Geoffrey Brand

A.R.A.M., L.R.A.M., A.R.C.M.

Chief Adjudicator



Geoffrey Brand won an Open Scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music, London, and entered in 1947 following military service.

His studies included conducting and the trumpet. In 1950, he was invited to join the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra under Sir Thomas Beecham and in that year toured the United States with this orchestra.

Later, he became a member of the orchestra at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden. It was during this time that his love of opera was deepened.

He joined the B.B.C. in 1955 as a producer of music programmes for radio and television.

In 1967, he left the B.B.C. in order to further his conducting career. In that year, he became the Editor of the British Bandsman, Music Adviser to the National Youth Brass Band of Great Britain and professional conductor of Black Dyke Mills Band, leading them to victory in the National Brass Band Championships the same year.

Since then, he has conducted Black Dyke when they won the National Championships in 1970 and 1972 and the British Open Championships in 1968 and 1972.

Geoffrey Brand conducts in many concerts, in England and abroad, both with brass bands and orchestras. He is particularly associated with performances of modern and choral works.

His recent travels as a musician have taken him constantly to the continent of Europe, to the West Indies and to New Zealand.

Geoffrey Brand is particularly interested in working with young people. He is married with two children. In 1975 he visited Australia as Chief Adjudicator for the National Band Championships.

Lt. Colonel. Alex H. Henderson Co-Adjudicator

Lieut. Colonel Alex H. Henderson, A.R.C.M., A.Mus.A., B.B.C.M., Director, Australian Army Band Corps. He was Chief Musical Adjudicator at the National Contest held in Auckland, 14th - 18th May, 1975.

A pupil of Mr. Percy Jones, of St. Augustine's Orphanage, Geelong City Bands fame, Lieut. Col. Henderson has been associated with amateur brass bands for over 36 years, first as a cornet and trombone player, and later as a conductor and adjudicator. He has regularly judged Senior and Junior band contests in all States of Australia over the last 13 years, the most recent National contest being the Australian Championships in Hobart, 1974.

A member of the Australian Regular Army Bands since 1950, he is a graduate bandmaster of the Australian Army School of Music 1956-57, and the Royal Military School of Music (Kneller Hall) U.K. 1959-62. During the latter course of training was a member of the famous Kneller Hall Trumpeters, and winner of the Original Composition for Military Band, (judged by Major G. H. Willcock, of Irish Guards/Black Dyke Mills Band fame).

The last amateur brass band conductor appointment held was with Footscray/Yarraville City Band of Victoria, and the last professional military band appointment held was as Director of Music, Eastern Command Band (now called The Band of the Second Military District) in Sydney. Subject to limited time available in current appointment in Canberra as Head of Corps, he assists the National Band Council of Australia in its work when requested, the most recent being to conduct their annual fortnight bandmaster training workshopseminar in various States during 1974.

One hobby and relaxation is singing, and he is currently a bass-baritone with various singing groups—including the Canberra Choral Society.

Jack Hansen - Drill Adjudicator

Mr. Jack Hansen has had vast experience—spanning some forty years or more in the brass band movement, as a player, drum major, conductor, teacher and drill adjudicator.

He commenced his band career in the Kincumber Boys Band under Mr. Thomas Mellor, later he played with the St. John's Ambulance Band—one of Australia's leading bands, conductor being the famous Albert H. Baile.

Mr. Hansen is now the Musical Director of the Bexley District Band, and of the two De la Salle Brothers College Bands, at Kingsgrove and Revesby. He has achieved a number of successes with all three bands at contests in all States over the last 20 years.

As drum major he has led many bands to success. He has conducted drum major seminars for the Band Association on a number of occasions.

For many years he was associated with Mr. Robert Llewellyn, one of Australia's outstanding Drum Majors.

Mr. Hansen is a member of the Band Association Executive, and Music Advisory Board and National Band Council Delegate.

He was awarded Life Membership for his services to Bands in N.S.W.






