I congratulate the organisers of the 1999 Australian Band Championships and wish all performers taking part the very best.





ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR GARY E. McPHERSON Adjudicator

Associate Professor Gary McPherson is currently Course Co-ordinator for Music Education at the University of New South Wales in Sydney. He completed his undergraduate training in music education at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music before gaining a Licentiate (L.T.C.L) and Fellowship (F.T.C.L) in trumpet performance from Trinity College, London, a Master of Music Education at Indiana University and a Doctor of Philosophy at the University of Sydney.




In July 1997 Gary retired as National President of the Australian Society for Music Education to become the Treasurer for the International Society for Music Education. Gary has had extensive experience as a professional trumpeter in symphony orchestras and jazz ensembles throughout Australia and has performed with the Australian Opera Orchestra as well as the Western Australian Symphony Orchestra and numerous other symphonic and opera orchestras. He has also performed with professional brass quintets, jazz ensembles and big bands for concerts and public broadcasts. While at Indiana University, Gary studied trumpet with Professor Louis Davidson, former Principal Trumpet with the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra. In addition, Gary has taught brass, concert band, and jazz ensembles as a high school music teacher and is now the Musical Director for the "Pipers" Wind Ensemble at the University of New South Wales. He is a brass examiner for the A.M.E.B and has adjudicated brass and concert bands in five Australian states at the State and National level.

Gary receives numerous invitations to give guest lectures on various aspects of music performance pedagogy throughout the world and over the past five years has taught in Germany, England, Sweden, Korea, Japan, Hong Kong, Italy, the Netherlands and the United States. In 1996 he received the first ever Large Australian Research Council grant for a study in music education to undertake a study with children learning instruments in primary school instrumental programs.

MR. RUSSELL HAMMOND A.Mus.A, ALCM. Adjudicator

Russell Hammond was raised in Tasmania where he received his first musical training as a pianist and a brass player. In 1961 he moved to Melbourne where he continued his involvement in the British Brass Band scene, specialising in brass and percussion playing. It was not until the early seventies that he "discovered" the concert band. His career path took him into the field of aviation where he undertook many innovative projects while continuing to participate in amateur music making. He became a music teacher with the



Victorian Education Department in the early 70's studying at the Melbourne College of Advanced Education at the same time. In the late 70's he moved to Queensland where he established the "flying music program" in the outback as part of the Priority Country Area Program, a Commonwealth initiative to improve education to disadvantaged and remote children.

Russell has been at the forefront of the development of the wind band movement in Australia. He conducted the Melbourne University Wind Symphony for five years and introduced most of the standard band repertoire to Australia.

He is the Founder, President and Musical Director of the Australian Winds, an organisation responsible for the Australian Wind Orchestra, the Australian Youth Wind Orchestra, and the National Children's Wind Orchestra of Australia. These groups have toured extensively throughout the world including Japan, Great Britain, USA, Hong Kong, Europe and Taiwan. Russell is an Honorary Life Member of ABODA of which he was Founding President and National President for six years. He also received many honours over the years for his commitment to music and serves in an honorary capacity on various International Music Boards.

He is a three times recipient of a Citation of Excellence from the National Band Association of America and he has conducted and lectured in many American universities and has conducted many honour bands at national and international music camps.

MRS. CATHY MORAN B.MusEd, LTCL, A.MusA. Adjudicator

Cathy Moran is a very experienced, highly qualified musician and adjudicator.

Cathy started her musical career at Sutherland Police Citizen's Youth Club when she was eight years of age and is still an active playing member of the band as well as President of the Band Committee.



As well as being an excellent clarinet

player which saw her selected at the Principal Clarinetist with the Bicentennial Concert Band (which toured U.S.A, Japan and Canada), she plays piano and organ and has completed 8th Grade AMEB in singing. For many years Cathy has been a high school music teacher and coordinator of music at various schools. She has extensive experience tutoring woodwind and brass as well as many years conducting school bands and choirs. Cathy is also a New South Wales Conservatorium of Music accredited private teacher.

She has been the Musical Director of numerous major musical productions including Oliver, Bye Bye Birdie and the Wizard of Oz as well as being the Co-ordinator and Director of the inaugural Southern Region Music Festival.

As a competitor in earlier years Cathy has won numerous State and National clarinet championship titles including the 1991 national Open Woodwind & Reed Champion of Champions.

Cathy has adjudicated at various band and solo and party championships at Metropolitan, State and National level, and brings a wealth of academic and practical experience to these championships.

MRS. JUDITH HUXTABLE B.A. A.MusA. Adjudicator

Judith Huxtable is a valued member of the music staff at Abbotsleigh Girls' School and Knox Grammar School.

As a flute teacher, she has successfully prepared many students for their AMEB examinations through to AMusA level over many years.

For the past 23 years Judith has been the highly respected and competent Director of the very successful and musically competent Abbotsleigh Flute Choir.

Judith is also past Director of the Sydney Flute Choir and is currently a member of the Willoughby Symphony Choir.

Her comprehensive knowledge of the flute repertoire, and vast experience in developing the skills of flautists during her extensive professional career, makes Judith an excellent choice as one of our adjudicators at the 1999 Australian National Concert Band Championships.

MR. ANTHONY TIMMINS B.A. DipEd.A.MusA Adjudicator.

Anthony Timmins began his musical training with his father who instilled in him a real passion for music. Commencing musical studies on clarinet and saxophone Anthony moved on to lower brass instruments and by the age of 14 he was a member of Willoughby City Band, one of Australia's most successful brass bands.

Anthony enjoys and participates in a wide range of music. In 1994 he performed at the Edinburgh Festival with cabaret performer, Bob Downe and during his time in Scotland Anthony also appeared on national BBC radio and television. He demonstrates his diversity of ability by performing on tuba and euphonium with the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra and holding the position of principal tenor tuba in the 1997 Australian Ballet's production of Janacek's Sinfonietta. Teaching is Anthony's highest priority and he is currently Director of Music at St. Leo's College, Wahroonga, a position which involves him in all aspects of music.

Anthony has conducted very successful bands at a variety of band festivals. He was the very proud conductor of Willoughby City Band when the band won the A Grade shield at the NSW State Championships in 1997.

As an adjudicator Anthony has a great deal of experience at Metropolitan, State and Branch contests and we are pleased to have him share his skills at the National Championships.

LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PHILLIP CHARLES ANDERSON GDipAppMus, FTCL, LTCL, DipMusMgt - Royal Australian Navy Adjudicator

Lieutenant Commander Phillip Anderson entered the Royal Australian Navy (RAN) in 1976. He received basic and advanced music training at the RAN School of Music. This saw his advancement to the rank of Petty Officer Musician. He served in all three bands of the RAN as Principal Clarinet Soloist and in 1986 he was posted to the Defence Force School of Music (DFSM) as a Woodwind Instructor. It was while at DFSM that he completed an Assistant Band Leader Course.



In 1987 he attained a Licentiate of Music Diploma in Clarinet Performance at trinity

College of Music, London. He was selected for commissioned rank in 1988 and commenced Band Officer Training that year at DFSM. During 1988 he was promoted to Chief Petty Officer Musician.

While on course, he undertook extra-curricular studies and was admitted as a Fellow at trinity College, London in Clarinet performance. In 1989 he received an Australian Band Orchestra Director Association award for best concert band arranger. In that year he also received his second Licentiate at Trinity College, this time in Military Band Conducting.

On completion of Band Officer Training in 1989 he was posted as Assistant to the Principal Music Director - Navy, then to HMAS PENGUIN in 1990 where he took up the position of Music Director and Officer in Charge of the RAN Support Command Band. During his time with the band he was responsible for raising the band's profile and developing it into a highly respected and sought after ensemble. During this period he composed many ceremonial works to commemorate the 50th Anniversaries of major naval battles and ship losses. He was awarded a Commendation from the Naval Support Command, Rear Admiral D.G. Holthouse AO RAN, for his leadership and management of the band. In 1993, he assumed the position of Senior Instructor, Advanced Training Wing at DFSM. 1996 saw his posting as the Music Director and Officer in Charge of the RAN Band - Melbourne.

Lieutenant Commander Anderson assumed his current position as the Music Director and Officer in Charge of the RAN Band - Sydney in January 1998.

COMMANDER ASHLEY W. GREEDY AM,LRAM,RAN -DIRECTOR OF MUSIC Adjudicator

Commander Ashley Greedy commenced his musical career studying percussion when very young. Prior to joining the Navy in 1965, he was regularly employed in several dance bands in the Sydney area. After graduating from the Navy's School of Music in 1966, as a French Hornist, he was posted to the Fleet Band of HMAS MELBOURNE for a tour of duty that included Canada, USA, Hong Kong, Singapore, Philippines and Japan. He joined HMAS SYDNEY in 1968 during the Vietnam conflict.



The next 10 years, and further musical

studies saw Ashley promoted to Chief Petty Officer Musician and posted back to HMAS MELBOURNE in 1977 as Assistant Fleet Bandmaster and Principal Drum Major. Her Majesty's Silver Jubilee Celebrations, the Fleet Review at Spithead and many musical performances in such countries as England, Holland, Italy, Sri- Lanka, Gibraltar and the Suez made it a very interesting year.

In 1978, he was selected to undergo a course for promotion to commissioned Bandmaster. He studied at the Royal Marines School of Music in England and he gained a Licentiate Diploma in conducting from the Royal Academy of Music. At the Academy he conducted such famous bands as the Royal Marines Staff Band & Orchestra, the Band of the Royal Military School of Music Knellar Hall, the Band of the Welsh Guards and the Band of the Coldstream Guards.

Commander Greedy has held appointments as Officer in Charge of the Royal Australian Navy's School of Music, responsible for the training of all Navy musicians; as the Music Director of the RAN Fleet Band with notable performances in Indonesia, China, Korea and Japan; and as the Music Director of the Victoria Naval Band appearing at the Royal Tournament at Earls Court London in 1987, and the International Marching Band Pageant Tokyo in 1988. Appointed a Member in the Order of Australia (AM) in the 1993 Australia Day Honours List, Ashley is currently the Director of Music RAN, and the Head of the RAN Musician Branch.

MR. ANTHONY BRAHE Adjudicator

Anthony Brahe, our percussion adjudicator, brings many years of experience and expertise to the solo & party percussion events of our 1999 Concert Band National Championships. Anthony started playing percussion in 1982 and by 1985, at the age of 15, he had commenced his professional career. He was selected to join the NSW Police Concert Band as Principal Percussionist



in 1990 and still enjoys this position where he is often featured as a soloist. Anthony is also called upon to conduct the band on some occasions. The contest scene is very familiar to Anthony. He has participated at metropolitan, state and national levels of competition. He has also been very well received as an adjudicator for the NSW Band Association. Anthony has always been a strong supporter of the Band Association of NSW and its Branches. He has successfully tutored and conducted workshops and been very involved with the Association's youth bands. Anthony in recent years has also become an accomplished reed and brass player and holds the position of Musical Director with the Bankstown District Concert Band where he enjoys conducting, training and encouraging young players.

Anthony enjoys a wide repertoire of music and has performed a range from Gilbert & Sullivan to West Side Story; the Australian Three Tenors to James Morrison.

When time permits Anthony will be found performing as a drummer on the evergrowing Sydney rock scene.



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
