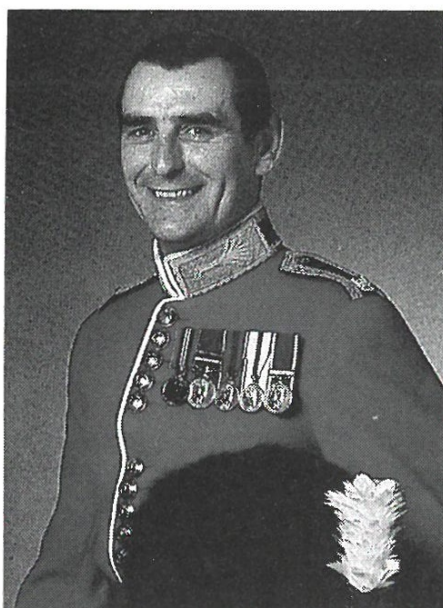

PROFILE ON

LIEUTENANT COLONEL PETER JACKSON



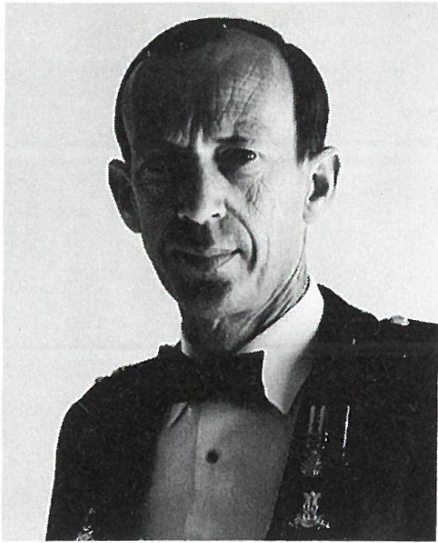
Lieutenant Colonel Jackson joined the Army as a National Serviceman in 1966 serving with the Southern Command Band. In 1971 he was posted as an instructor to the Army School of Music. In 1974 he was selected for overseas training at the Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall, where he won the Worshipful Company of Musicians medal for the best all round student of his class, and prizes for composition, orchestration, and instrumental performance.

Whilst in London he studied conducting with Maurice Miles, conducting professor Royal Academy of Music, and became an Associate of the Royal College of Music.

Commissioned in 1978, he has served as Senior instructor the Defence Force School of Music on two occasions and as Officer Commanding/Music Director of the Band of the First Recruit Training Battalion.

Prior to his present appointment, he was the Officer Commanding/Music Director of the Band of the Third Military District where he served for four years. He assumed his present appointment as Commanding Officer/Chief Instructor of the Defence Force School of Music on 2nd November, 1987 where he is responsible for the training of all musicians for the Australian Defence Force.

Despite a busy career, Lieutenant Colonel Jackson takes an active part in the civilian music community as a guest conductor and adjudicator. As a conductor of Brass Bands he has enjoyed great success winning many titles including the National "A" Grade Title.

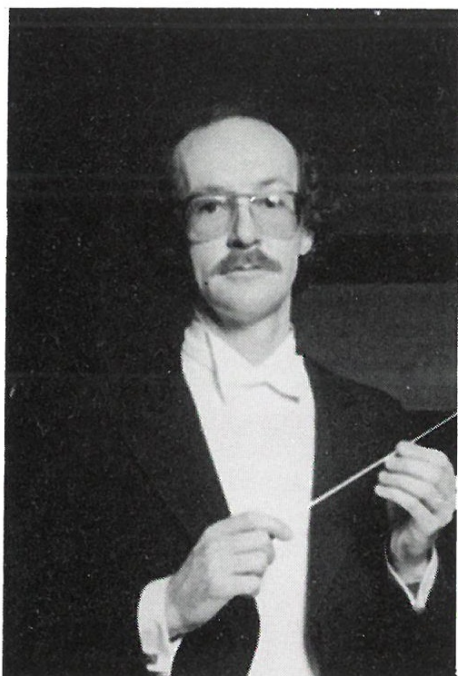


PROFILE ON MAJOR (RTD) DEREK TAYLOR

Derek Taylor was born in Oldham, Lancashire and educated in Gloucester. On leaving school he joined the Army as a Junior Musician in the Royal Irish Fusiliers as a cornet player, studying for twelve months with the legendary Jack McIntosh, virtuoso cornettist, professor of cornet and trumpet at Kneller Hall. Derek gained considerable experience playing not only with Concert Bands and Orchestras but also with Brass Bands. Whilst a pupil at Kneller Hall he played repiano cornet for the Borough of Barnes Brass Band, a very successful championship section Band later to become the Watney Band.

On his return to the Royal Irish Fusiliers as principal cornet, he gained rapid promotion to Band Sergeant and returned to Kneller Hall as a Student Bandmaster becoming a member of the celebrated Kneller Hall Trumpeters and played at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in Westminster Abbey. Following a successful three year course he was appointed Bandmaster of the 16th/5th The Queen's Royal Lancers, eventually becoming the senior Bandmaster of the Army and assistant to the Principal of Kneller Hall. Derek was commissioned as Director of Music to the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst where he remained for five years before his appointment to the Welsh Guards, where he completed his military career which spanned forty two years. Awarded the MBE for services to Music, he was presented with his award by the Sovereign on the day on which he and his wife Margaret left for Australia. Before leaving the United Kingdom, Derek declined invitations to be professional conductors of several top British Brass Bands.

Currently Director of the Tamworth Conservatorium Music Centre where his wife Margaret (a recent principal Soprano of the English National Opera) is head of the vocal department. They have been in Australia for six years bringing with them a wealth of International experience in the performance and administration of music. Derek is the conductor of the Regional Youth Orchestra in Tamworth, also the TRMC Junior Clarinet Choir, and the Tamworth Clarinet Choir.



PROFILE ON

MR. GARY McPHERSON

Gary McPherson is presently a Senior lecturer and Course Co-ordinator for Music Education at the University of N.S.W. His interest in music began at the age of 11 when he joined the Parkes Town Band and by the age of 16 he had won over 50 band titles including the Australian Junior and Senior Championship on the E flat Cornet. As a youngster he performed with the Parkes Town Band and Wollongong City Band.

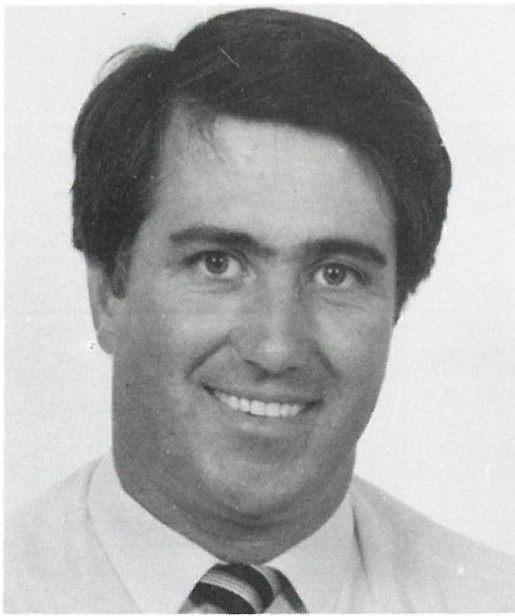
After graduating from the N.S.W. Conservatorium Gary taught for a number of years in Canberra secondary schools and also performed as a professional member of the Canberra Symphony Orchestra. In 1981 Gary travelled overseas to complete his degree and to study Music.

After returning to Australia he again taught in Canberra schools and in 1983 was appointed Lecturer in Music at the Tasmanian College of Advanced Education where he played cornet with the Latrobe Federal Brass Band. From 1984 to 1988 he was course controller for Music Education and Musicianship courses at the the University of Western Australia.

Since arriving in Sydney in 1987 Gary has been active in training instrumental teachers and ensemble conductors at the University of N.S.W. where he conducts the concert band.

At the beginning of 1990 Gary worked at the University of Illinois, near Chicago (this University established the first brass band in America). During his visit he worked with Professor Daniel Kohut devising a research program which he will undertake during the next few years in order to study various aspects of how musicians develop performance skills on an instrument.

In recent years Gary has worked throughout Australia adjudicating instrumentalists. At the University of N.S.W. he co-ordinates the performance requirements for students undertaking undergraduate training in music educations. Gary is also state President for the Australian Society for Music Education.



PROFILE ON MR. GREGORY DOYLE

Greg is a current member and former Vice President of the Band Association of N.S.W. and has served as N.S.W. delegate on the National Band Council.

He became a Drill Judge and member of the Drill Advisory Board of N.S.W. in 1986 and in 1987 was invited to the N.Z. Championships where he was instructed in judging techniques by Chief Drill Judge, Tony Cowan.

Greg first judged at the Australian Championships last year in Adelaide. Other appointments include three N.S.W. Marching Championships, the East Coast Display Marching Contest and a variety of street parades.

As a Drum Major, Greg led Willoughby Band to successive wins at the Australian Quickstep/Display contest 1985, 1986 and in 1987 both the Quickstep/Display and Street March Contests. Under Greg's leadership Willoughby won the Trophy at the Sydney Anzac Day March and entertained spectators with display marching at Sydney's Premiership Rugby League and A.F.L. matches.

Greg is the present conductor of Moruya Brass Band on the N.S.W. South Coast.

NOTT'NUM TOWN

THE CASTLE built on rock, high over the City of Nottingham was modified by Henry II and grew in size and magnificence during the reigns of Edward IV, and Richard III who marched from the Castle to meet Henry Tudor at Bosworth Field in 1485. Edward III surprised Mortimer and his mother, Queen Isabella at the Castle, and so established his throne. "Mortimer's Hole" is one of the hiding places still to be seen in the underground passages.

Charles I raised his standard there, and it withstood the Royalists throughout the Civil War.

THE RIVER TRENT, 725 miles in length, and third longest river in England, winds from Biddulph Moor through Nottingham County and is navigable as far as Nottingham.

A pleasure spot in its reaches, one can imagine the strolling couples, with the ladies clothed, from crinolines to mini-skirts.

GOOSE FAIR, bringing nostalgic memories of caliopes, swing-boats, coconut shies, naphtha lamps, etc., traditionally dates from the Charter of Edward I in 1284, and is supposedly named from its sales of Geese, some 20,000 coming from many miles around.

During the centuries it has been held annually, changing its make-up with the times, and is opened by the Lord Mayor, following a proclamation on behalf of the Sheriff of Nottingham, whose predecessors were so harassed by Robin Hood and his Merry Men.

The Festive City

Suite for Brass Band

This work has been commissioned for the 1981 Festival in the City of Wollongong, Australia, when Brass Bands are to be especially featured.

There are four movements:

I – City between Mountain and Sea

A brief introduction is based on the rhythm of the City's name. Following this, the 9/8 rhythm typifies the sea and the Alpine style of the mountains. Solemn chords remind us of the City's churches, and bright, rhythmic music the happy general atmosphere.

II – The Sublime Point

The music illustrates a gradual climb to the high point, a song-like passage as one gazes at the view, and a gradual descent.

III – Port Kembla

Here can be found the City's heavy industry, steel works and coal loader. The music is strongly rhythmic and unyielding.

Óðin

In the mist and darkness of the long harsh winters of Iceland in the ancient day, flourished the 'old religion', a baleful and all-powerful influence on the lives and destiny of those who inhabited Scandinavia and those remote and forbidding northlands. It was a barbaric age of superstition, pagan belief in magic and violent heroics. In a wild and hostile land was practised the secret ritual of 'casting the runes', those mysterious stone-carved hieroglyphic symbols, said to be possessed of magic powers and capable of foretelling the future. The cult of Odin was a dark and malevolent one. He was the god of the occult and of war; the lord of all the northlands, guardian of the mystical secret of the runes and all-omnipotent among the gods.

We are to a large extent direct descendants of those early Viking marauders from across the North Sea and beyond, whose nordic culture remains deeply ingrained in many aspects of our own way of life even to the present day. Some of the spirit of aggressive, challenging heroics has come down to us in the ceaseless struggle for supremacy, still pursued symbolically in the prowess displayed in musical performance. This is particularly so in the cult of the brass band whose music of such heroic caste has long flourished as one of its salient features. The mystical rites of casting the runes might be said to be still observed in the solemn drawing of lots, the numbers of which are even thought by some to be imbued with dark and prophetic qualities, foretelling the outcome of the imminent conflict.

The lettering of the score cover is based on authentic Icelandic carvings found on the Ragnarok Stone at Kirk Andreas in the Isle of Man. It is believed that this was made sometime in the 1100's by Gaut, a Viking sculptor. It depicts the Raven, a symbolic creature in Viking mythology, communing with Odin who is being devoured by the ferocious wolf, Fenrir while the serpent entwines them both.

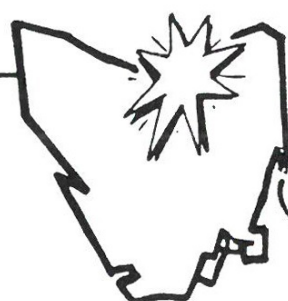
The work is in three movements; much of the thematic material is based on the 13th century plainsong Dies Irae.

The opening Intrada is sombre in mood. Only in the middle section does any optimism intrude.

The rest of the movement develops the opening phrase of the plainsong tune, mainly in heavy chordal writing.

The second movement is a Chorale and Variations. The chorale melody follows the main outline of the plainsong. The five variations that follow are varied in mood and intensity.

The final March is much happier in mood and has a lyrical tune in the middle, first heard on horns. However references to the Dies Irae are still apparent and the final bars of the work contain a quote from the opening movement. The music has come full circle.

CITY OF SYDNEY CONCERT BAND

The City of Sydney Concert Band is Sydney's own band and resident band for the Sydney Town Hall. Proudly supported by the Council of the City of Sydney, the band performs at many ceremonial occasions and functions as required by the council. Apart from its official role within our cities annual programme of civic and festive events, the bands charter gives it freedom to enjoy a much wider area of influence and has become an important forum for the development and refinement of performance skills in young musicians from all over the city. With its unique link to the City of Sydney, under the patronage of the Lord Mayor, its commitment to overseas tours and officially endorsed cultural exchanges with Sydney's Sister Cities, the band is enjoying a growing reputation both locally and internationally.

The City of Sydney Concert Band has origins going back to 1985 when the Council of the City of Sydney endorsed the formation of the City of Sydney Youth Festival Concert Band as a special activity associated with the International Year of Youth. This band first rehearsed at a weekend camp at Vision Valley in February 1985 before taking part in a series of public concerts during that year.

In 1986, the then Director of Music, Mr Victor Grieve sought the support of Council for the continuance of the Band as the City of Sydney Bicentennial concert Band, with the aim of performing at events leading up to and during Australia's 200th birthday celebrations. The Bicentennial Band performed with great distinction giving some 75 public performances during 1987-88 and undertaking two major overseas tours visiting England, France, Japan, Canada and USA. Performance highlights include Portsmouth U.K. in the presence of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth on the occasion of the departure of the First Fleet Re-enactment and on the forecourt of the Sydney Opera House on that never to be forgotten Australia Day in 1988. The band also performed at the Piazza and in the daily parade at Expo 88 in Brisbane and at the renowned Calgary Stampede.

When the City of Sydney Bicentennial Band Completed its charter on December 31st 1988, an interested group of parents and friends of the band prepared a new submission to council recommending the formation of the City of Sydney Concert Band as its permanent successor. The proposal was accepted and the Council enthusiastically endorsed the formation of a permanent concert and marching band to represent this City. With Squadron Leader Michael Butcher appointed as the new Director of Music, the reformed band rehearsed for the first time in May, 1989.

The City of Sydney Concert Band is able to perform a wide range of music in both concert and marching role and prides itself on its ability to provide suitable music for virtually any occasion. The band has entertained the citizens of Sydney in all manner of events and functions, both indoors and outdoors including product launches, opening nights, conferences, receptions, music festivals, mayoral balls, dinner dances, street parades, sporting fixtures, ship departures etc. Since the band became a permanent part of the Sydney scene in 1989, it has completed two further major tours returning to Japan in 1990 and in 1991 visiting Central Australia.

The Sesquicentenary of the City Council and the growing status of the band has seen a marked increase in performance activity in 1992. During the first quarter of 1992 the band has enjoyed its most active period since the height of the Bicentennial Celebrations. The performances include such prestigious functions as the Lord Mayor's Charity Concert, the arrival and departure of the SS QEII, the arrival of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and Prince Phillip at Sydney Town Hall, the World Cup Cricket, St Patrick's Day Parade and the 60th Anniversary of the Sydney Harbour Bridge.

In July this year the band will embark on its forth and most ambitious overseas tour when it will visit six European countries. During the three week tour, the band will perform in Switzerland, Luxembourg, Belgium, France, Spain and England. The highlight of the tour, and indeed its main purpose, is to visit and perform at the Universal Expo in Seville Spain. The Band will be performing for the Australian National Day celebrations in company with James Morrison, Circus Oz and the aboriginal Rock group Yothu Yindi. The band has been honoured by the Australian Government in being the only non-professional group endorsed to perform at the Expo, the largest International Event ever held. The tour, which also coincides with Sydney's Sesquicentennial Celebrations, will see the band again visit our Sister City of Portsmouth where they will perform at the Portsmouth Festival. The band will also perform at the new Euro Disneyland which only opens this month.

The Director of Music, Squadron Leader (Ret'd) Michael Butcher, was formally Director of Music of the Royal Australian Air Force and is one of Australia's most distinguished band conductors. He has had a lifelong involvement with Military and Community Bands with considerable success in National competition. He held the position of Director of Music, NSW Police Band for ten years before his Air Force posting where he conducted the RAAF Central Band, widely regarded as Australia's foremost Military Band. Michael Butcher is a skilled music arranger and has to his credit the official arrangement of our National Anthem.

The 60 member band has an open age policy, with current member ages ranging from 15 to 60 (average of 21) and includes some of the finest young musicians drawn from the Sydney metropolitan area. The band dresses in a striking blue and white uniform with white Akubra hats for outdoor and marching performances and a dark blue and white uniform for formal indoor concerts.

The band has come a long way since those modest beginnings in 1985. As it enters its eighth year its reputation and stature continues to grow and its role as ambassadors for the City of Sydney gathers momentum with the completion of each tour. With all this the bands future place in the hearts and minds of Sydney's fun loving citizens seem assured.

Each of the folksong suites is based on tunes from Great Britain, and all are dedicated to the memory of Percy Grainger. Like the folk-music settings of that composer, they use the original melodies in a variation or passacaglia-like form as a means for harmonic and contrapuntal invention.

The third suite consists of three such settings: "Droylsden Wakes", a sentimental verse-and-chorus piece (Droylsden being an old village in Lancashire); "Lord Bateman", a vigorous, virtuosic setting with constant metrical changes; and "3 Ships And Lisbon", a mixture of two folktunes and a third original melody by the composer. In this last setting, one might imagine the bells of a distant town with the listener and his party approaching; on entering the town, the visitors are overwhelmed with the majestic "3 Ships" melody, but nevertheless attempt to whistle their own tunes over the top.

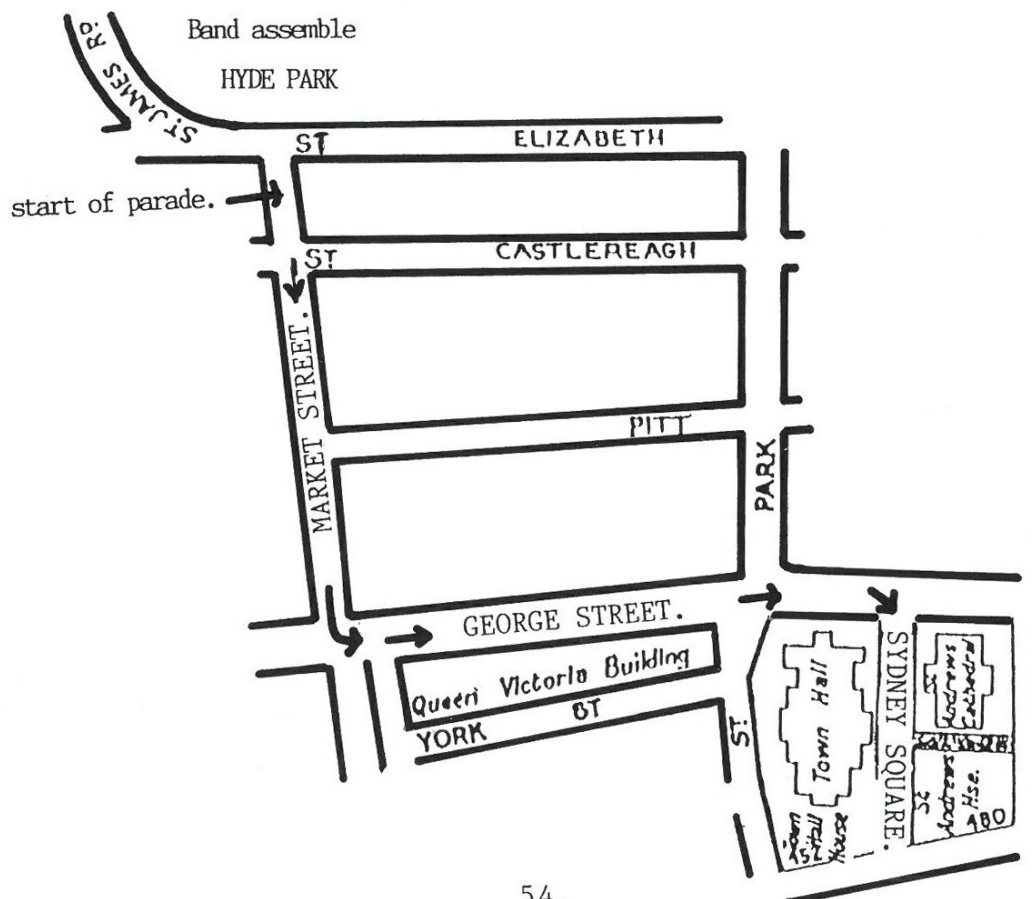

OVAL MARCHING EVENT

(Compulsory for ALL Senior Brass Grades.)

- The marching contest will be an Oval March in accordance with Clause 3, page 3 of the N.B.C Drill & Marching Regulations 1988 (revised edition published October 1990.)
- The first element, Set Diagram, will be Diagram No.6, page 41 of the N.B.C Drill & Marching Regulations 1988. Approval has been sought from the N.B.C to amend the layout of the Diagram as detailed hereunder to afford maximum spectator benefit.
- The second element will be an Own Choice Display of minimum three (3) minutes and maximum six (6) minutes in accordance with the regulations at pages 8 & 9 of the N.B.C Drill & Marching Regulations 1988 and to commence immediately at the completion of the set diagram.
- The area available for the Own Choice Display will measure eighty (80) metres by fifty (50) metres.
- INSPECTION will be carried out in marching formation immediately prior to the bands competing in the Oval March competition.

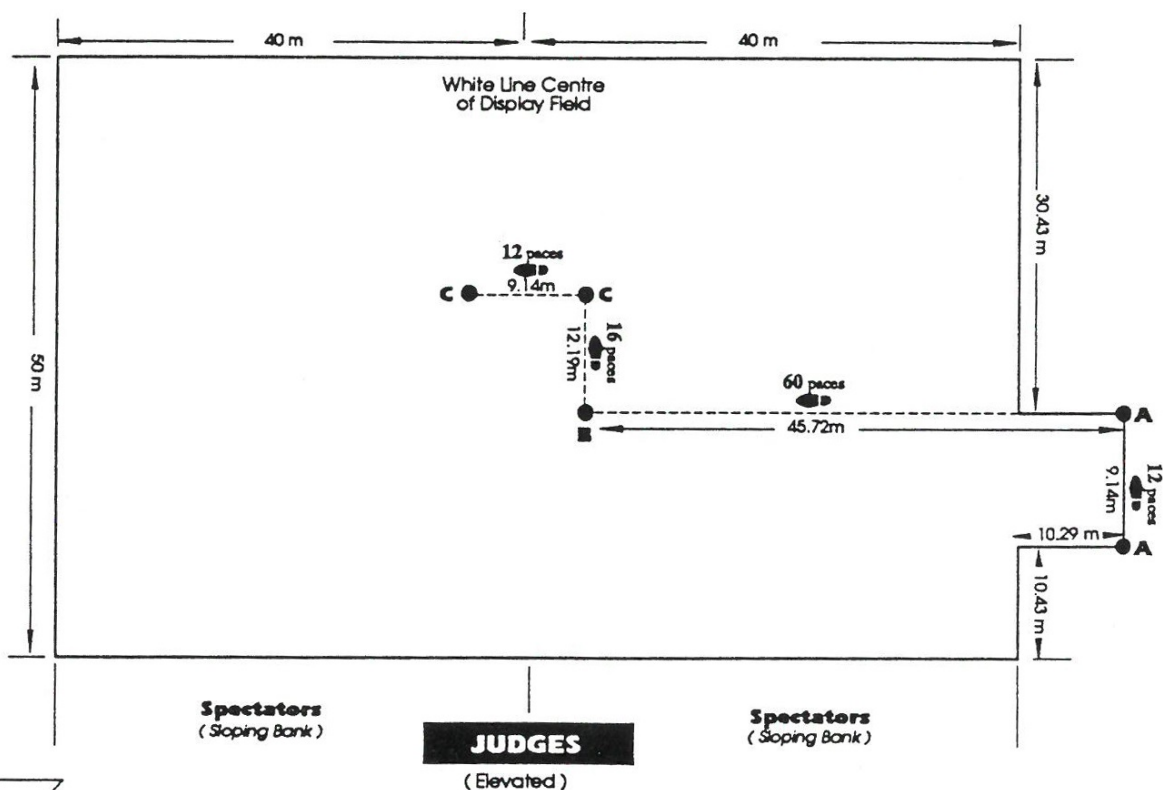


DIAGRAM No. 6 (Amended)

The band will fall in, in marching formation, at point A.A. and move off in quick time, playing, and march to point B., right wheel and march to point C.C. At point C.C. the band will counter march from front to rear and flank to flank, right turn and march forward and then commence the Own Choice Display Marching. The distance between A.A. and B. is 45.72 metres or 60 paces. The distance between B. and C.C. is 12.19 metres or 16 paces. Band means front rank. The flages at point B. and C.C. will need to be moved immediately the band has passed these points when marching forward to commence the Own Choice Display Marching.

Points and judging criteria will be as per General Marching Regulations - Rule 15. There will be no inspection in the Street March. Champion marching band in each grade will be determined by aggregate points of both marching events.



CONDITIONS OF CONTEST

1. All Rules of the National Band Council of Australia shall apply throughout the contest, together with any other Rules as submitted herewith.
2. All Bands and Soloists should make themselves familiar with the Rules of the National Band Council of Australia by obtaining a copy from their respective State Governing Body. Ignorance shall not be an excuse.
3. All competitors are advised to pay particular attention to N.B.C. Rules 3 (b), 14(b), 15(b) (d) (e) (f) (g), 16(b) (c) (f) , 17(a) (b) (c), 23(b) (e) (j) (m). Rule 16(b) and 23(b) is two calendar years.

QUARTETS twelve (12) minutes
CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS eight (8) minutes
5. **MUSIC SCORES**
Scores for the Adjudicator for ALL BAND ON STAGE PERFORMANCES MUST BE SUBMITTED NOT LATER THAN **FRIDAY, 6th MARCH, 1992** or the Band will incur IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION. (Refer N.B.C Meeting, Launceston Easter 1987).
CONCERT BAND OWN CHOICE SELECTION
SCORES AS DETAILED AS POSSIBLE with all bars numbered must be supplied.
BRASS BAND OWN CHOICE SELECTION
A FULL SCORE with all bars numbered must be supplied
HYMN
A short score of AT LEAST (2) STAVES with sufficient cues to permit an effective adjudication, with all bars numbered must be supplied.
QUARTET SECTIONS
A FULL SCORE with all bars numbered must be supplied.
N.B.: All competitors are advised to thoroughly acquaint themselves with the current Copyright Laws before submitting their own choice music scores.
6. Bands and all their players must be duly registered for three (3) calendar months prior to the date of the contest with their respective State Governing Body or New Zealand Brass Band Association, this rule will also apply to all Permit Players. (N.B.C. Rule 15(g)).
7. The Championship in each grade shall be awarded to the Band gaining highest aggregate points for the TEST SELECTION AND OWN CHOICE SELECTION.
8. In SOLO and QUARTET sections N.B.C. Championship Qualifying standards shall apply: i.e. OPEN SECTIONS - EIGHTY FIVE (85) POINTS, JUNIOR SECTIONS - SEVENTY EIGHT (78) POINTS, or the Championship for that section will not be awarded.
9. AWARDS shall be distributed in the following manner - Medal & Certificate 1st & 2nd, Certificate only 3rd. QUARTETS- winners trophy for band and certificate for each player.
10. Bands entering in two(2) grades must play different OWN CHOICE SELECTIONS in each Grade. Junior Bands eligible to play in OPEN D GRADE may use the same OWN CHOICE SELECTION IN BOTH GRADES. (N.B.C. Rule 16(f)).
11. In Quartet sections each member of the party must be registered with the one (1) Band, including the conductor, and must wear the uniform of that Band. Competitors in these sections will be allowed the services of their Bandmaster, or another registered member of the Band as conductor (N.B.C. Rule 23(i) (j)).
12. Any entrant competing in a JUNIOR SECTION shall not have attained the age of nineteen (19) years as at the date of the competition. Birth certificate or other means of proof of age may be required (N.B.C. 3(b)).
13. Trumpets and French Horns shall be excluded from all OPEN BRASS BAND SECTIONS. (N.B.C. 15(a)).
14. Any protest or dispute must be lodged IN WRITING to the Contest Secretary, or a member of the Protest Committee, not later than fifteen (15) minutes after the decision of the Adjudicator(s) has been announced, if the protest be against a Band the fee shall be \$10.00, if against a Party or Soloist the fee shall be \$5.00 (N.B.C. 22(h) (k)).
15. The organising committee reserves the right to withhold Trophies and Awards from any Band which does not participate in all events listed on the schedule, excluding those specifically stated as being OPTIONAL.
16. **PLAYING ORDER**
A draw for playing order, in all events, will be made by the Contest Committee, competitors must appear in that order
17. Competitors in any section may be disqualified if not ready to perform immediately after the previous competitor has completed their performance
18. **WARM UPON STAGE** (Band sections) No warm up will now be permitted.
