

Mr. Eric Roughana and his hard working committee deserve much of the credit for organising the Championships, which at the outset must have seemed a daunting task.


The Mount Gambier City Council, community service groups, business houses and individuals also assisted.



Adjudicators



Mr. Ronald Hanmer, F.T.C.L.; L.R.A.M.; L.G.S.M.; L.T.C.L.

Born in Surrey, England. Became a professional musician on leaving school at 17, and plays piano, organ, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet and violin – all badly! Has always specialised in arranging and composing music, covering the whole range from jazz to classics, from string orchestras to brass bands and choirs. Best known composition in Australia is “Pastorale” – more familiar as the theme music from the old ABC serial “Blue Hills”. Very many arrangements and compositions for band, including the test piece for the Australasian National Championship in 1978, “Down Under”. This was the first time a new piece had ever been premiered in Australia, and it went on to be used later in the year as a test piece in the British National Championship at the Royal Albert Hall. Two of the earliest works to become known to brass bands were “Souvenir de France” and “Stephen Foster Fantasy”. These proved so popular the world over, that they were published for piano solo, orchestra, brass and military band. More recent band compositions include several test pieces – “Mexican Fiesta”, “Episodes for Brass”, “The Four Corners of the World” and one yet to be used in Australia – “Alice in Wonderland”, which is the test piece for “C” grade in these Championships. He has a particular love for Latin-American music – was for 30 years chief arranger for Edmundo Ros, and also stage music – for many years he arranged music for the London Palladium shows, among many others. He believes there is no such thing as good and bad music – only good and bad players!



Dr. Charles H. Benner

Charles H. Benner, Professor of Music Education. B.S. in Ed., Wittenberg University; M.Ed., University of Cincinnati; Ph.D., Ohio State University. Teacher of instrumental music and high school principal, Ohio public schools. Band adjudicator; writer of numerous published articles on instrumental music teaching and music education. Recipient of 1971 Ohio Music Education Association Distinguished Service Award and of Wittenberg University 1973 Canticum Novum Award. President, Ohio Music Education Association, 1958-60; President, MENC North Central Division, 1965-67; President, Music Educators National Conference, 1974-76; Member, Board of Directors, International Society for Music Education, 1974-76. Faculty, School of Music, The Ohio State University, 1957-68; Faculty, College-Conservatory of Music since 1968. Professor Emeritus, University of Cincinnati, 1979.

Mr. L. Baxter, Queensland

Mr. Baxter has been a registered Adjudicator with the Queensland Band Association for over 20 years. Apart from Solo, Party and District Competitions, he has adjudicated at Ballarat, Victoria, 1960; New Zealand National Championships in Auckland, 1961; New South Wales, Lismore, New South Wales, 1962; Sydney, 1964; Tanunda, South Australia, 1964; Sydney, 1966; Launceston, Tasmania, 1968; Sydney, 1971; Sydney, 1974.

Mr. E. (Ted) Simons, New South Wales

He has taught well over 1,500 pupils in the various bands he has conducted. He was appointed Conductor to the Corrimal (New South Wales) Citizen's Band at the age of 18 years, achieving great success in contesting.

A registered Adjudicator since 1946, he has adjudicated in Queensland, South Australia, Victoria and Tasmania, plus all brass banding centres of New South Wales. With Mr. Simons' wealth of experience, we appreciate his service to our panel of Adjudicators for the National Championships at Mount Gambier, 1980.

Mr. Harold Walmsley, South Australia

Commenced with Federal Band, Brisbane, under W. H. Davis at the age of 12 years. He was appointed a Conductor of the Manly Concert Band at the age of 18 years. As a Conductor he has been successful in winning contests in Junior grades through to A grade. Has won Solo contests on Tenor Horn, Soprano and Bb Cornet.

Some of the bands he has conducted are: City of Perth, Maryborough Navy Band, R.A.A.F. Band, Bathurst District Band, Barrier Industrial Union Band, St. John's Ambulance Band, S.A.

He has been an adjudicator in all States since 1950 including Tasmania and South Street, Ballarat.

Mr. William H. Soames, New South Wales

Bill Soames received his early training from his father, who was the Conductor of Parramatta Band; later he studied Cornet and Conducting under the great E. P. Kerry.

As a Bandmaster, Bill has achieved success in all grades, both Junior and Senior. As a teacher, he has had outstanding success, his pupils having won numerous State and National Championships; also having phenomenal success in Party Items, Quartettes and Septettes.

Bill is a registered Musical Adjudicator with the Band Association of New South Wales and has officiated at many competitions.

At present Bill is on the teaching staff of St. Joseph's College, Hunters Hill, New South Wales.

Mr. Norman Henstridge, Brisbane, Qld.

Norm will be remembered as a Soprano and Bb Cornet player of considerable ability, having been Champion of Champions on both instruments. His services as an Adjudicator are keenly sought after throughout Australia and New Zealand. He has officiated at the New Zealand Nationals on two occasions, has been chief Adjudicator at Ballarat on three occasions and has Adjudicated in every other State. Mr. Henstridge is currently involved with the Junior movement in Queensland, conducting seminars and music schools in various areas throughout the State.

Mr. Neville Duniam (Queensland), Drill Adjudicator

Neville Duniam has had 43 years experience in all areas of band work in Australia, including playing with civilian, Army, Navy and Police Bands in Tasmania, Victoria, South Australia and Queensland.

As a musician, he has won 2 Champion of Champions awards, 2 Australian, several State titles, plus Best Player and many Open Solo events in district contests.

On the Drill side, he instructed and judged Marching Girls, was a Company Sergeant-Major in the C.M.F. and since 1956 has coached and led bands at contests in South Australia and Queensland.

In 1977 and 1979 he was Drill Judge at Queensland Championships, in 1978 judged at the National Titles in Melbourne and has also judged at several of the district contests held in his home State.

At present he is a member of the Queensland Drill Advisory Panel, and is a band delegate on the Queensland Band Association.

Mr. Britton Jones, Victoria

Began his career as a Side Drummer with a juvenile band in Richmond in 1920 and played with Richmond bands until 1934. In June, 1934, he was a foundation member of a new band starting in a new suburb and played with them until 1963 on Side Drum Bass, Drum and Drum Major. He later became a Drill Judge in 1963 and during the past 17 years he has judged in Queensland, Tanunda and all over Victoria, with 10 contests at Ballarat. He is in his 17th year as a delegate on the Victorian Bands League and during those years was Vice-President for 9 years and President for 2 years, and in 1972 was made a Life Member of the Victorian Bands League. Mr. Jones is not registered with any band, but is registered with the Victorian Bands League as an unattached Drum Major, which allows him to act on permit as Drum Major for any Band in a contest that does not have a Drum Major.

Contest Rules

1. All rules of the National Band Council shall apply throughout the contest, together with any other rules as submitted herewith.
2. Bands and soloists must play in the order in which they appear in the programme.
3. All or any competitors in Junior Sections may be required to produce their birth certificates or other proof of age prior to the commencement of their section of the contest.
4. Age as referred to in these rules shall mean the age of the contestant as at the date of the contest.
5. Each ensemble must consist of members of the one band (including the Conductor), and all shall wear uniform.
6. Competitors in ensemble sections, other than trios, shall be allowed the services of either their own Bandmaster or a member of their band as a Conductor.
7. Trumpets and French Horns may only be used in accordance with National Band Council Rule 15A.
8. Competing bands, ensembles and soloists are requested to be ready to play immediately the previous competitor is finished.
9. Bands will be permitted to check tuning for two (2) minutes only at the commencement of each appearance.
10. The Committee reserves the right to withhold prize money from any band which does not participate in all events listed on the schedule excluding those specifically stated as optional.





On arriving at point AA Band will counter-march from front to rear to point BB, then counter-march from flank to flank and continue marching to point E, right turn and march to point FF, right wheel and march to point GG, halt and continue to play march to the end of strain. Any band halting before or moving past point GG will be penalised one point for each pace. NOTE: When band turns right to counter-march from flank to flank at point BB, Drum Major and Drummers will turn left. When leading file is in line with left flank Side-Drummer, they will move off with band and complete the diagram. Band means front rank.
