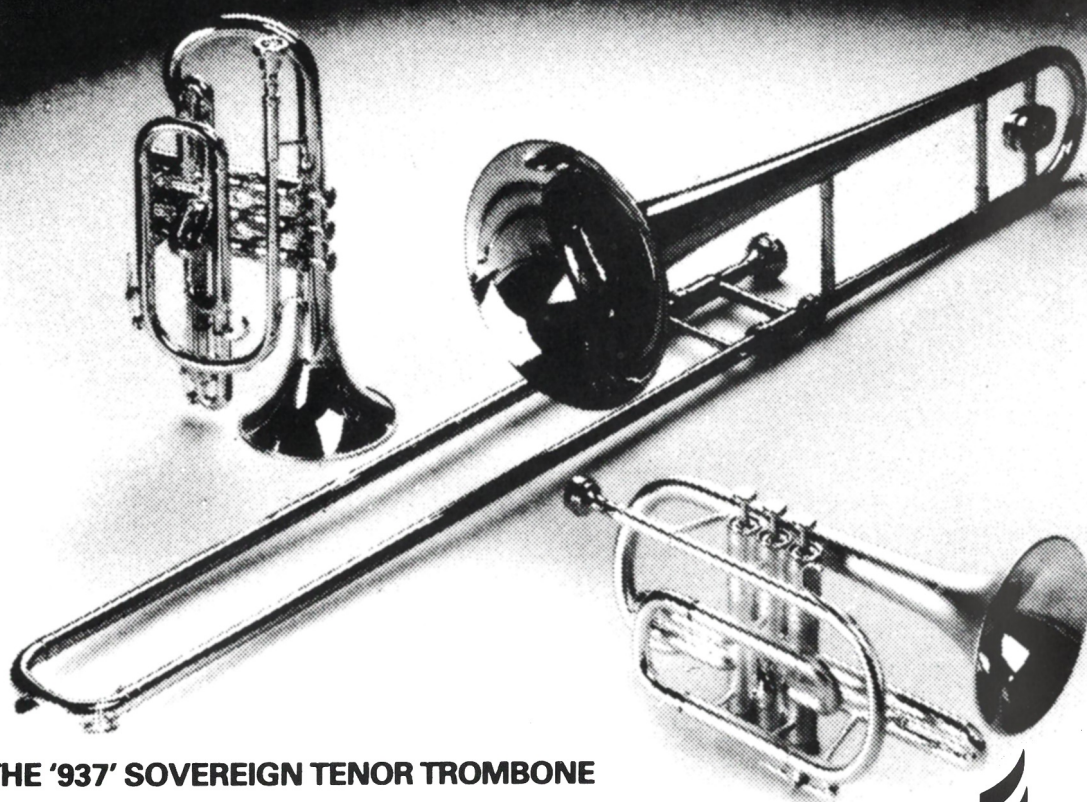

BILL MARTIN

A Short History

BILL MARTIN started playing the cornet in his local town band at the age of eight. Following his army service with the Somerset Light Infantry Band, and a short period with the Metropolitan Police Band in London he joined Boosey & Hawkes in 1951 as a brass band representative.

Changes in the organisation of the company meant a move to the Edgware instrument factory in 1959 and his appointment as advertising manager, soon to be followed by a move to the buying department, where he spent eight fascinating years travelling the World's Manufacturers, being appointed purchasing director in 1968.

Further re-organisation brought him back into the selling business when he was appointed export sales director in 1973 and in the following years he made extensive visits to the Far East, and North America.

More recently he was asked to concentrate on the development of the company's business with the World's Bands. He was largely responsible for the creation of orders placed with the company to re-equip the army bands in Indonesia, and for supporting the Boosey & Hawkes agent in Japan in the setting up of dealerships in that country to supply the growing English style brass band movement there.

In 1980 he represented the company at the New Zealand Centennial Brass Band Contest in Christchurch.

It was in May 1981 that Boosey & Hawkes took over the management of the National Brass Band Championships of Great Britain, and the European Brass Band Championships and this brought the formation of a new company, Boosey & Hawkes Band Festivals Ltd which he heads as Managing Director.

We also hope that you all find time to enjoy your stay here and to visit many of our city's unique attractions.

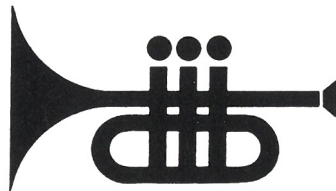

MEET THE ADJUDICATORS

Major Colin Harper

A.M., M.B.E., A.R.C.M., A.(Mus.)A., L.C.M.

Chief Music Adjudicator

Major Harper's early instrument training was in violin and trumpet. Later, during a three-year course at Kneller Hall he was awarded the Conducting and Composition and Choral Arranging prizes for both Orchestra and Band. While in London he played at two 'Royal Weddings' and many other national occasions. He specialised in recordings and the Broadcasting field. At the conclusion of this period he gained Associateships in Conducting and Theory at the Royal College of Music and London College of Music. He performed regularly as the Musical Director at numerous Edinburgh Tattoos.

In Australia he has conducted orchestras, bands and choirs. He was Conductor of Kinneil Collier Brass Band (Scotland) and is a registered Brass Band Conductor. He is also a member of the Art Committee's WESTERN AUSTRALIAN 150th ANNIVERSARY. He produced and directed 'Search Light Spectacular'.

1972-75 - Adjudicated W.A. Brass Band Festival and Contest.

Since 1972 — Adjudicator W.A. School Brass Band Festival and Contest.

Awarded Membership of Australia — Queen's Birthday Honours List 1981.

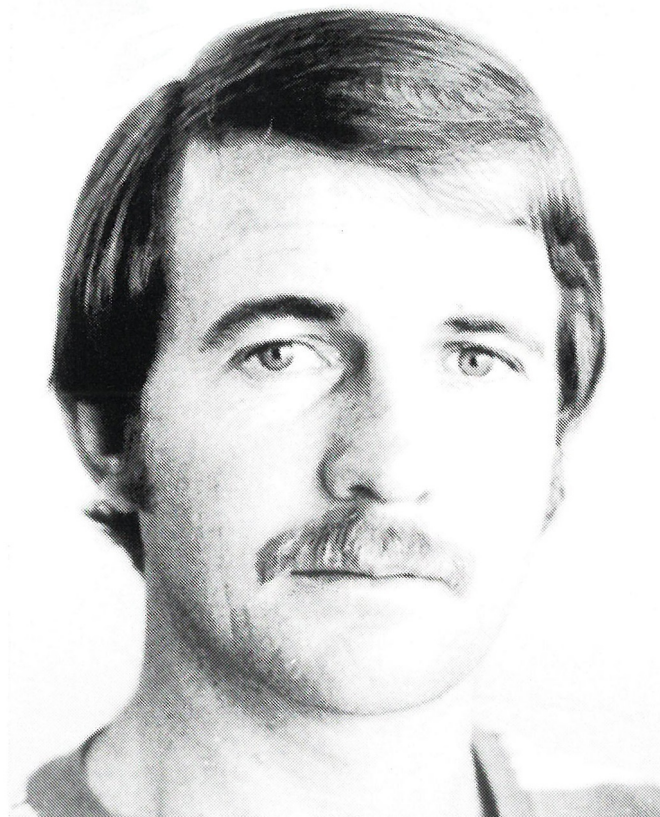
Appointed Director of Music — 12th Commonwealth Games in Brisbane 1982.

Drill Adjudicator

Geoff first commenced working as a drum major of the Cairns Combined Schools Band in 1963, and has held this position for the last 19 years. During this time he has won several awards at both State and Australian levels. He was appointed to the position of a registered drill judge with the Queensland Band Association in 1973. His first appointment to the position of adjudicating as a drill judge was for the State Championships held in Nambour in 1976.

The highlight of his career was the tour of New Zealand to compete in the New Zealand National Titles held in Dunedin in 1978. On this occasion he was the drum major of the Townsville Citizens Band.

Drill Adjudicator

Mr Duniam has had 45 years experience in music and drill, with many bands in Australia, both brass and concert, and has also served with bands in the Australian Army and Navy, and the South Australian Police Band.

As a soloist in competitions, he has won champion of champions titles in South Australia and Queensland, and has competed at the Ern Keller Memorial Trophy Contest at St. Mary's, N.S.W.

On two occasions he has won Australian Champion Trombonist, also several state trombone championships, here and in southern states, plus best player, and various open solo events at district contests and eisteddfods.

In drill, Mr Duniam has instructed marching girls, and has judged at state and district competitions for that organization. Taking up drum-majoring as a sideline in 1956, he has coached and led bands when allowed to by his musical activities.

Since passing the drill adjudicators exam in 1975, he has been regularly employed at district contests in Queensland, and judged the Queensland Band Championships in 1977 and 1979. He has also judged three national contests so far, Melbourne 1978, Mount Gambier 1980, and Burnie 1981. This appointment for the National Championships at Townsville makes it four Nationals in five years, very few drill judges have had this honour in Australia, and he must be one of the best qualified drill adjudicators at the present time.

Neville Duniam is the current president of the Queensland Band Association, and member of the State Drill Advisory Panel.



Don Coxon

Assistant Music Adjudicator

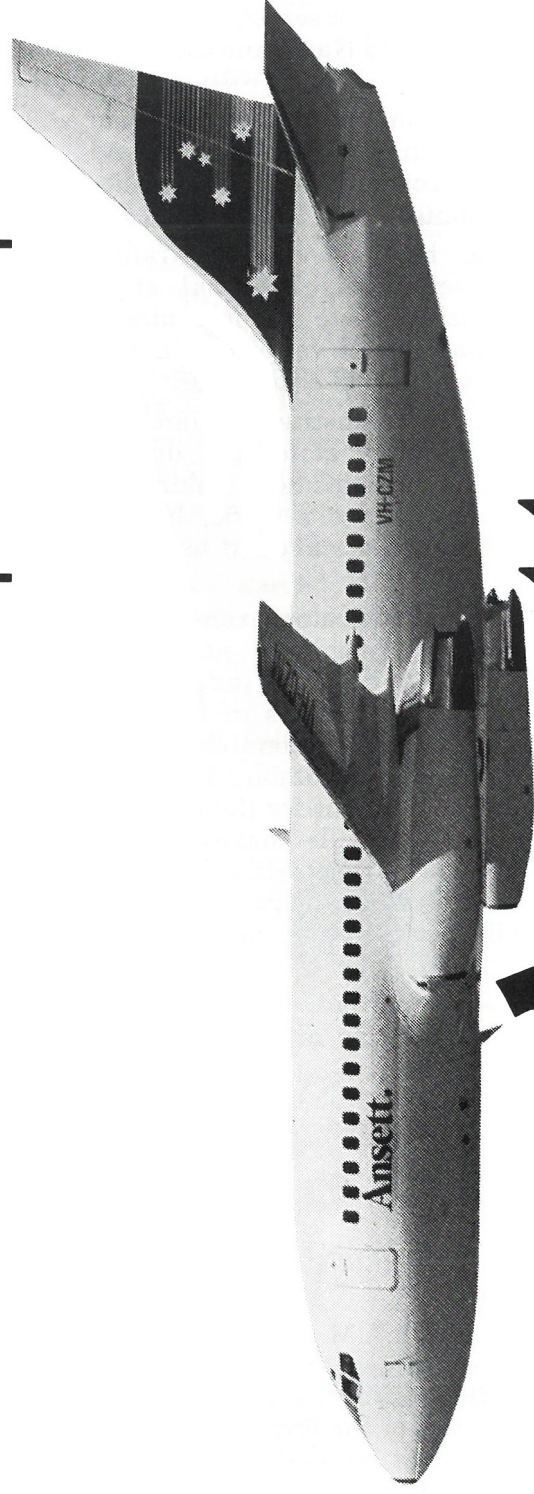
Lieutenant Commander Gordon Donald Cunningham Coxon L.R.A.M. in his previous position as Director of Music, Royal Australian Navy held responsibilities for the training of the bands and bandmasters of the Royal Australian Navy Band Service. He received his musical education at the Royal Australian Navy School of Music and at the Royal Academy of Music, London. During his tenure of appointment, he had the privilege of serving the Royal Family on numerous Royal Tours. In 1970, he led the band that was honoured by being chosen as part of

Australia's representation at Expo '70 in OSAKA Japan.

In 1975 he was appointed instrumental music advisor to the education department of Victoria — A major part of his work is to visit high schools and talk with school administrators, music coordinators and teachers about problems peculiar to this aspect of music education. Mr. Coxon's vast experience both as a musician and an administrator qualified him to greatly assist with the present and future development of instrumental music.

Geoffrey Auty was born in Bolton, Lancashire England and joined the Band and Military Department of Boosey & Hawkes in London in 1947 after war service in the Royal Navy.

He was appointed as manager of the Aldershot Branch in 1953, and for the next four years was involved with the servicing and maintenance of British Army Bands.

Transferred to Australia in 1958 after a short spell in the company's branches in the U.S. and Canada, he came to Australia to establish a branch of Besson Australia Pty. Ltd. as an associate company of Boosey & Hawkes. The Besson branches around the world were absorbed into Boosey & Hawkes in 1962 and at that time he moved to Sydney to take charge of the instrument operation in the Boosey & Hawkes Group throughout Australia.

At the moment he is involved with the special task of liaison with Bands, Military and Contract Departments throughout Australia and the South Pacific area, and together with this the servicing of all Boosey & Hawkes Band Instrument Dealers.

Geoff Auty has a broad musical taste and is interested in band and orchestral music having played both trumpet and flute in bands and orchestras in England. He is keenly looking forward to the Townsville Contest and has enjoyed the excitement of contests and competitions in several countries since his first at Belle Vue, Manchester, England, in 1947.
