

Brief History of Hahndorf

In 1838 approximately 500 German Lutherans from the provinces of East Germany came to South Australia seeking religious freedom. In early 1839, some of these settlers founded a village which they named Hahndorf (Hahn was the captain of one of the immigrant ships and dorf means village). The names of the original 52 heads of families are recorded on plaques in the Pioneer Memorial Gardens in the Main Street.

The settlers immediately erected rough shelters and began to clear the land so that crops and gardens could be planted. The women walked to Adelaide where they found a ready market for surplus vegetables, butter and eggs.

Many of the early houses were built in a characteristic style—a frame of sawn red gum timber with the spaces filled in with wattle, straw and mud or bricks. Examples of this type of house may be seen in the Main Street and at Paechtown.

The first church was dedicated in 1840. This was followed, on the same site by the St. Michael's Lutheran Church in 1859, and the St. Paul's Lutheran Church built in 1890. A school was begun in 1840. An off-shoot of this school was the Hahndorf Academy (later Hahndorf College), which opened in 1857 and closed in approximately 1916. Its building now houses a museum and art gallery.

The first flour mills were built in the early 1840's—a water mill on Cox Creek (no longer standing) and a wind-mill (restored) halfway between Hahndorf and Mt. Barker; a steam mill was built in the town in 1854—it now houses a restaurant.

Hahndorf is now losing much of its rural character and is rapidly becoming a residential area.

MUSIC ADJUDICATOR

MR. REG. BISHOP

A man of many and varied experiences. Commenced playing at the age of eleven on the cornet, under Mr. R. Wells at Gosford. Joined the Army under Bill Lomaine also with Jim Huggett and finally with the Eastern Command Band under Bill Pearson. Played with the Tivoli Circuit for eight years, travelled with the Borovlinsky Ballet, National Opera Company and the Sydney Symphony Orchestra for six years under such conductors as Ignor Strawnsky, Ignor Morkwites, Dr. Nicolai Malko, Effrum Kurtz, Joseph Krips. This is only a portion of named conductors. After a while he taught several school bands with a wide range of success, being conductor for the Brigedene Convent Orchestra of 69 players. His time at St. Lios College was a rewarding time, achieving five National, two School and three Junior "A" grade titles between 1968 and 1971. He has served as an Adjudicator since 1969 at places like Lithgow, Newcastle, Armidale, Tamworth, Mooree, Rockdale, Sydney and Adelaide in 1970. The position he holds is Professor of Brass at Newcastle Conservatorium.

MUSIC ADJUDICATOR FOR BANDS

MR. G. W. ROWE

During five years military service, saw service in two of the top Command Bands. Has been a Junior Band trainer, Bandmaster, Choirmaster and Music Tutor. Has a wide range in Musical Appreciation, light classics to modern, rhythm and jazz. He is still an active player, the trombone being his principal instrument.

MUSIC ADJUDICATOR FOR SOLO AND PARTY

GALVIN H. JOHN

Present Conductor of the Tanunda Town Band, the leading South Australian "A" Grade Band which is over 100 years old.

Commenced banding at the age of 10 years on Euphonium and gained many successes in solo competitions. At the age of 16 years was playing solo Euphonium for the Tanunda Town Band.

Most of the early tuition was received from his father, the late A. P. John, who was conductor of the Tanunda Town Band for 22 years, and also from his brother, the late Frank John, one of Australia's Champion Trombonists.

Has completed 20 most successful years as Conductor of the Tanunda Band, during which time they have won the Australian Championships and for six years were unbeaten in South Australia. During the past 20 years the band has also won no fewer than 11 consecutive Test Pieces. They are present S.A. Champions.

Mr. John was the planner and also the lecturer for the first Junior and Senior Band Seminars to be held in South Australia under the guidance of the South Australian Band Association. He is still actively engaged in Junior development.

Was guest conductor for massed bands when the Queen Mother visited South Australia in 1960, consisting of 600 bandsmen. Mr. John was adjudicator at Southport (Qld.) State Contest in 1970, and at Australian Championship Contest at Maryborough (Qld.) 1971, and at Stanthorpe (Qld.) State Contest in 1972. Has also adjudicated in Perth, N.S.W., Victoria and South Australia.

MR. C. F. SORRELL, M.B.E.

Mr. Cliff Sorrell is President of the National Band Council of Australia and Past President of the S.A. Bands Association Inc. and the S.A. Bands Marching Girls Association. In 1971 a business appointment was responsible for his leaving this State and he now resides in Sydney, N.S.W.

He has adjudicated at Band Contests all over Australia since 1961. On five occasions he has been appointed to judge the National Championships of Australia and he judged the 1971 titles at Maryborough, Queensland. His contribution to the development of brass banding in South Australia was rewarded an M.B.E. by Her Majesty the Queen in the 1971 New Year's Honours.

BLACKTOWN DISTRICT JUNIOR BAND

Band formed in 1969, contested for the first time in 1970 in "C" grade Australian Championship gaining first place. Regraded to "B" in 1971, contested "B" grade and "A" grade N.S.W. Championships in 1971 gaining first place "B" grade and first place "A" grade. Regraded "A" in 1971, contested N.S.W. Championships in 1972 and again awarded first place. Contested Australian Championship Ballarat 1972, gained second place and suffered first defeat.

Many of band personnel have been successful on all instruments from 1969 to 1972 in Band Solo and Party Competitions and also Eisteddfod. At 1972 N.S.W. State Solo and Party Contest, Blacktown Band won all Duets and Quartettes in both Junior and Open sections.

Band members are encouraged to take music as a subject for external examinations and many of the boys are consistently successful in examinations conducted by the A.M.E.B.

Mr. Keith Kellett has been the Band Conductor for most of the band's existence and has been responsible for its high standard of musical excellence. Currently the band is N.S.W. Senior "C" grade Champion, and N.S.W. School Boys Champion. In 1968 the band won the N.S.W. "B" grade Junior Championship and 1970 the Australian Senior "D" grade Championship. Mr. R. E. ("Dick") Ballard, the Hahndorf Junior Band's very popular bandmaster, has had a most colourful career as a band member, since he started banding at Tailem Bend at the age of 13.

Mr. Jack Rogers was his first bandmaster.

In 1923, he transferred to Adelaide where he played with the 48th Battalion Bugle Band Senior Cadets. Later, he transferred to the 48th Battalion Band Citizen Forces, where he held the ranks of Band Corporal and Deputy bandmaster.

He was later Band Sergeant (B.M.) for two years.

Dick played the French horn in the last season of the Municipal Tramways Symphonic Band; and he received a certificate to mark this. One of only 25 such certificates, he still has it among his many banding treasures.

He joined the student orchestra at the Conservatorium, where he played the French horn, and later was bandmaster for the Port Lincoln Town Band for about eight years.

In 1938, he transferred to Mount Barker Junction, and became bandmaster for the Hahndorf Town Band, of which he was still a member at the time the Hahndorf Junior Band was commenced in 1967.
