

PROFILE OF ADJUDICATORS

KEVIN LESLIE JARRETT


Kevin started his career as a musician in 1943 and won his first New Zealand title at the age of 10, when he won the Junior Cornet Championship. In 1957 he won the New Zealand Amateur Cornet Championship, in 1964 the Australian Cornet Championship and later the New Zealand Cornet Championship in 1970.

Kevin joined the New Zealand Army Band in 1965 and in 1967 was posted to Malaysia as solo cornet for the First Battalion, Royal New Zealand Infantry Regiment Band. As Bandmaster he went with this band to Singapore in 1971. During this posting he was awarded the ANZUK Force Commander's Commendation, the first New Zealand soldier to win this honour.

In 1975, Kevin returned to Wanganui to take up the appointment of conductor of the Tenderkist Wanganui City Silver Band. The band won the Australian A Grade title in 1988. Kevin won the Open Trumpet Solo at this contest.

During his 60 years involvement with brass bands, Kevin has been selected as a member of the National Band of New Zealand on 11 occasions and appointed four times as Music Director. Kevin has also been appointed as Musical Director of the National Youth Band of New Zealand three times and has been its mentor from 1996 until 2004. He is an accomplished adjudicator and has adjudicated in Australia at 16 different contests since 1998.

In 1996 Kevin was appointed National Director of Education for the New Zealand Brass Bands Association and he was awarded the MBE for his services to the brass band movement in New Zealand.



BARRIE GOTT. M.MUS. LTCL, A. Mus.A.

Barrie Gott began his professional career as a trumpet player with the National Training Orchestra and was a regular casual with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

Over the past 30 years his work in education has seen him teaching at primary, secondary and tertiary levels in New South Wales and Queensland as well as music director for bands in USA and Australia, and in California as Director of Instrumental Music at Azusa Pacific University where he conducted various ensembles and choirs as well as lecturing in arranging, conducting, orchestration and music theory. Barrie has also served as Music Director for the Salvation Army in Southern California and Eastern Australia.

He is a published composer in the United Kingdom, USA and Australia as well as being a commercial arranger with many credits internationally. As an adjudicator he has officiated at national, state and regional band contests as well as the Siddis entertainment contest in Norway and the Australian Academy Music Festivals, Catholic Colleges Festival and the City of Sydney Eisteddford.

Barrie is currently employed by the Education Queensland as an instrumental instructor, as a state examiner for the Australian Examinations Board and he also conducts the Salvation Army Brisbane City Temple Band.



KEN MACDONALD

Ken owes most of his success to his father, Stanley, who taught and encouraged him as a young boy. Stanley conducted many Brass Bands, composed and arranged and concentrated a lot of time to the development of younger players.

Ken was accepted into the National Youth Orchestra and Youth Brass Band of Great Britain after a series of auditions at the early age of 14.

In 1966 he was approached by Harry Mortimer to join one of his "MEN OF BRASS" Bands, Morris Motors, this was the beginning of his association with England's Top Bands.

Ken has played in the Grimethorpe Colliery Band as Principal Cornet and the renowned Black Dyke Mills Band involving contests, cutting numerous records, many television and radio appearances, and playing an average 80/100 concerts per year.

Ken has performed and made records with musical groups as diverse as the world famous London Symphony Orchestra to Paul McCartney and Wings. He has also performed at the celebrated "Henry Woods Promenade Concerts" at the Royal Albert Hall in London, toured America and nearly all of Europe, as well as playing for the Royal Family.

Since his arrival in Australia in 1983 Ken has played a significant part in the development of Concert and Brass Bands. He has adjudicated throughout Australia, Europe, America and New Zealand, making many guest appearances and has conducted seminars and workshops for Boosey & Hawkes and Yamaha. He took up the Musical Directors position with the Hawthorn City Band in 1985, leading them to 6 National Championships and many State and overseas titles, as well as tours to America and New Zealand.

Although throughout his life Ken has concentrated his efforts with Brass Bands, he has spent a lot of time involved with the development of Concert Bands. He is at present employed at Balwyn High School, and is Head of Brass, and Concert Band Co-Coordinator.

His inspiration, energy, experience and humour inspire everyone who comes in contact with him.

He is well respected as an astute adjudicator and examiner and has continued through the years to give helpful and instructive comments.

WILLIAM BROUGHTON

As a new permanent resident of Adelaide Australia, William Broughton spends his time composing and arranging commissions for various genres in orchestra, concert band, brass band, big band and other musical groups. He is part-time lecturer at Adelaide University Elder School of Music with large and small ensembles, composition/arranging, film scoring, one to one tutoring and brass master classes. He also travels interstate lecturing at other schools, performing as conductor and soloist as well as giving motivational presentations.

Bill began his career as a studio musician in 1968 and soon was playing lead trombone for most of the television and motion picture studios in Hollywood. With encouragement from David Rose, Lalo Schifrin and Morton Stevens, Bill moved easily into the next phase of his career composing for shows like "Quincy, M.E.," "Hawaii 5-0," "BJ and the Bear," and "The Tonight Show," He also had several Symphonic and other commissioned compositions premiered as well and completed a major production for Disney in Orlando, Florida.

In October 1994, Intersound International released six albums entitled The Magic of The Movies with Bill as artist and conductor. He arranged and compiled complete scores and orchestrations for full orchestra, many from the original sound tracks, then conducted the National Symphony of Mexico (The Orchestra Of The Americas) in the recording. As if that's not enough, Bill has written and performed on the albums "Spiritual To The Bone," and "Spiritual To The Bone 2," two jazz albums of all trombone artists that has been given rave reviews by professionals in the industry, including Billboard Magazine.

In March 1996, Bill was hired to be the Music Director for the opening and closing ceremonies for the 1996 Atlanta Paralympics Games. The Rochester Symphony (New York), San Diego Symphony and Mexico City Philharmonic have all recorded Broughton's music.

Bill has also made solo/lecture tours to Japan, Australia, Norway, The Netherlands, Sweden and the UK.
