
On behalf of the National Band Council, I extend to everyone a successful contest and a safe return home after the playing is done.



Wing Commander Eric Banks, OBE

Eric Banks was born into a musical background in South Shields in the North of England, an area famous for its bands and personalities and so his natural love of band music was well founded in his early formative years. At the age of 17 he became a member of the Central Band of Her Majesty's Royal Air Force, during which time his repertoire of concert music was firmly established with this world famous band for the next 8 years.

He then became a bandmaster is the Royal Air Force and later was commissioned Director of Music of the Central Band. In recognition of his services to music he was awarded the MBE in 1974. In 1983, he was appointed


Principal Director of Music, Royal Air Force and principal conductor of the Central Band of Her Majesty's Royal Air Force. In 1985 he was elected a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Musicians, London and later that same year was elected a Freeman of the City of London. In 1989 he was further honoured by the award of the OBE.

His long and distinguished career as a conductor of concerts, broadcasts, recordings, films and television has also taken him to most parts of the world as a guest conductor, adjudicator and examiner. Throughout his professional life, he has maintained his work with the brass band world by his writing, conducting, adjudicating and recordings. Eric is principal conductor of the London Symphonic Wind Orchestra and a guest conductor of the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra.

Vincent Fryer

Vin Fryer began studying euphonium at the age of 9 and later studied trombone and tuba. Vin went on to become a State and National Champion soloist many times over, playing with East Kew Central School Band, Kew Citizens Band and Hawthorn City Band in Victoria. Vin moved to Queensland in 1973 where he was tuba player with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra for several years. During this time he also conducted brass, military and concert bands and orchestras and taught tuba at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music.

In 1993 Vin retired from the Queensland Education Department after 14 years as an educator and



conductor of the highly successful Brisbane State High School Orchestra, Symphonic and Concert Bands.

Vin has adjudicated at many State and District band championships and solo events. He is a member of the Institute of Music Teachers, Vice President of Australian Band and Orchestra Directors Association (Qld) and currently performing a part time consultancy in primary and secondary schools.







Philip Davis

Phil studied at the Newcastle Boys High School and commenced playing trombone with 2RNSWR Army Band from 1964-67 with Charles Partridge. He was a member of the National Training Orchestra from 1967-1969 and joined the State Orchestra of Victoria as Principal Trombonist from 1969-1985. Phil has played with many brass and concert bands in New South Wales, Victoria and Queensland.

He is currently Lecturer in the Wind, Brass and Percussion Department at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music, Co-Ordinator of Music at Redlands College, Band Director, Moreton Bay College, Director of Music of the

McGregor Summer Schools and Redlands Winter Music Camps and Conductor of the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra.

Phil is also an AMEB Examiner and freelance trombonist, clinician, conductor and adjudicator.

Barrie Gott

Barrie commenced his playing career as a professional musician studying trumpet with John Robertson and Harry Larsen at the New South Wales Conservatorium of Music. He subsequently joined the National Training Orchestra and fulfilled many engagements with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

His love of brass band music led him to writing for that genre particularly Salvation Army bands where he has had a number of works published in the US and UK. His experience as a composer and arranger of choral and orchestral music has led to many performances in Japan and Europe.



In 1983 he travelled to the US where he obtained his Master's Degree in Conducting and spent 5 years at Azusa Pacific University in California as Director of Instrumental Music. Upon returning to Australia in 1991 Barrie took up an appointment as Territorial Music Director for the Salvation Army. He is currently developing young musicians in primary and secondary schools in Queensland where he is the Regional Education Co-Ordinator, Sunshine Coast, for the Australian Academy of Music.

Barrie has adjudicated State and District contests in both Queensland and New South Wales.






Chief Drill Adjudicator - Geoffrey Fry

Geoffrey Fry has been a bandsman since he was 8 years old and has been a drum major and drill adjudicator for 30 years, his career as a drum major commencing with Cairns (CS) & Citizens Band. He has been a successful drum major with a number of bands in the Northern Zone of Queensland and initiated the implementation of seminars and workshops for drum majors and bands in Queensland. who owe their proficiency to the training they have received from the time and dedication Geoffrey has given. Geoffrey has adjudicated at many State and District contests since 1975. Geoffrey is a member of the 1995 Nationals Organising Committee.






Assistant Drill Adjudicator -Trevor Fitzgerald

Trevor commenced his career as a bandsmen at the age of 12, attended his first contest in 1949 in Tenterfield, NSW. In 1980 he was appointed drum major of Sunnybank Band and has won drum major titles at both State and National level. Under his leadership Sunnybank Junior Band was undefeated in marching and drill for 11 consecutive years, while the senior band won 5 diagram displays in succession. Trevor has judged at both State and District levels, but this contest will be his first Nationals as an adjudicator.


Assistant Drill Adjudicator - Ken Howlett

Ken has been actively involved in Queensland bands for 26 years as a player and drum major and is currently the drum major of the Mackay City Band. 


Brad Millard



Percy Code — Impressario

A brief look at one of Australia's great musicians by Norm Harris

Percy Code achieved far more in his life time than many of us who live in the modern era do. As well as being an acclaimed cornet champion, he was also a great orchestral trumpet player, a composer, conductor and a respected human being. Many people today do not appreciate his contribution to music in this country. It goes beyond banding, where among the older members he enjoys 'legend' status, and in his day, his name was a household word. Many of us have grown up having played many of his solos or marches, and to a lot of younger musicians not a great deal is known about Percy. Let's take a closer look at the life of this man.

Born July 3rd, 1888, in South Melbourne, Edward Percival Code was the son of Edward Thomas and Mary Ann Code, both of Bendigo. At an early age he was taught by his father to play piano, violin and the cornet. By age 14 he was already being acclaimed as a great soloist, and before he was 22, would be both Eb and Bb cornet champion, enjoying the reputation of being the most brilliant cornet player Australia has produced. In 1910, the English adjudicator, Mr William Short, said that there was no superior to Code in the entire British Isles. As a consequence of Short's recommendation, Percy was invited to tour Australia with the famous English brass band, 'Besses o' the Barn'. In 1911 he travelled to England to again play with Besses and also to study.


Percy studied orchestration and composition at the Royal College of Music in London, gaining both the Associate and Licentiate Diploma, and was awarded the gold medal for the candidate achieving the highest marks in the British Empire.

After returning to Australia, Percy went on to conduct champion bands and choirs and in doing so established an enviable reputation with the baton.

1921 saw Percy travelling to the United States where he performed under contract with the San Francisco Orchestra. Australia at this time did not have a professional orhcestra as such, and any training he gained in this medium would have been with amateur orchestras, and is also a confirmation of Percy's skill as a performer that he was able to secure a position in one of America's major orchestras.

After his time in America he returned to Melbourne and worked in the orchestra at radio 3AR and theatre orchestras. Radio broadcasting did not start until 1923 and employed small (10-15 piece) orchestras.

When the Austalian Broadcasting Company was formed in 1929, this new organisation decided to have a full time orchestras to play a variety of music for the culturally deprived. In Sydney and Melbourne these musical aggregations numbered eight to ten players. The ABC at this time was not a government body, but a free enterprise agreement between Sir Benjamin Fuller of Fuller's Theatres, cinema owner Stuart



Doyle of Greater Union Theatres, and Frank Albert of J. Albert and Son, music publishers. It was not until 1932 that the government took control of the ABC and changed the name to Australian Broadcasting Commission.

In 1929, Percy Code was appointed principal conductor of the ABC and of the Melbourne ensemble, and in 1936 was transferred to Sydney to train the ever growing orchestra in that city. As principal conductor with the ABC Percy conducted many first performances of major orchestral works and was instrumental in training several of the other orchestras as they became established, as well as conducting operas and working with visiting overseas artists.

As senior conductor he worked almost every day conducting a variety of music for live concerts, recording or live broadcasts. Percy proved himself to be an impressive conductor as well as being a thorough orchestra trainer. Orchestra players respected and admired Percy's musicianship, and his rehearsals were always very carefully planned with never a wasted moment. In 1947 Percy was transferred back to Melbourne where he spent his last active years until poor health forced his retirement in 1951. He died on the 16th of October, 1953 and is buried in the Box Hill Cemetary.

Percy conducted over 2,000 concerts during his years with the ABC. He is one of the few bandsmen to become an orchestral conductor, but is better known for his 11 solos for brass instruments, and the several marches for brass band that he wrote. He also wrote a tutor for brass entitled Allans Modern Method for Cornet or Trumpet.

His contribution to the musical life of Australia is very considerable, and we all owe this great man a debt of gratitude for his selfless dedication to music.

To this day the many solos of Percy Code are played at eisteddfod's around Australia, and quite often you'll year one of his marches at a contest. In bandrooms his name is still spoken with reverence. All this seems a fitting tribute to this great Australian musician don't you think?

Norm Harris is a freelance trumpet player who now resides in Melbourne. He studied and worked in the United States, was lead trumpet with the Daly-Wilson Big Band, the GTV 9 Orchestra and at the Flamingo Hilton in Las Vegas. He has taught at Sydney Conservatorium, the Defence Force School of Music and is currently on staff at Melbourne University. He is currently recording the solos of Percy Code, due for release late 1994. Many of Norm's students enjoy professional careers.

An Australian Tuba Player studying overseas Des Ward

This is a short account of my experiences as I pursued further study overseas. It may help to bear in mind that it was written from the perspective of a 23 year old who looks back on 11 years of playing.

I started playing the tuba in the primary school system in Brisbane at the age of eleven. My school, Mt Gravatt South State Primary School had a very strong music program and that combined with the help I received from my Mother (a piano teacher) gave me a strong grounding and a love for music.

When I went to high school (age 13) the music programme at my school was not so strong, however I was fortunate to play in the brass bands around Brisbane and had a fine teacher Mr Brian Morrison, to point me in the right direction. Following Brian's advice I became involved in the Queensland Conservatorium's Music School program which was fantastic and continued my studies with Mr Craig Cunningham (Principal Tubist, Qld. Symphony Orchestra). After school I attended the Qld. Conservatorium enrolling in the diploma course still working under Craig. At the end of my second year I met Mr Steve Rosse' (Principal Tubist, Sydney Symphony Orchestra) whilst on an Australian Youth Orchestra tour. Realizing that I wanted to emulate the American style of playing more I enrolled in the Canberra School of Music and completed my diploma there under Steve.

After completing my diploma I became determined to study further overseas and with Steve's help contacted Mr Bob Tucci (Principal Tubist, Bavarian State Opera) and Mr Tom Walsh (Principal Tubist, Munich Philharmonic) in Munich. I chose Germany for my destination thinking along the lines of obtaining work. I lived and studied there for one and a half years after which I met Mr Roger Bobo in a masterclass and upon his suggestion and that of my former teachers I moved to Rotterdam, Holland which is where I currently am.

Having what I could consider the best training on my instrument possible in Australia I found that the level in Germany was, to a large degree higher. Maybe a reason for this is the cultural base in this country, every town has an orchestra and often an opera company as well! Certainly people are more exposed to "Classical" music or for that matter Jazz, Concert band music or any other form of music.

However for me the main difference was a sense of professionalism that pervaded everyones' playing. At first this was a little difficult to grasp for me as moving into the professional orchestras in Australia I had found that the tolerance level or could one say the professional standards if

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not lower were different. For example, a rehearsal in Germany was business, paid business, when the conductor spoke, his word was law and I never saw anyone talk to a neighbour louder than a whisper and in short comments if they talked at all. For a tuba player in an orchestral situation you came in, played your part correctly, in time and in tune, then went home on the first train after the job, it was a formal situation and one had to dress and act formally or one didn't get employed again!

As far as work went in many respects it simply took time. I had to build up contacts slowly and found that being able to speak the language was a distinct advantage and being Australian seemed to be better than being from certain other countries (an unfortunate fact). Even so it took me ten months before the first paid job came along. The mainstay of jobs for freelance brass players in the Munich area seemed to be the church festivals and various quintet jobs. I was fortunate enough to obtain freelance work with the Munich Philharmonic and the Bavarian State Opera but my bread and butter as it were came from quintet jobs.

As far as obtaining full time work in Germany for my instrument it became apparent that the positions being auditioned were filled only with German nationals. Foreigners were mainly uninvited to the auditions. I came to realize, that bluntly put, you must not only have a very high standard in your playing but also know people within the orchestra you wanted to audition for. In fact, sad as it is to say, I believe that this is the case in most of the world today.

When I decided to move to Holland I chose not to look for work as much and concentrated mainly on improving the standard of my playing. I did however through other musicians find that work was at best scarce, there were teaching possibilities but most foreign students at the Rotterdam Conservatorium were mainly involved in their studies and intended to return to their home countries.

My advice to high school students intending further study in music is this – know the odds. Be completely aware of advantages and disadvantages of the music profession if you wish to perform. After the decision has been made to aim at a performing career give it your best shot, go for it 110 percent because in the next town or the next city or the next country there is someone who is working at 120 percent, of that you can be sure. The only other piece of advice comes from a good friend and former teacher of mine, Craig Cunningham – make sure you have fun along the way, the rainbow is just as much fun as the pot of gold at the end!!
