

OUR MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

GEOFFREY BRAND

A.R.A.M., L.R.A.M., A.R.C.M.

Geoffrey Brand is an English-born musician and conductor whose international reputation has been built over a wide range of musical activities.

During his studies at the Royal Academy of Music, London, where he gained an Open Scholarship, he won prizes as a trumpet soloist and orchestral player and attracted attention as a conductor.

As a trumpet player he was invited to join the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra (touring the U.S.A with that orchestra in 1950) later becoming a member of the Royal Opera House Orchestra, London for five years.

In 1955 Geoffrey Brand became a BBC Producer of music programmes, working in radio and television for 12 years, before leaving to concentrate on a conducting career.


Since then Geoffrey Brand has worked with orchestras, choirs and bands, making regular tours as conductor and music educator to the U.S.A, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Israel, Malaysia, Indonesia and extensively throughout Europe including conducting tours in Russia and Kazakhstan.

Geoffrey Brand is founder, artistic director and conductor of The City of London Wind Ensemble, a prestigious group which draws its players from the finest professional wind players in London. C.D recordings of the C.L.W.E have won international acclaim.

With his wife, Violet, Geoffrey Brand has written two books, "Brass Bands in the 20th Century" (1979) and "The World of Brass Bands" (1986) both published in England by Egon Publishers.

In the U.S.A Geoffrey Brand is highly sought after as clinician and conductor at Universities and Colleges.

Recent acknowledgements of his work include the International Award of the Mid West Clinic presented In Recognition of Outstanding Contributions and Dedication to Instrumental Music Education on an International Level and also the Grainger Award for services to the music of Percy Grainger.




KEVIN LESLIE JARRETT MBE

Kevin started his long career as a musician in 1943 when, at the age of six, he joined the Fielding Junior Band playing the cornet. He won his first New Zealand title at the age of ten when in 1947 he won the Junior Cornet Championship. He repeated this success in 1948.

In 1953 he moved to Wanganui where he joined Queen Alexandra's Own Band, under the conductorship of Ernie Webb.

In 1957 he won the New Zealand Amateur Cornet Championship and in 1959 was the principal cornet player for the band when it won the New Zealand A Grade Championship.

Kevin moved to Palmerston North in 1960 and continued to achieve success. His most notable achievement was in 1964 when he traveled to Ballarat in Australia, and won the Australian Cornet Championship.



In further pursuit of his musical career Kevin joined the New Zealand Army Band in 1965 and, in 1967, was posted to Malaysia for two years as solo cornet for the First Battalion, Royal New Zealand Infantry Regiment Band. He returned to this Band in Singapore in 1971, this time as Bandmaster. During this posting Kevin was awarded the ANZUK (Australia, New Zealand, United Kingdom) Force Commander's Commendation, he was the first New Zealand soldier to receive this honour. The award was given to Kevin for his devotion to duty, and for his work with the 1RNZIR Band. On his return to New Zealand Kevin was appointed Bandmaster of the New Zealand Army Band, stationed in Burnham.

Kevin transferred to Wanganui in 1975 and took up the appointment of Conductor of his former band, by then known as Tenderkist Wanganui City Silver Band. Kevin conducted the band the Band for 25 years and in the year 2000 Kevin retired as Conductor of the Band, although the Band was then known as Wanganui City Brass.

During his 54 years involvement with brass bands Kevin has been selected as a member of the National Band of New Zealand on eleven occasions, and appointed as Musical Director four times, the pinnacle of achievement for a conductor.

Kevin has also been appointed Musical Director of the National Youth Band of New Zealand three times in 1978, 1979 and 1981.

In 1986 Kevin was awarded the MBE for his services to the Brass Band movement in New Zealand. In 1997 he was appointed National Director of Education for the New Zealand Brass Bands Association.

Kevin is also an accomplished adjudicator, and has officiated at many New Zealand competitions. He has been an adjudicator in Australia on 14 different occasions.

BARRIE GOTT **M.MUS., LTCL, A.Mus.A.**

Barrie Gott began his professional career as a trumpet player with the National Training Orchestra and was a regular casual with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

Over the past 30 years his work in education has seen him teaching at primary, secondary and tertiary levels as well music director for bands in USA and Australia.

He has worked in New South Wales and Queensland in private and state schools and in California as Director of Instrumental Music at Azusa Pacific University where he conducted various ensembles and choirs as well as lecturing in arranging, conducting, orchestration and music theory.

Barrie has also served as music director for The Salvation Army in Southern California and Eastern Australia.

He is a published composer in the United Kingdom, USA and Australia as well as being a commercial arranger with many credits internationally.

As an adjudicator he has officiated at national, state and regional band contests as well as the Siddis entertainment contest in Norway and the Australian Academy Music Festivals, Catholic Colleges Festival and the City of Sydney Eisteddfod.

Barrie is currently employed by Education Queensland as an instrumental instructor and is a state examiner for the Australian Music Examinations Board.

He also conducts the Salvation Army Brisbane City Temple Band.



DEREK TAYLOR – MBE

Former Director of the Tamworth Regional Conservatorium of Music, a position which he held for ten years until semi-retirement in January 1996, Derek Taylor's career in music began in the British Army at the age of fifteen years. Commencing as a boy musician cornet player in the Royal Irish Fusiliers, Derek eventually became Bandmaster of the Queens Royal Lancers, the youngest Bandmaster in the Army at the age of 26 years. In 1969 as the senior Bandmaster of the Army he became School Bandmaster of the Royal Military School of Music Kneller Hall, before commissioning as Director of Music of the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst. After five and a half years in that appointment he became Director of Music of HM Welsh Guards, one of the world's finest bands, a position he held for twelve years before retiring to Australia in 1986.



A member of the celebrated Kneller Hall Trumpeters whilst a student Bandmaster, Derek was a member of the Trumpet team which played at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth. He has travelled the world in his various appointments, playing in more than 40 countries. During his last eight years in the Welsh Guards, Derek was examiner in conducting for the Royal Academy of Music in London and has also examined for the Royal College of Music, Trinity College and the Ministry of Defence. Awarded the MBE for his services to music, he was invested by the Queen on the day of his departure for Australia. He is now a well known Band adjudicator in this country and has adjudicated at State, National and International levels. He adjudicated the National Championships in Tasmania in April 2000 and the NSW State Championships in Newcastle in August 2000.

In 2001 he adjudicated the Western Australia State Championships in Perth and in 2002, the Queensland Championships at Gladstone and the W.A Championships again, in Perth.

At the end of 2002, Derek gave up the Consultancy to the Board of the Tamworth Regional Conservatorium, the conducting appointments of the Regional Youth Orchestra, the Concert band and the Conservatorium Clarinet Choir and with his wife, Margaret, has relocated to Montville Queensland. Still avoiding complete retirement, Derek has accepted the post of Conductor of the Sunshine Coast Youth Orchestra.

MICHAEL BELL studied for the Diploma of the State Conservatorium of Music (D.S.C.M.) and Bachelor of Music Education at the Newcastle Conservatorium of Music. In 1986 he began study at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music for his Bachelor of Music (performance). He studied under Baden McCarron and Arthur Hubbard..

In his student days Michael was a member of the Australian Youth Orchestra, Sydney Youth Orchestra and the Sydney Conservatorium Orchestra. In 1989 he studied in London with Michael Hext, principal trombone of the London Philharmonic Orchestra. Since 1991 Michael has been a regular member of the Hunter Orchestra.

From 1990 he has been the Musical Director of the University of Newcastle Concert Band and from 1990 to 1999 the conductor of Toronto Brass Band. Both bands have had many successes in competitions at State and National levels. Michael is presently a part time Lecturer in Trombone in the Faculty of Music of the University of Newcastle. He additionally also has a private studio and is involved with Music and Band programmes at four schools in the Hunter Region.

Michael was Musical Director for the Opera Hunter 1999 Season of The Merry Widow, the 2000 season of Die Fledermaus as well as the 2001 season of West Side Story.

Michael has adjudicated previously for the Band Association of N.S.W at Branch and State contests and in 2002 adjudicated at the N.S.W State Solo Championships.

IAN COOK graduated from Newcastle Conservatorium of Music in 1978 having studied clarinet with Clive Amadio being awarded the Diploma of the State Conservatorium of Music (D.S.C.M.) and the L.Mus.A. In 1985 Ian continued his studies at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music studying with Alan Vivian and Terence Stirzaker in the Bachelor of Music program.

In 1981 Ian studied clarinet pedagogy and repertoire with Pamela Weston and Colin Bradbury in London. In 1989 he returned to London to take lessons on basset horn with Georgina Dobree.

For the past ten years Ian has tutored and conducted at the Pan Pacific Music Camps in Sydney. In 1993 he toured South East Asia conducting the Pan Pacific Music Camp Youth Wind Orchestra. In 1998, 1999 and 2000 he was guest conductor of the Wind Symphony at the International Music Camp. Last January Ian toured the East Coast of the U.S.A with the Wind Symphony.

Currently Ian is a member of the Woodwind Department of the Faculty of Music and Conservatorium at the University of Newcastle as well as being Director of Bands.

In 1993 he was awarded a high commendation in the "Award of Excellence in Teaching" by the University of Newcastle. In 1997 Ian received for his work with the Wind Orchestra the Vice Chancellor's Award at the Annual Scholarship Night.

In 2000 he gained his Master of Music from the University of Newcastle majoring in conducting. In addition, Ian's research area was the editing of a new performing edition of the Quintet for basset clarinet and strings by Mozart. This year Ian is continuing his studies in a doctoral program in the Faculty of Music with a major emphasis on opera conducting and wind orchestra. His mentor has been Myer Fredman.

JOHN KELLAWAY studied at the Sydney and Newcastle Conservatoria of Music, gaining his Bachelor of Music Education Degree in 1987. In 1991 he was appointed Lecturer in Trumpet at the University of Newcastle's Faculty of Music and is currently the Head of Brass. John has also studied for his A.Mus.A, L.Mus.A, D.S.C.M and L.T.C.L.

As a player John is involved with solo, ensemble and orchestral playing, and has recorded, as well as played trumpet for the New England Ensemble, Sydney Festival Brass, University of Newcastle and Hunter Orchestras. He has toured all the Eastern States of Australia, New Zealand, Switzerland, England and America.

As a Conductor John has directed the New Life Singers, Metropolitan Players, Sound Construction Company, Hunter Opera, Newcastle P.C.Y.C. Brass Band, the Novacastrian Arts Orchestra and the University Conservatorium Brass Choir.

John is committed to the promotion and development of music in Australia. Many choirs, orchestras and ensembles have benefited from his workshops. He has also been the Education Officer for the Hunter Orchestras and lectures final year University undergraduates in conducting skills.

He has been delighted to see that persistence has finally paid off, and that from the commencement of the 2002 academic year, brass band instruments such as the cornet, euphonium, trombone and tuba have been accepted at Newcastle University for the Bachelor of Music performance studies.

John has been successful in his applications to study overseas on Newcastle University Conference Fellowships and has continued to develop the activities of the International Trumpet Guild and has supported the establishment of the Australian Trumpet Guild.

He is a highly respected and experienced adjudicator who has previously adjudicated at State and National level on many occasions.

BETH MOLONEY

M.Mus., B.Mus.Ed., T.Mus.A., L.T.C.L., A.Mus.A. (Fl. & T of M), T.C., A.A.C.

Beth Moloney has been involved in music performance and education for over 24 years as a player, educator, conductor and adjudicator. Principally a flautist Beth has also expanded her studies to include performance on most woodwind as well as brass and strings. As a player she has been involved with woodwind, brass, orchestral and chamber ensembles of all forms professional and amateur. As a competitor she has had success at all levels as a soloist and in duets, quartets and ensembles.

Beth completed her Bachelor of Music Education and commenced High School Music teaching. At the same time developing her already established private teaching studio. Beth earned a reputation as a fine teacher for children of all abilities and especially her abilities in dealing with adult learners. Her work with struggling young ensembles in schools and other areas saw them flourish into fine musical groups. She continued her studies adding a diploma in theory to her performance and teaching diplomas and continued through a Masters degree at the University of NSW.

Beth is the Musical Director of the Sutherland Shire Police and Community Youth Club Concert Band who were promoted to A Grade Concert following wins at last year's National and NSW State Championships.

Beth is married with two young children. She is looking forward to adjudicating at the 2003 Nationals and wishes all competitors the best of luck for your performances.

STEVEN MORTON graduated from the University of Newcastle Conservatorium of Music in 1990 having studied percussion with Ken Laing and Graeme Leak being awarded the Diploma of Music with High Distinctions in Performance and Chamber Music.

Steven currently holds the position of Lecturer in Percussion at the University of Newcastle Conservatorium where he also directs the Conservatorium Percussion Ensemble.

Having experience with a wide range of musical styles, Steven teaches drums and percussion at Newcastle Grammar School and both the Newcastle and Maitland branches of the Conservatorium.

Steven's performing experience includes The Hunter Symphony Orchestra, The Sydney International Orchestra, various Theatre Orchestras, Jazz Bands, Big Bands and Rock Bands. He has also been involved in numerous recordings for television, radio and CD.

THE ALBERT BAILE TROPHY

This trophy was instituted in 2000 to honour Albert Baile – one of Australia's most successful brass band conductors of the 20th Century. Baile took the Newcastle Steelworks Band to Britain in 1924 and they became the first overseas band to win the British Open. He formed and toured the Commonwealth Bands in the late 1920's and achieved great success with St. John Ambulance (NSW) Band in the 1940's and 1950's.

Baile was named conductor of Australia's Band World Band of the Century in 2001 and the award, presented to the conductor in each brass grade winner at the National Championships is a fitting way to perpetuate the outstanding contribution he made to brass band music.

The plaques are donated by Muso's Media which also presents similar awards to the conductors of the champion concert bands.

OUR DRILL ADJUDICATORS

DAVID KURTHI **(Chief Drill Adjudicator)**

At the age of thirteen when David commenced playing percussion with the Waratah Mayfield Brass Band, he had a desire to lead the band in marching. David became a member of the Newcastle Police Citizens Boys Club Brass Band some years later and due to the unavailability of their Drum Major was given the opportunity to lead the band. David immediately excelled in this position and was instrumental in the band becoming a formidable marching group throughout Australian Championships.



With drum majoring and training the Newcastle Police Citizens Boys (later Youth) Club Brass Band, David won eight Youth Club Championships, five Australian Championships and numerous State and Regional competitions and street parades. David has won three Australian National Drum Major awards.

In 1988 David was invited to train and drum major the St Marys Band Club Brass Band to compete in New Zealand. With only six weeks to train the band they won the New Zealand B Grade Display Marching Championships which no other Australian band had achieved. Following that, David continued to lead and train the band achieving two first and two second places in Australian National Championships.

David introduced the free style marching (oval marching) to New South Wales in 1986 with a series of weekend camps and he maintained a high profile by organizing and lecturing at drum major camps for the Hunter Regional Band Association.

David was appointed Chief Drill Judge at the Australian National Championships in Sydney in 1996 and was a member of the Drill Panel at the 1998 Nationals in Adelaide. He has adjudicated at the South Australian State Championships and Tanunda Festivals.

David is highly regarded in marching circles for his commitment to excellence and professionalism in marching. He has adjudicated throughout NSW at numerous Regional Championships and Street Parades.

David was the Chief Organiser of the Australian National Championships held in Newcastle 1997 and since 2000 has been enjoying country banding, training and marching.

GREG DOYLE. **(Drill Adjudicator)**

GREG DOYLE is a member and former Vice President of the Band Association of NSW and has served as the NSW Delegate on the National Band Council. He became a Drill Judge and member of the Drill Advisory Board of NSW in 1986 and in 1987 was invited to the New Zealand Championships where he was instructed in judging techniques by Chief Drill Judge, Tony Cowan. Greg first judged at the Australian Championships in Adelaide in 1991, and was Chief Drill Judge in Sydney in 1992 and Newcastle in 1997. Other appointments have included NSW Marching Championships, the East Coast Display and Marching Contest and a variety of street parades.

As a Drum Major, Greg led Willoughby Band to successive wins at the Australia Quickstep/Display contest 1985, 1986 and in 1987 both the Quickstep/Display and Street March contests.

In recent years, Greg was the conductor of the Moruya Brass Band on the NSW South Coast but is now living on the Central Coast of NSW and is enjoying active community banding as a member of the Tuggerah Lakes Show Band.

KEN HUCKSTEPP (Drill Adjudicator)

Ken has had a lifetime of experience in banding and is a Life Member of the Band Association of New South Wales and winner of NSW Bandsman of the Year Award in 1987.

Ken commenced learning percussion from his father at the age of eight and joined the Rockdale Boys Band. In later years he gave service to many bands including Bexley Boys, Hurstville, Bexley District, Bankstown, Sutherland and St. Marys and was in demand to assist other bands, particularly at competition times. He toured New Zealand with the successful Portland Boys Band, under the leadership of Ted Simons in 1953.

Ken was solely responsible for percussion being included as a solo event at State and National Championships and was the inaugural winner of this event in 1970, followed by many other State and Regional titles.

During the 1980's Ken became involved as an administrator and was the Secretary of the Sydney Metropolitan Band Branch for a period of six years and also served as a Member of the Board of the Band Association of N.S.W for over twelve years. During this period Ken was an active member of the State Drill Advisory Board and for several years officiated as a Drill Judge at street parades and other competitions including the Sydney Anzac Day March.

PARTICIPANT'S MEMENTO

Every band participating at the 2003 Australia National Band Championships will be presented with a memento of the occasion.

These mementos were made for the Band Association of N.S.W by Mr. Rex Burton.

Mr. Burton's interest in woodturning commenced in 1986 when he completed a ten week W.E.A course. He had never even seen a wood lathe up until that time but following completion of the course became addicted to the hobby.

Mr. Burton was working very long hours with the Wollongong City Council and although he didn't get much time for woodturning, he did have the opportunity to collect a lot of timber, an art in itself. The timber has to be cut, prepared and stacked so that it doesn't destroy itself as it seasons. Mr. Burton discovered that by trial and error and a lot of timber became firewood in the process.

He retired in 1999 and now has a lot more time to experiment with his woodturning. He makes a wide variety of articles and everything is useable. He has not previously made a lot of trophies or ornaments and the 2003 Nationals task was a unique experience for him.

The mementos. The maps of NSW are from Plane Tree, sourced from trees that were cut from the footpath in Burelli Street, Wollongong, some years ago. The bases are camphor laurel, sourced from a large tree in a Russell Vale (NSW) backyard. The pedestals are made from limbs taken from a golden cryptic pine that still grows in Mr. Burton's front yard. The maps are attached to the pedestal with a steel pin.

Mr. Burton suggests " Bands travelling by plane who set off security metal detectors at the airport, and can't find the cause, might check their memento!"

A TRIBUTE TO THE EARLIER BANDS OF NEWCASTLE

The choice of Newcastle as host city for this year's Australian National Band Championships provides an appropriate opportunity to recall the names of some former bands, conductors and players who, musically speaking, brought fame to this city they called home.

As a result of the success achieved by the now legendary Steelworks Band during its tour of Britain in 1924, it is, understandably, regarded as Newcastle's most famous brass band. However, it should not be forgotten that there were other bands, before and after 1924, who also brought honour to Newcastle at national and even international level.

The history of banding in Newcastle goes back a long time, for records reveal that district bands were well established and active at Waratah, Lambton and Wallsend for some years before 1870. They can all, therefore, be regarded as "early" Australian brass band formations.

Published reports of the day indicate that their services were well in demand for they were regularly engaged to provide music for lodge processions, workers' picnic days, regattas, race meetings, sports days, dances or any other function where the sound of music was considered an added attraction or just to enliven proceedings. Brass bands in those days, usually numbered no more than sixteen or seventeen players and those mentioned above were, according to contemporary newspaper reports, considered excellent combinations.

Preceding those district bands was the band of the Newcastle Volunteer Rifles which was in existence around the year 1860. It was trained by a Mr. Fanning who even composed a march for them, not surprisingly entitled-"The Newcastle Volunteer Rifles". A Naval Brigade Band was also established about 1869. Of those very early Newcastle bands, Waratah is the only one still functioning, though now under the banner of Waratah Brass.

Other Newcastle bands that existed before the end of the 19th century were located at Burwood, Wickham, Minmi, Hamilton, Stockton, Merewether, Carrington and Adamstown. Also there was The Blue Ribbon Temperance, the Fire Brigade (F Fitness), The Great Northern (George Hardy), Artizan's (Wm. Cantello) and Barkel's Model (Bill Barkel). In addition there was the 4th Regiment and the Newcastle City, both of which were conducted by Bill Barkel. Not all of those bands, however, functioned at the same time.

The first Newcastle band to establish a reputation for itself beyond the local area was the 4th Regiment under Bill Barkel. In January 1888, it won the Grand Centennial Contest at Sydney, which was the most important band contest held in Australia up to that time. In winning the event, the Newcastle band easily defeated bands from Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia and various areas of N.S.W. The 4th Regiment also competed successfully at contests in Wollongong and Newcastle during the early nineties. Its fame was such that sometime in 1891 it was chosen to record several selections on wax cylinders which were later used during early public demonstrations of the Edison phonograph around Australia.

When Council established the Newcastle City Band in 1898, Barkel was appointed bandmaster. He quickly justified that appointment by registering a hat-trick of wins (1901-02-03) at the great series of band contests inaugurated in 1900 by the South Street Society at Ballarat, Victoria. The Newcastle City Band was, in those days, Australia's premier brass band and Bill Barkel certainly one of this country's finest bandmasters.

In a review of Newcastle bands published in 1916, it was said that Barkel was, at some time during his life, involved as conductor of almost every district band in Newcastle. His overall contribution to the bands of Newcastle as a teacher and conductor was both lengthy and highly beneficial. He died in 1920.

Other names prominent in pre-war years were Henry E Kerry, James J Kelly and, of course, Albert H. Baile. Kerry was an Englishman who first visited Newcastle as a member of the Besses o'th'Barn Band during its second world tour of 1910-1911. On completion of the tour he returned to Newcastle and was immediately offered the conductorship of the newly formed Municipal Band which replaced the former City Band. Later in 1923 when the Municipal band was re-organised as full military style combination he continued as conductor and from 1919 until his death in 1931 also had control of the Merewether Band. The Municipal band was A Grade NSW Champions in 1921.

Kerry taught many young players in a private capacity and trained a number of school bands including Cook's Hill, Adamstown, Hamilton and Wickham. A first class euphonium player himself he tutored Ernie Ormerod who later succeeded in winning several State euphonium titles

and the Championship at Ballarat in 1921. Ernie was one of a select group of instrumentalists who mastered the technique of producing three distinct notes simultaneously on his instrument.

James J Kelly, known throughout the band world as "J J", came from Scotland and like Kerry taught many young players. He had charge of a number of bands in the district, the first of which, West Wallsend, was passed to him by Bill Barkel. He was bandmaster of West Wallsend from about 1912 until 1932 and whilst there tutored a young Danny Taylor who later toured with the Steelworks Band as deputy to the principal cornet, Arthur Stender.

Kelly's name though, is usually associated with the Hamilton Citizens' Band with which he competed regularly at the Sydney contests between 1928 and 1936. During that period Hamilton was awarded five first placings (which included two National titles) and three seconds (including one National). Kelly's services were lost by Newcastle in 1937 when he accepted a lucrative offer to take control of a band in Queensland.

As stated earlier it is the Steelworks Band that most band people remember and associate directly with the City of Newcastle. And synonymous with that group is the name of Albert H Baile, their conductor, whose name is now secure in British and Australian band history.

In 1924, the Steelworks Band was the first Australian brass band to compete against the crack British combinations and to the surprise of many in Britain and Australia they did this with remarkable success. The band competed in England's three most important contests that year, winning two, the British Empire Championship at Halifax and the historic Belle Vue Championship, Manchester, then gaining third place at the National Championships, Crystal Palace London. This was a magnificent achievement by the local Newcastle band that proved itself to be of world class standard under the guidance of Albert Baile.

By the late thirties, Newcastle's four existing suburban bands, Hamilton, Merewether, Waratah and West Wallsend were struggling to survive hard economic times, due to a lack of adequate financial support from the City Council. A recommendation by Council that each disband and reform as one was strongly resisted and somehow each managed to survive and retain their own proud identity.

In the post war years, the tradition of banding in Newcastle has been kept alive by many dedicated individuals. Of these, the names of Jim Reilly and Jack Cameron are linked with the Newcastle Transport Boys' Band and West Wallsend respectively. Others who played a prominent role were Percy Hopwood, Joe Goodshaw, Charlie Partridge, Michael Golding and Frank Simm, who received an OAM for his services to music and bands in 1981.

Percy Hopwood, the doyen of Newcastle bandmasters when he died in 1966, gave over fifty years service to various Newcastle bands as player and conductor. Apart from his recognized ability as a contesting bandmaster he was renowned for his beautiful penmanship displayed in the creation of numerous musical scores much sought by other conductors especially in pre and immediate post war years.

Frank Simm, another wonderful personality, will be remembered for the magnificent work he carried out as teacher and conductor of the Newcastle Police Citizens Boys' Club Band from its formation in 1959.

Frank achieved innumerable contest successes with this band of juniors, none of whom were over the age of eighteen. They were successful in both junior and senior divisions in National

Contests in Australia as well as New Zealand. In 1975, as Australian Junior Champions, they were honoured with an invitation to participate in the British Youth Championships at the Royal Albert Hall, London. And from a select group of ten very polished junior bands, did well to gain fifth position. Before returning home they toured Switzerland where they presented eleven concerts in seven days.

In 1985, the band made a second visit to Switzerland to compete in an International Youth Band Championship contest in Zurich, when they were placed fourth. On that occasion, Frank, being unable to travel, the band was under the musical control of John Kellaway. The result was a pleasing outcome for a group of young Australian ambassadors who, through their musical expertise and exemplary behaviour, brought much credit to themselves and Newcastle, Australia.

Quite apart from contesting, the district bands of Newcastle served the community very well with their weekly and on occasions bi-weekly seasonal outdoor and indoor recitals. Those programmes filled an important place in the social life of the residents of the City, particularly so in the days before radio and talking pictures.

The bands of the Salvation Army also performed a vital role in the musical and spiritual life of their followers, but their history in Newcastle does not reach back as far in time as our community bands. Nevertheless, they too, have their own famous personalities. Harold Morgan, bandmaster at Lambton for some years prior to the outbreak of war in 1939 succeeded Harold Scotney as bandmaster of Sydney's Congress Hall Band in 1941. Another prominent identity was Edgar Smith, an excellent cornet player, formerly of the Tighe's Hill Band, was for some years principal cornet of Congress Hall, Sydney.

The above is not meant to be a brief history of band activities in the City of Newcastle, for far more space would be required to do justice to the subject. Rather, it is an attempt to highlight and record the names of just some bands and individuals who contributed to the upkeep and advancement of the band movement in Newcastle during their own period of time. Without them and their like our kind of music would certainly not have survived as well as it has over the years. And Newcastle would have been the poorer for their absence.

Before concluding, special mention should be made of Waratah Brass, a band whose history can be traced back prior to 1870. thereby qualifying as one of this State's earliest formed bands still functioning.

Currently under the musical control of Ron Prussing, it was previously led for ten years by Ron Grice who raised it from a C Grade to an A Grade combination. Under Ron Grice, Waratah won three NSW State Championships and under their present musical director are current NSW State Champions.

Waratah is not only a successful contesting combination but, having won the Ern Keller Band of the Year award for the past seven successive years is, undeniably, a band that knows how to entertain an audience.

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
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UNIT 14
Understanding the Blues Progression I-IV-V

The 12-bar blues is a chord progression that finds its origins in the field songs of American slavery. It is the most commonly played progression in jazz and there are thousands of blues heads (melodies written to blues changes). The head is what jazz musicians call the melody of a song.

In its simplest form, the 12-bar blues is based on just three dominant chords. These chords are built on the 1st, 4th and 5th notes of the scale. A chord built on the first note of the scale is called the **One chord (I)**, or also the **Tonic chord**. So, in the key of concert B \flat , the Tonic (I) chord is a B \flat chord (your C chord). A chord built over the fourth note of the scale is called the **Four chord (IV)** and a chord built upon the fifth note of the scale is, you guessed it, the **Five chord (V)**.

When you play the blues based on your knowledge of the Tonic chord, which you will learn about the IV and V chords later on in this book, the blues progression. It begins with four bars of the Tonic chord (I).

Two bars of the IV chord, returning back to two more bars of the I chord.

Two bars of the V chord, returning back to two bars of the I chord and a final two bars of the I chord.

Blues Progression
 12 features the chord roots of the 12-bar blues progression, and then playing along. This is NOT a call-and-response track you play along. Practice until the roots are memorized and secure nature your C chord, (the I chord).

WRITE
 Write down the roots of the I, IV and V chords for your C blues scale, and the first three notes of a scale for each root. This will help you identify the notes you need are in the concert B \flat scale (your C scale).

IMPORTANT: Learning to play the blues is an essential element in building your chops and mastering the jazz language.

PRACTICE
 Practice the 3-note scales that you just wrote as indicated on the staves below. This will help you get more comfortable playing and hearing around the roots of the chords for the 12-bar blues changes.

IMPROVISE
Call-and-Response
 CD Track 23 has call-and-response melodies featuring the 3-note scales you have been practicing above. After you are comfortably singing in response to the CD, practice playing the response patterns. **Congratulations!** You are improvising to the 12-bar blues!

RECOGNIZE
Recognizing Chord Roots
 CD Track 24 is NOT a call-and-response track. In this instance the track features a progression that is NOT the blues, but is made up of I, IV and V chords. Write down the Roman numeral names and chord roots each time you hear the chord change, as played by the trumpet player.

CHOP-MONSTER CHALLENGE 14
I, IV and V Chords
 This Chop-Monster Challenge is similar to the Recognize exercise above, but on CD Track 25 there is no trumpet to help you hear the chord roots. Monster jazz musicians can identify chord changes by listening just to the bass and piano.
