Band music is the music of the people.

Bands make a great impact on the lives of our young people and provides them with an amenity which educates them and teaches a knowledge and love of music — the finest of the arts.

With the provision of contests everywhere, bands are now able to bring their performances to near perfection and present to the public musical entertainment which is a delight to the ear and a credit to the amateur band movement.

Brass bands are world wide. In Australia alone the National Band Council has over 300 bands affiliated with its State governing bodies.

The Tasmanian Bands League first held its State titles in 1947 and hold them every year. Last time the Australian Championships were held in Launceston was in 1950 when only three interstate bands competed. This year there are 19 Mainland and 10 Tasmanian bands competing.

MUSIC ADJUDICATORS FOR AUSTRALIAN BAND CHAMPIONSHIPS, 1969

Mr. LLOYD THORNE, Auckland, New Zealand.

He had early training in Salvation Army, where he was a recognised cornet soloist.

Solo cornet, 4th Brigade Band under Dean Goffin (composer of Rhapsody in Brass).

Later Conductor 9th Brigade Band, 2nd N.Z.E.F. in Italy and Japan, with band of 40, choir and dance band.

Studied at Canterbury University. Teacher's Diploma in Music, L.T.C.L. (Conducting, Harmony, etc.).

Successfully conducted Bands in D, C, B and A Grades in New Zealand National Championships, winning the A Grade Championship of New Zealand TWICE.

Adjudicated at several Contests and Championship Competitions.

Principal Adjudicator at New Zealand National Championships 1965 and South Australia in 1966 and 1968.

A member of Management Committee of New Zealand Brass Band Association for several years. At present conducting a B Grade Band with mostly young players, many of school age.

Mr. DON. CUSHION, Hobart, Tasmania.

Registered Music Adjudicator and member of the Music Advisory Board of the Tasmanian Bands League.

He has been principal trumpet player in the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra for 19 years and at time of appointment was youngest trumpet player ever appointed to such a position; also played on loan to the Western Australian Symphony Orchestra.

Currently teaching Brass at Tasmanian University.

At the age of seven years he studied under "Hughie" Niven with Brunswick City Band (Vic.); was Solo cornet at the age of 16 and appointed Deputy Bandmaster at 18 years.

His playing covers Ballet, Opera, Symphonic, Dance and Brass Bands.

Appointed Music Adjudicator at Tasmanian Bands League Championships in 1964, 1965 and 1967, and with the N.S.W. Band Association, 1968.

His adjudications have always been well received and we predict a good future for Don.





BRIEF HISTORY OF SOME COMPETING BANDS Malvern Municipal Band (Vic.).

Established 1911 as the Malvern Metropolitan Tramways Band. Started on its successful career in 1912 under the late Captain Harry Shugg (1915-46), then Mr. W. Philpot (1950-59), then his son Harry took over his father's baton. This Band is one of Australia's outstanding "A Grade" Bands, winning in Australia and New Zealand 56 first prizes from 1912 to 1965. Sydney 1966 "A" Grade Aggregate, Ballarat 1967 "A" Grade Aust. Championship. President Cr. C. R. Cameron, Musical Director Mr. Harry Philpot and Secretary, Alan Walsh.

Footscray-Yarraville City Band (Vic.).

This "A" Grade Band has been several years contesting first as the Kingsville & Yarraville Band (before 1916). The present Band rose from "B" Grade Victorian Championship to "A" Grade Victorian Championship 1959, S.A. Championship 1961 then again the Victorian Championship in 1966. President Mr. A. J. Beaton, J.P.; Musical Director Mr. Phil. Thorn, Secretary Mr. E. R. Webb.

Blue Mountains City Band (N.S.W.).

This young (in age) Band from Katoomba with a good future having grown from a Junior Band in 1937 to 1964 when the present Bandmaster then only young in years took over and this Band rose from "D" to "A" Grade in three years. This is a hard-to-beat record for a Band with an average age of 22 years and represents a true family band. Bandmaster, Wilf. Dyason, Drum-Major Ken Duff and Secretary, O. Hughan.

Burnie Citizens Band (Tas.).

This Band is always a keen contesting Band which is always in the top group of Tassie Bands and has a good record. Bandmaster Trevor Reid, Drum-Major Kevin Barry and Secretay Mr. C. Carr.

City of Brighton Municipal Band (Vic.).

A suburban Band a few miles out of Melbourne (Vic.). Their records date back before the turn of this century, played with mixed success over a number of years, their greatest achievement was in 1967 at Traralgon (Vic.), winning three sections in their grade. Bandmaster Mr. Eric Kiely, Drum-Major "Chum" Matheson and Secretary Ron Pearson.

St. Arnaud Citizens' Band (Vic.).

This Band was known in 1875 as the Lord Nelson Band and won the first Australian Championship at Ballarat in 1900. Like all Bands, suffered a setback for many years, only doing a lot of charity work. Have raised over \$100,000.00 for their local hospital. President Mr. H. R. Halfhide, Bandmaster W. Youngson and Secretary Mr. L. A. Carlyon.

St. Joseph's Silver Band (L'ton, Tas.).

124-years-old Band created by the St. Joseph's Total Abstinance Society (Constitution now changed) in 1845, makes this the oldest civilian Band in Australia. One of the first acts of the Band was a charity concert for widows and orphans of the Crimean War. Possibly the best known Bandmaster was the late Alec Lithgow, composer of the marches 'Invercargill'', ''Dunedin'' and many others. Bandmaster Fred McCarron, Drum-Major Norm. Andrews and Secretary Ron Beasmore.

Latrobe Federal Band (Tas.).

(Established 1872). Well known as a successful quickstep Band, Bandmaster C. Hambleton, Drum-Major and Secretary Ivan Johnston.

Hobart City Band (Tas.).

The current holder of the Tasmanian Championship for the last three years. President M. Lynch, Bandmaster Gordon Sheedy, Drum-Major Noel Pratt and Secretary Frank Ford.

Launceston City Band (Tas.).

(Established 1876). In its early days was a military type Band (loved and known as the Spit & Dribbles by the people of Launceston), but now a brass Band coming back to make its musical ability known. Bandmaster Ron. Booth and Drum-Major Max. Harris.

Launceston Railway Silver Band (Tas.).

This Band is on its way up again in the contesting field and will make top grade before long. Bandmaster Albert Calcraft, President Max Gurr, Drum-Major Alan Tucker and Secretary Terry Wood.

"B" GRADE TEST

By Drake Rimmer

This is the well known history of the brutal Roman Emperor Nero, his ruthless casting of the Christians to the lions and his enjoyment of the spectacle of their destruction. St. Peter plays a prominent part in this story. Throughout the work these themes occur and recur — the callous Nero, the devout Christians and the prayer and supplication of St. Peter. The work consists of three continuous movements.

1. Nero and the Christians.

The opening movement (allegro moderato) pictures with fierce, bold, heavily accented chords the cruel Nero. There is no mistaking the Roman flavour of brutality and harshness. The contrasting Andante which follows introduces the Christian theme in a thinly scored passage. One is never far from Nero however and a brief but well marked vivace passage reminds us of this once again.

2. Prayer and Martyrdom.

The Andante begins with a prayer by St. Peter (euphonium solo), but this soon leads into a demanding ferce passage depicting the martyrdom of the Christians. A return to the devout Christian theme follows.

3. Retribution.

The final triumph in death of the Christians is heard in this broad and noble concluding movement. There is an extended climax culminating in a big ritenuto in the last two bars.

DRAKE RIMMER

A nephew of the famous William Rimmer, Drake Rimmer studied music and medicine concurrently, gaining doctorates in both fields. His contribution to music is immense. In the brass band world, he is a prolific composer and arranger, a noted conductor of championship bands and is a widely known adjudicator (having officiated in this respect on over 500 occasions). He has performed in opera, written a number of operas and oratorios and is director of three operatic societies. He resides in Kirkcaldy, Scotland.

"Quo Vadis?" is one of Drake Rimmer's more popular compositions and has the virtue of being an excellent concert item as well as being a demanding contest piece for senior bands.

"LIFE DIVINE"

"A" GRADE TEST

The choice of the tone poem "Life Divine" as the A Grade Test for this year's Australian Championship is a very good one indeed.

It was written as the test piece for the 1921 British National Brass Band Championship held at the Crystal Palace, London, and when first published created a tremendous amount of interest.

The composer, Cyril Jenkins, had written "Coriolanus" for the 1920 Crystal Palace contest and after that competition was reported to have stated, "If I write another test piece I will not only dig out the baritone from his hide-out but I will give the so-called secondary parts much more difficult music to play".

"Life Divine" was, therefore, intended to be a technically severe test for senior section bands and it still remains so after almost fifty years.

It is interesting to note that the composer originally titled the work "A Comedy of Errors" but was persuaded by the publishers to change the name because they felt the title to be too pointed especially during early rehearsals by bands.

Despite its technical difficulties "Life Divine" has remained a popular work with contesting bands not only in this country but also in Britain and New Zealand and is justly regarded as a classic in the brass band repertoire.

DR. CYRIL JENKINS


Dr. Cyril Jenkins, composer of "Life Divine", was born in Swansea, Wales, in 1889 and during his early years worked in a South Wales coal mine.

After winning a scholarship he studied for a time under Ravel in Paris. He was a prolific composer from his early student days and his compositions total over six hundred pieces including choral and symphonic works.

As well as "Life Divine" and "Coriolanus" he has also written for brass bands a tone poem "Victory" (1929) and more recently (1965) the symphonic poem "Saga of the North".

Illness forced Dr. Jenkins to take up residence in Australia many years ago and at present he resides in Melbourne.





# "Fowey River Suite"

## "C" GRADE TEST

### BY ERIC BALL

The river Fowey (pronounced 'foy') rises in the bleak Bodmin Moor in the County of Cornwall in south-west England. It is a river of many moods, flowing through charming, intimate countryside. The area abounds with stories of past history.

This suite, composed especially for the Cornwall Youth Brass Band, has three movements.

- 1. "Dozmare", pool of legends. Strange, ghostly tales are told of this deep, quiet pool.
- 2. ''Golitha Falls''. Here the river becomes wider, cascading over shelves of rock.
- 3. "Troy Town". This is the ancient name of the town of Fowey at the mouth of the river, busy with craft of all kinds. Here the larger vessels put out to sea.

### ERIC BALL

Eric Ball has been for many years at the forefront of the brass band movement, as teacher, band trainer and above all, composer.

His career started in the Salvation Army and as far back as 1920 his works had attracted the attention of the serious musician. For the latter part of his 20 years' active service with the Army he was conductor of the famous International Staff Band.

Since 1943 he has worked mainly as a freelance musician, conducting and composing. His time is now devoted to conducting at concerts and Festivals, and composing test pieces and adjudicating.

His test pieces are used in all grades, and are also widely used as concert items.

Eric Ball was born in Bristol, England, in 1903.

## "D" GRADE TEST

Frank Wright was born in Ballarat, Victoria, and is the youngest of ten children of a very musical family.

He received instruction on the cornet from the late Percy Code and after winning the Australian Cornet Championship against fifty-three competitors, went to Britain in 1933.

Frank Wright is well known throughout the brass band movement as composer, arranger, conductor and adjudicator. As an adjudicator he has officiated at major brass band competitions not only in Britain and Europe but also Australia and New Zealand. He has the distinction of being the only person who has presided on the adjudicators' panel of The World Music Festival held at Kerkrade, Holland each time since its inception in 1948.

He has scored many of the test pieces used in the championship grade of the British National Championships held in London since the war, including "Diadem of Gold" (in which he was responsible for introducing the "Tremolo" effect), the overtures "The King of Y's", and "The Force of Destiny", to mention just a few.

A Fellow of the Guildhall School of Music & Drama at which he is a Professor of Brass and Military Band Scoring and Conducting; a Member of the Association of the Trinity College of Music, London and editor of "The Conductor" journal of the National Association of Brass Band Conductors, Frank Wright is an acknowledged authority on every aspect of brass banding.
