

N.B.C. NATIONALS CANBERRA 1984 CONTEST RULES:

- 1. All rules of the National Band Council shall apply throughout the contest, together with any other rules as submitted herewith.
- 2. Bands soloists must play in the order in which they appear in the programme.
- 3. All of any competitors in Junior Sections may be required to produce their birth certificates or other proof of age prior to the commencement of their Section of the Contest.
- 4. Age as referred to in these contest rules shall mean the age of the contestant as at the date of the contest.
- 5. Each Quartet must consist of members of the one band (including the Conductor), and all shall wear uniform.
- 6. Competitors in Quartet Sections shall be allowed the services of either their own Bandmaster or a member of their band as Conductor.
- 7. Trumpets and French Horns may only be used in accordance with National Band Council Rule 15.
- 8. Competing Bands, Quartets and Soloists are requested to be ready to play immediately the previous competitor is finished.
- 9. Bands will be permitted to check tuning for Two (2) minutes only at the commencement of each appearance.
- 10. The N.B.C. Executive shall make decisions on matters during the Contest and those decisions shall be final.

Test Pieces for Bands and Soloists are for the first time in the history of banding Australian Compositions or transcriptions and this has been made possible by the total support by the Music Board of the Australia Council in enabling so much of the music to be specially published for the Canberra Championships. The N.B.C. wishes to acknowledge with thanks this vital support for this project; it is interesting to note that further Australian compositions are now being commissioned for use by bands in all States.

CASH PRIZES AND CERTIFICATES FOR ALL EVENTS.

1st., 2nd., and 3rd. places in each Brass and Concert Band Event will receive \$300.00, \$200.00 and \$100.00 respectively namely A, B, D, and Junior Grades of Brass Bands and A.B, and Junior Grades of Concert Bands.

The Senior and Junior Band with the highest aggregate of points in the Street March will receive \$100.00 each.

Official N.B.C. Championship Certificates will be issued to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in ALL EVENTS including Solos.

The Senior and Junior Champion of Champions will each receive \$100.00 each. The list of N.B.C. and other Trophies is published in this programme together with the Boosey and Hawkes (Aust) Pty Ltd Special Trophies of Valuable Musical Instruments and Medallions.

A Special new TROPHY has been inaugurated for the Champion A Grade Concert Band by the Prime Minister, Mr Bob Hawke and will be a perpetual trophy known as the "PRIME MINISTER'S TROPHY".

CHAMPIONSHIP AGGREGATE:

The CHAMPIONSHIP AWARD in each BAND EVENT is decided by the total points of the TEST PIECE and OWN CHOICE.

CASH PRIZES AGGREGATES:





Message from Rt. Hon. R. J. L. Hawke, Prime Minister



It is, as he designed it, a city of light and space — a garden city.


There are many great buildings, historical monuments and national treasures. Several tours run each day from the Civic coach terminal taking in







DR. PETER G. CLINCH


Peter Clinch was born in Western Australia and began studying music at the age of nine, making his first solo appearances on clarinet and saxophone for the Australian Broadcasting Commission at a very early age. Before he was 20 years old he had gained an outstanding reputation for his performances with opera, ballet and symphonic orchestras, as well as chamber and jazz ensembles, often as a soloist. Peter Clinch's talents also encompass arranging, composing and conducting, and at one point in his career he played principal solo clarinet in the Royal Australian Air Force Central Band and for 10 years was Principal clarinettist with a T.V. studio orchestra in Melbourne. Among his many current chamber music activities he regularly tours overseas with the Australian composer Felix Werder's contemporary ensemble — Australia Felix. He is in great demand as a woodwind clinician. Peter Clinch has been a celebrity solo artist for the Australian Broadcasting Commission on three occasions, working as a soloist with all the Australian symphony orchestras and on National Television.




Profile on: Ken Huckstepp Percussion Judge

Ken commenced playing percussion at the age of 8, following in the footsteps of his father Hayden, who was said to be one of the country's finest percussionists.

Ken commenced with Rockdale Boys, Bexley Boys and later Hurstville Municipal. In 1952 he was a member of the successful Portland Boys' Band that toured NZ. In later years he gave service to Bexley District and Sutherland Shire Bands and is currently a member of St. Mary's District Band.

In 1965 he was responsible for the introduction of percussion as a Solo event and 1967 saw this section in the NSW State titles and 1970 in the Nationals.

As a soloist he won the Nationals in 1970, NSW State titles in 1970, 77, 78, 79, 80, 1982 saw his first appointment as an adjudicator, at the NSW State titles and 1983 to National championship. Ken has written the Tests for Percussion for the Championships of 1983 and 1984.



PROFILE ON JUDGE: DON CUSHION VICTORIA

Don's early Brass training was with Flt. Lieut. Hughy Niven and the Brunswick City Band, after which from 1950 to 1974 he was Principal Trumpet with the ABC-Tasmania Symphony Orchestra. Since the early 40's he also saw much experience as Musical Director, of Dance, Radio, and T.V. ensembles.

He is now professionally involved in administration nationally for professional musicians and represents Australia annually on international conferences of musicians from major countries.

Since 1969 he has adjudicated many times in State and National Australian Contests as fulfilment of his 38 years experience as a Bandsman and Professional Musician.




Squadron Leader: Laurie Hicks, O.B.E., L.R.A.M., A.R.C.M. Concert Bands
