The Town of TANUNDA in the BAROSSA VALLEY

Lying in the heart of the beautiful Barossa Valley, the town of Tanunda has a long tradition of banding. Its earliest settlers—German Lutherans, who had come with the aid of the man who contributed so much to South Australia's development, George Fife Angas—brought with them many characteristics that have left their mark on the town and its way of life. The order and cleanliness of the town, the churches, the names and the activities reflect this origin. So does the town's tradition of banding, for the early settlers brought their instruments with them to play for church services, "tin-kettling," and for fun. The Tanunda Band celebrated its centenary some years ago, and band contesting commenced in the town 58 years ago.

In 1957 the Australian Band Championships were conducted at the Tanunda Band Competitions, and the Tanunda Town Band gained the "A" grade title.

The Show Hall, in which tonight's session is being held, is used in March by the Tanunda Agricultural, Horticultural and Floricultural Society, the branches of the Agricultural Bureau, and other organizations to display the great variety of products in the district—from farms, homes, schools, and industry. This Hall also features the annual "Kaffee Abend" of the Liedertafel Male Choir, and the Melodienacht of the Town Band. It is the home of the Tanunda Youth Club.

Mr. FRITZ HOMBURG, O.B.E.

Associated with the Tanunda Band Competitions for many years as its secretary and driving force, Mr. Fritz Homburg, O.B.E., celebrated his 80th birthday. The town honoured him with a special Concert and Social Evening, at which reference was made to his civic service on the Town Council, his work for the Institute, his leadership of the Liedertafel, and support of banding. Several years ago the S.A. Bands Association presented him with their Award of Merit.

The objective of the Tanunda Band Competitions is "to maintain and develop interest in banding and band music."

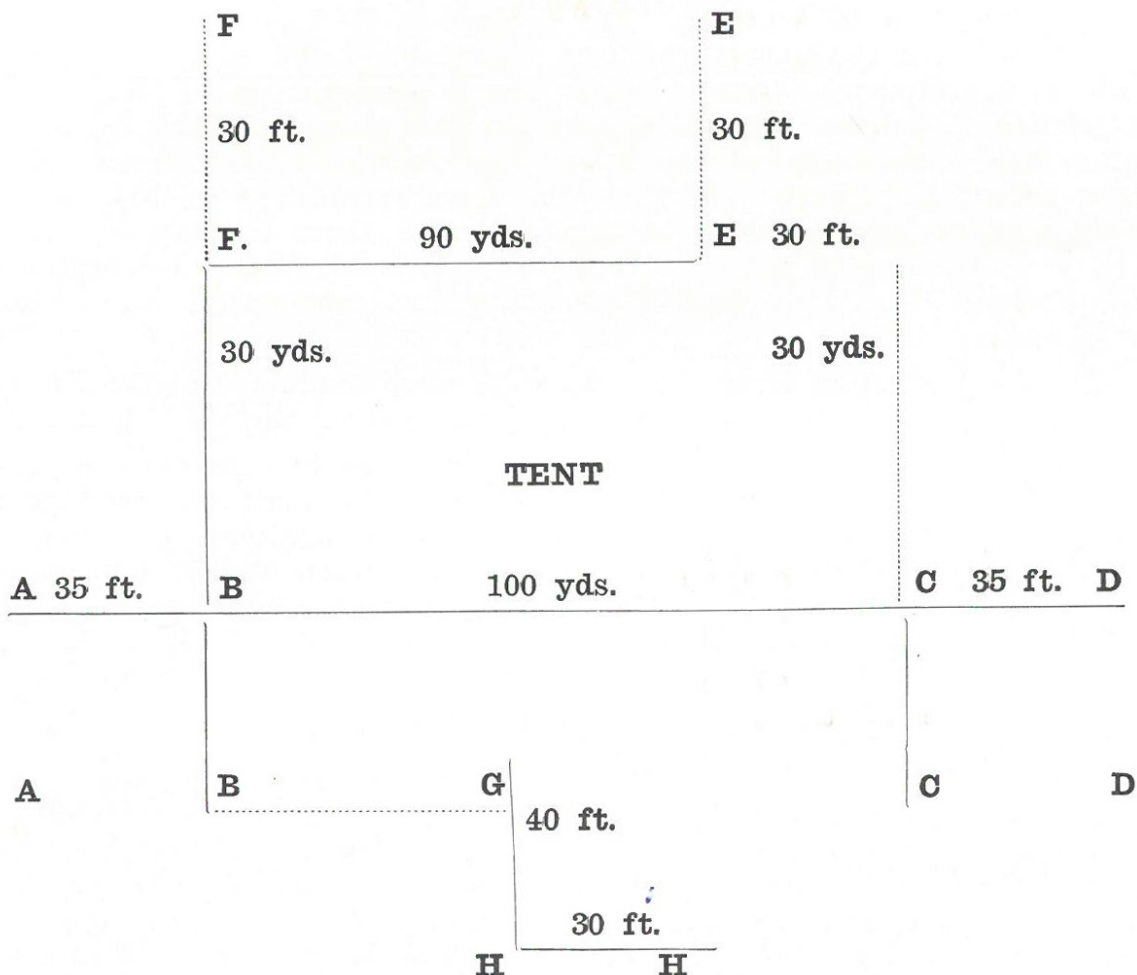

No. 5 DIAGRAM



Band will fall in, in marching formation, at AA and move in quick time playing Quickstep march, and march to point DD. On arriving at point DD, band will counter-march from front to rear and from flank to flank. Right turn march to point CC. At CC band will right wheel and march to point EE. At EE, wheeling to left between the flags, then march to point FF. At FF band will left turn and march to BB. At BB band will right turn, march between the flags to point AA. At AA band will counter-march from front to rear and flank to flank, right turn, and march to point G. At G band will right wheel, march to point HH. At HH band will halt, continuing to play until end of strain. Any band halting before or moving past point HH will be penalised one point for each pace.

Band means front rank. All evolutions must be performed within the diagram.

MUSIC

Mr. Lloyd Thorne, of Auckland, New Zealand

This year we welcome Mr. Lloyd Thorne, L.T.C.L., of Auckland, New Zealand, as music adjudicator. He is well known to bandsmen there as an impartial and competent adjudicator and was principal adjudicator of the 1965 National Contest. He is also very well known to the general public as compere of Sunday morning Band Sessions, a duty he has performed for over 16 years, first in Christchurch and later in Auckland.

Mr. Thorne commenced his musical training in the Salvation Army at the age of 11 as a cornet player. His first experience as a conductor was with a male choir. In the war years he played overseas with the 4th Armoured Brigade Band and later conducted the 9th Brigade Band in Italy and Japan, where it was known as the Band of the 2nd N.Z.E.F. Associated with this work was the formation and training of a 12-piece dance orchestra and a 40-voice choir. He gained his Teacher's Diploma (L.T.C.L.) in conducting, arranging and harmony in part-time study at the Canterbury University.

Mr. Thorne led the Addington Workshops Band to "D" and "C" Grade victories, and led the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Brigade Band, now called the Waitemata Silver Band, to two "A" Grade N.Z. Championship wins. Latterly he has conducted the Auckland All-Star (composite) Band in successive victories in the Wills Inter-Provincial Contest at the Festival of the Pines at New Plymouth.

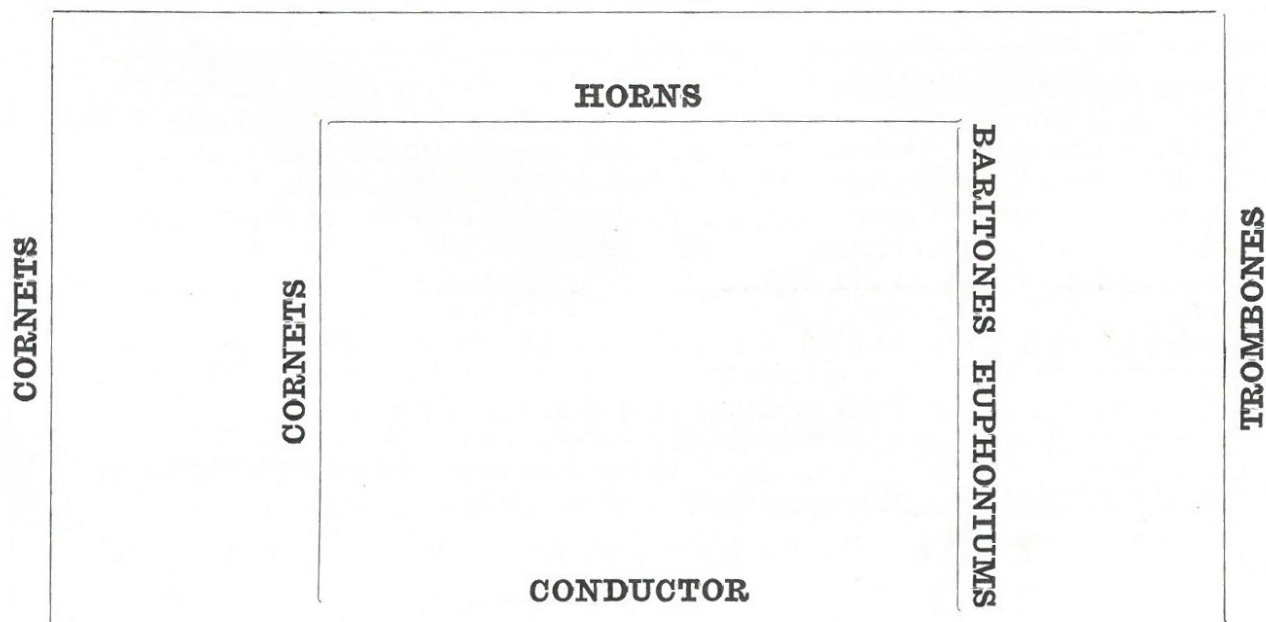

Mr. Sorrell has been for 10 years President of the S.A. Bands Association and also for 10 years Foundation President of the S.A. Bands Marching Girls Association. He is S.A. representative on the National Band Council.

His banding experience goes back to the Sturt Street School Band, of which he was both member and drum major. He led bands to success at Tanunda and Ballarat and has won drum major's trophies. His successful band associations include Prospect City Junior and Senior, Mt. Gambier Citizens, Hindmarsh Municipal, Henley and Grange, and Glenelg Citizens Bands. For the past 12 years he has served as drill adjudicator, and has done much training of junior bandsmen. His adjudications have included State Band Championships in South Australia, Queensland, and New South Wales, and Australian Band Championships twice at Ballarat. He has been an annual adjudicator at Tanunda since 1961.

In 1964 Mr. Sorrell was appointed Director of the Adelaide Festival of Arts Pageant, and this year he was responsible for the successful Torchlight Pageant in Adelaide. He is a man to whom South Australian banding owes much.

THE BANDS

"A" GRADE

GLENELG CITIZENS' BAND

This Band celebrated its jubilee in 1964. It has a fine record of wins at Tanunda, going through all Grades.

KENSINGTON & NORWOOD CITY BAND

Formed in 1898, this Band has been a regular contestant at Tanunda. It had its first win here in "C" Grade in 1924, when it was known as the Magill Vice-Regal Band. Its first win in "A" Grade company was in 1960, when it won the aggregate at Tanunda. In 1962 it had the honour of being the first S.A. Band to win the "A" Grade Own Choice music at Ballarat, Victoria. This was an Australian Championship Contest. At Ballarat in 1964, again at Australian Championship level, the Band was placed equal first with Malvern Municipal (Vic.) in the Quickstep. A fortnight later, here at Tanunda, it won the Own Choice music and Quickstep. In January, 1965, the Band moved into its new bandroom at Norwood Oval. This is called "The Albert Moir Bandroom," honouring the late Mr. Moir, who was Band President for many years as well as Patron of the S.A. Band Association. This Band won the Australian Music Championship at Ballarat last year.

MALVERN MUNICIPAL BAND (Victoria)

This Band, established in 1911, has Sir Robert Menzies as one of its patrons. Its contesting record includes 56 first prizes in Australia and New Zealand from 1912-1965, the Australian Championships at Perth in 1959, and last year the Australian Championship "A" Grade aggregate at Ballarat, where it previously had sundry Victorian and Australian Championship victories. Its musical director is Mr. Harry Philpott.

METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BAND (Victoria)

At Tanunda in 1936 the late Mr. Percy Jones described this Band as "the finest combination Australia has produced. I have awarded it maximum points for this great effort—an unprecedented marking in this country." An old-established Band that reached its peak between 1930 and 1950, with four Australian Championship victories and a run of 16 undefeated marching contests. It has had many famous conductors and plays every Friday at 2 p.m. when the Headquarters Fire Station at Eastern Hill, Melbourne, presents a public display. Its present conductor is Mervyn Simpson. The Fire Brigades Band dropped out of contesting for some years, but since re-entering has won "B" Grade at Preston in 1966, and was equal second to Preston in V.B.L. "A" Grade this year. It has six members who have won individual Australian titles. These bandsmen are Trombonists Charlie Ring and Vic Rogers, Claude Scanlon (baritone), Fred Yeadon (Eb bass), Rod Lowe (cornet—4 times), and Reg. Walsh (soprano).

PORT ADELAIDE CITY BAND

Many junior members are now playing with the Senior Band. This policy of giving promising juniors a chance to play in the Senior Band has proved well worthwhile. Our Junior Band have had great success since its formation just over two years ago. It is certainly a wonderful training ground for our future bandsmen. The Port Adelaide City Band have always supported contesting and over the years have come up from "C" Grade to our present "A" Grade rating reached in 1966. This is our first year of contesting in "A" Grade. We regard it as an honour to compete in an Australian Championship and wish all competing Bands the best of luck. Members are: K.
