The Netherlands

Jan Cober is one of The Netherlands foremost clarinetists and conductors.

He studied the clarinet and conducting at the Maastricht Conservatory in The Netherlands.

He continued his studies under the tutelage of Dutch musicians Willem van Otterloo and Ferdinand Leitner.

Cober then taught clarinet at the Dutch Conservatories of Maastricht, Utrecht and Tilburg.

In 1972, he was appointed to the position of principal clarinet with the Radio Philharmonic in The Netherlands, and in 1977 he attained the same position with The Hague Philharmonic.

Solo appearances and chamber music complement his orchestral and conducting activities.


Jan Cober appears regularly as a guest conductor with the Dutch Radio and Television orchestra.

His international reputation has spread with appearances in concerts and festivals in Boston, New York, Texas, Germany, France, Spain, Portugal, Austria and Australia.

He has made several recordings and CDs with band and orchestral music.

Jan Cober has visited Australia on a number of occasions and will act as one of two international adjudicators at the 1997 National Band Championships in Newcastle from Friday, March 28 to Monday, March 31.

Bengt Eklund, of Sweden, is a trumpeter of unique international acclaim, with a reputation for performance and teaching.

In 1970, he founded the Bengt Eklund's Baroque Ensemble, which plays replicas of baroque trumpets and trombones. The ensemble's latest recording, "Courtly Trumpet Ensemble Music" is a worldwide best seller.

In 1983, he formed the Goteborg Brass Band, which went on to become World Champion Brass Band in 1988.

His reputation as one of Sweden's finest brass teachers began when he was appointed Professor of trumpet and brass at the School of Music, University of Goteborg.


From 1989 to 1993, Bengt Eklund was also Director of Studies of the Department of Performance at the University of Goteborg with a special interest in exchange students and teachers from around the world.

In 1992, he was appointed Professor of Trumpet at the Norwegian State Academy of Music in Oslo, Norway.

Since 1994, he has also held the position of President of the European International Trumpet Guild and is its International Membership Coordinator.

Bengt Eklund will be one of two international adjudicators at the 1997 National Band Championships in Newcastle from Friday, March 28 to Monday, March 31.

John Kellaway was born in Newcastle, Australia. As a conductor John has directed the New Life Singers, Metropolitan Players, Sound Construction Company, Hunter Opera, Newcastle Police Citizens Youth Club Brass Band, Maitland City Brass Band, Sophisticated Swing Jazz Orchestra, Novocastrian Arts Orchestra, University of Newcastle Conservatorium Brass Choir, "I Medici" Chamber Orchestra and the Hunter Symphony Orchestra.

He is an adjudicator and music adviser to the Band Associations of New South Wales and adjudicates in Australian competitions for brass.

He is committed to the promotion and development of trumpet music in Australia. John has conducted workshops and concerts in Australia, New Zealand, Switzerland, England and the United States of America. As a successful applicant for a Newcastle University Conference Fellowship he attended the 1994 International Trumpet Guild Conference in Champaign/Urbana U.S.A. and was invited back to America to perform in the International Brass Festivals of 1995 and 1996 in the United States. In 1994 John formed the first Australian Chapter of the International Trumpet Guild at the University of Newcastle.

John is on the Board of Directors of the International Trumpet Guild and is leading figure in the Organization of the International Trumpet Guild in Australia and the Asian/Pacific Region.

John's current research interests are the collation of the Directory of Brass Music composed by resident Australian composers and early brass performance techniques on Natural Trumpets of the English Baroque tradition. At present he is Lecturer in Trumpet at the University of Newcastle, and lectures on conducting skills at the University of Newcastle. He is considered one of the leading teachers in his field in Australia and is building an international reputation as a trumpet pedagogue and performer. He has been invited to give masterclasses and teach performance skills at the 1997 International Trumpet Guild conference in Goteborg Sweden in August 1997.

Brett Kelly undertakes a diverse and demanding range of musical activities. He is Principal Trombone of the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra, a leading solo and chamber performer, an outstanding exponent of contemporary music and is increasingly active as a conductor. In this role he is Artistic Director of the highly respected chamber orchestra, "The Academy of Melbourne".

He studied at the Newcastle Branch of the New South Wales State Conservatorium of Music, graduating in 1979 having gained both the Teachers and Performers Diplomas. In 1978 and 1979 he was Principal Trombone in the Australian Youth Orchestra and in 1980 was appointed Principal Trombone of the Elizabethan Sydney Orchestra, resident at the Sydney Opera House. In 1981 he won the N.S.W. State final of the A.B.C. Instrumental and Vocal Competition in the Wind and Brass section and soon after was appointed Principal Trombone of the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra. As times he has performed as soloist with the M.S.O., Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Queensland Symphony Orchestra, Philharmonia of Melbourne and Melbourne Musicians.

Brett has studied conducting with the distinguished Austrian/Romanian conductor Robert Rosen and during July and August 1991 undertook advanced study with a number of prominent conductors and teachers in Europe; firstly at the Vienna Conservatory, then in Switzerland, Salzburg and finally in Czechoslovakia at a course with six prominent conductors including the Chief Conductor of the Czech Philharmonic, Juri Belohlavek. At the course in Switzerland Brett was chosen to conduct the South Bohemian Chamber Philharmonic (Czech) in a public concert which concluded the Mastercourse. During the Czechoslovakian course Brett conducted the Bohuslav Martinu Philharmonic in works ranging from Haydn to Bruckner and Tchaikovsky.

COAL RIVER SYNOPSIS

Coal River is about the Hunter Valley region of New South Wales. The Hunter River, once known as Coal River flows into the Tasman sea at Newcastle. I begin the piece with "The Fatal Shore". This title, indeed the idea for this opening section of the music, is inspired by Robert Hughes' book. The first chapter, captures in the most exciting manner the impressions and feelings of the convicts on their first sighting of the Australian coast. They are overwhelmed by the sandstone cliffs, the endless beaches, a coastline of stunted, dry, spiky vegetation behind which they espy ranges of impenetrable forests. The convicts find themselves in the purgatory of a wild and daunting prison of unimaginable vastness.

The opening bars catch the mixed and complex feelings of loss, anguish, oppression, on the one hand, and on the other hand, resignation, acceptance, curiosity and wonder. The opening chords and melodic motive form the basis of much of the music that follows. At Allegro Vigoroso, the basses sound the next important theme. A theme of relentless vigour. I imagine the brutal, harsh existence, that was the lot of the convicts in this strange and inhospitable environment. The drum, alerts us to the oppressive militarism of the colonial authorities. At C, bar 39, I introduce, what I call my "maritime" theme. This is an important theme and reappears throughout the piece. It reminds me of the English broadsides. It has the rolling rhythm of the songs of the sea. In this section there are moments of hope, but omnipresent in the background, there is the sense of oppression sounded by the basses and the drum. As the music develops it takes on the character of work song. This evokes the image of convicts labouring incessantly. Digging and carrying coal and lime. Driven by the whip, only a few surviving the cruel suffering under the yoke of the penal authorities.

Life was so harsh in the convict settlement of Newcastle, that many attempted escape. Some succeeded. They wrought havoc among the tribes. Abducting the women, murdering the elders, destroying anyone and anything that got in their way. "The Baying Hounds", inspired by the poem of Mary Gilmore, is about the fugitive. The army relentless in pursuing the escapees was equally relentless in dispersing the tribes. The colonial policy was to release the land for settlement. The Kooris suffered what amounts to genocide at the hands of the convicts, the army, and the settlers. The idea of this music is pursuit, flight, anger, fear. The music finds no resolution. In this new form the opening chords of "The Fatal Shore" are sounded again. We do not forget the oppression and cruelty of our past. We simply and violently hand it on.

The British lay claim to this vast continent and all its resources. To settle and develop these resources a policy of migration was put in place. "Come You Not From Newcastle?", The miners came, and with them their families, and many settlers, to many regions, from all parts of the British Isles and beyond. The Hunter Valley was rapidly occupied. In a short time, the main quest was coal. Most of the land was already taken. Agriculture, sheep, wine, general trade, stepped back, making way for the black gold. Endless wealth and power, dormant beneath the ground. There for the taking. I discover a traditional folksong from Newcastle-on-Tyne. I throw it into the Valley. There is much hustle and bustle, and surfacing, I detect a humourous note.

The mines, and the miners, are central to the development of Newcastle. Mining is dangerous. There are many deaths and injuries. Some of the mines extend far out, under the sea. It is possible to hear the ships pass over as they enter harbour. "Beneath Tidal Water" a book by Ed Tonks inspired this section.

Imagine a lone bugler at the entrance of every mine. The mines are like tombs. The bugles sound across the valley, overlapping, intermingling, calling for the lost workers and mourning for their wives. Out of this emerges an expression of anger and betrayal. Forsaken by both man and God. Crimond, the twenty-third psalm, is bitter and harsh. The music rises within fiercely contained anger. Such anger and grief is not sustainable. These feelings fall away, and are transformed into acceptance and resignation.

On the backs of the miners we career into the modern world. "Shaping The Hunter" begins with the base line from "The Fatal Shore". It is developed as a fugue. There are many branches, many streams. We pursue our dreams and ambitions, gathering the resources we find on the way. "The Baying Hounds" call us yet again. We fly into the embrace of heavy industry and ensuing wealth. The music pounds on with increasing tension. With a deeply buried sense of preordination, the mythical, almost forgotten giant kangaroo awakens and bounds along the fault line. The town collapses like a house of cards. The earthquake, is both reality and metaphor. Archetypal memories, of bitter struggle easily forgotten, are rekindled.

The "Finale" is a new beginning. We build on what we have. The brutality and the suffering from the past is not forgotten. It takes new form. The trombone is the messenger of resolve, and like the songs of the Songmen, the stories of the past are retold and lead us slowly, with dignity and joyousness into a hopeful future. The carillon, rings out across the valley, a greeting for the new millennium.





NATIONAL A GRADE BAND CONTEST OPEN

Nine Australian and New Zealand bands competed in the first section of the Australasian A grade championships at Newcastle Showground last night.

Results will not be announced until the second section – the "own choice" – takes place tonight.

Only 1125 attended the contest. Some people, unaware until the programme began that each band would play the same test selection, left early.

Mrs. I. Heaton, of James Street, Hamilton, who was among those who left before 9 o'clock, said: "We didn't know it was going to be the same thing over and over. We were very disappointed, although the bands play well."

Suspected of "Crashing"

A number of bandsmen had difficulty in getting into the ground. Although they had special tickets, a gatekeeper thought they were trying to crash in because they were not in uniform. They changed on the ground.

The test selection was a symphonic legend, "Princess Nada", arranged by Dennis Wright. rendition times ranged from 11min. to 12min. 10sec.

Although no comment on general standard will be made by the judges until tonight, popular opinion was that performances were of exceptionally high quality.

The judges, each in a separate tent behind the dais on which the bands played, were Messrs, H. Shugg, J. J. Kelly and J. Compton.

The nine bands, in order of draw, were: Barrier Industrial Unions, N.S.W. Road Transport and Tramway, Melbourne Metropolitan Fire Brigades, Wellington Waterside Workers, Newcastle Ex-Servicemen's and City, Northern Suburbs, N.S.W. Railways Institute, Sydney St. John Ambulance Brigade, and Bathurst District.

Officials expect large crowds at the sessions this afternoon, tonight, tomorrow afternoon and night.

This afternoon, the C grade "own choice" and B grade quickstep contests will be decided. The C grade quickstep and A grade quickstep will be held tomorrow afternoon, and B grade "own choice" tomorrow night.

Instrumental competitions will be held at the City Hall and Caldwell House this morning.

Additional bands will arrive from Sydney and Katoomba today.
