WELCOME TO TANUNDA AND THE BAROSSA VALLEY

The Barossa Valley with its wine industry, its history of settlement by German Lutherans, and of incorporation of their traditions and way of life into the Australian setting, is one of South Australia's major tourist attractions. Its annual influx of tourists is increasing and along with this the district's facilities for catering to their needs.

One of the inherited customs of the pioneers that has continued is an enthusiasm for brass bands and their music.

When the first German Lutheran settlers came into the Tanunda area they brought with them their brass band instruments. They played them at worship services, for weddings and the "tin-kettling" of the newly weds, and for fun at home and community functions. The Tanunda Band celebrated its centenary some years ago, and took part in band contesting when it was first introduced 60 years ago. The early settlers brought with them qualities of character that have left their mark in the town and district of today. The order and cleanliness of the town, the churches, the street trees, and the town's activities, all may be interpreted in relation to their pioneer origins.

The Tanunda Recreation Park is the centre not only of recreational activities, but has been the scene of religious festivities, charity functions, the Barossa Valley Vintage Festivals, and is the locale for the annual Agricultural, Horticultural and Viticultural Shows. The Show Hall is used by the Tanunda Liedertafel for its annual "Kaffee Abend," by the Festival Committee for its annual Vintage Dinners, by the Tanunda Town Band for its annual "Melodienacht," and it is the home of the Barossa Valley Youth Club, and is used for occasional sporting and religious gatherings.

In recent years the holding of the "A" Grade Own Choice Selections in the Show Hall at night has proved very satisfying to listeners and bandsmen alike.

In this year's National Championships the difficult task of programming for 30 Bands in four grades in one day (never before attempted in a National Championship) means concurrent tests on the Oval, in the Show Hall and in the Tanunda Institute during the day with the "A" Grade and "C" Grade Own Choice Selections in the latter two venues in the evening. The final announcements of results and presentations of trophies will be at the Show Hall for "A" Grade and "B" Grade and in the Institute for "C" Grade and "D" Grade.

The town of Tanunda and the Barossa Valley in general has much to show the visitor. Its churches, historical museums, wineries, homes and public buildings, its distinctive scenery and varieties of rural production are full of interest. Visitors are invited to come again—and again. The town of Tanunda and its citizens welcome you, as do all citizens of the Barossa district.

The Tanunda Band Competitions Committee thanks all who help in this year's National Band Championships—the State Government and its representation, the Chief Secretary (Hon. A. F. Kneebone, M.L.C.) present here today, the Australian Council for the Arts, the National Band Council, the S.A. Bands Association, the Bands, their committees and auxiliaries, the adjudicators and their writers, the donors of trophies and of funds (as listed elsewhere), the advertisers, marching girls and their S.A. The future will be exciting, challenging and rewarding, and in conclusion and on behalf of the National Band Council I thank those dedicated people who are responsible for the conduct of the 1973 Championships and the Bands who have worked so hard to compete today.

ADJUDICATORS

CHIEF MUSIC ADJUDICATOR

Mr. Norman A. Thorn, Dunedin, N.Z.

Mr. Norman Thorn was in 1965 appointed Musical Director of the National Band of New Zealand, which toured Canada and U.S.A. and was acclaimed by many critics as "the finest Band in the world." He has recently served the Australian National Band Council as tutor for the National Training and Education Programme made possible by the co-operation of the Australian Council for the Arts, the various State Band Organisations and the National Band Council. He is an executive member of the N.Z. Brass Bands Council and is known for his wealth of musical knowledge.

Mr. Thorn's long banding career commenced in 1937 when he was a member of the Burnham Military Camp Band. He was a member of the R.N.Z.A.F. Band that toured Australia in 1945, had personal successes as a soprano cornet player in the period 1947 to 1953. He led from 1949 the Kalkorai Band (now Roslyn Mills, Kalkorai) that achieved the N.Z. Championship in three successive years—1952-1954. He has been a choirmaster in the church of St. Bernadette, musical director of Dunedin Choral Group, an honorary life member of the U.S. Navy Band, and was guest conductor of many Bands, including the Royal Canadian Artillery Band.

ASSISTANT MUSIC ADJUDICATOR

Major Alex H. Henderson, N.S.W.

Director of Music for Australian Army Bands—Canberra

He has been involved in Brass and Military Bands for 36 years as a cornet and trombone player and as conductor and adjudicator throughout Australia. Graduated in the Australian Army School of Music at Balcombe, Victoria, and the British Army School of Music—Kneller Hall in England. He is an Associate of the Royal College of Music. Major Henderson was senior instructor at the Australian Army School of Music and Director of the Eastern Command in Sydney before taking up his present appointment in 1970.

He judged the National Championships at Maryborough, Queensland, in 1971 and recently judged the New South Wales Championships at Blacktown.

He will be the tutor for the National Band Councils Training and Education Programme in 1974.

QUICKSTEP MUSIC ADJUDICATOR

Mr. Ernie Alderslade

Mr. Alderslade commenced his banding career with the Malvern Band in Victoria, and later played with Preston, Mildura and Tanunda Bands. Whilst in the latter he won the trombone section in the Australian Solo & Party Competitions. At present he is director of music of the S.A. Police Band, having been appointed conductor in 1969. He will adjudicate the quickstep music.

CHIEF DRILL ADJUDICATOR

Mr. C. F. Sorrell, M.B.E.

Mr. Cliff Sorrell is President of the National Band Council of Australia, and was formerly president of the S.A. Bands Association and the S.A. Bands Marching Girls Association.

Mr. Sorrell was responsible for the preparation and publication of the first National Band Council Training Manual as issued to the Band movement earlier this year, and also for the introduction of the National Training and Education programme which is conducted annually. He recently visited New Zealand and had long discussions with the Chief Band Drill Judge, Mr. Laurie Davidson, and a N.Z.B.A. judging panel, analysing the New Zealand methods.

When in South Australia, Mr. Sorrell was responsible for a five-year Junior Bands programme that is now bearing much fruit. In his national office he is now working on a five- and ten-year plan for consideration at the National Conference at Tullamarine in June 1974.

He has adjudicated in various National Championships and has judged at Tanunda regularly for many years. He was awarded the M.B.E. by the Queen in 1971.

ASSISTANT DRILL ADJUDICATOR

Mr. R. E. Pennell

Mr. Pennell has been assistant drill judge on many occasions at Tanunda Competitions and has judged many Junior Band Contests in South Australia. He is a registered S.A.B.M.G.A. judge for marching girls competitions.



ST. JOHN AMBULANCE BRIGADE BAND

The St. John Ambulance Brigade Band is now in its thirteenth year with the St. John Ambulance Brigade and is (after many years as Henley & Grange Band) recognised as one of the leading South Australian Bands. It has met with its fair share of success, being the first South Australian Band to win an “A” Grade Test at Ballarat. Its members have won many Open Solo Competitions during the years. The uniform worn by members is the St. John Ambulance Brigade uniform. The Musical Director is Mr. H. Walmsley, now in his second year with the Band. Band personnel is: A. Paterson (President), A. KENSINGTON & NORWOOD BAND

This Band has good support from local government. This year its 74th annual general meeting was held in the Mayor’s chambers for the second time; and following the Council’s acquisition of a large church building, which was a concert hall and which has two large rooms suitable for rehearsal for use as a cultural centre, it has every prospect of gaining a new practice room with just the right acoustics and amenities. It will probably be shared with the local orchestra. The Band will on November 23rd present the first brass band concert to be held in Adelaide’s new Festival Theatre—no mean feat when it is known that the cost of hiring the theatre is \$1,000 per night. The Band’s officers are Messrs Bernard Bygrave, Musical Director; Keith Pope, Secretary; Ray Torry, Treasurer; and Alan Moore, Band Sergeant. The Kensington & Norwood Junior Band is being re-organised, with gradual upgrading to a “D” grade youth band. Senior Band euphonist Ray Curson is its Bandmaster. The Band is well known at the Tanunda Competitions with many successes in its record.

TANUNDA TOWN BAND

First formed in 1860, Tanunda Town Band has a formidable list of achievements, including many State Championships and a National Championship. Last year at Tanunda it won the State Championship. Tanunda Band has its own band hall and acquired a new set of instruments three years ago. It has a very active Ladies’ Auxiliary, which supplied new uniforms several years ago, and recently bought evening jackets for the Band. Each year, in May, the Band stages its very popular “Melodienacht,” a night that not only brings annual income to it, but presents the public with a Brass Band at its best, playing the way the public likes. Conductor Gal John comes of a very old “banding” family and has in recent years served as adjudicator in other States and New Zealand. MALVERN MUNICIPAL BAND (Victoria)

The name of Malvern first appeared in the Band world back in 1912, where, as the Malvern Metropolitan Tramways Band, it began its successful contesting career. In 1946 the name was changed to its present title of the Malvern Municipal Band. Over the years the Band has been very fortunate in having some great names as musical directors, such as the late Captain H. Shugg from 1915 till 1946, then the late Mr. W. J. Philpott from 1950 till 1959 when, due to ill-health, he was forced to relinquish his position, which was taken over by his son, Mr. Harry Philpott, who was a member of the Band for 21 years, 10 years as a player and 11 years as musical director, until his retirement 3 years ago. The contesting records of this Band read very much like a history book, inasmuch as from 1912 until 1972 they have scored no less than 62 first prizes in Australia and New Zealand. The year 1959 was the start of a record that will stand for many years to come, because, from that date until 1968, the Band never failed to win either a State of Australian Championship. In 1968 the Band had to be content with second placing at both the Victorian and the Australian Championships, but the years 1969 saw the Band back on top again by winning the Australian Championships which were held in Tasmania. In 1970 the Band was again placed second in the Australian Championships, held in Sydney. In 1971 the Band, under its new conductor, Mr. Wilf Dyason, competed in the Australian Championships held at Maryborough, Qld., and again regained the title of Australian Championship "A" Grade Band. This was followed up with wins in the Victorian Bands League Contest and the Royal South Street Contest with the fine result, three contests and three first placings in the one year. In 1972 the Band competed at the Victorian Bands League Contest, gaining first place and also at Royal South Street Competitions. In addition to contesting work the Band also appears at charity engagements, including processions in Melbourne and other country cities.

FOOTSCRAY & YARRAVILLE CITY BAND (Victoria)

This Band, established in 1908, is the present holder of the "A" Grade National Championship, having won at Ballarat (Vic.) in 1972. For its musical director, Mr. Merv. Simpson, this was his third Australian Championship win, the others having been twice with the Melbourne Fire Brigade Band. Footscray & Yarraville have competed at Tanunda on three previous occasions, and in Australian Championships at Launceston and Sydney. It has competed regularly at Ballarat for 25 years and is going to Hobart next Easter for the National Championships there. Its officers are: Cr. G. Cruickshank, President; E. R. Weiss, Secretary; A. McKimm, Social Secretary; and M. Simpson, Musical Director.

HAWTHORN CITY BAND (Victoria)

This Band has been subsidized and supported by the Hawthorn City Council for 64 years. It has successfully competed as an "A" Grade Band for over forty years and has been led by such well-known conductors as the late J. Booth-Gore, late A. P. Paxton, N. B. U'ren and Ken Smith. Currently its Musical Director is Squadron Leader L. H. Hicks, O.B.E., L.R.A.M., A.R.C.M., who previously was Conductor of the Black Watch (R.H.R.) and R.A.A.F. Central Bands. Squadron Leader Hicks was chief music adjudicator at Tanunda several years ago. Band personnel: A. Leffanue (President), K. A. Bulman (Hon. Secretary), L. H. Hicks, O.B.E. (Conductor), A. “B” GRADE

ARARAT CITY BAND (Victoria)

This Band is making its fourth visit to Tanunda—last year it won the “B” Grade Championship. It is a frequent contender in the Ballarat, Wimmera and V.B.L. Contests. Ararat’s uniform is khaki and green, with orange tie, all tailored for the individual bandsman wearing them. It gets a substantial annual grant from the City of Ararat. Before 1942 the Band was known as the Ararat Citizens Band. Its officers are Messrs W. Powell, President; F. Makin, Secretary; and R. Humphries, Bandmaster.

CITY OF BALLARAT MUNICIPAL BAND

The history of this Band goes back 73 years to the time when Mr. Thomas E. Bulch formed “Bulch’s Model Brass Band.” He had formerly been bandmaster of the Allendale & Kingston Band and the Band of the 3rd Battalion in Ballarat.

There have been many changes of name, places of practice, and conductors since, and ups and downs in competitive events. Leaders or renown in banding who have led the Band include E. T. Code and his son, Percy Code, Frank Wright, Alfred Rowell, Harry Shugg, Charles Smith, Charles Turner, and others. Today’s Conductor is Russell Clogan. Early this year, through the action of the City of Ballarat Council, the Band acquired a new set of instruments, and a new band hall.

1st BATTALION ROYAL VICTORIA REGIMENT (1. R.V.R.) BAND

A few years ago this Band was known as the 58th/32nd Battalion Band. It is made up of C.M.F. members, and wears the standard summer uniform of the Regular Army Bands. The Band believes that it is the first C.M.F. Band to be registered with the V.B.L., and the first to compete from Victoria in an Australian Bands Championship. The Band is conducted by W.O. R. TUGGERAH LAKES DISTRICT BRASS BAND (N.S.W.)

Tuggerah Lakes District Band was formed in 1946, with Mr. Dick Wells its first Bandmaster. Its headquarters are at the holiday resort town “The Entrance,” which is situated on the Central Coast midway between Sydney and Newcastle. Mr. Bert Champion later replaced Mr. Wells as Bandmaster, and then in 1960 the Band’s present Musical Director, Mr. Don Stewart, took the Band over generally and has been assisted to this date by Mr. Albert Bain as his deputy. The Drum Major is Mr. Ron McLure. The uniform colour of the Tuggerah Lakes District Band is green and gold with black trimmings. Over the 27 years of the Tuggerah Lakes District Band’s existence it has won numerous major awards. Its most memorable occasion was in 1969 at the Australian titles in Launceston, Tasmania, where it won both the “B” and “C” grade titles and also in that year the N.S.W. State “B” Grade title. It has also won many junior major awards, including the Australian junior band title and numerous junior solo titles. The Band also has an excellent record for marching, having won Australian titles and for several years being undefeated in marching events in New South Wales. Tuggerah Lakes District Band has its own band hall and a very energetic committee and Ladies’ Auxiliary, which has enabled the Band to participate in many interstate Contests, including Tasmania, Victoria, Queensland and this year South Australia.

The Band became one of the best marching bands in Australia and had many contesting successes whilst rising from "D" Grade to "A" Grade. The present Kew Citizens Band has had a successful contesting career since being formed. Recent wins have been as follows—1969: 1st "B" Grade Victorian Championships; 1970: 3rd "B" Grade South Australian Championships; 1971: 3rd "B" Grade V.B.L. Contest, 2nd "B" Grade Victorian Championships, equal 1st "B" Grade South Australian Championships; 1973: 2nd "B" Grade V.B.L. Contest. GEEELONG WEST CITY BAND



KADINA & WALLAROO BAND



MARANANGA BRASS BAND
