hillip McCann

CHIEF ADJUDICATOR

hillip McCann is one of the best-known names in the Brass Band World. He was born in Bo'ness, Scotland, where he began his playing career with the Kinneil Collier band at the age of eight. He played Principal Cornet with the National Youth Brass Band and the famous Men O' Brass before advancing to the same position with the world famous Black Dyke Mills Band in 1973. He remained with the Black Dyke until 1988, and since then has maintained his reputation as Principal Cornet at the Leyland DAF Band as well as the Williams Fairey Engineering Band.

He has toured extensively as a recitalist in Europe, the U.S.A., Japan and Australia and in England he has played in all the prestigious venues together with radio broadcasts and appearances on television.

Phillip is also busy in giving master classes with bands throughout the world.

He is a member of the internationally renowned instrumentalists assisting the Yamaha Corporation in the development of their range of wind and brass instruments.

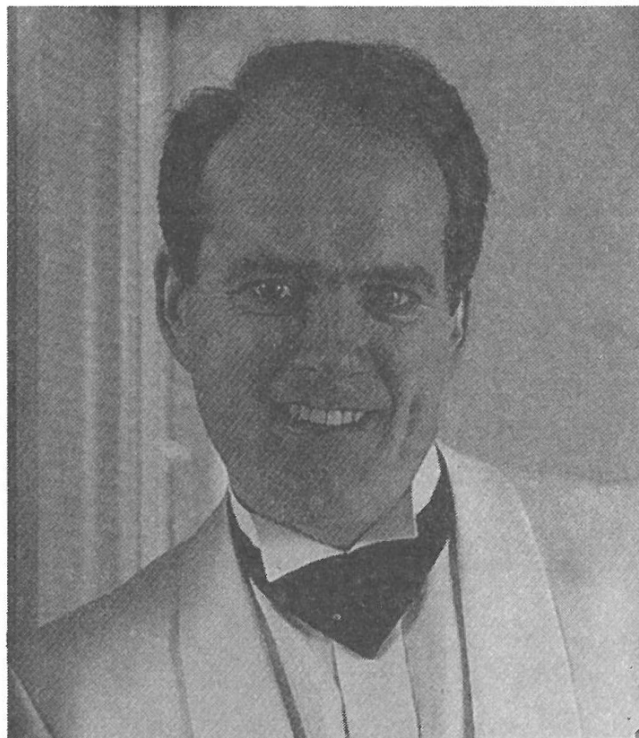
Phillip is heavily committed to teaching brass music through his work at The University of Huddersfield and Huddersfield Technical College.

In recent years he has progressively increased his activities as a conductor and was the

founder and Musical Director of the highly successful Sellers Engineering Band from Huddersfield.

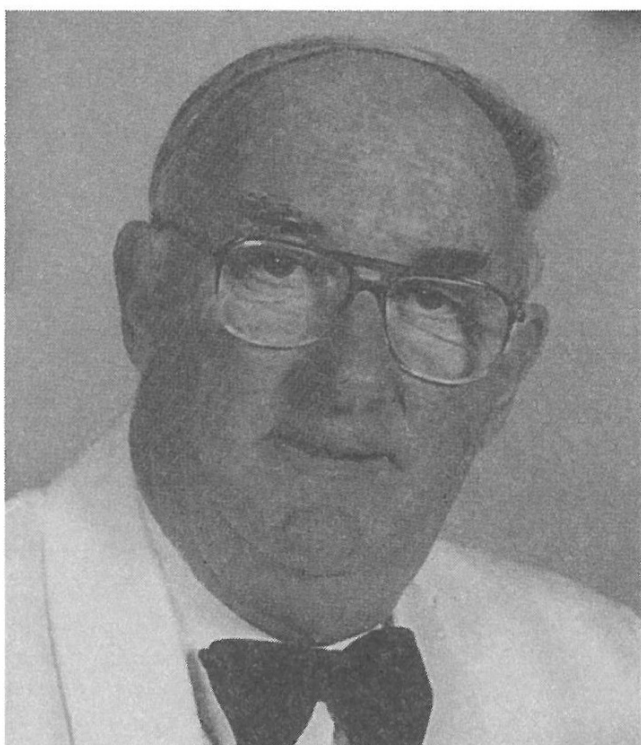
Phillip's recordings of The World's Most Beautiful Melodies are universally admired for the exquisite tone and musical expression in the playing, and are featured regularly on B.B.C. Radio along with Classic F.M.

His unique style and tone quality have been used by composers to combine with orchestra for film and T.V. sound-tracks; such as Anna of the Five Towns. Woman of Substance and the immensely popular B.B.C. television series Hetty Wainthropp Investigates".

ADJUDICATOR



*K*evin Jarrett began playing the cornet in 1943. As a soloist he has won many titles including the New Zealand and Australian Open Cornet Championships.

Kevin was selected for the New Zealand 1962 National Band before becoming leader of the National Band for its 1965 tour to America.

Throughout his playing career Kevin was a member of seven National Bands and in 1985 also held the post of 'Assistant to the Conductor'.

Kevin's conducting career began with the New Zealand Army and since 1975 he has conducted Wanganui City Brass taking it from B grade through to A grade culminating in a victory in the 1988 Australian Bi-Centennial Brass Band Championships. In 1978, 1979 and 1982 Kevin conducted the National Youth Band of New Zealand.

However Kevin reached the pinnacle with his appointment as conductor of the 1989 National Band following the death of Mervyn Waters. Kevin then directed the 1990 National Band at the Auckland Commonwealth Games before conducting the 1992 National Band on a very successful New Zealand Tour.

Kevin has just completed a tour of America conducting the 1995 National Band of New Zealand.

In 1986 Kevin was awarded the MBE for his services to music.

A D J U D I C A T O R

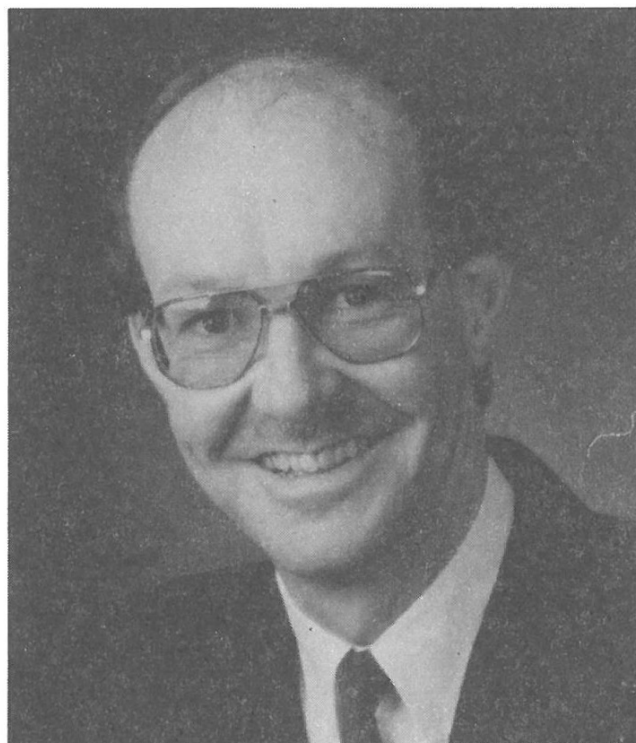
Dr. Gary McPherson is Course Co-ordinator for Music Education at the University of New South Wales in Sydney, Australia. He completed his undergraduate training at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music before completing a Licentiate and Fellowship in trumpet performance from Trinity College, London, a Master of Music Education at Indiana University and a Doctor of Philosophy at the University of Sydney.

Gary grew up in Parkes NSW, where he joined the local band. As a soloist Gary won over 50 regional, State and Australian brass band titles before the age of 17, including the Australian junior and senior Soprano Cornet Championship.

Gary has had extensive experience as a professional trumpeter in professional symphony orchestras and jazz ensembles throughout Australia.

He has taught brass and concert bands as a high school music teacher and directs the Pipers Concert Band at the University of NSW.

Gary is currently National President of the Australian Society of Music Education, Review Editor for the International Journal of Music Education, Co-editor for a new journal (Research Studies in Music Education) and an examiner for the Australian Music



Examinations Board. He has adjudicated brass and concert bands at State and National level in five Australian states and is regularly invited to give workshops and other presentations.

During late 1994 Gary was invited to give guest lectures on musical performance, learning theory and pedagogy at some of the finest universities in the United Kingdom, the United States and Sweden. In January and February of 1996 he was invited back to Sweden for six weeks, giving lectures and taking performance ensembles in four universities. During his time in Sweden he also took rehearsals with the City of Malmo Brass Band, introducing them to Australian compositions.

Major Derek Taylor RTO.

ADJUDICATOR

Derek Taylor joined the Royal Irish Fusiliers as a Band boy at the age of fifteen. He became a sergeant and principal cornet at the age of nineteen, entering Kneller Hall as a Student Bandmaster in 1952.

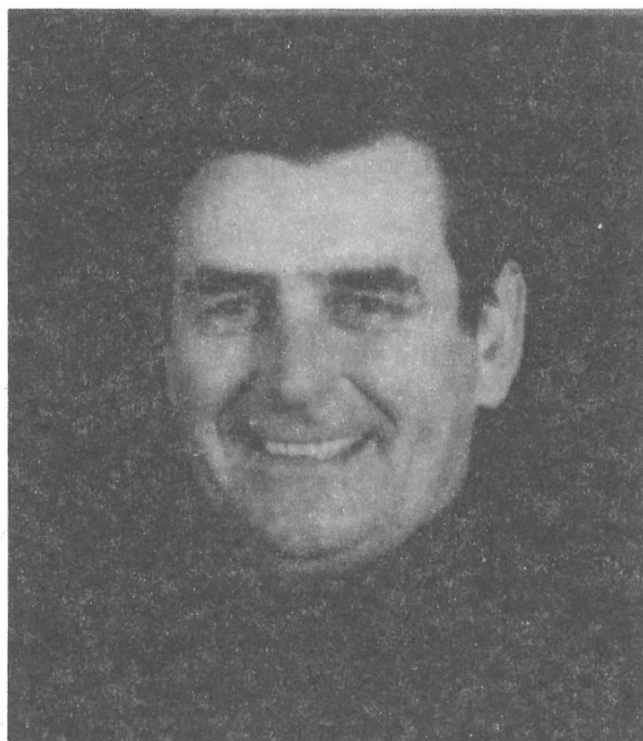
One of the Kneller Hall Trumpeters in Westminster Abbey at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth, Derek graduated in 1955 and was appointed bandmaster of the Queens Royal Lancers at the age of twenty six years, the youngest in the British Army.

In 1969 he was appointed the School Bandmaster at Kneller Hall, the senior Bandmaster in the Army, serving with the celebrated Colonel "Jiggs" Jaeger.

From Kneller Hall Derek was commissioned and appointed Director of Music, The Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, a position he held for five and a half years before serving the last twelve years of his military service as Director of Music HM Welsh Guards. Derek was awarded the MBE for services to music and invested by the Queen on the day he left the United Kingdom for Australia.

Director of the Tamworth Regional Conservatorium of Music from 1986 - 1996 and now, consultant to the Governing Board, Derek Taylor is a vastly experienced orchestral, band and choral conductor, administrator, arranger and adjudicator.

For eight years before leaving the UK, he was conducting examiner for the Royal Academy of Music and has examined for United Kingdom Ministry of Defence, Royal College of Music and Trinity College. He has adjudicated many contests in NSW including the National Championships for which he has again been engaged for 1996.



tan Priestley

A D J U D I C A T O R

Stan Priestley was born in Nottingham England and he became a professional musician in 1968. His achievements are outstanding and it is difficult to do justice to them here, but some highlights include;

- 1969-93 - solo trombonist for the "National Concert Band of Great Britain" and the Virtuoso Brass Band of Great Britain as well as second trombone for the "National Brass Band of Great Britain".
- Sept 1983 - June 1989 - Musical Director of Gunnedah Shire Junior and Senior Bands during which time the band won 5 State and 1 National title.
- Oct 1989 - June 1990 - Musical Director of Auckland City Brass Band who won the National Championships in May 1990.
- Had the honour of playing "Grimethorpe Aria" at the Proms Albert Hall, in Zagreb performed Vinko Globokar's avant-garde instrumental piece for Brass Bands.
- Worked for radio and television in London, Washington, Germany and France as well as recording for Strawberry Recordings, EMI and Decca. Rothman's Player of the year (England).
- Has tutored Brass and Woodwind in England, N.Z. and Australia with great success and is currently tutoring at least six Sydney Schools.

For his efforts, Mr Priestly was awarded the Australia Day Medal for his services to music.

PERCUSSION ADJUDICATOR

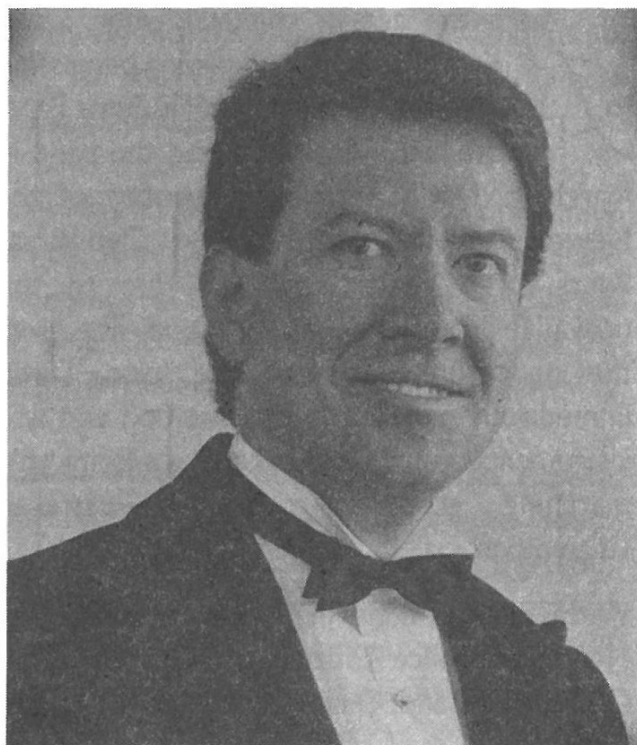
*A*fter studying classical guitar for 6 years, Brian became more interested in hitting things than plucking them.

In 1977, while studying under Richard Miller and playing with the Willoughby Brass Band and the Sydney Youth Orchestra Brian was chosen to represent Australia as a percussionist in the first Asian Regional Youth Music Camp held in Manila, The Philippines.

Since then, as a freelance drummer, timpanist and percussionist Brian has worked through a very wide spectrum of the music industry. He performs regularly with the Sydney Symphony, Sydney Opera House and Australian Chamber Orchestras. He has toured the United States and Europe with the SSO; Japan with the Australian Philharmonic and Europe with the ACO. Brian has also been guest principal timpanist and percussionist with the SSO on a number of occasions.

As well as all the major orchestras Brian has performed with and recorded for such diverse groups as The Australia Ensemble, The Seymour Group, Synergy and INXS - just to name a few.

Brian is also in demand as a session musician having worked on countless albums (commercial and orchestral) Radio/television and cinema jingles, documentaries and film scores, from Hanna-Barbera cartoons to feature films.



In addition to performing, Brian has composed percussion solos and adjudicated for many N.S.W. and National competitions. He has examined for the N.S.W. Conservatorium and Canberra School of Music, as well as directed percussion studies at Barker College since 1978.

David Kurthi

CHIEF DRILL JUDGE

*A*t the age of thirteen when David Kurthi commenced playing percussion with the Waratah Mayfield Brass Band, he had a desire to lead the band in marching. David became a member of the Newcastle Police Citizens Boys Club Brass Band some years later and due to the unavailability of their drum major, was given the opportunity to lead the band. David immediately excelled in this position and was instrumental in the band becoming a formidable marching group throughout Australian Championships.

With drum majoring and training the Newcastle Police Citizens Boys (later Youth) Club Brass Band, David won eight (8) Youth

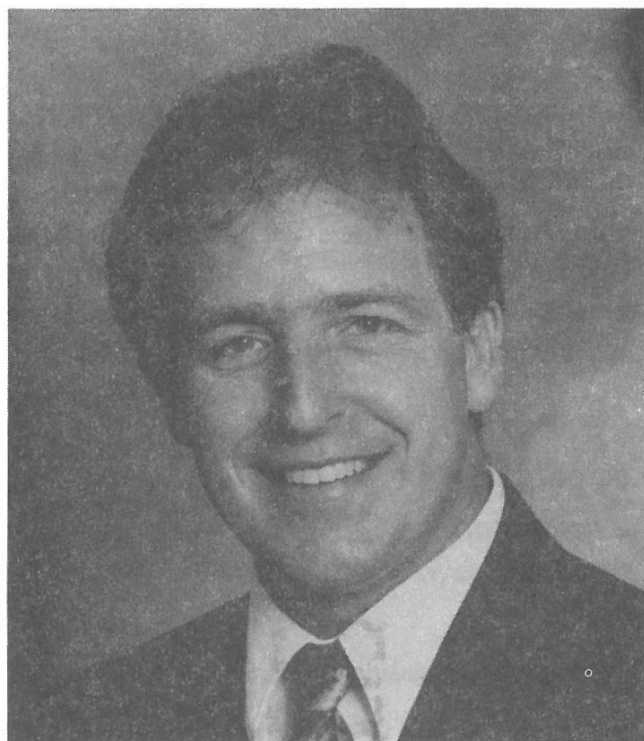
Club Championships, five (5) Australian Championships and numerous State and Regional competitions and street parades. David has won three Australian National Drum major awards.

In 1988 David was invited to train and drum major the St. Mary's Band Club Brass Band to compete in New Zealand. With only six weeks to train the Band they won the New Zealand "B" Grade Display Marching Championships which no other Australian band had achieved. Since that time, David has continued to lead and train the band to two Australian National Championships and second on two other occasions. The Band has also been placed in the top three every year in the Street March.

David introduced the free style marching (oval marching) to New South Wales in 1986 with a series of weekend camps. He has maintained a high profile by organising and lecturing at drum major camps for the Hunter Regional Band Association.

David is highly regarded in marching circles for his commitment to excellence and professionalism in marching but takes a realistic approach by expressing, "I joined a Brass Band to play music and not be a marching girl, so lets enjoy marching".

David has adjudicated throughout New South Wales at numerous Regional Championships and Street Parades. This will be David's first appointment at an Australian National Championship.

DRILL JUDGE

In 1947 Brian Carrett was taught Brass Band Music by Mr. Dudley Kingston, from Dubbo Salvation Army.

Brian has played in the Dubbo Salvation Army Band from 1949 to 1952. On EEb Bass. Dubbo Citizens & District Band from 1953 to 1963 on BBb Bass, Moree District Band from 1963 to 1975 on BBb Bass, Gunnedah Municipal Band 1975 to 1980, Narrabri District Band 1980 to 1983 on Cornet and is now a Member and Secretary of the Nowra Town Band playing Flugel Horn.

Brian was trained as a Drum Major by the late Jack Hansen, St. Johns Ambulance Brigade Band and was Drum Major of the Dubbo Citizens Band and the Moree District Band.

He was examined and passed by the Drill Advisory Board of the Band Association of N.S.W., in 1965 and has been a Drill Judge for Contests run by the Western District Branch at Parkes, Dubbo, Coonamble, Gilgandra, & Coonabarabran and Contests run by the North & North West Branch at Gunnedah, Coonabarabran. Barraba, Moree, Armidale & Tamworth. He also judged the N.S.W. Junior Championships in Newcastle in 1976-77 and the Queensland State Championships at Toowoomba in 1978.

Brian has won many Championships in N.S.W. Western District Branch Champion 1958-63. Australian National "A" Champion 1961,

North & North West Branch Champion 1964-75 and Queensland State "A" Grade Champion, Bundaberg 1969.

Brian has had many years of community service: 48 years in Brass Bands, 40 years State Emergency Services (Communications Officer), 18 years Honorary Ambulance Officer & 12 years Voluntary Fire Fighter.

Brian is currently Secretary of the Nowra Town Band, Liaison Officer for the South Coast/Southern Highlands Branch of the Band Association of N.S.W. (in the process of formation), and a Member of the Drill Advisory Board of the Band Association of N.S.W.



ohn Callinan

DRILL JUDGE

John Callinan has been involved with Brass & Concert Bands for 42 years.

Commencing his banding with West Wallsend Brass Band at age 9, as a Cornet player. When West Wallsend Band became a Junior Band, John joined the Newcastle Transport Institute Band and for a short while played Flugel Horn prior to being appointed Drum Major, a position he held for 10 years.

During this time he played Percussion with the 2nd Battalion Royal N.S.W. Regiment Brass Band C.M.E. John was appointed Drill Adjudicator in 1972 and in the 25 years has adjudicated at Regional, State & National Contests.

John was a Foundation member of the Mid North Coast Branch, now The Hunter Region Band Association Branch.

Over the years John has had an involvement with most of the Bands in the Newcastle and Lower Hunter area, as Drum Major or Marching Tutor.

THE YEAR OF THE DRAGON - PHILIP SPARKE

1984 was not only the centenary of the Cory Band (The Premier Brass Band of Wales) but it was also the year in which they had the opportunity of completing the hat trick of British National wins.

To celebrate their centenary, the band commissioned Philip Sparke to compose a work to be premiered at a concert in March. Philip Sparke writes of the work;

"At the time I wrote "The Year of the Dragon" Cory had won two successive Nationals and I set out to write a virtuoso piece to display the talent of this remarkable band to the full. The work is in three movements.

1. TOCCATA opens with an arresting side drum figure and snatches of themes from various sections of the band which try to develop until a broad and powerful theme from the middle of the band asserts itself. A central dance - like section soon gives way to the return of this theme which subsides until faint echoes of the opening material fade to a close.

2. INTERLUDE takes the form of a sad and languid solo for trombone. A chorale of the whole band introduces a brief spell of optimism but the trombone solo returns to close the movement quietly.

3. FINALE is a real tour-de-force for the band with a stream of rapid semi quavers running throughout the movement. The main theme is heroic and march like, but this is interspersed with lighter, more playful episodes. A distant fanfare to the sound of bells is introduced and this eventually returns to bring the work to a stirring close.

Cory again won the British National Championship completing the hat trick making 1984 truly "The Year of the Dragon". The Dragon is the National Fauna Emblem of Wales. The National Colour is Red - hence "Red Dragon".

THE BELMONT VARIATIONS - SIR ARTHUR BLISS

Sir Arthur Bliss came to appreciate the great skill of Brass Bands when he first wrote for the Media (Kenilworth - 1936) and later (1959) when he became chief guest conductor at the concerts which follow the National Championships at Royal Albert Hall each year.

The Belmont Variations - This work opens with a short introductory figure on trombone and lower Cornets, followed by the theme introduced by Flugel Horn in the key of 'A Minor' (for Bb instruments). The first variation is a 6/8 played by Flugel, Soprano Cornet, Euphonium and Baritone with a lovely pizzicato like Bass in 2/4. The second variation is a "Chattering" figure played pp ending in a crashing fz. Variation three featured Euphonium in the key of Bb Minor - a wonderful change of key. A chromatic slow moving Bass and a triplet acc. on the other valved instruments plus solemn chords on Trombones give the variation great density and beauty. Variation four is in the nature of a light-hearted waltz in Bb Major played as Cornet Solo broken towards the end by a bravura cadenza for Cornet, Euphonium and Trombone, most unexpected and quite thrilling. Variation five is for full band in D Major - again a great change of key - the 'Tune' is first played on Trombones and 'thickened' by Basses a few bars later. The whole variation is brilliant and rhythmic.

Variation six opens as a Trombone Trio in F Minor followed immediately by a Quartet in F Major played by Flugel, two Horns and euphonium which is then carried on by full band in a quiet reflective mood - a perfect 'sandwich' between the fifth Variation and the Finale which follows. This takes the form of a stately polonaise. The frequent changes of key and of time keeps the interest alive to the very end. A perfect example of a master craftsman.

The piece takes its name "Belmont" after the town in Massachusetts U.S.A. where the composer's wife was born. It was composed for the National Brass Band Championships of England in 1963.
