PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This year of celebrations continues with the second major event being the Solo and Party Australian Championships.

It is fitting that we should have with us at this time, over fifty Interstate Bandsmen who are some of the finest soloists in Australia, coming from Queensland, New South Wales, and Victoria, to compete against our own instrumentalists.

The outstanding feature of these competitions is the number of junior competitors both boys and girls from Interstate, Country

and City who are under the age of eighteen years.

This fact alone proves the success of our five-year Development Plan, when we recall that in 1963 when the last Australian Championships were held in South Australia we had only 25 entries in the Junior Sections as compared with 120 on this occasion.

Our Development Programme has included both Senior and Junior banding and our policy of decentralisation has done much

to assist and stimulate interest in country areas.

Carnivals have been conducted successfully at Port Augusta, Whyalla, Port Pirie, Mount Gambier, Waikerie, and the State Championships have been centred at Tanunda, and all of these contests have had an impact on the growth of our movement.

We are particularly pleased that the Kensington and Norwood City Band won the "A" Grade Australian Championships at Ballarat last year, which further shows the high musical standard

we have achieved in this State.

It is with pride and gratitude that we review the progress of the past five years, and we believe that the image of banding in this State has improved immensely, and that the public of South Australia now has a greater appreciation of brass band work as a result.

I must pay tribute to the State Parliament, Civic Authorities, Education Department, Press, Radio, T.V., and all those members of our movement in both City and Country areas who have contributed so much to the success of our first Five-Year Plan.

My best wishes to all competitors.

CONDITIONS OF CONTEST

All Rules of the National Band Council and the South Australian Band Association Inc. will apply throughout these competitions

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Competitors will compete in order of draw shown in Official Programme.
- 2. All Competitors including Juniors and Conductors MUST appear in uniform (Except for unattached members).
- 3. Competitors in party sections must be members of the one Band.
- 4. Competitors must play the one instrument throughout the contest.
- 5. All solos must be accompanied by piano, Duets, etc., optional.
- 6. No person to be on stage other than competitor and accompanist during the performance of solos.
- 7. Tuning of instruments restricted to 20 seconds.
- 8. Trumpets not accepted in any Senior sections.
- 9. Four or more Entries in Section, 1st and 2nd Trophies. Three or less Entries, 1st Trophy only. Less than two entries no contest.
- 10. In the event of a tie occurring for 1st and 2nd positions, the value of the trophy shall be divided.
- 11. A time limit of six minutes for Seniors and five minutes for Juniors shall be strictly observed in all work including piano, except for Champion of Contest and Test Music sections. (BELL WILL TERM-INATE TIME LIMIT).
- 12. Competitors admitted free to session in which they are appearing.
- 13. ALL MUSIC own choice except where otherwise specified. Judges copy to be forwarded to the Secretary not later than 26th July. Enclose slip with name and section number clearly marked, with music. (Bars must be numbered).
- 14. ENTRY FEES Solos 30c, Duets 50c, Trios 75c, Quartettes \$1, Septettes \$1.20. Junior Sections HALF PRICE.
- 15. All entry fees must accompany entry and date of birth must be stated on Entry Forms for Junior Section Competitors. Age shall be as at date of Contest.
- 16. Winners of all Senior Sections eligible to compete in Champion of Contest.
- 17. Winners of all Junior Sections eligible to compete in Champion of Contest.
- 18. Any Junior or Juvenile Competitor who has entered and won any Senior Section shall not be eligible to compete again in Junior Sections.
- 19. No Competitor shall play any item with which they have won a first prize within the last two years.
- 20. No Solo shall be played in more than one Section by any competitor, Champion of Contest excepted.
- 21. Official Accompanist for Senior Sections only.
- 22. A separate form for each section entered must be submitted to the Secretary, otherwise entries will be rejected.
