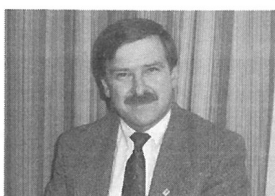
NATIONAL BAND COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA

ADJUDICATION PANEL

Dr. Brenton Broadstock

Open A Grade Brass

Born in Melbourne, he studied history, politics and music at Monash University, and later composition and theory with Donald Freund at Memphis State University in the USA and with Peter Sculthorpe at the University of Sydney. He received the degree of Doctor of Music from the University of Melbourne where he is currently an Associate Professor and Coordinator of Composition

Brenton has 36 compositions on 23 commercial CDs and has received some 25 prizes and awards for composition, including the 1999 Don Banks Award from the Australia Council which enabled him to compose for the year, including visits to the USA, Italy, England and Russia.

His music has been performed at many international festivals and he has had performances by all of the major orchestras in Australia and by many ensembles and bands overseas. In 2001 his work *Gates of Day* for 4 brass bands, military band and 2001 bells was premiered at the Melbourne International Festival.

In 1988-89 he was the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra's Inaugural Composer In Residence and in 1991 he signed a publishing contract with G. Schirmer (Australia), the first Australian composer to do so. His five symphonies were released on the Dutch Etcetera label in 2001 performed by the Krasnoyarsk Symphony Orchestra.

Dr. Barry Bignell

Open A & B Grade Concert

Dr Barry Bignell commenced his career as a musician in the Australian Army. He simultaneously studied under a scholarship at the Canberra School of Music, and subsequently attended the Royal Military School of Music, London, whilst studying conducting at summer schools in Europe.

As Director of the Australian Army Band, Melbourne, from 1979 to 1984, his performances of Percy Grainger's complete music for windband received critical acclaim.

Barry left the Army in 1985 to pursue a career as an orchestral conductor. At this time he received a Goethe Institute scholarship and spent the year studying repertoire with the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra and the Berlin State Opera.

Barry maintains a career as conductor and clinician in both professional and amateur spheres, and has been guest conductor for many ensembles including the West Australian and Adelaide Symphony Orchestras, the State Orchestra of Victoria, The Australian Pops Orchestra, Rantos Collegium, Geminiani Chamber Orchestra and the Melbourne Youth Orchestra.

Since 1990, whilst maintaining a conducting career, Barry has been lecturing at both graduate and undergraduate level at the University of Melbourne Institute of Education and at the Victorian College of the Arts school of Music, where he is currently head of postgraduate studies. In addition, he is patron, chair, or member of a number of organisations committed to music education and the arts.

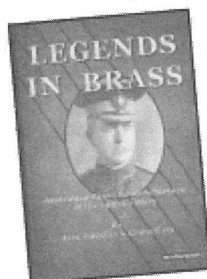

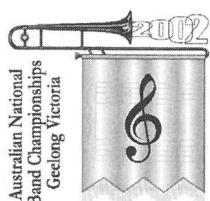

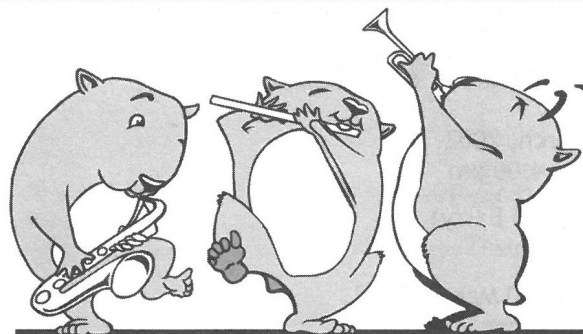

HAROLD R. SHUGG

by Ian S. Douglas - Vice-President VBL

In 1998, when the National Championships were last held in Victoria, the program included an article about Melbourne bandmaster Mervyn Simpson. Merv was at one time a player and deputy Bandmaster at Malvern Tramways Band under Harry Shugg, one of Victoria's highly respected bandmen. Harry was born in 1891 in Geelong, and lived in Noble Street, less than 2 km from where these 2002 Championships are being held. With such connections it seemed fitting that we should continue the idea of recalling our great bandmen, and that he should be given recognition in this program.

Harry was the eldest of seven children, most of whom were musical. His father, a local plumber, was also named Harry, and was a bass player with the Geelong Town Band. Being friendly with the manager of the local Allans Music store, Harry senior often brought instruments into the home. When little Harry was six years old his father brought home a cornet, and proceeded to give him lessons. It seems he wanted higher notes than little Harry could play at the time, and one of his sisters told her mother "Daddy is making little Harry sick!". Nevertheless the lad went on to the Geelong IOR Band (the Independent Order of Rechabites), where he played solo cornet at the age of nine, and at age twelve went to a South Street Ballarat contest with the Geelong Town band.

He then played with the Geelong Artillery band, but in 1906/7/8 he played soprano cornet with Ballarat City Band at South Street contests. Also in 1906, at age 15, he toured through Victoria to New South Wales and Queensland as a guest with St Augustine's Orphanage Band. In 1910 at the age of 19 he became the Bandmaster of the Geelong Harbor Trust Band. In the early days of Geelong there was no harbour, and early settlers arriving there by boat had to wade, or in the case of the ladies in their long dresses be carried, to the shore. The Geelong Harbor Trust was set up to remedy the situation. Its Chief Commissioner Mr G.F. Holden decided that he wanted a band, and chose Harry to set it up. Holden gave him carte blanche to travel by train around Victoria to listen to bands, and invite the best players to come to Geelong. They were accommodated at the Shugg family home until they found permanent lodgings.

That year he took the Geelong Harbor Trust Band to South Street, where it achieved a double victory by winning C grade by 19 points from 10 other bands, as well as B grade by 11 points from 13 other bands. In 1911 they won B grade by 40 points from 10 other bands, and in 1912 won B grade at Maryborough. The Victorian Band Association then not surprisingly



regraded the Band to A grade. Harry then took the band to the ANA contest in 1913, winning test, own choice, quickstep and aggregate, with prize money of £230 and the O'Brien and Down Cup valued at 100 guineas. The same year they won the Australasian Championship with "Valkyries". Due to the inroads caused by World War I the band closed in 1915.

Harry took up the post of bandmaster at Malvern Tramways Band on 22nd December 1914 when the band was just 3 years old. He took over from Robert McAnally, well known for his arrangements of hymns and "Waltzing Matilda". Within one year Malvern had been regraded to A grade

from C grade. That year they tied with Collingwood at South Street as winners of A grade with the highest aggregate and won the Boosey Shield.

In 1917 and 1918 they won A grade in the ANA Championship, with prize money of £230 and the O'Brien and Down Cup valued at 100 guineas. At the same time Harry was competing as a soloist, and became a member of the VBA Music Advisory Board. Malvern won at South Street in 1920, 1921 and 1922. They had planned to go to England to compete, as various visiting British adjudicators had waxed enthusiastic over the standard of performance here, and had said that our best bands would give the British bands a "run for their money". Money was in fact the stumbling block, as it was too hard to raise the amount required for the fares, and the best Malvern could achieve was to go to Auckland in New Zealand for the NZ Exhibition Contest in February 1925, where they won all but the quickstep (which was won by an army band) and came home with 6 shields/cups and prize money of £400.

In 1926 Harry took them to the Queensland State Championships which they won, including the oval and diagram march and the sight reading competition! He was appointed an honorary Captain in the Australian Army in June 1935 and thereby became the District Bandmaster of 20 Australian Army bands in metropolitan and country Victoria - ie Southern Command. His sister, Mrs Dorrie Anderson, recalls his surprise and amusement at being granted the rank and a uniform. His duties were to "instruct Bandmasters, buglers and trumpeters, and to compose and arrange music". In this period he was able to widen his experience by visiting with the 14 Battalion Band of Prahran, the ABC Wireless Military Band, and in the UK with Manners Main Colliery Band.

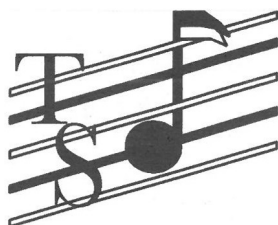
It is noteworthy that during World War 2 Harry would have been responsible for Salvation Army Bandmaster and composer Sergeant Arthur Gullidge, who became Bandmaster of the 2/22 Battalion Band and which was

made up entirely of Salvation Army players from in and around Brunswick, of whom all but one perished early in WW2 in the sinking of the Japanese prisoner of war ship the "Montevideo Maru".

As to Harry's methods of instruction, Merv Simpson is quoted as stating that he followed them. This involved paying attention to the minute details often neglected by others. Gordon Feore, who has been a player at Malvern (now Stonnington City Brass) for at least 70 years, recalls that Harry gave him many nights of free private lessons pre WW2 to aid the band in winning contests. He was a stern task master, and seemed to be like a mechanical metronome to the young player. He made sure that all were playing their parts correctly, and would swap difficult passages to other players if it was necessary to get them correct. The great rival was Frank "Massa" Johnston and the Melbourne Fire Brigade Band, who were to be beaten before all others.

In all Harry Shugg remained at Malvern for some 33 years, retiring prematurely in mid 1947 aged 56 due to the onset of Parkinson's disease. He is remembered as one of Victoria's and Australia's great men of banding.

I am indebted for much of the above information to Harry's sister Mrs Dorrie Anderson, who at 105 years young was interviewed last year for Eastern Community Broadcasters Inc by Peter Beck and myself, and to Wes Brown the Secretary of Stonnington City Brass.
