



- 1.—This contest is being held subject to the contest rules of the Australian Band Council and the Band Association of N.S.W.
- 2.—Bands must compete in both selection contests and Street March in their official grade and may compete in the grade immediately above.
- 3.—Championships for each grade will be decided upon the total music points for both selections—Junior Grade, Own Choice Selection and Hymn.
- 4.—Bands competing in two grades must play different Own Choice Selections.
- 5.—Less than four bands competing in any grade, no third prize money will be allotted.
- 6.—Bands must be placed on stage to formation adopted—Band Contesting Formation No. 2.
- 7.—Secretaries and Conductors of Bands must observe perfect punctuality in assembling to draw for positions at times and places appointed and in placing their Bands upon the Contest stage.
- 8.—Every Band must play a different March each time it competes.
- 9.—The contest is under the control of the Contest Committee and any Band not ready to participate at the appointed time will render themselves liable to be fined or disqualified.







MR. NORMAN G. GOFFIN, L.T.C.L., B.B.C.M.



Born in Scotland and emigrated to New Zealand. Commenced brass band experience at the age of seven on an Eb horn and side drum. Experience in Salvation Army bands for twenty years up to the outbreak of the second World War, when he then enlisted with the first Eschelon New Zealand Forces and served for 3½ years as deputy conductor of the Fourth Brigade Band in the Middle East. On his return to New Zealand he was the conductor of the Burnham Camp Band for two years with the rank of Lieutenant.

On resuming civilian life he became deputy conductor of the famous Woolston Brass Band under the conductorship of the veteran, R. J. Estall, M.B.E. during which time Mr. Goffin won many national awards as cornet soloist and duettist.

He toured Britain and Holland with the highly successful National Band of New Zealand in 1953 and 1962. Although normally a Bb cornet player, Mr. Goffin changed over to the Eb soprano for these tours.

Mr. Goffin is at present the conductor of the Onslow Brass Band (Wellington). This band, having won B Grade honors has now risen to A Grade.

Mr. Goffin holds a Conductor's Diploma from the Trinity College of Music and has completed all but one of the subjects for the degree of Mus. Bac. He has adjudicated on many occasions at District and National contests in New Zealand. He has had considerable experience in orchestral (symphonic) fields and choral work apart from his work in brass bands extending over 40 years.—December, 1965.

DRILL ADJUDICATOR

MR. LES LEWIS



Les Lewis has been a BBb. Bass and Bass Trombone player in various bands for the past 40 years as well as a Drum Major over the past 30 years. A very commendable record indeed.

At present he is Drill Instructor of the Campbelltown/Camden and Boys' Town Bands as well as being a registered Drill Adudicator with the Australian Band Council, a member of the N.S.W. Drill Advisory Board and a member of the executive of the Band Association of N.S.W.

Les judged at the 1964 N.S.W. State Championships and at most Group Band Contests in N.S.W.

His willingness, at all times, to advise Drum Majors (especially the young ones), on their errors, has made him a well liked personality at contests in N.S.W.

D U B B O — The Hub of the West

The town of Dubbo is situated in the Central Western division of New South Wales, 261 miles by the Mitchell Highway from Sydney. It is an important rail and road centre being the hub of a network of roads and railway lines extending to all parts of the State as well as being on the shortest direct route between Melbourne and Brisbane and Adelaide and Brisbane. It also has a thrice daily air service to and from Sydney.

The country around Dubbo was discovered in 1818 by John Oxley and was first settled in 1824 when George Palmer and John Wylde received permits to occupy two geographical miles of land adjacent to the Macquarie River. When explorer Sturt passed through the area in 1828 he recorded that 1847 head of cattle and 6,133 sheep were running on this holding so that, from its earliest days, this district has been prominent in the pastoral industry.

The site of the present town was first settled in 1841 and was proclaimed a village in 1849. In 1872 it became a Municipality, the population then being 381 compared with 16,000 today.

The district is mainly used for agricultural and pastoral purposes, supported by a large abattoir, controlled by the Dubbo Municipal Council and Stock Saleyards under the control of the Talbragar Shire Council. It is also the headquarters of the Macquarie County Council which distributes electricity throughout the west.

The town of Dubbo has developed into an important Commercial Centre, with large and modern shops, commercial offices, professional services, health and educational facilities. It is well laid out with wide tree-lined streets and extensive parks and recreational space.

A visit to Victoria Park, comprising 45 acres and situated in the centre of the town is rewarding. Included in this park, in addition to well-planned gardens, lawns and trees, are a Begonia House, Propagation House, Wishing Well, pond and fountain, an Olympic Swimming Pool, three turfed cricket ovals, twelve tennis courts, bowling and croquet greens and basketball courts.

Adjacent to the Park, in Darling Street, is the Pioneer Museum, which houses relics and records of the early days of the Community. Other sporting and recreational facilities are provided throughout the Municipality.

Dubbo possesses two bands, the Dubbo Citizens' and District Brass Band and the Dubbo District Pipe Band. It is interesting to note that as early as 1879 J. Diehl formed the Dubbo Brass Band and Orchestra and the band has continued to serve and entertain the community since that year. The Pipe Band is of considerably more recent origin, but also plays an important part in the social life of the town.



The easy-going slacker cannot claim to be the average bandsman for he is the one who lowers the 'average' standard.

Many bands would now be defunct had they not possessed a nucleus of these bandsmen who, when the 'stars' have deserted the band, have still carried on!

Here's to the 'average' bandsman! May he be joined by many others who are now carrying 'L' plates.
