

MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

CHIEF MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

Barrie Gott & Major Graham Lloyd

BARRIE GOTT

Barrie Gott (b.1947) began his music career as a professional musician, studying trumpet with John Robertson and Harry Larsen at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. He subsequently joined the National Training Orchestra and was a regular casual player with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. He also played as a commercial player in Sydney, Los Angeles and Brisbane backing artists such as James Morrison, Kenny Rogers and Petula Clark and working in studios such as Alberts, Oceanway and Martinsound. He has also been a regular arranger and player for the Lord Mayor's Christmas Carols.



Barrie holds performance diplomas from the AMEB, Trinity College of Music, London and a Masters degree in conducting from Azusa Pacific University in California where he studied with Dr. Gary Bonner. He has also studied composition and arranging at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music with Ross Edwards and Don Banks. Other conducting studies were taken with Robert Miller.

Barrie has taught at all levels of education in private and government sectors and was Director of Instrumental Music at Azusa Pacific University.

As Director of Instrumental Music at Azusa Pacific University he was responsible for oversight of visiting teaching staff and all ensembles including bands, the orchestra and jazz ensemble. In addition he was a staff arranger for the university choir and orchestra.

He has also directed musicals such as Bye Bye Birdie, Chicago and Little Shop of Horrors. His classical repertoire includes major symphonic works both instrumental and choral having performed the Verdi Requiem, Messiah and Rutter's Gloria on several occasions. Barrie has served as music director for Salvation Army bands in Sydney, Pasadena and Brisbane as well as the Brisbane Excelsior Band where he was successful in bringing a new dimension into concert programming.

Barrie has also served as Master of Ceremonies for City Council events and has performed as a soloist on Singing Brisbane programs at City Hall.

As a composer and arranger Barrie is published in Australia, United States, Great Britain and Europe and his works are on concert programs all over the world. He is a regular contributor to the Standard of Excellence repertoire for beginning concert bands in the education system.

Barrie is also an adjudicator for contests, festivals and eisteddfods throughout the world having officiated at regional, state and national contests in Australia and overseas in Norway and New Zealand and is a state examiner for the AMEB.

Barrie was the recipient of the 2004 Frank Wright Medal for services to banding in Australia.

GRAHAM LLOYD

MMus (Melb), ARCM, LTCL, AMus A

Graham Lloyd's early music interests saw him learning violin and cello at Secondary School after which he enlisted into the Australian Regular Army in 1972 as an Apprentice Musician studying the clarinet. Graduating from the Army Apprentices School in 1973 he received the Boosey and Hawkes prize for instrumental proficiency. He was given several postings, rising to the rank of Staff Sergeant.



In 1982, he began his Student Bandmaster Course at the Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall, London. Among the prizes he received on completion of the course were: the Somerville Prize for best concert band arrangement and the coveted Worshipful Company of Musicians Trophy and Silver Medal for the best overall student of the course. He returned to Australia late in 1985, was promoted to Lieutenant and appointed to the Band of the 5th Military District, Perth, Western Australia.

In September 1987, he was posted to the now Defence Force School of Music in Macleod, Victoria, and was subsequently promoted to Captain. In this position he was responsible for the training and instruction of all Army and Navy musician enlistees. Additional duties included the teaching of advanced arranging techniques and harmony to the various promotion courses, in particular, the Band Officers Course.

In 1989, Graham was posted to the 3rd Military District Band in Melbourne, Victoria. Later that same year he accepted the position of Director of Music, Royal Australian Air Force and Commanding Officer of the then RAAF Central Band and, soon after, was promoted to Squadron Leader. In 1997, he was appointed as the Commanding Officer of the Air Force Bands. In 2000, he was posted to RAAF Training Command, in charge of Air Force music policy and the future direction of Air Force bands.

In February 2004, Graham accepted the position of Officer Commanding/Chief Instructor at the Defence Force School of Music and transferred back to the Army with the rank of Major.

Graham's main music interests are composing, arranging, teaching and conducting. His Concert Band work, *Prelude for a Festival*, won the 1988 Yamaha Composer of the Year award. Additionally, he has arranged and composed over 500 works for Concert Bands, Brass Bands and orchestras for every possible occasion from major concerts in the Opera House to the Edinburgh Military Tattoo in Sydney in 2005. He completed his Masters in music composition at Melbourne University in 1999. In 2009 Graham completed his long awaited book "*Understanding intonation for Musicians not Mathematicians*".

As a conductor, major highlights include, Guest Conductor of the 70 piece United States Air Force Band in Washington D.C. in 1993, conducting the RAAF Band at the 1995 Royal Tournament in London; and conductor of the Federation Bells and Brass Concert at the Sidney Myer Music Bowl, Melbourne in November 2001.

Graham is regularly called upon to adjudicate State and National community band festivals, eisteddfods, solo and small group contests and to lecture on various music subjects including arranging, composition and conducting. Graham is now concentrating on advancing music knowledge by presenting training seminars and workshops across Australia and overseas for music educators and ensemble directors. In his spare time he arranges for bands and orchestras and even finds time to write compositions for concert bands.

GUEST OVERSEAS ADJUDICATOR

DR. CHRISTOPHER HUGHES

Now in his 17th year as a conductor, Dr. Christopher Hughes is Professor of Conducting and Chair of the Conducting Faculty for the College of Music at Mahidol University, Thailand. In this capacity, Dr Hughes conducts the Symphony Orchestra, Wind Symphony and Chamber Winds, guides the master's and doctoral programs in conducting, and administers all aspects of the university ensemble program.



In addition to his university responsibilities, Dr Hughes serves as resident guest conductor for the Thailand Philharmonic Orchestra. Prior to this position, Dr Hughes served on the faculties at Lander University and the University of Colorado.

Born in Bloomsday in Aspen, Colorado (USA), Dr Hughes's interest in the beauty of music began early. He decided to pursue conducting as a profession after experiencing the artistry of many of the great conductors who were in residence at the Aspen Music School. In 2005, Dr Hughes was awarded the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in instrumental conducting and literature at the University of Colorado where he was a student of world- renowned conductor Allan McMurray.

DR KEVIN CAMERON

Kevin Cameron is an acclaimed Australian conductor and music educator. He is in demand as an adjudicator and guest conductor throughout Australia.

He received his initial musical training at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, and has studied music in London, Perth, the United States, and finally Newcastle, where he was the first recipient of the award of Doctor of Philosophy in Music at the University of Newcastle.



Dr Cameron has studied conducting with the eminent American composer/conductor Edward Applebaum, the Italian maestro Gian Luigi Gelmetti, and the world-renowned conducting teacher Gustav Meier. Dr Cameron has appeared with the Sydney, Tasmanian, West Australian, and Darwin Symphony Orchestras, the State Orchestra of Victoria, the Auckland Philharmonia, the National Orchestra of Ukraine, and many youth and community orchestras across Australia. In 1994, he was the inaugural winner of the ABC's *Young Conductor of the Year* competition, and has subsequently held numerous musical posts, including Assistant Conductor of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra, ABC Conductor in Residence, and Music Director positions at Murdoch University, Newcastle University Choir, the Band of the South Australia Police, and the University of Newcastle Symphony Orchestra. During his time in Newcastle, Dr Cameron served as the founding Artistic Director of the Upper Hunter Conservatorium of Music.

As an educator, Dr Cameron has held teaching posts in a variety of primary, secondary, and tertiary institutions. He has recently concluded his term as Director of Music at Pembroke School, where he also served as Music Director of the Pembroke Chamber Singers and the Pembroke Symphony Orchestra. He continues to pursue active research and performing interests, and currently serves as President of the National Band Council of Australia and the South Australian Band Association.

Constantly in demand as an adjudicator, Dr Cameron has officiated at contests and competitions in all Australian states and territories. In recent years he has adjudicated at Royal South Street, the Australian National Eisteddfod, State Band Championships in NSW, South Australia and Western Australia, the Tanunda Contest, and many country eisteddfodau. In 2010, Dr Cameron served on the jury for the Thailand International Wind Ensemble Competition, and this year will adjudicate sections at the Australian National Band Championships and the Sydney International Music Festival.

Dr Cameron has received acknowledgement for his work in community music and music education. In 1998, he was named the City of Newcastle's *Young Citizen of the Year* in recognition of his contribution to the artistic and cultural life of the Hunter region. In South Australia, he was named the SA Band Association's *Music Director of the Year* in 2003, and in 2006 was the recipient of the prestigious SABA Award of Merit. More recently, he was selected by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade to participate in the Australian-Malaysia Institute's *Young Leaders Exchange Program* from a national field of nominees. In 2008, Dr Cameron received the National Band Council's *25 Year Service Medal* for his distinguished involvement in community banding.

Dr Cameron is currently Head of Music at Unity College, Murray Bridge. He is also Music Director of the Unley Concert Band, South Australia's most successful community concert band. Dr Cameron maintains a passion for music and education, and continues to assist the development of musicians through his involvement in professional and community music ensembles as a conductor, coach, adjudicator, advisor, artistic administrator, and teacher.

CHIEF DRILL ADJUDICATOR

DAVID PETERS
Chief Drill Adjudicator
Tasmania



David Peters commenced his banding with City of Launceston RSL Brass (then called the Invermay Silver Band) in 1965 and remained a member until moving to Hobart in 2003. He was actively involved with the band, both as a player and Drum Major, and holds life membership.

Drill was always an important part of the Launceston RSL Brass programme and one where David took a keen interest. He was a member of the highly successful marching unit of the 1970's which won the National D Grade title in 1975 and 1976, followed by the National C & D Grade title in 1977.

In addition to a number of successes at the Tasmanian State Championships, David led the band to win the National B Grade Marching Championship in Launceston in 1993 and Newcastle in 1997. On both occasions, and again in 2000, he also won the prestigious Jim Brill Memorial trophy for the Champion Drum Major.

David was appointed Drum Major of Glenorchy City Concert Brass in 2004. Since that time, the band has been placed in two National and four State Marching Championships, with David winning the Bill Welling Shield for Champion Tasmanian Drum Major in 2008 and 2009.

David is Vice President of the National Band Council of Australia, immediate Past President of the Tasmanian Bands League and is a member of the League's Drill Advisory Board. He is a Life Member of both the TBL and NBCA. David has judged at Tasmanian State titles, Tanunda, and the National Championships on several occasions, and at regional contests at Nambour and Mount Gambier.
