band has their own rotunda and have erected swings, slides and seating on their own park site, donated to them by the Sarina Shire Council.



NOTICES AND INSTRUCTIONS

This Contest is held under the auspices of the Australian Band Council, and rules of the Council and the Q.B.A. will apply throughout.

Bands must compete in all sections for which they have entered on the official programme.

All marching contests are compulsory.

Each Band Secretary shall collect the personal signature of each competitor on the form provided before each item at the Contest. These forms must be completed and returned to the Queensland Band Association officials before the Band may compete.

Secretaries and Conductors of Bands must observe perfect punctuality in assembling to draw for positions at times and places appointed and in placing their bands upon the contest stage.

Each Band in its numerical order must be ready to march on before the preceding one has left the stage. Each Band, after leaving the stage, must play an item as next band gets ready if required. The Band drawing last place will play the First Band on to the stage, the first Band shall play on the Second and so on in their rotation.

The Contest delegates reserves the right to require the competing Bands to take part in any street marching or playing they may deem desirable.

Any Band late at the drawing, or not ready to proceed with the Contest as directed by the Q.B.A. Officials is liable to a fine or disqualification. The Delegates of the Q.B.A. have sole control of the music portion of the Contest and all their directions must be carefully and promptly complied with.

The Secretaries of each of the Bands for whom places are to be drawn must present themselves at the time and place for such drawing. Any Band not present at the time appointed may not be eligible to compete. Defaulters may be fined.

Bands must be placed on Stage according to formation adopted by the Australian Band Council.

All competitors must be properly dressed.

No Band shall engage in any counter attraction at the Contest without the consent of the Committee.

Any competitor in solo and party competition arriving after drawing for position has commenced will not be allowed to compete. Competitors must play in the position drawn.

No emergency players shall be allowed in any party item.

Winners of any event must repeat their item if called upon to do so by the delegates.

All items will be taken in order as arranged in this programme, unless otherwise notified, but the Contest Delegates reserve the right to alter or amend the Programme as required by circumstances.

Any courtesy items played during the contest, whether at Street Marching, playing Bands on or off the platform, or at inspection, shall not include any item that has been, or will be played in a competitive number in such contest.

In any item in the Contest the Contest Delegates reserve the right to allocate a time limit to the competitors necessary.

All contest music which is own choice in both solo and party competitions shall be restricted to a maximum of five minutes duration. Contest delegates reserve the right to further reduce this maximum if they deem necessary.

At this contest, in all solos which are test music, all repeats are eliminated.

Soloists and parties playing own choice music must provide a copy for the Judge, otherwise they will not be allowed to compete. All music bars must be numbered.

The Adjudicator's awards for solo and party competitions will be announced as decided by the Contest Delegates. Band awards will be announced at the end of the final session, with the exception of Diagram Marches, which will be announced during the competition.

In Junior Grade and Boys' Items, competitors must be under the stated age at the date of competition.

Birth certificates must be produced on demand by contest delegates.

SOLO AND PARTY COMPETITORS — When a solo item is in progress, only the competitor in that particular item will be allowed on the stage. Solo competitors will not be allowed on the stage while the preceding item is in progress, or until they are called for the purpose of drawing for places in the item in which they will compete.

Competitors may tune their instrument with the piano prior to the commencement of each respective competition. Tuning will not be permitted during a competition.

Competitors are reminded that in each competitive item, they will be judged on Department.

No person (other than officials) will be allowed on or about the stage during any competition.

Bands must play a minimum of two (2) Verses in each hymn tune.

Each band will be required to supply a copy of their OWN CHOICE MUSIC.

After tuning, competitors must remain where directed until called to the stage to perform.

All Bands must be in possession of the PALING'S HYMN SHEET and Massed Marches as selected.

Music in Diagram March and Street March will be "own choice". Bands must provide Scores with Bars marked at the Drawing for positions. Solo Cornet parts may be accepted for the Street March.

Competitors must conform to the commencing times as appearing in the programme. Late Competitors at the draw for positions will be excluded from the item.

All solo and party entrants who within fourteen (14) days of a contest withdraw their entry and/or fail to compete, and who do not present a doctor's certificate, shall pay to the Association the sum of £1 (one pound).
