

## THE MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

AY FARR (b.1948) was brought up in a musical family in the small town of Hereford, England. He started playing the cornet at the age of 5, and later joined the Hereford Salvation Army Band where his father was bandmaster. He was educated at the Birmingham School of Music and at the Royal Academy of Music.

After 10 years as a professional musician with the BBC Radio Orchestra he started his career as a conductor. In 1979 he accepted a full time position as Resident Conductor with Grimethorpe Colliery Band, the band featured in the movie "Brassed Off".

Ray has appeared in hundreds of concerts around the world and in some of the finest concert halls including the Royal Albert Hall and the Sydney Opera House and has gained a reputation as a stylish conductor and a planner of interesting concert programmes ranging from light music to "avant-garde". He is equally adept in Classical and modern music and has conducted opera, ballet and oratorio. In 1988 Ray won a special Arts Council Award to study contemporary music with Edward Gregson and Jorma Panula, Professor of Orchestral Conducting at Helsinki's Sibelius Academy.

He has appeared as a guest conductor all over Europe most notably with the National Youth Bands of England and Switzerland and several European Gala concerts. Ray has been much in demand as a band adjudicator appearing in national competitions in England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland, Holland, Belgium, Sweden, Norway, and Australia.

Today, Ray is a busy, freelance conductor, based in Bergen, working with amateur and professional bands and orchestras around the world.

had won several major junior solo competitions. At the age of 12, he was appointed Principal Cornet of the Clydebank Burgh Band. In 1985 he moved to England to further his studies at the Huddersfield University, during which time he joined the ranks of the famous Black Dyke Mills Band, touring Australia in 1988. Russell left university with a Diploma in Music with a Distinction in performance and has become a highly sought after musician, both domestically and


internationally. He is well recognised for his soloist abilities, as well as his devotion to the brass band movement.

In 1993 Russell established a relationship with Yamaha as an endorsee and recognised soloist. This relationship continues today and enables him to share his performance skills and the benefit of his experience with many bands and their members. Until recently, Russell was living and working in Norway, where he conducted a number of bands in the Rogaland District. During this time he also travelled to England, participating in the British National Championships and the famous Spennymoor UK Entertainment competition as the conductor of NSK-RHP Ransoms Band.

Russell has adjudicated the Switzerland Solo and Quartet Championships in 1995, the NSW Brass Band Championships and the National Youth Brass Band Championships in 1999, and this year, the North American Brass Band Championships in Washington.







# THE MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

Barrie GOTT began his professional career as a trumpet player with the National Training Orchestra and was a regular casual with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. Over the past thirty years his work in education has seen him teaching at primary, secondary and tertiary levels as well as music director for bands in USA and Australia. He has worked in California as Director of Instrumental Music at Azusa Pacific University where he conducted the concert band, jazz ensemble, the orchestra and oratorio choir as well as lecturing in arranging, conducting, orchestration and music theory.

Barrie has also served as music director for the Salvation Army in Southern California and Eastern Australia. He is a published composer in the United Kingdom, USA and Australia as well as being a commercial arranger with many credits internationally. As an Adjudicator he has officiated at National, State and Regional band contests as well as in Norway. Barrie is currently employed by Education Queensland as an instrumental instructor and is a state examiner for the Australian Music Examinations Board. He is also the secretary of the Australian Trumpet Guild. He has recently been appointed to the National Band Council Music Advisory Board.



VAN COCKING has had a very distinguished career in the Australian Army both as a trombonist and musical director. He was principal trombone with the Australian Army Bands in Melbourne, Sydney and Townsville and the Australian Army Band on its tour to the United Kingdom for Queen Elizabeth II's Silver Jubilee. Following his commission to captain he became second in charge and deputy musical director of the Royal Military College Band, Duntroon. In 1995 after resigning from the Army, he became Director of Music at John Paul College, a position he still holds. In 1996 he adjudicated at the World Championships for Marching Show Bands in Calgary, Canada and has also adjudicated at many Brass Band Championships throughout Australia. He has successfully taken both the John Paul College and South Bank Marching Bands to World Championships and recently was involved in training the Olympic Marching Band. Ivan is now an examiner for the AMEB.



Stell FAVELL began his musical life in Cairns under the main influence of his father Bob Favell. Neil moved from Cairns to commence studies at the Qld Conservatorium of Music in 1986. During his four years of study Neil was also a member of the QYO in which he performed as Principal Horn in his final year. He was also awarded the Conservatorium Brass Prize in his post graduate year.

Since then Neil regularly freelances with the Qld Philharmonic, Qld Symphony and Qld Pops Orchestras and is currently Tutor of French Horn and Brass at Anglican Church Grammar, Hillbrook Anglican School and Saint Paul's School at Bald Hills. Neil is also the Horn and Ensemble Tutor at the QBA Youth Band Camps.



Over the past 18 months Neil has adjudicated at several regional contests in Queensland and has taken on a brass ensemble called Pinnacle Brass.

ORALCOLM BELL began his music career as a drummer and bassist in rock and jazz bands. He Served in the Australian Army Band Corps performing on Tuba, Bass Guitar and Percussion. A highlight of his performing career was a solo performance on the stage of the Sydney Opera House. During his 23 years with the Army, he studied and later taught arranging and conducting. In 1985 he was posted to the Defence Force School of Music where he became the Senior Instructor (Advanced Training) and was responsible for the design and implementation of all promotion courses. He was presented with a formal commendation from his Commanding General for this work. By 1993 he was the Officer Commanding and Conductor of the Australian Army Band (Melbourne). After his retirement, Major Malcolm Bell joined Education Queensland as a multi-instrumental instructor and conductor. He continues to be in high demand as an adjudicator, guest conductor of the Queensland Wind and Brass.

#### SYNOPSIS:

TALLIS VARIATIONS

by Philip Sparke

The hymn tune on which these variations are based is the third of nine that Thomas Tallis wrote in 1567 as part of a psalter for the first Anglican Archbishop of Canterbury, Matthew Parker. It was later used by Vaughan Williams in the English Hymnal and as the basis for his *Fantasia*.

After a turbulent introduction, the first half of the theme is stated by the middle of the band. Variation 1 (bar 31) is based on the first two notes of the theme, exploring the E minor tonality with repeated semiquaver activity. Variation 2 (bar 134) contains a gentle solo for flugel horn and a varied statement of the theme in chorale form. variation 3 (bar 211) starts with a series of short solos before a serene melody appears on cornet. The theme then appears, reharmonised, before the variation closes peacefully. The final variation (bar 262) is ebullient in character, starting with cornet fanfares, and evolves around a fugue-like theme first presented by the euphoniums. Eventually music from Variation 1 returns to herald the final, fiery statement of the theme, accompanied by figures from the fugue. The piece ends quietly, the serene beauty of the tallis chorale unshakeable.

#### **Philip Sparke:**

Philip Sparke was born in London and studied composition, trumpet and piano at the Royal college of Music. It was at the College that his interest in bands arose, he played in the College wind band and also formed a brass band among the students, writing several works for both ensembles.

At this time his first published works appeared – *Concert Prelude* and *Gaudium*. a growing interest in his music led to several commissions, his first major one being for the Centennial Brass Band Championships in New Zealand – *The Land Of The Long White Cloud*.

Further commissions followed from individual bands, various associations and the BBC, for whom he three times won the EBU New Music for Band Competition (*Slipstream, Skyrider and Orient Express*). He has written test pieces for brass band championships in New Zealand, Switzerland, Holland, Australia and the UK, twice for the National Finals at the Royal Albert Hall.

# SYNOPSIS:FIRESTORMby Stephen BullaFirestorm was composed by Stephen Bulla on the occasion of the tenth anniversary of the "United States Army<br/>Brass Band" and had its first performance at the Gala Concert of the North American Band Championships in<br/>1991.

The inspiration for this composition was the war in the Persian Gulf and its continuous presentation to the world through the medium of television. Bulla wanted to capture the emotion and colour of the events of war as they were played out on the television screen.

Composed as a single movement rhapsody, the work is framed by the riveting sounds of airborne bombing raids; brass and percussion combining to create a gripping sense of tension. The interior of the work is cast in flashback sequences. The first features the cornet section in a frenetic melody that captures the free spirited antics of a Baghdad market scene. following is a poignant soliloquy depicting the calm, unspoiled beauty of the Iraqi countryside before its siege. These beautiful melodies are presented by the four "cornerstones" of the band: Solo Bb Cornet, Eb Cornet, Eb Alto Horn and Euphonium.

Stephen Bulla noted that his sense of inner creativity surrounding this project was directly related to the emotional impact of the war upon him. The final page of his score bears the following poignant inscription: "Completed February 26 1991, Kuwait liberated today".

### THE DRILL ADJUDICATORS

EVILLE DUNIAM commenced his band career in 1937, playing trombone with the Hobart RSL Junior Band. In 1942, he enlisted (underage) in the 2<sup>nd</sup> AIF and played different Brass instruments in two Army bands. After the war, he joined the band of the Royal Australian Navy and learned the French Horn at their first School of Music. On leaving the Navy in 1949, he went back on the trombone and in 1950 took part in his first band contest, got the "bug" and for the next 26 years competed regularly at contests in several states. Neville won two Champion of Champions titles, two National



titles and several States. Neville won two Champion of Champions titles, two National titles and several State titles and took part in many successful ensembles. Always interested in drill, he has won many Drum Major trophies and in 1976 he passed the drill judges exam and since then has adjudicated at 17 National and State contests. Neville is a past President of the QBA and has been a delegate for 22 years. He is currently the Vice President and is a Life Member of the QBA.

REVOR FITZGERALD has been involved in banding since 1949, but from 1980 onwards became involved as a Drum Major, winning many trophies at Regional, State and National levels, in addition to playing with his band. He has been active in training two bands as well as coaching others in marching and drill, and has also served as minute secretary and Vice President of the QBA.

Trevor has adjudicated at numerous contests since 1990. This will be his second Australian Championships appointment. His great love – Diagram and Display marching.

P HIL MEAD commenced his band involvement in 1959 when he joined the St George Sutherland Brass Band as a percussionist. He has been a Drum Major for the past 38 years and has achieved much success at local, State and National level, including Best Drum Major at the Australian National Championships on a number of occasions. Currently he is a member of the Yagoona District Brass Band in the south west of Sydney where he is principal percussionist as well as Drum Major. He has

been a member of the Drill Advisory Board in NSW for many years and has regularly assisted with the training and coaching of bands. Phil has judged at a variety of marching events and parades including previous National Championships in Sydney and Newcastle. In 1999 he was awarded Life Membership of the Band Association of NSW in recognition of his extensive service to the banding movement over a continuous period exceeding 42 years.



She EVIN WENDT is a retired RAAF Warrant Officer but it was during a stint in the Army that he made Shis mark as a successful drill instructor. He started his banding career as the Drum Major of the Bundaberg Municipal Band at age 18, after being taught by his father. As Drum Major of Bundaberg Municipal, he was always placed in diagram marching and won many trophies as Champion Drum Major at State and National levels. While in the Air force he was Drum Major of RAAF Amberley and Richmond Bands and Band Master of the Wagga and Williamtown Drum Bands. Kevin has been a drill adjudicator for 39 years and has judged at District, State and National levels. His QBA awards are Long Service, Badge of Merit, Distinguished Service Medallion and Life Membership. For meritorious services to RAAF bands, Kevin was awarded the British Empire Medal in the Military Division in 1979.

CEOFF FRY started his band career with the Cairns Combined Schools Band in 1960 and is now a life member of that organization. As a player, he started on Tuba and moved to Baritone. He was still a teenager when he became the Cairns' Drum Major in 1963. His band was considered one of the State's most proficient marching bands. He was appointed a Queensland Drill Adjudicator in 1973 and has helped many bands with their drill and ran seminars for drum majors. Geoff is the current President of the QBA and has been awarded their Long-Service Medal, Badge of Merit and Distinguished Service Medallion. He is also Vice President of the National Band Council.



#### SYNOPSIS:

SYMPHONIC VARIATIONS

by Jacob De Haan

This composition is based on a passacaglia theme, in which artistic perfection, symphonic drama and oriental melody lines play a role. The passacaglia is originally a dance made up of a series of variations above a bass line constantly present as an ostinato. It is not in this sense that 'Symphonic Variations' are in the passacaglia form but in the sense of the open form of the variations.

Jacob De Haan, himself originally an organist, took his inspiration for this piece from the famous passacaglia for organ in C-minor by J S Bach.

Following the introduction of the passacaglia theme (in the bass) the entry by the trumpets and trombones forms the majestic start to a musical adventure, in which this theme (often fragmentary) returns in variations. Then there follow two faster movements with dramatic contrasts and vituose passages. Particularly striking here is the use of two characteristic intervals from the beginning of the theme namely the minor second and the augmented fourth. An apause in the composition comes in the slow bridge where a syncopated bourdon (perfect fifth) is constantly repeated. The tension grows in dynamics and harmony, and the oriental-flavour becomes obvious in the melody. We arrive at a faster movement via an accelerando, in which a perpetuum mobile based on the passacaglia theme is central. Finally the whole flows into a martial theme, in which the ostinato accompaniment in the descant derives from the passacaglia theme.

#### Jacob De Haan:

Jacob De Haan was born in Heerenveen, the Netherlands in 1959. He grew up in a musically orientated environment. Via his piano/organ lessons he was, at an early age, able to develop his creativity as a future composer. Following his senior education, Jacob De Haan completed his studies at the State Conservatoire in Leewarden, majoring in school music and organ and minoring in trumpet, fanfare and wind band direction. Subsequently he lectured in arranging at the same conservatoire. Currently Jacob De Haan works as a composer and arranger.

#### THE EXPERIENCE OF A LIFETIME!

In 1999, one of New Zealand's finest 'A' Grade bands, Woolston Brass from Christchurch received an invitation to compete in the 148<sup>th</sup> British Open Brass Band Championships. The year 2000 event was to be held in Birmingham, England and the set music was 'Ceremony' by Michael Ball. The Band's last appearance at the Championships was some twenty-five years ago in 1975 where they obtained 5<sup>th</sup> place. The invitation to return to compete from Mrs. Mortimer (the owner and convenor of the British Open Band Championships) was eagerly accepted, and the detailed planning commenced. Woolston Brass' conductor, David Gallaher, writes here about the banding experience of a lifetime!

Before undertaking the tour, the band was well aware that the top British bands have been performing at the highest of professional standards for a number of years. We were very realistic about our chances. A number of the players could not make the trip for a variety of reasons. We were fortunate in being able to call upon very able replacements: Kevin Joughin from South Australia (cornet), Mike Ford (tenor horn) and Riki MacDonnell (euphonium). Before moving to Australia, Kevin Joughin had a long association with Woolston Brass and was a former Principal of the Band.

On 1<sup>st</sup> September 2000, a tour party of close to eighty players and supporters embarked on our adventure, stopping in Melbourne, before flying to a brief stop-over in Singapore. The Band performed at Senotosa Island before departing for the UK late that evening.

From arrival at Heathrow, we made a brief visit to Windsor, then travelled north to be the guests of the Woodfalls Band, situated about nine kilometers out of Salisbury. This was to be our base prior to moving up to Birmingham. After a regular morning rehearsal at their bandroom, tours were on offer in the afternoon to Bath, Stonehenge, Lord Montague's famed car collection and the naval base of Portsmouth.

Our ever-resourceful manager, meanwhile, had negotiated for the Band to do a short lunchtime concert in Salisbury Cathedral. This proved to be an inspired setting, as the band sounded magnificent in this 800-year-old wondrous edifice. To have had the opportunity to unexpectedly perform in one of Europe's finest Cathedrals was indeed a highlight among many on this tour.

The journey to Birmingham took in a short stop in culture-ladened Stratford-upon-Avon. Our accommodation in Birmingham was at the very well appointed Burlington Hotel. The Band arranged to rehearse at the Langley bandroom and began to come to its peak nicely.

The Championships were held at Birmingham's magnificent Symphony Hall on Saturday <sup>(h)</sup> September. We drew eleventh. One or two initial insecurities and twenty seconds to get used to the hall cost us dearly in a very high calibre competition. We were one of only three bands not to have played on that stage before. However once we settled down, the playing was first rate. The Band received a very warm reception from this most critical of audiences.

Buy as you View Cory Band under Robert Childs were announced as winners of the 148<sup>th</sup> British Open, with his brother Nick taking second place with Black Dyke Mills Band. Being placed thirteenth out of the twenty-three bands was not what we hoped for, but it wasn't a result that had us hanging our heads for too long. There was much to commend in our performance and some very positive comments were delivered on the Band's performance by brass band 'afficionados' who attended.

A feeling of not having fully shown our best form was resolved the next day when the Band performed in 'The World of Brass Concert' in the Symphony Hall. Our contribution including 'Knight of the Road' and Sir Dean Goffin's 'Rhapsody In Brass', was part of a seven-hour marathon concert. Other bands featured included Black Dyke, Fodens, Faireys, Willebroek from Belgium, the All Star Girls of Brass, and the Columbus Band from Ohio USA. A feast of brass, but at seven hours long, perhaps it was asking a bit much of the audience. As if that wasn't long enough, the combined bands of Dyke, Ohio and Woolston performed the 1812 Overture under the direction of Nicholas Childs, as a finale! Whilst not the best performance musically, it certainly did not lack atmosphere. The cannons appearing from the back of the Hall looked most impressive, but couldn't be heard over the volume level of the massed bands.

A tired yet happy entourage of Woolstonians headed for three days in London. Apart from one light rehearsal, it was 'beat the feet' time to squeeze as much in as possible. A visit to the forty-year-old Boosey and Hawkes factory in Edgeware proved most interesting. The Bass players were able to try the new models of basses out. So much of the work is still done by hand. It was fascinating to see the dints being so easily taken out of the bass. The factory is shifting to new premises in the near future.

We were based for all our excursions in the North in the delightful spa town of Buxton in the High Peaks District of Derbyshire. It was here that we met up with Bob Mulholland. Bob is the editor of the 'Brass Band World' magazine and he was responsible for much of the advice we received in the planning stages of our tour. Bob also organized our concert in Buxton with the Williams Fairey Band and guest conductor, Geoffrey Brand.

The next day, the band headed back across the Pennines to the Dales of West Yorkshire. (Saddleworth). This is the home of the Dobcross Band Club where we were to perform a joint concert. The hospitality extended to us at Dobcross was humbling. Some of our party had caught some of the Dobcross Youth Band in rehearsal the previous evening. Most of their promising players don't make it as far as the Dobcross Band. They are usually snapped up by one of the many top grade bands within a few kilometers of their village. The Dobcross Band opened the concert at the Uppermill Town Hall in impressive style. All of the major British and European Bands have performed here and it was pleasing for us to give perhaps best performance of the tour at this venue in front of such a knowledgeable audience. We included a couple of New Zealand works, which were well received.

Our final tour day was taken up with last minute shopping in Buxton, packing the bags for an early start the next day and a quick rehearsal with Geoffrey Brand before the Williams Fairey Band concert. Geoffrey was in fine form and was still full of that vigor and musicianship that has helped to forge his outstanding conducting career. A fitting concert ended a great tour, with many celebrities of the banding world present including Goff Richards, who met the Woolston Band after the concert.

As we reflect on our recent experiences in the UK, all seems to have happened so quickly. We had a banding experience of a lifetime! Woolston Brass is grateful for the assistance received from the NZ Bands' Association and the good wishes that accompanied us from many other fellow New Zealand bands for our participation in the 148<sup>th</sup> British Open Championships.

### THE EARS HAVE IT

Have you ever listened to a band and wondered why they sound harsh or muddy or simply out of tune? How many times have you seen a conductor stand in front of a band and say, "Let's tune up," ...... get everyone to play a Bb at the same time, but then do nothing more to correct the tuning? In professional groups, tuning becomes automatic. A note is sounded and everyone tunes to it. In amateur bands and in particular school bands, players need to be taught how to listen to the pitch in order to tune themselves - but first it must be done by the conductor. To some conductors, 'TUNING' is a word they don't wish to know about, but with a little bit of study their bands would improve 100%.

In my many years of conducting school bands, some of the problems that I have encountered include reed strength, posture, breathing, fingerings in both brass and woodwind, harmonics and slide positions. All the aforementioned are an individual study in themselves and are some of the main causes of untunefulness. Unless conductors are aware of these things, their bands will always sound out of tune.

Some simple solutions to start the ball rolling would be:-

- Make sure woodwind players don't stick around on 1 1½ reeds for too long. Move them on to 2 2½ as soon as they can handle them. This will raise the pitch by having to use more air to make them sound.
- Make sure they sit correctly. I always tell the clarinet players to imagine there is a brick wall behind them and to sit back and put their head on it. Their heads will automatically be up straight and create a good embouchure. Make sure trumpet players don't play with their elbows on their knees. Young flute players often hook their right elbow over the back of the chair. Sitting up straight also improves breathing and therefore will improve tuning.
- Know all the fingerings and slide positions on all instruments. This is a very interesting study in itself, but it is imperative that conductors avail themselves of this information in order to train their bands correctly.
- Study harmonics. This is a sure way to learn all of the enharmonic fingerings and slide positions in order to be able to guide players to the most appropriate fingering or slide position for a particular passage. If this is not taught in the early stages, many bad habits are formed which are hard to break later on.
- Help train young ears. While tuning up, have them decide whether a note is sharp or flat by letting each player tune to the first clarinet or trumpet. They will soon catch on and in no time the band will be tuning itself.


