

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO ACHIEVE AND MAINTAIN GOOD HEALTH?

Healthy Eating:

Eat plenty of fresh fruit, vegetables, wholegrain breads and cereals. Eat moderate amounts of lean meat, skinless chicken, fish and low fat dairy products.



Regular Exercise:

Try to get 30 minutes exercise at least 3 times a week. Remember, "Walking" is excellent exercise and a simple and effective way of staying healthy.

Control your Weight and try to be SMOKE-FREE.



500,000 Australians have diabetes, half of whom are not aware of it.

What is Diabetes?

Diabetes is a condition where there is too much glucose (sugar) in the blood. The body is unable to keep the blood glucose level within normal limits ie 3.5 - 8.0mmol/L. If the blood glucose level stays high for too long a person's health may deteriorate, sometimes quite seriously.

There are two major types of diabetes:

NIDDM (Non Insulin Dependent Diabetes Mellitus)

85% have Type 2 or NIDDM or Adult-onset. It usually occurs in adults over 40 years of age, especially in people who are overweight. The risk of developing adult-onset diabetes is higher if you have family members with diabetes BUT just because you don't have diabetes in your family does not mean that you are not at risk.

IDDM (Insulin Dependent Diabetes Mellitus)

Only 15% have Type 1 or IDDM. This type of diabetes usually occurs in people younger than 30 years but can happen at any age.

THE "WESTERN" LIFESTYLE IS CHARACTERISED BY A HIGH FAT, LOW FIBRE DIET, REDUCED EXERCISE AND INCREASED OBESITY, ALL FACTORS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF ADULT-ONSET DIABETES.






A Message From the Premier Of Victoria



MESSAGE FROM THE VBL PRESIDENT





CONDITIONS OF CONTEST

1. All Rules of the National Band Council of Australia shall apply throughout the contest, together with any other Rules as submitted herewith.
2. All Bands and Soloists should make themselves familiar with the Rules of the National Band Council by obtaining a copy from their respective State Governing Body. Ignorance shall not be an excuse.
3. All competitors are advised to pay particular attention to NBC Rules 3(b), 14(b), 15(b)(d)(e)(f)(g), 16(b)(c)(f), 17(a)(b)(c), 23(b)(e)9J(m.)
4. **Time Limits**
 - Own Choice Selections**
 - Open A & B Concert fourteen (14) minutes
 - Open A & B Brass fourteen (14) minutes
 - Open C & D Brass twelve (12) minutes
 - Junior A Concert twelve (12) minutes
 - Junior B Concert twelve (12) minutes
 - Junior B Brass ten (10) minutes
 - Hymn (all grades)** five (5) minutes
 - Hymn** to be selected from recognised Church Hymnal, words must be supplied
 - Quartets - Sections 57 - 58** eight (8) minutes
 - Champion of Champions** eight (8) minutes
5. **Music Scores**

18th February 1994 or the Band will incur immediate disqualification. (Refer NBC Meeting, Launceston, Easter 1987.) Band will be required to supply **three (3) scores for all own choice items** to be performed on stage.

 - Concert Band Own Choice Selection**
Scores as detailed as possible with all bars numbered, must be supplied.
 - Brass Band Own Choice Selection**
A full score with all bars numbered must be supplied.
 - Hymn**
A short score of at least two staves with sufficient cues to permit an effective adjudication, with all bars numbered must be supplied.

QUARTET SECTIONS
A full score with all bars numbered must be supplied.
NB All competitors are advised to thoroughly acquaint themselves with the current Copyright Laws and Regulations before submitting the Own Choice Music Scores. If a score is submitted with any form of IDENTIFICATION it will be immediately returned and another score without identification must be submitted within ten days. (This includes band or personal name.)
6. Bands all their players must be duly registered for Forty two (42) days prior to the date of the contest with their respective State Governing Body, or, New Zealand Brass Band Association. This Rule will also apply to all Permit Players. (NBC Rule 15(g)).
7. The Championship in each grade shall be awarded to the Band gaining highest aggregate points for the TEST SELECTION AND OWN CHOICE SELECTION.
8. In Solo and Quartet sections N.B.C. Qualifying standards shall apply; i.e. OPEN SECTIONS - EIGHTY FIVE (85) POINTS, JUNIOR SECTIONS - SEVENTY EIGHT (78) POINTS, or the Championship for that section will not be awarded.
9. Trophies shall be distributed in the following manner - 4 or more competitors, 1st, 2nd, 3rd; 3 competitors, 1st & 2nd only; 2 competitors 1st only; 1 competitor shall be the discretion of the adjudicators.

10. Bands entering two(2) grades must play different OWN CHOICE SELECTIONS in each grade. Junior Bands eligible to play in OPEN D GRADE may use the same OWN CHOICE SELECTION IN BOTH (NBC Rule 16(f)).
11. In Quartet sections each member of the party must be registered with the one (1) Band, including the conductor and must wear the uniform of that Band.
Competitors in these sections will be allowed the services of the Bandmaster, or another registered member of the Band as conductor. (NBC Rule 23(i)(j).)
12. Any entrant in a JUNIOR SECTION shall not have attained the age of nineteen (19) years as at the date of competition. Birth certificate or other means of proof of age may be required. (NBC Rule 3 (b))
13. Trumpets and French Horns shall be excluded from all OPEN BRASS SECTIONS. NBC Rule 15(a))
14. Any protest or dispute must be lodged in WRITING to the Contest Secretary, or a member of the Protest Committee, not later than fifteen (15) minutes after the decision of the Adjudicator(s) has been announced, if the protest be against a Band the fee shall be \$10.00, if against a Party or Soloist the fee shall be \$5.00 (NBC Rule 22 (h)(k).
15. The organising committee reserves the right to withhold Trophies and Awards from any Band which does not participate in all events listed on the schedule, excluding those specifically stated as being OPTIONAL.
16. **ADJUDICATION**
All on stage band performances will be judged by a panel of three (3) adjudicators who will sit separately and be behind a screen. Comments will be recorded simultaneously with the band's performance.
17. **PLAYING ORDER**
A draw for playing order, in all events will be made by the Contest Committee, competitors must appear in that order. Competitors will be advised of their place in the draw and will be given an approximate report time as soon as is practicable after the close of entries.
18. Competitors in any section may be disqualified if not ready to perform immediately after the previous competitor has completed their performance.
19. **CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS**
All recognised Brass Band Wind Instruments, plus, Trumpet, French Horn and C Tuba, will be included in the Brass Champion of Champions, Open and Junior.
All other wind instruments will be included in the Woodwind Champion of Champions, Open and Junior.
In the Percussion Sections, Open and Junior the Champion Percussionist will be decided by the aggregate of points awarded for each section on the following basis: 1st - 5 points, 2nd - 3 points, 3rd - 2 points, for starting - 1 point.
20. **WARMUP ON STAGE (Band Sections)**
Prior to the playing of the HYMN each Band will be allowed one minute.
Prior to the playing of the OWN CHOICE SELECTION (Brass Bands only) Bands may perform an item of NOT MORE THAN THREE MINUTES DURATION. (This item not to be judged.) These time limits will be strictly adhered to.
21. **ENTRIES**
All entries MUST BE ON THE OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM and must supply information requested.
22. **ENTRY FEES**

ALEX LITHGOW

Born in Scotland on 1st December 1870, raised in Invercargill, New Zealand and spending most of his adult life in Launceston, Tasmania, from the confines of this small environment, Lithgow managed to make an international name for himself in the early decades of this century. He was called "Australian March King" and "Sousa of the Antipodes." Lithgow music was featured at outdoor entertainments, on concert platforms, it was recorded on Phonograph cylinder, on early Gramophone discs and pianola rolls and was heard on wireless programmes.




The exact number of Lithgow marches is unknown as some were pirated and others lost during the First World War when in Germany for printing, and although Alex wrote songs, waltzes and suites, it is his marches which have stood the test of time. "Invercargill" is still considered one of the finest quick marches ever written. Many Lithgow tunes commemorate Australia and New Zealand and have accompanied troops to two world wars and to victory celebrations.

Lithgow was a cornet champion and more importantly, a gentleman who believed his wonderful talent should be shared by all. He advised young bandsmen and musicians to think about the piece of music for ten minutes and play it for five! He also published much of his own work under the names of Commonwealth Band Music.

Young Alex was five years old when he and his family stepped ashore on NZ soil. Father started to teach him the cornet when he was about nine years old. In 1881 aged 10 Alex joined the then famous Invercargill Garrison Band. Other than family, the only formal musical instruction received was on the violin. Alex dabbled in composition from an early age and tried out new tunes as a member of a little dance band. "Wairoa" written when Alex was about seventeen is recognised as his first published composition.

For thirteen years Alex Lithgow served the Garrison Band, twice winning the title Cornet Champion of NZ and eventually becoming the band's leader. He was a compositor before becoming a professional musician. He was business manager of the family entertainment group and was always performing with other musical combinations or solely. He played violin in the local Theatre Royal orchestra.

In July 1894 Alex Lithgow took up the position of bandmaster with St. Joseph's Band in Launceston. New Year's Day 1895 Lithgow and his band were victorious at the Castlemaine, Victoria contest and on 18th July of the same year repeated the result in a competition to settle the question of who was the premier band of Tasmania. During his early days in Tasmania the gifted composer also conducted the Campbell Town Band and returned to his trade when St Joseph's experienced financial problems. With Lithgow at the helm the band entered numerous contests with varied results, never able to repeat the triumph of 1895 although Lithgow compositions did win prizes and were chosen as test pieces for contests.

AUSTRALIA'S FIRST NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP WAS IT AT *BATHURST* OR *BALLARAT*?

Numerous band contests were held at various locations around Australia during the latter half of the last century. Most were generally local affairs but in the closing years of the 1890's a number of "Intercolonial Contests" were promoted by several different bodies.

In 1896 and again in 1897 the then newly formed Band Association of New South Wales staged their Intercolonial Contests in Sydney. These were followed in Melbourne by the Druids Society with similar events in the years 1897 - 98 and 99. Another was held in Launceston in 1898. Each of these contests attracted a number of top bands from various areas in Australia and the 1897 and 1898 Melbourne events each included an entrant from New Zealand.

A visitor to the Launceston contest of 1898 was Mr. Abe Gartrell, bandmaster of Bathurst City Band. Gartrell was so impressed with what he heard and saw whilst in Launceston that on his return home he became determined to stage a similar event in Bathurst. In due course an advertisement appeared in the "Bathurst Times" announcing the "Federal Intercolonial Band Contest" would be held in November, 1899. Separate divisions for first and second class bands (as they were referred to in those days) were to be provided and there was also nine sections for solo instrumentalists.

Entries for the second division numbered three only with nine bands in the first division. Amongst the latter was the Wellington Garrison Band of New Zealand, Code's Melbourne and Sydney's Newtown Band, the remaining bands were all from country areas of New South Wales, including one from the small isolated mining township of Hillgrove situated in the far north.

When the results of the competition were announced in the Bathurst press it was clearly stated that the senior band events and the solos were for "The Championship of Australasia." That contest, therefore, appears to have been the first "National" event held in Australia. And the Hillgrove Band, conducted by Hughie McMahon, became the first band to secure national honour, having beaten the famed Code's band of Melbourne by eight points, who were runners-up. But it is not clear just how, when and why the status of the contest changed from being an "Intercolonial" event to an "Australasian Championship" and one is left wondering how the promoters justified the elevation.

In the Bb cornet solo event, Hillgrove's conductor, Hugh McMahon gained first prize with a perfect score of 60/60 points. There were nineteen entrants.

Many people within the band movement associate early Australian National Championships with the contests promoted by the South Street Society at Ballarat. But although the Society promoted its first contest for bands in 1900 it was not until the 1903 event that the competition officially assumed the importance of an Australian Championship.

Apart from the above, the 1903 event was significant for several other reasons. Firstly, it attracted a then record entry - seventeen bands in all, representing five states - and they all competed against each other as grading at Ballarat was not introduced until 1905. Secondly, the contest was won by

the Newcastle City Band the only entrant from New South Wales. This band was undoubtedly one of the finest combinations in Australia at the time and under their conductor, William Barkel, had competed at Ballarat on the two previous occasions, winning both times.

Newcastle City, therefore, became not only the first band to gain the title of "National Champion" at Ballarat but was also the first band to gain the distinction of securing a hat-trick of wins at the famous banding centre.

In the blue ribbon solo section, the Bb cornet championship was won by Hugh McMahon again with a perfect score of 100/100 points. (What a magnificent player that man must have been.) And from all accounts thoroughly deserving of the title, "Emperor of the Cornet."

Although contesting at Ballarat does not generate the same "magic" today as it did in the early years of this century, it still remains in the hearts of many bandsmen "The Mecca of Australian Banding."
