





United Kingdom Chief Adjudicator (Brass)




Roy was born in Yorkshire of a family whose forebears have been associated with banding for 5 generations.

He started playing the cornet at the age of 9 years and at the age of 36 years he was invited to join the famous Black Dyke Mills Band first as Bandmaster and later as Musical Director. He helped in the making of 30 Long Play Recordings, directed the band in numerous broadcasts and TV programmes, led them in their contest successes and conducted contests in many parts of the UK and the continent.

Roy adjudicated at the British Open Championships (1975) Granada Band of the Year (1977) and other National contests in Norway, Switzerland and in Australia 1978 and 1981.





As an Administrator has represented Australian professional musicians at international conferences in U.K., Europe, U.S.A., Mexico and all Asian countries.

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

Allan joined the Launceston Railway Silver Band in 1938 and has been actively associated with the Band; continuously as a player, committeeman (Chairman 1968-73), Drum Major and Conductor 1980-85; except for war service with the R.A.A.F.

He was appointed Drum Major in 1954 a position he held until 1984 when a severe illness forced his retirement from full active participation with the band.

Allan was appointed Drill Adjudicator in 1963 and has judged at many State Titles as well as two National Championships. besides winning the Bill Welling Shield on Five occasions as Best Drum Major at the State Titles.

He is at present, Chairman of the organising committee of the 1987 National Championships.

Allan is a life member of the L.R.S.B., and was awarded the T.B.L. Badge of Honour in 1984.

Victoria

Chief Adjudicator, (Concert Bands)



Ron is no stranger to Tasmania having visited the state on numerous occasions both as Bandmaster and Adjudicator at State Titles.


He has had an excellent grounding in band music having been selected to attend the famous Kneller Hall, the training ground of potential Band Masters of the Bands of the British Army.

Ron was appointed Bandmaster of the well known Regimental Band of the Black Watch which he led with distinction.

He was recruited as Musical Director of the R.A.A.F. Central Band a unit he developed musically to a top grade combination, very much in demand for Military as well as public appearances. During his long association with the R.A.A.F. band, he was instrumental in the making of numerous long play recordings and conducted concerts in all States of the Commonwealth as well as overseas.

Glenn returns to Tasmania on his first visit as an Adjudicator. He was born in Hobart and his earlier musical experiences were gained in that city both with Orchestral work and Brass Bands.

He has appeared as soloist in three states and at present is Principal Trumpet with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra and is a well known exponent of chamber Music.

Glenn was appointed Bandmaster of the Elizabeth City Band in South Australia, a position he held for six years. During that period his expertise was instrumental in lifting the Band from D Grade to A Grade, an excellent achievement.

DON CUSHION Tasmania

Don who has been appointed reserve adjudicator commenced his musical career with the Brunswick City Band at the age of eight (8). He became Principal cornetist at 16 years and Deputy Conductor at 18 years. Don was for many years Principal Trumpet with the Tasmanian Symphany Orchestra.

He has adjudicated at many State and National Titles in most states of Australia.

Don is at present General Secretary of the Musicians Union of Australia as well as Secretary of the Tasmanian Bands League.

DOUG BRADSHAW

(Tasmania) Chief Drill Judge



Doug was appointed Drill Adjudicator in 1964, after beginning his band music career with the R.A.N.R. in 1931. He was appointed Drum Major of the Latrobe Federal Band a position he held for twelve years winning eight consecutive Quickstep Championships.

He has won the Bill Welling Shield on four occassions for Best Drum Major at the State Titles and was judged the Best Drum Major at the V.B.L. Championships conducted at Ballarat in 1965.


Doug has adjudicated at 20 State Titles, 3 National Titles, and at Tanunda (S.A. 1975.

He is a life member of the Tasmania Bands League and has also been awarded the T.B.L. Badge of Honour.

Doug is at present Chairman of the Drill Advisory Board.

Monti is a member of the Musical Advisory Board of the Tasmanian Bands League, being appointed in 1986. He has an excellent musical background obtaining his B.A. (Applied music and music education) at the Seattle Pacific College.


He has performed as a Trombone soloist at many public recitals both in Washington (USA) and Tasmania. He was Principal Trombone 1977-80 with the Cascade Symphony, Seattle, Washington.

Monti has also been guest conductor at a number of band festivals and conventions as well as adjudicator at the Washington State Music Educators National Convention 1981-84.

He is at present Lecturer at the Centre of Music Studies T.S.I.T., is Conductor/Founder of the T.S.I.T. Concert Band and Chamber Singers, and is a member of the Tasmanian Trombone Quartet.

IAN MATHERS B.E.M.

(Victoria)



Ian joined the East Kew Citizens' Band in 1941 as a percussionist and in 1953 became the Secretary and Drum Major of the Band.

When the present Kew Band was formed in 1957 by the amalgamation of the Kew and East Kew Bands, Ian retained these positions and has held them ever since.

He was elected President of the Victorian Bands, League in 1979 and served in this position for 4 years. He is also a registered adjudicator and has adjudicated marching contests throughout Australia.

Ian was Chairman of the Committee which was responsible for the establishment of the Kew Music Centre in 1978 and is currently the Chairman of the Board of Management and Co-operative Secretary for this Centre.

In 1981 Ian was awarded the B.E.M. for his service to brass bands.



LANCE LITTLE (Victoria)

Lance had his first appointment as Drum Major with the Terang Citizens, Band in 1945 and has been leading and instructing both Brass and Pipe Bands since that time.

During 20 years as Drum Major of Ararat City, he led that band to National Championship success at Ballarat in 1973 and in the same year won the South Australian Championship held in Tanunda (S.A.).

Lance has adjudicated at South Street, Ballarat; Tanunda (S.A.) on a number of occasions as well as the 1985 National Titles in Melbourne and 1986 National Ttiles in Adelaide.

Besides winning the Most Efficient Drum Major Award, on 17 occasions Lance adjudicated at the Inaugral Joe Stanbrough Marching Championships held in Launceston 1985.

A TRIBUTE TO ALEX LITHGOW

Alex Lithgow was born in Glasgow, Scotland in 1870 and moved to the New Zealand town of Invercargill in 1876.

By the age of 11 he was a competent musician his instruments being cornet and violin. He was, at that time, playing his cornet in Invercargill Garrison Band and became principal soloist five years later.

He was twice awarded the silver cornet as Dominion Champion.

In 1894 he moved to Launceston to conduct St. Joseph's Band. This was a time when bands were extremely popular and gave many public performances. In Launceston, the rotundas in City Park and at Cataract Gorge were the scene of many pleasant performances.

Alex Lithgow had an enthusiasum and talent that must have appeared unbridled. As well as his association with St. Joseph's Band he was bandmaster for the Launceston Regiment, conductor for the Campbell Town Band, conductor at the Princess Theatre, (during the "silent movie" era), founder of Launceston Orchestral Society and Launceston Concert Orchestra, compositor at the Daily Telegraph, publisher and composer.

As a composer he was prolific and brilliant. His march compositions included "Westbury", "The Southlanders", "March of the Anzacs", "Gippsland", "Victoria" and, of course the famous "Invercargill".

It was "Invercargill' that drew acclaim from the great Phillip John Sousa who, in fact, was to include it in his own concerts.

"Invercargill", named after the town of his youth, was also the name of his home at 151 George Street, in Launceston. It was at this house that he composed and it was from there that he published, not only his own compositions, but also Commonwealth Brass (and Reed) Band Journal.


Lithgow's compositions were not restricted to marches. He also composed two suites, "At the Movies" and "In Sunny Australia".

In later years he moved to "Holyrood House", at 136 St. John Street, Launceston.

Alex Lithgow died in 1929 and was laid to rest to the sound of massed Launceston bands playing "Invercargill'.

4. MUSIC SCORES

Brass Band Own Choice Selections

A full score with all Bars numbered, must be supplied.

Concert Band Own Choice Selections

Scores as detailed as possible with all Bars numbered, must be supplied.

Hymn

A short score at least 2 stave, with cued entries to permit an effective adjudication, with all Bars numbered, must be supplied.

Contest March/Diagram, Display March/Street March

A solo cornet and euphonium part with all Bars numbered must be supplied.

Quartet/Ensemble Sections

A full score with all Bars numbered, must be supplied.

SOLO SECTIONS

(Sections 37-46 only)

A copy of the Solo with all Bars numbered must be supplied on the day of the contest.

All scores for Band Own Choice sections must be submitted not later than **31st JANUARY**, **1987**. Competitors failing to submit own choice music by this date will incur a **FINE OF \$20.00**.

N.B. All competitors are advised to thoroughly acquaint themselves with the current Copyright Laws before submitting scores etc.

- 5. Bands and players must be registered for 3 months prior to the contest date with their respective State or New Zealand Band Association/ League, this includes permit players.
- 6. All Band Championships will be awarded to the Band gaining the highest aggregate of points for the Set Test Selection and Own Choice Selection.
- 7. All points awarded during the Championship will be collated to determine Section aggregate winner.

- Bands entering two (2) Grades must play a different Own Choice Selection in each Grade. Junior Brass Band's eligible to play in Open D Grade may use the same Own Choice Selection in both Grades.
- 9. A short check tuning only will be permitted at the commencement of each appearance.
- 10. In Quartet/Ensemble Sections each member must be registered with the one Band, including the Conductor, and must wear the uniform of that Band. Competitors in these Sections shall be allowed the services of their Bandmaster or a member of the Band as Conductor.
- 11. Competitors in ALL SECTIONS may be disqualified if not ready to play immediately the previous competitor has finished.
- 12. Any Competitior entering a Junior Section shall not have attained 19 years of age at the date of the competition. Birth Certificate or other proof of age may be required.
- 13. Marching for Open A B C D Grade Brass Bands is compulsory-Diagram/Display and Street March.
- 14. Trumpets and French Horns shall be excluded from all Senior Brass Sections including Quartets.
- 15. Any protest or dispute must be lodged in WRITING to Protest Committee within 30 minutes of Adjudicators decision.
- 16. The Organising Committee reserves the right to withhold all Prize Money, Trophies and Awards from any Band which does not participate in all events listed on the schedule, excluding those specifically stated as Optional.

17. PLAYING ORDER

A draw for playing order, in all events, will be made by the Contest Committee. Competitors must appear in that order.



LAUNCESTON

Launceston is known as the Garden City and is the gateway to Tasmania. It is the centre of approximately 70,000 people and is situated at the head of the Tamar River, confluence of the North and South Esk Rivers.

Launceston, founded in 1805, is older than all mainland capital cities except Sydney. Colonel Paterson landed at Oyster Cove (George Town) on November 5th 1804, but after a short period moved across the river to form a settlement named York Town. Colonel Paterson explored the Tamar River, and toward the end of 1805 a small group under Sgt. Dell was instructed to land at the head of the river with the intention of creating another settlement to be named Launceston after the large city of Launceston in Cornwall, U.K. Sgt. Dell landed where Ritchie's Flour Mill now stands, and built the first blockhouse on the site where the Old Brisbane Arcade is situated.

Launceston is full of old world buildings and has many parks and gardens, foremost of which is the 12 hectare City Park adjoining the Albert Hall, where some sections of the Championships will be held. A visit to the picturesque Princes Square with its fine surrounding buildings such as Moreton House, Milton Hall and St. John's Church, is worthwhile.

Possibly the best known tourist attraction is the Cataract Gorge and Cliff Grounds, a large natural reserve of flora and fauna, and only ten minutes walk from the city centre. It is interesting to note that on Friday, 13th March this year, circus performer Alfons Buglar, accomplished the feat of creating a world record in wire walking, crossing on the wire of the Chair Lift spanning the gorge, a distance of 308 metres, in 12 minutes.

Another major attraction is a visit to the Penny Royal Gun Powder Mill Complex, sail on the "Lady Stellfox", ride on the the old Launceston tram etc. A pleasant way to spend three or four hours.

The Launceston Country Club Casino, the second legalized casino in Australia, with its many and varied facilities, is also an excellent place to visit.

The city boasts two of the most aesthetically attractive pedestrian malls in the heart of its retail area, and a Civic Square featuring various forms of architecture from Georgian to a futuristic office accommodation.

There are many interesting and enjoyable areas to visit within the city and surrounding districts. Enjoy your visit, enjoy the sights; they are all worthwhile.







A FEW INTERESTING OBSERVATIONS

- 1. That Launceston was founded late in 1805 and is the third oldest city in Australia.
- 2. That anaesthetic was first used in Australia at St. John's Hospital (now Morton House, Charles Street) Launceston, in June 1847 by Dr. William Pugh.
- 3. That the first original Australian play (by Evan Henry Thomas) was produced in Launceston in 1835.
- 4. That the first iron railway ran from Launceston to Deloraine on February 10th, 1871.
- 5. That the first Australian born citizen to be knighted, Sir Dry, was born at Elphin in 1815.
- 6. That Launceston was the first city in the Commonwealth to supply electric current from its own power station to light the city in 1895.
- 7. That the first inter-colonial cricket match in Australia was played in Launceston in February 1851, between Victoria and Tasmania.
- 8. That Victoria received its first settler from Tasmania in November 1834, Mr. Edward Henty. He was followed by Batman and Fawkner.
- 9. It is said that Melbourne was founded at Launceston, at the Batman Fawkner Inn, and that John Batman sailed in the "Rebecca" from the Tamar, to lay the foundations of Melbourne in 1835.
- 10. Gold was discovered at Beaconsfield (originally named Cabbage Tree Hill) in 1869.
- 11. That the tower of St. John's Church (cnr. St. John and Elizabeth Street) built in 1825, still stands.
- 12. Launceston was chosen as the headquarters of the first Australian Maritime College, which is situated at Newnham.

BANDING IN LAUNCESTON

Brass Military Bands have existed in Australia since the first fleet sailed into Botany Bay, therefore our country is rich in heritage with martial music.

Launceston, founded in 1805 and being the third oldest city in the Commonwealth, can be proud of its association with the early inception of banding in the new world.

The recorded history of the numerous bands that have been formed since that time has been very erratic, but the St. Joseph's Band of Launceston claims to be the oldest band still in existence, being founded in 1845. Around about the time of the formation of the Launceston City Band in 1876, Launceston had in existence, as well as the two mentioned, the Trademen's Band, St. Pat's Fife and Drum, a string band, and also another drum and fife combination. In 1894 the Garrison Band was established with George Harrison as bandmaster (this may have been the early foundation of the Launceston Railway Silver Band). History records fierce rivalry between these three first class bands.

Launceston, while not possessing a band of A Grade standard, has carried on its early tradition and can be well proud of its banding history. It must still rank highly amongst cities of Australia in respect to ratio of citizens and musical combinations.

In a city of approx 70,000 people, Launceston has 4 Brass Bands, 1 Concert Band, 1 Highland Pipe Band, as well as a number of other musical combinations, e.g. T.S.I.T. Concert Band, Launceston Youth Orchestra, and St. Cecilia School of Music.

Space does not permit coverage of the history of all groups, suffice will have to be with the 4 Brass and 1 Concert Band, - interesting reading.

THE ST .JOSEPH'S BAND INC. was formed in 1845. The first bandmaster was the late Mr. John Agnew of the 96th. Regiment. One of the first charitable acts was to play at a bazaar held in the old Cornwall assembly room adjoining the Batman Fawkner Hotel. The bazaar was given in aid of the widows and orphans of the men who fell in the Crimean War and a substantial sum was realised.

In December 1876 the band chartered a special train for the Hobart Regatta and at that time many of the public were afraid of travelling on the line, being under the impression that the engine might at any time "take to the bush". The trip turned out to be a very successful one.

At the outbreak of the second World War saw the band depleted again in numbers of senior players and the duties were ably carried on by the sixty strong junior band under Prof. W.B. Caton of the Grenadier Guards Band and Bandmaster Cecil Gooding. This band toured Tasmania for several years and raised thousands of pounds for charities. Two of these members continued their studies in Sydney and later joined the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

The band is today undergoing another revival and it should soon be able to take its place on stage in the not too distant future.

Bandmaster — Brian Ellis.

THE LAUNCESTON CITY BAND was founded in November 1876 by Mr Alexander Wallace, bandmaster of Dundee, Scotland, together with members of the disbanded Launceston Volunteer Rifle Band and other musicians.

In 1877, with a large instrumentation of a full Military Band, it won the Open Championship of Australia.

It is interesting to observe that up to 1958 the band had only 3 conductors - Mr. Wallace, Mr. J. Edwards and his son Mr. Chester Edwards. In 1906 Mr. C. Edwards was appointed band master, and the same year was successful in winning the Championship of Australia for cornet, at Ballarat. Mr. Edwards had the distinction of conducting the band for 52 years.

The Band has experienced a long and varied existence with radio broadcasts, Tivoli Theatre appearances, and the usual appearances at State Championships, together with many other engagements. The Band is at present undergoing a rebuilding program, and it should not be very long before they appear in the contesting arena again.

In 1929 the Band moved to its present bandroom in Bathurst Street, a valuable piece of real estate which is fully owned by the Band.

In 1916 the Band was engaged to lead the Launceston Fire Brigade to a church service in remembrance of comrades killed in action, and those who were still serving in WWI. After hositilities ceased the brigade decided to continue the service and asked the band to participate, an engagment which is still valid today.

Conductor — Noel Wheeler. Drum Major — Bob Young.

LAUNCESTON RAILWAY SILVER BAND. Records show that the band was first founded in 1904, with the main purpose to attend the first railway employees picnic. One book in Tasmania though, carried an advertisement for the picnic in the 1890's and mentioned the band. For the the first few years it is indicated that the combination functioned spasmodically, until it settled into a regular band.

It proved to be very strong in the 1930's, 40's and 50's, with sound financial footing due to the running of weekly Old Time Dances at the Albert Hall every Saturday night for 26 years.

Prior to WWII, most eligible members were also members of the 12th Battalion Band, and at the outbreak of war these members immediately enlisted in the A.I.F., being stationed at Brighton

Army Camp, Elphin Showgrounds and later Darwin. The Band, since WWII, has regularly contested at Ballarat and have attended Nationals in Launceston, Burnie, Sydney and Adelaide.

Retirement of several key players saw the band drop from B Grade to D Grade - it is now back to C Grade, finishing second at the Burnie Nationals 1981. Recent winners of the Joe Stanbrough Marching Championship.

The band is proud of a number of members with continous service since the late 1930's and at present has six father/son or daughter combinations.

Musical Director - Mike Wheldon, Drum Major - Brian Callander Practices are conducted at Band Room, Elphin Showgrounds, Mondays and Thursdays, where players learners and visitors are most welcome.

THE NORTHERN SUBURBS SILVER BAND was formed in 1940 as the Invermay School Band. The name was changed to the Invermay Silver Band in the late 1940's, as the average age of members increased.

In 1970 the name was changed to its present form to better reflect the area the band served and from where it drew its members. At the same time the uniform was changed to its current design and colours.

The band was Australian "D" Grade Marching Champion in 1975 and 1976 and in 1977 won the combined "C" & "D" Grade National Marching Championship. In 1975 its then Drum Major, Miss Carol Davis, was adjudged the Most Outstanding at the Sydney National Championships.

In State competitions, Northern Suburbs Silver has won a State Championship five times in the past decade. In 1977 & 1978, it won the State "D" Grade Championship. The band is the current Tasmanian "C" Grade Champion, having won the same title previously in 1978, 1979 and 1980.

The Northern Suburbs bandrooms are situated on the corner of Barton & Janefield Streets, Mowbray. Visitors are welcome to call in, either to play or listen, when the band practices - 7.30 p.m. Mondays & Thursdays. Learners of all ages most welcome.

LAUNCESTON'S BEL CANTO BRASS BAND was formed in July 1983, six members attended the first rehearsal.

The Band now has 28 playing members, only five of these have had previous experience. The Band is quite proud that they have introduced so many young members to the Brass Band Movement. The Band rehearses each Wednesday night at Ravenswood High School, and has marching practise occasionally.

Having travelled to Adelaide last Easter to compete in their first Australian Championships, the members are looking forward to participating again this year in their home city.

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

INSPECTION

- 1. Bands will be inspected in Marching Formation at the International Velodrome, at a location as directed by the Marshall in Charge, on Friday, 17th April, at times listed.
- 2. Composition of Band: 18-25 instrumentalists plus percussion.
- 3. Carrying of Basses will be optional, either Upright or under Left Arm, but must be uniform within the band.
- 4. Positioning of percussion is optional.
- 5. Time allowed for preparation of Band for inspection will be 3 minutes.
- 6. Time allowed for Inspection Adjudicator will be 4 minutes.

DIAGRAM

Band will fall in at A.A. and move off in quick time to D.D.

On arrival at D.D., the band will counter march from front to rear, flank to flank, then right turn and march to C.C.

At C.C. band will right wheel and march to point E.E.


At E.E. band will left turn and march to point F.

At F. band will right turn and proceed with own display.

N.B.C. rules will apply in respect to movements until after right turn at F. Pacing and timing will be effective from B.B. to C.C.

DISPLAY

- 1. Own choice display will follow the completion of the right turn at F, and will be carried out in the prescribed area of 56 x 45 metres.
- 2. Judging of the drill and display will cease when the Band is given the Command "Stand at Ease" following the halt.
- 3. The main criteria for judging display will be Execution, Public Appeal and Spectacle, Balance and Progress.
- 4. Music will be judged on Suitability, Balance, Variety and Sound.
- 5. Judging of music will cease at the end of the strain, after the halt at the completion of the display.






