

SQUADRON LEADER GRAHAM LLOYD. ARCM, LTCL, A Musa. ADJUDICATOR.

Squadron Leader Graham Lloyd enlisted into the Australian Regular Army in 1972 as an Apprentice Musician studying the clarinet. Upon graduation he received the Boosey and Hawkes prize for instrumental proficiency, and was posted to the 4th Military District Band in Adelaide. South Australia.

In 1976 he was detached to the Army School of Music, Balcombe, Victoria, as a clarinet and theory instructor. The same year, he was posted to the Band of the First Recruit Training Battalion at Wagga Wagga, N.S.W. followed in 1977 by a further posting to the Army School of Music where he was promoted to the rank of Sergeant and later Staff Sergeant.

In 1982, Squadron Leader Lloyd began his Student Bandmaster Course at the Royal Military School of Music Kneller Hall, Twickenham, London. Among the prizes he received on completion of the course were: the Besson Cup and Medal for gaining the highest marks in the Ministry of Defence Examinations, the Sommerville Prize for the best concert band arrangement, and the coveted Worshipful Company of Musicians Trophy and Silver Medal for the best overall student of the course.

He returned to Australia late in 1985; was promoted to Lieutenant and appointed as the Second in Command/Deputy Music Director of the Band of the 5th Military District, Perth, Western Australia.


In September 1987, he was posted to the now Defence Force School of Music in Macleod, Victoria, and subsequently promoted to Captain. In this position, he was responsible for the training and musical development of all Army and Navy musician enlistees and advanced promotion courses.

In 1989, he was posted as the second in Command/Deputy Music Director of the 3rd Military District Band in Melbourne, Victoria. later that same year he accepted the position of Director of Music Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) and commanding Officer of the RAAF Central Band.

His main interests are: conducting, composing, and arranging. In his capacity as an arranger, he has had the opportunity to write for local, national and international artists both in Australia and in England.

As a composer, his work "Prelude for a Festival" won the 1988 Yamaha Composer of the Year award at the Australian National Band and Orchestra Clinic, held in Sydney, against opposition from musicians Australia wide.

MAJOR (Rtd) DEREK TAYLOR MBE.



ADJUDICATOR.

Derek Taylor joined the Royal Irish Fusiliers as a Band Boy at the age of fifteen. He became a sergeant and principal cornet at the age of nineteen, entering Kneller Hall as a Student Bandmaster in 1952. One of the Kneller Hall Trumpeters in Westminster Abbey at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth, Derek graduated in 1955 and was appointed Bandmaster of the Queens Royal Lancers at the age of twenty six years, the youngest in the British Army. In 1969 he was appointed the School Bandmaster at Kneller Hall, the senior Bandmaster in the Army, serving with the celebrated Colonel "Jiggs" Jaeger. From Kneller Hall, Derek was commissioned and appointed Director of Music The Royal Military Academy. Sandhurst, a position he held for five and a half years before serving the last twelve years of his military service as Director of Music HM Welsh Guards. Derek was awarded the MBE for services to music and invested by the Queen on the day he left the United Kingdom for Australia.

Director of the Tamworth Regional Conservatorium of Music from 1986 - 1996 and now, consultant to the Governing Board, Derek Taylor is a vastly experienced orchestral, band and choral conductor, administrator, arranger and adjudicator. For eight years before leaving the UK, he was conducting examiner for the Royal Academy of Music and has examined for United Kingdom Ministry of Defence, Royal College of Music and Trinity College. He has adjudicated many contests in NSW including the National Championships for which he has again been engaged for 1996.



MRS. CATHY MORAN. L.T.C.L., A.MusA. B.MusEd.

ADJUDICATOR.

Cathy started her musical career when she was eight with Sutherland Police Citizens Youth Club Band. Her musical qualifications are very extensive and she is a very experienced music teacher having been the Co-ordinator of Music at De La Salle, Kingsgrove conducting and tutoring the Brass Band for 6 years and also teaching music at De La Salle College, Caringbah where she was the Conductor of the College Choir.

Cathy has been the Musical Director and Producer of 5 Major Musical productions including Oliver, Wizard of Oz, Bye Bye Birdie. She was the Co-Ordinator and Director of the inaugural Southern Region Music Festival of 1990 and 1991.

Cathy also plays piano and organ and has accompanied instrumental soloists for examinations. She was the Principal Clarinetist with the Bicentennial Concert Band (including tours of USA, Japan and Canada). Cathy has won many State and National Clarinet Titles and was the 1991 National Champion of Champions. Woodwind Section. She is a N.S.W. conservatorium of Music accredited Private Music Teacher and has her 8 Grade A.M.E.B. in Singing.



MR. REG BISHOP. O.A.M.

ADJUDICATOR.

Mr. Bishop's achievements are outstanding and cannot have justice done to them here but some highlights are as follows:

- * In 1943-44 he played Solo Cornet with the Eastern Command Band. A.I.F.
- * 1946-52 was Co-Principal Trumpet with the Tivoli Circuit.
- * 1953-55 played 3 seasons with the National Opera Company under many famous Conductors.
- * 1955-61 played French Horn with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra under Sir Eugene Goosens and many many other Conductors.
- *1960 approached the supervisor of Music in the Education Dept of N.S.W. for finance to start Brass groups in the schools. This proved successful and resignation from the Sydney Symphony Orchestra followed.
- * 1959-71 formed and Directed Willoughby Municipal Brass Band and Lane Cove Municipal Band.

1961-72 St. Leo's College Wahroonga. Employed as Music Teacher in a class room situation as well as Musical Director of the Brass Band.

*1969-73 took over the position of Teacher of Brass at the Newcastle Conservatorium of Music. The work with St. Leo's continued as well until pressure of work and travel from Sydney to Newcastle made it necessary to resign from St. Leo's. One of the most memorable occasions was an invitation by the Citizen's Committee of Sydney to be in charge and build a group of 200 brass players around St. Leo's Band to play the opening Fanfare for the visit of Pope Paul. This took place at Randwick Race Course before 2500,000 people.

*1974 moved to Victoria. Joined the staff at Aquinas College, Ringwood. Formed Brass groups there and at St. Leo's Box Hill.

*1980 Returned to N.S.W. and took up position at St. Patrick's College Sutherland and reformed the Band where he stayed until 1983 when illness forced him to resign.

*1981-83 Became Conductor of Kogarah Municipal Band and after 3 months won D Grade. The Band was promoted to B Grade.

*1984 moved to Woy Woy on the Central Coast where he taught at the Central Coast Music Centre which is affiliated with the Sydney Conservatorium. Started a Junior Band to assist the Gosford City Band.

*1988 Completed "Syllabus For Brass" a graded development Method of Teaching and Practice that may be used as an examination series.

Reg has adjudicated at many Band and Solo Competitions.



MR. DAVID MEAD.

PERCUSSION ADJUDICATOR.

David began playing percussion at age 9 under the tuition of his father Phil. Continuously, since that time he has remained a member of brass and concert bands under the banner of the Band Association of N.S.W. In his 15 years of playing he has been a very successful soloist winning 26 State solos including 7 times champion Percussionist as well as the national champion percussionist in Melbourne in 1994. Since this time David has concentrated on adjudication being appointed at branch (Hunter and Sydney) and state levels.

David was a member of the state A Grade champion brass band in 1988, 1989 and 1991 and has also been a member of winning concert bands at state level. He was also a member of the 1990 N.S.W. youth band.

In his spare time he has also played with numerous musical societies, light opera companies and orchestras. David also has an interest in composing percussion solos, two of which have been selected as test pieces for this year's national championships. He also enjoys tutoring privately and at workshops developing young players.

David holds a Bachelor of Commerce in Marketing and works as a production Manager for an Agricultural Machinery Company.

David is currently the principal percussionist with the St. Marys Band Club Brass Band.

These dances were composed early in 1957 and are dedicated to the BBC Light Music Festival. They are all based on original melodies but one, the melody of which was composed by Robert Burns.

The first dance is in the style of a slow strathspey - a slow Scottish dance in 4/4 meter - with many dotted notes, frequently in the inverted arrangement of the 'Scotch snap'. The name was derived from the Strath Valley of Spey.

The second, a lively reel, begins in the key of E flat and rises a semi-tone each time it is played until the bassoon plays it at a greatly reduced speed, in the key of G. The final statement of the dance is at the original speed in the home key of E flat.

The third dance is in the style of a Hebridean Song and attempts to give an impression of the sea and mountain scenery on a calm summer's day in the Hebrides.

The last dance is a lively fling which makes a great deal of use of the open-string pitches of the violin (saxophones in the band edition).



Overture for a Celebration begins with a bright, jubilant introduction which should be played dynamically before settling into the following legato style of the main theme. The initial presentation of the melody by the low brass should be balanced with the counter bass line played by the tuba and low woodwinds.

The B section begins with a light, clear presentation of the melody played by the clarinets. Care should be taken to ensure that all three parts are equally expressive in dynamics and phrasing during this section. After the presentation of the second melody in the B section, the piece should build in intensity to the triumphant restatement of the first melody before slowing to the tranquil finish.

The transition to the D.S. should again build in intensity as it leads to an abbreviated restatement of section A. The Coda should provide a bold finish to this exciting overture.
