THE Mayor of Bundaberg (Ald. B. McLean) and the Contest Committee, on behalf of the citizens, extend to you a hearty welcome to Bundaberg and to the Band Contest.

To Bundaberg has fallen the distinction of holding the first of the all-Australian Championship Contests under the scheme devised last April, when the Australian Band Council was formed; and it is anticipated that this contest will prove worthy of the important occasion.

Our city has a population of 11,500, almost the whole of which is dependent on the Sugar Industry of the district. The Millaquin, Qunaba, Bingera and Fairy-mead Mills, four of the leading sugar-mills of the State, are near the city, and employ thousands of men during the crushing season.

Other district industries are the manufacture of mining and sugar-crushing machinery, dairying, milling of district timber, distillation of alcohol from sugar by-products, and the breeding of stud cattle. There are also furniture, fish-curing, bacon-curing, pottery and agricultural machinery works, noted plant nurseries, and considerable fruit and poultry growing. The Foundry, Refinery, Distillery, Butter Factory, and Sawmills of our city are known throughout the State.

Attached to Bundaberg are the seaside resorts of Bargara and Nielson Park within suburban range and served daily by bus and by train; Burnett Heads, the mouth of the river 10 miles away; North Coast and Elliott Heads, 12 miles; at each of which surfing may be enjoyed in perfect safety. There are also the river resorts of Skyringville and the Kolan River, where excellent fishing may be obtained.

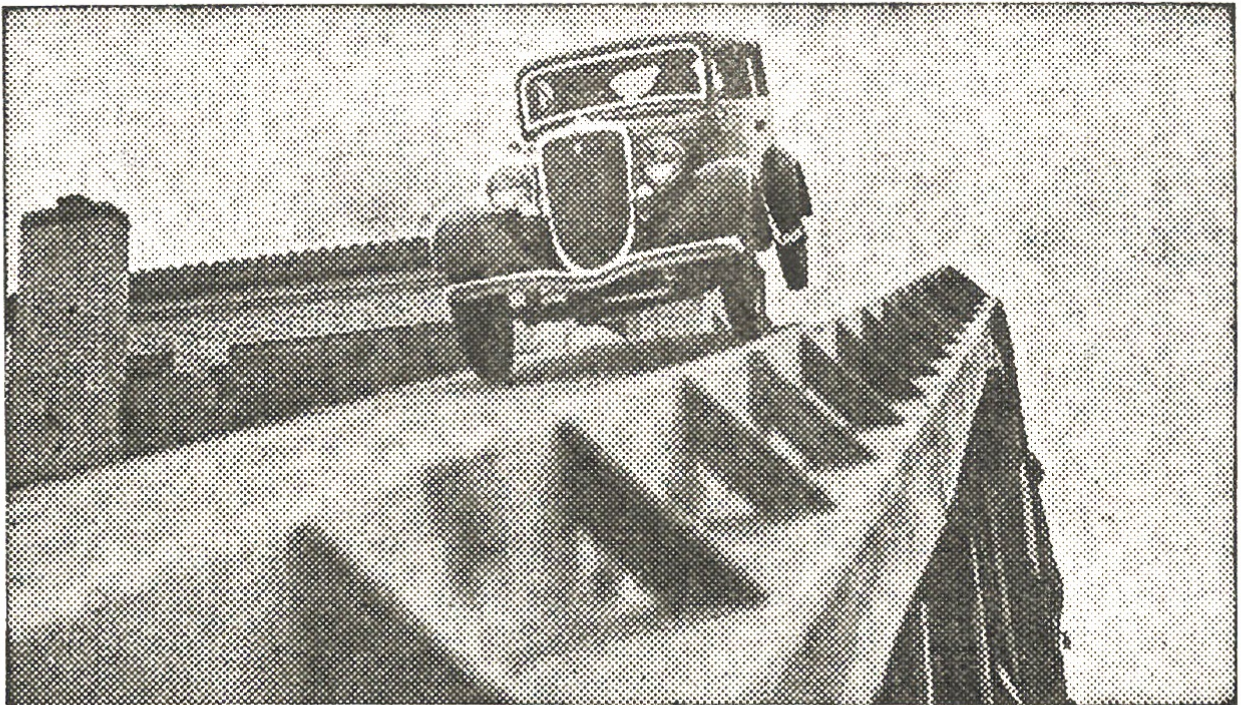
We wish you a pleasant stay in our city, and trust you will return some day to further enjoy the natural beauties of our district, which is climatically one of the most attractive localities in the State.

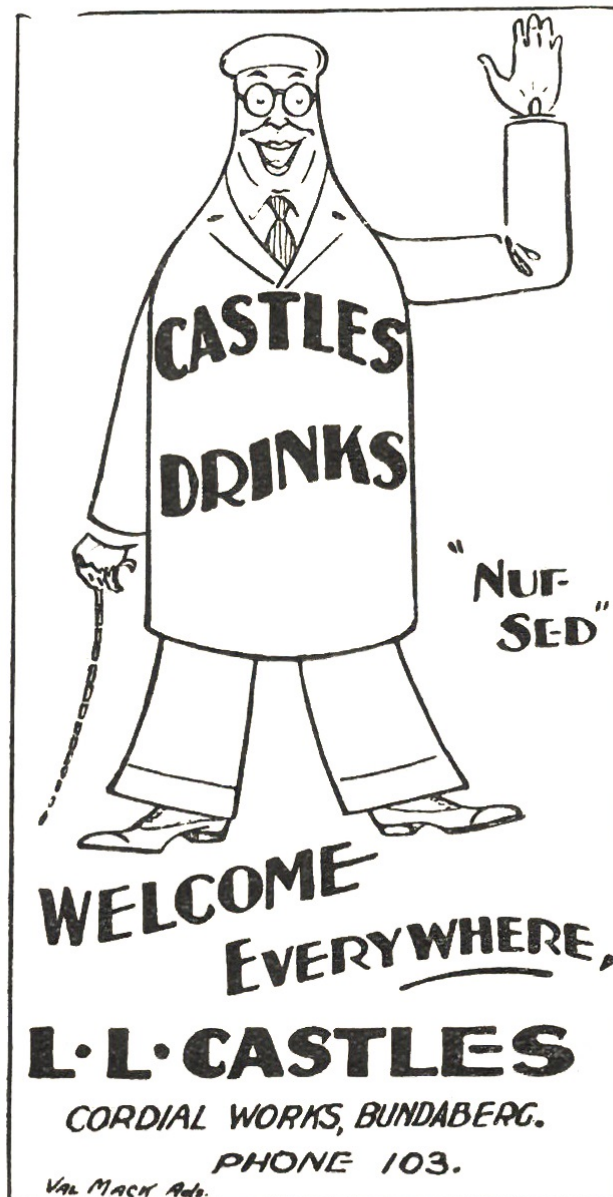

Notices and Instructions.

1. This Contest is held under the auspices of the Australian Band Council and the Queensland Band Association, and all rules of these controlling bodies will apply throughout.

2. Bands must compete in all sections for which they have been entered on the Official Programme. Minimum penalty for defaulters £5/5/- and forfeiture of all entry fees.

3. All drawings for Solo, Party and Band items will take place fifteen minutes before the time appointed for each item to start. Drawings for Band items will take place at the office of the Q.B.A. at the Show Grounds, for Solo and Party items at the Austral Hall, and for Street Marches at the Secretary's Office, 80 Bourbong Street.

4. The Secretary (or other duly appointed representative) of each of the Bands for whom places are to be drawn must present himself at the time and place for such drawing. Any Band or Soloist not present at the time appointed will not be eligible to compete. Defaulters will be fined. This will be strictly enforced.

5. The band drawing the last place will play the first band on to the stage. Each band in its numerical order must be ready to march on before the preceding one has left the stand; and, after leaving, must play an item as the next band gets ready.

6. Each band Secretary shall collect the personal signature of each competitor on the forms provided, before each item at the Contest. These will be checked by the Q.B.A. Officials.

7. All competitors must be properly dressed. (vide Q.B.A. rule.)

8. Soloists and Parties playing own choice music must provide judge's copy of own choice piece, otherwise they will not be allowed to compete.

9. The Adjudicator's Awards for Solos and Party Competitions will be announced at the end of each competition. Band awards will be announced at the end of the final session, with the exception of the Diagram Marches, which will be announced at the completion of each Band's performance.

10. No band shall engage in any counter attraction to the Contest.

11. The Committee reserves the right to require the competing Bands to take part in any street marching or playing they may deem advisable.

12. Winners of any event must repeat their item if requested to do so by the Committee.

13. All items will be taken in the order as arranged in this programme, unless otherwise notified, but the Committee reserves the right to alter or amend this programme as required by circumstances.

14. Each Band will be photographed by the Official Photographers. Solo and Party winners must also arrange to be photographed.

15. A penalty shall be imposed on all Bandsmen who have entered for Solo or Party Competitions, and whose Band is present at the Contest, and who fail to give eight hours notice to the Contest Secretary of their intention not to compete.

Special Notices to Bands.

Voluntary playing from the Station to respective Hotels will be appreciated.

Comic Opera or Musical Comedy Selection is compulsory to all A, B, and C Grades Queensland Bands. Otherwise Bands must take part in all items of the grade (or grades) for which they have entered.

Any Band late at the drawing or not ready to proceed with the Contest as directed, shall be liable to a fine or disqualification at the discretion of the Contest Committee. The Q.B.A. Officials have sole control of the musical portion of the contest and all their directions must be carefully and promptly complied with.

All Bands are required to participate in the Massed Bands Items and are instructed to provide themselves with the Hymns "Rock of Ages" and "Fierce Raged the Tempest" (Paling's Hymn Sheet), and the March, "Cavalry of the Clouds."

In the quickstep contest the maximum points that may be allotted shall be as follows:—Inspection, 20; Pacing, 20; Timing, 20; Evolutions, 60; Music, 80; Total, 200. (See A.B. Council Quickstep Regulation 3.)

In all Selection Contests the maximum number of points shall be 150. (See A.B. Council rule 55.)

In Hymn Contests, Bands shall play not less than two verses.

In Selections and Hymns, Bands must be placed on the Band Stand according to the formation adopted by the Q.B.A. as appearing in this programme.

In the event of less than three Bands competing, the Committee reserves the right to withhold the second prize; and in the event of less than four Bands competing, the Committee reserves the right to withhold the third prize.

The attention of all Band Secretaries is drawn to Rule 87 (Q.B.A. rules), which must be strictly adhered to.

Rule 87 reads:—"At all courtesy items played during the Contest, whether at Street Marching, playing Bands on or off the platform, or at Inspection, no items shall be played that will be used in Competition.

NOTE.—In the Boys' Solo items, competitors must be under the stated age at the date of competition.

The Adjudicator.

Mr. Percy Jones, of Geelong, Victoria, is a musician of fine attainments, and as conductor, band trainer and adjudicator, is held in the highest esteem in musical circles.

In his early teens Mr. Jones proved himself a remarkable cornetist, winning the cornet championship two years in succession at South Street, Ballarat, with 99 points out of one hundred on each occasion. The eminent English adjudicator on the second of these performances, said, "the winner has stood absolutely alone; it would have taken John Paley, the champion cornetist of England, to beat him."

Mr. Jones was equally successful as Conductor of the famous St. Augustine's Boys' Band. He made its name a household word in Australia by the merit of its performances in winning the championship in A grade against all comers at Ballarat, and its subsequent tour of the Eastern States and Tasmania.

The Geelong public were not slow to recognise the talents of the rising young musician, and on the advice of Professor Marshall-Hall, the celebrated Orchestral Conductor, he was sent to Europe for further experience and study. Entering the Vienna Conservatorium he was immediately awarded a scholarship for his fine trumpet playing; here he studied pianoforte and composition under famous masters. Mr. Jones spent a period in Leipsic, Berlin, Brussels, Paris, Rome and London, becoming acquainted with the musical life, with particular reference to orchestral and band work.

After four years' study in Europe he returned to Geelong in 1911 and established himself in the practice of his profession as pianoforte teacher, band and orchestral conductor. The following year with the Geelong City Municipal Band he again annexed the A grade Championship at Ballarat, with Mr. Alf Gray, of Manchester, as adjudicator.

Immersed as he is in the work of his profession (he is conductor of the Geelong City Municipal Band, the St. Augustine's Boys' Band and instructor of the Corps' Band at the Geelong Grammar School, besides a large private clientele), Mr. Jones has not done much competitive work of late as competitor, but his services are in great demand as adjudicator throughout Australia. He judged the recently held Sydney Contest last January, the South Australian Band Championship at Tanunda last October, while he will officiate as one of three judges at the Victorian Grand Centenary Band Contests to be held next June in Melbourne.

A signal honour was also bestowed on him when he was selected by the Australian Broadcasting Commission as one of the judges of the Australian Composers' Competitions held in 1933.

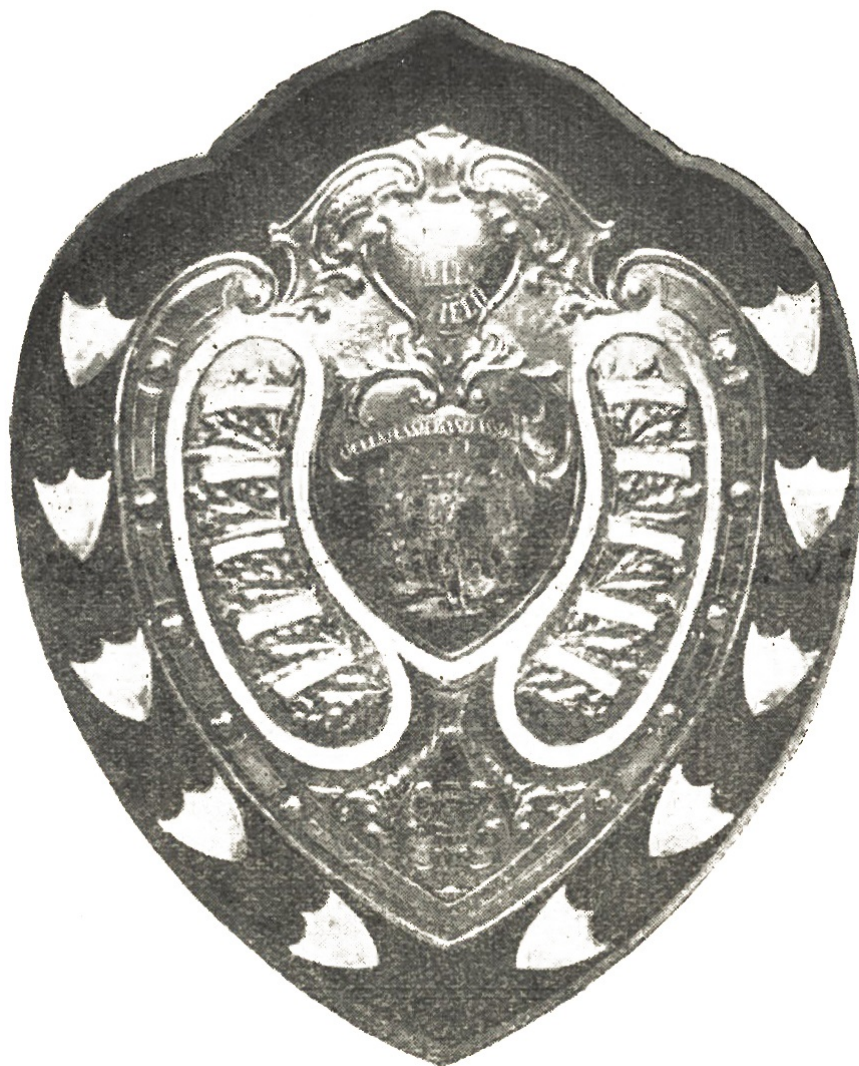

Conditions of Besson Shield

Boosey-Hawkes Shield.

1. At least three A Grade Bands must compete and take part in the Test Selections.

2. The Band awarded the first prize in the A Grade contest, that is, the Test Selections, provided it is a Queensland Band, shall hold the Shield for ten months from the date of contest. The Trustee or Secretary of such band is to give a guarantee that the Shield will be returned to Messrs. Paling and Co. Ltd., Brisbane, within not more than 14 days from the date of its due return.

3. In the event of any Band, other than a Queensland Band, being awarded the first prize in A grade contest, then the Shield is to go to the Queensland Band next in succession obtaining the highest number of points, provided the Band is not the winner of a prize lower than the second. Should a Queensland Band not succeed in obtaining either first or second prize, the Shield shall not be presented at that particular contest.

4. The Band winning the Shield three times (not necessarily in succession) shall become the sole owner of the Shield.

King and King Cup.

THE KING & KING CUP, for A Grade Diagram March, donated by Messrs. King and King Ltd., Brisbane, is to be won three times, not necessarily in succession. The Cup is to be awarded to the Band obtaining the highest number of marks in the A Grade Diagram March, and is to be held until the next contest.

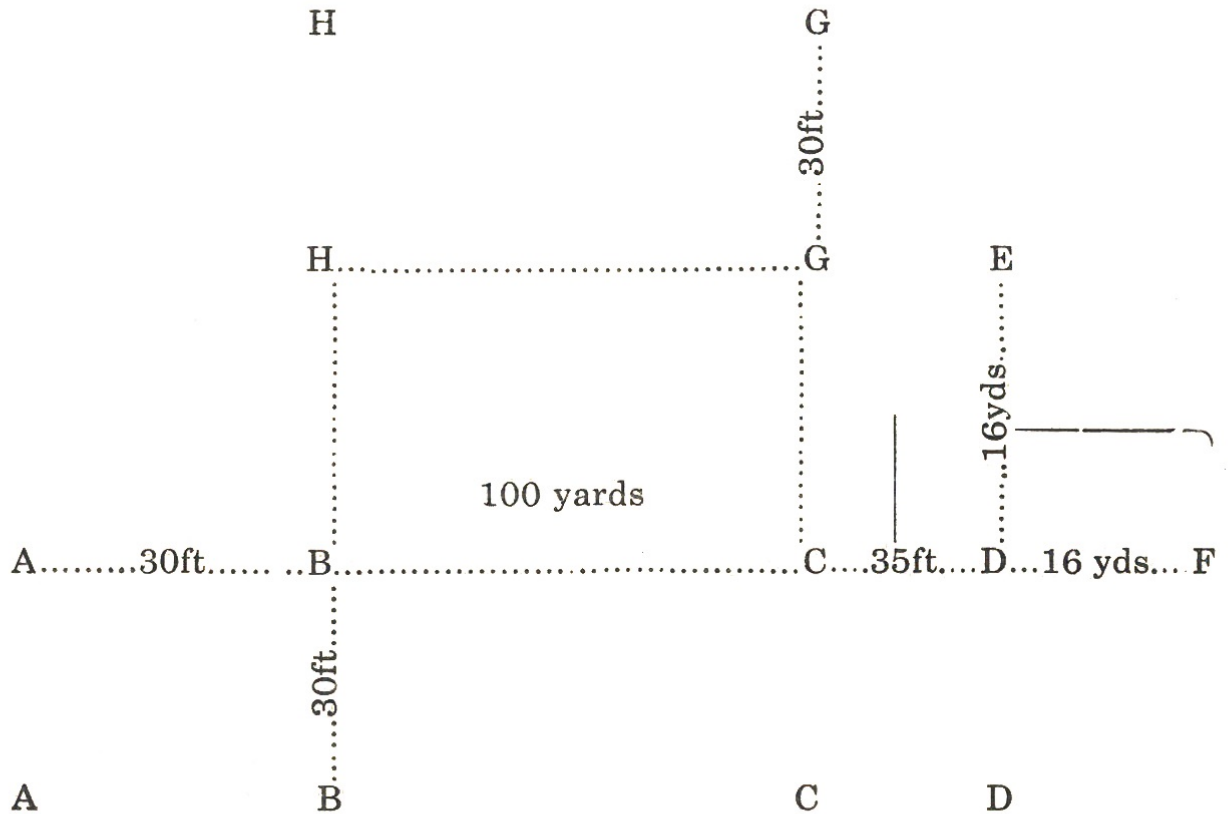

Explanation of Plan

Band will fall in in two ranks and dress at AA. Open for marching, and move off in quick time playing Quickstep March to point DD. Time and paces will be counted and timed between points BB and CC, which should be marched in one minute and 120 paces taken. For every pace under or over 120 one point will be deducted, and for every one-fifth of a second one-fifth of a point will be deducted. On arriving at point DD, Band will turn to left and march to point E, turn to the right and right wheel so as to place point F in front of centre of Band, halt and cease playing at end of the strain. Band will then move by the shortest way to point DD without playing and halt. (Bands will not be judged after ceasing playing at point F, until they are again ready to move off from point DD).

Band will then move off from point DD on word of command, playing the Quickstep March, wheel to the right and marching to points GG, wheeling to the left between them and marching to points HH, wheeling to the left after passing between them and marching to point AA, wheeling to the right and passing between them. On passing through point AA, Band will countermarch front to rear and from flank to flank; on completing countermarch Band will march to DD, where it will again countermarch from front to rear and from flank to flank as before, halt at point CC and cease playing at end of strain. After leaving point AA the first time Band will not again be dressed by word of command.

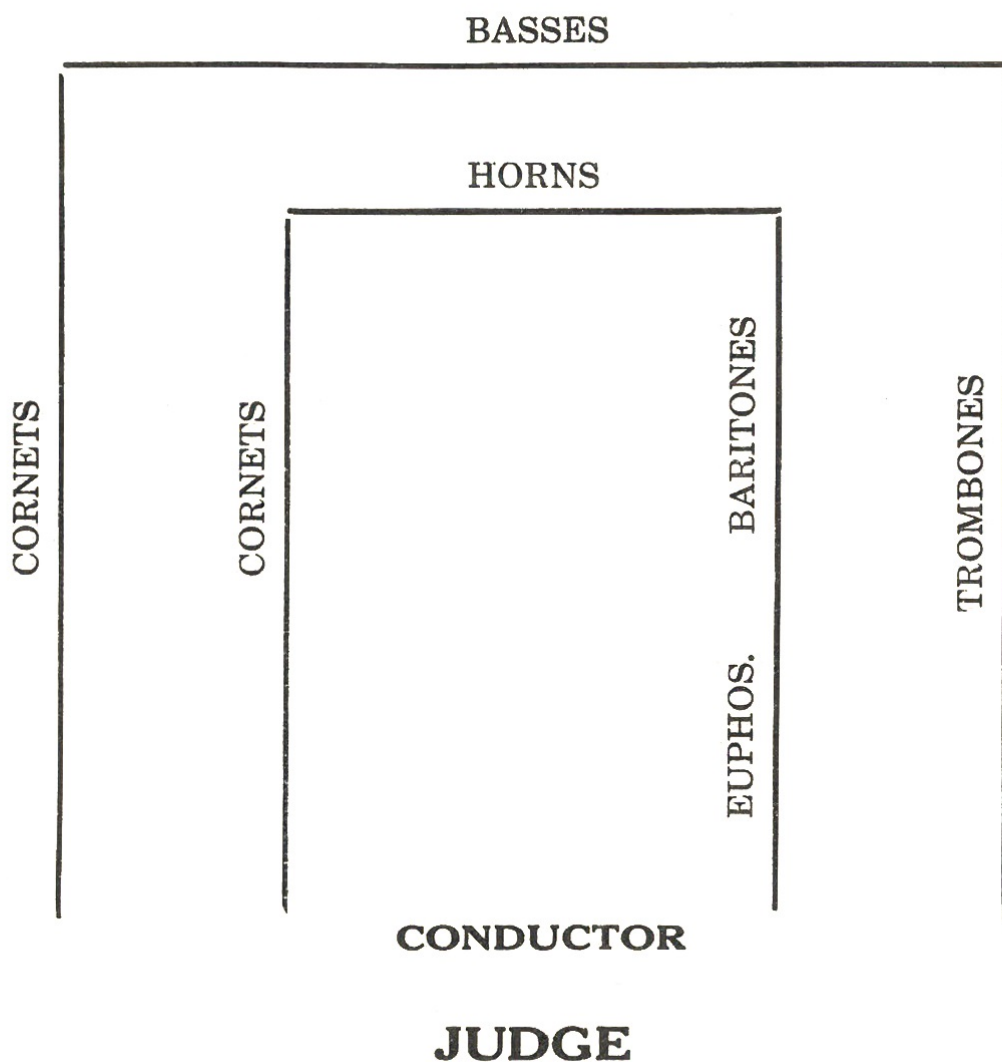

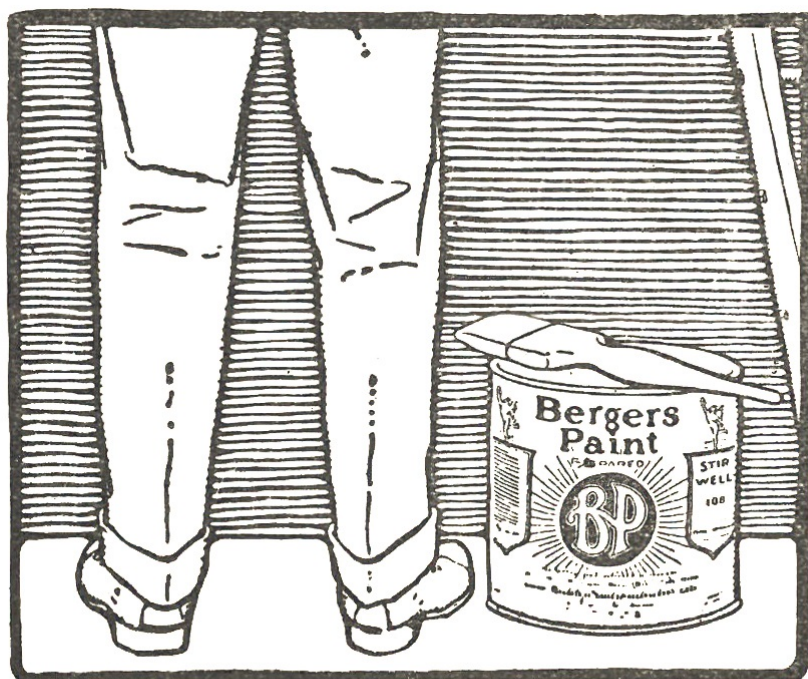
