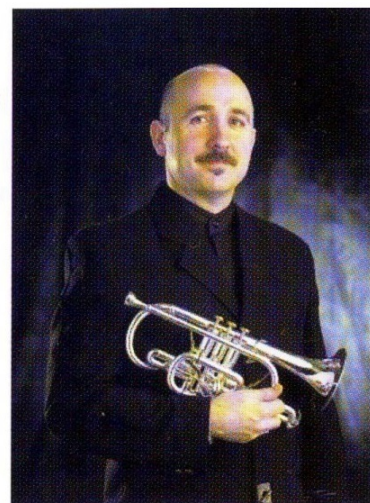

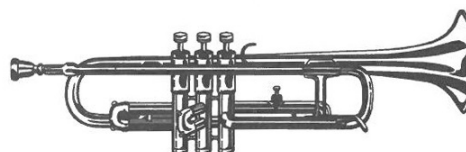

Profile of Adjudicators

Major Ian McElligott

ARCM LRAM

Chief Music Adjudicator



Our Chief Music Adjudicator, Major Ian McElligott, was born in Yorkshire, into a musical family, and commenced studying the trumpet at the age of seven.

In 1974, Ian joined the Army as a professional trumpet player. Later, he successfully completed a three-year course in advanced music studies at the Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall. Upon graduation, he won awards for arranging and compositional skills, choral works, conducting, and academic achievement. Additionally, he became an Associate of the Royal College of Music, London and Licentiate of the Royal Academy of Music, London.

By 2000, Ian had risen to the rank of Major, and upon completion of a particularly successful career as a Service musician, he relinquished his final appointment as the Director of Music to the Band of Her Majesty's Coldstream Guards.

As a professional musician, Ian continues to receive commissions for compositions and arrangements, which include writing for the BBC. He conducts the Staines Band following its recent promotion to the championship section of the brass band movement, and in July 2002, was appointed Professional Conductor to the Brighouse & Rastrick Band.



Major Graham Lloyd

M Mus (Melb), ARCM, LTCL, A Mus A

Senior Music Adjudicator

Major Graham Lloyd enlisted into the Australian Regular Army in 1972 as an Apprentice Musician. In 1982, he began his Student Bandmaster Course at the Royal Military School of Music Kneller Hall, Twickenham, London. Among the prizes he received on completion of the course were the coveted Worshipful Company of Musicians Trophy and Silver Medal for the best overall student of the course.

In September 1987, Graham was posted to the now Defence Force School of Music in Macleod, Victoria, and in 1989, accepted the position of Director of Music Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) and Commanding Officer of the then RAAF Central Band. Soon after he was promoted to Squadron Leader.

In February 2004, Graham accepted the position of Officer Commanding/Chief Instructor at the Defence Force School of Music and subsequently transferred back to the Army.

Graham's main interests are conducting, composing, arranging and teaching. He has arranged and composed over 300 works for Concert Bands, Brass Bands and Orchestras – a number of which are published in Australia (including his Brass Band test pieces: *The Loaded Dog*; and *Through a Soldier's Eyes*). He completed his Masters in Music composition at Melbourne University in 1999 studying with Professor Brenton Broadstock.

Graham is regularly called upon to adjudicate State and National community band festivals and contests; and to lecture on various music subjects including arranging, composition and conducting.

Monte Mumford

BA (Performance), BA (MusEd),
MMus, ACC

Senior Music Adjudicator

Monte Mumford is Chief Musical Director of the University of Tasmania Community Music Programme. He earned his BA degrees in Performance, and Music Education from Seattle Pacific University, USA and his M.Mus in Performance from the University of Tasmania, Australia. His present duties include the oversight of the Community Music Programme, conducting the University Wind Orchestra, providing professional development for the conducting staff and serving in an advisory role for the Junior Instrumental Programme.

In 1989, he founded the University of Tasmania Summer Music School. The Summer School holds a national reputation as one of the most innovative, intergenerational programmes in Australia. The School's team of administrators, conductors and tutors are of the highest international calibre.

Mr Mumford has performing credits as a conductor and trombonist in a variety of roles and with many popular, international artists. His conducting and trombone performance activities include regular solo recitals, radio and television performances, national conferences, Broadway musicals, and recording sessions.

Mr. Mumford enjoys an international reputation as a conductor, clinician, lecturer educator and adjudicator. He is highly regarded for the experience, expertise and passion he contributes to music education.

Peter Quigley

B.A.Mus Educ. M.Ed.Studies. T.T.C.

Senior Music Adjudicator



Peter has had a long association with the Tasmanian Bands League and music education in Tasmania. His earliest days of banding started in Launceston with the then Launceston Boys and Citizens Brass Band, under the direction of Neil Graham. In 1969, Peter won the Australian Junior Champion of Champions on cornet and later went on to further his studies at the Tasmanian Conservatorium of Music, graduating in 1977 with a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education and later a Master of Education. Since then, Peter has taught in several schools and colleges in Tasmania and has played an influential role in the development of secondary and senior secondary music education in the State as curriculum writer for secondary and senior secondary TCE Music syllabuses, Northern Moderator of year 11/12 Music and State Examiner and Critic for Senior Secondary Music. Peter is currently State Music Advisor for years 10 - 12 Music.

He has been the Musical Director of the Latrobe Federal Band and City of Devonport Brass. Under Peter's direction, the Latrobe Federal Band won a Tasmanian B Grade Championship and two Victorian B Grade Championships. He is also the conductor for the Esk District combined Colleges Stage and Concert Bands and under his guidance the bands have been awarded several gold shield awards at the Melbourne Schools Bands Festival. Last year Peter was selected to undertake a Conductor Development Program with Symphony Australia under the guidance of Graham Abbott.

Peter's interests in music extend to choral work, musicals and adjudication. He is currently Program Manager for the Esk District Instrumental and Band Program, which includes more than 13 schools and colleges. He is currently working on 42nd Street with the Launceston Musical Society.

Associate Music Adjudicators

Bruce Lamont

B.A.(Mus), Grad. Dip (perf), Dip School Music,
LMusA (AMEB)

Bruce began playing cornet at an early age at Hyde Street, Footscray. He became Victorian and South Australian Junior Brass Champion at the age of 12 and shortly after, Australian Junior Champion. Bruce studied trumpet in Adelaide, and later in Hobart, Switzerland and Sweden. He entered the Tasmanian Conservatorium of Music as the first recipient of the Thomas Matthews Memorial scholarship.

In 1974 Bruce became Principal Trumpet with the Australian Youth Orchestra, touring Japan and S.E. Asia. Later that year he graduated and took up his current position as Principal Trumpet with the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra. He has been soloist on numerous occasions and has toured extensively nationally and internationally with various orchestras.

Bruce has been tutor in trumpet at the Tasmanian Conservatorium of Music for the past 30 years, is a frequent eisteddfod adjudicator, and examiner and advisor in brass for the AMEB.

Edward (Ted) Hicks

Ted Hicks began playing with Latrobe Federal Band in 1951 on tenor horn, successfully taking part in competitions as a soloist over many years. He won Junior Championships on horn, soprano cornet and cornet, and the prestigious Alf Buck Memorial Trophy on two occasions.

The feature of Ted's playing career at Latrobe was a trip to England in 1979, taking part in the Edinburgh Festival and doing a concert tour. Whilst undertaking tertiary study in music and teaching at Devonport High School, he continued to play in dance bands and choral society orchestras.

Ted served a period with the Preston Municipal Band under Charles Smith during which time they won the 1968 Victorian A Grade Championships. In 1989, Ted took over as conductor of the City of Devonport Brass Band which won the State C Grade title in 1990. On moving to Launceston he became conductor of City of Launceston Brass taking them to the State B Grade Championships and the band section of the Devonport Eisteddfod in 1993. He is currently at the helm of State D Grade Champion, Launceston Railway Silver Band.

He has been a registered adjudicator for eight years and has judged several Devonport Eisteddfods and the State Band Championships. In 2001 Ted was Chief Music Adjudicator at the Tasmanian State Championships held in Ulverstone.

Robert Bedwell

MMusEd

Robert is a past member of the Royal Australian Navy Band and a former classroom music teacher. As President of the Band Association of NSW, Chairman of the National Band Council of Australia's Music Consultative Committee and Vice President of the National Band Council of Australia he is active in the band movement in general.

Robert is a clinician and has also adjudicated on many occasions including the NSW State and Hunter Region Solo & Party Contests, the NSW State Band Championships, Festival of Brass Nambour, Yamaha Band Festival and the NSW State School Band Championships.

Robert has worked professionally as conductor, performer and arranger in Music Theatre. Robert is very active in instrumental education on the Central Coast (NSW) and in Sydney. Currently he is Band Director at The Forest High School and Frenchs Forest Public School, as well as the Central Coast Concert Band.

Robert has conducted a number of band tours including performing at the Asian Pacific Band Directors' Association Conference in Hong Kong and, more recently, undertook a very successful tour of Japan, Las Vegas and Los Angeles.

Matthew Goddard

B.MusPerf(Hons)

Percussion

Matthew Goddard started his musical life as a drum kit player in Hobart before moving to Melbourne to study orchestral percussion at the Victorian College of the Arts where he gained an Honours degree in Music Performance. As a freelance percussionist in Melbourne he worked with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra, played on many film and television soundtracks and maintained a busy teaching schedule. In June 1998 Matthew travelled to Japan where he worked as Timpanist and Percussionist with the Orchestra Ensemble Kanazawa before returning to Hobart in June 1999 to take up his current position as Principal Timpanist with the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra. Matthew is a past member of the Glenorchy City Concert Brass and the Tasmania Police Pipe Band.

Tracey Patten

B.MusPerf(Hons), PostGradCert(Amsterdam)

Percussion

Tracey Patten began her tertiary studies in 1989 at the Elder Conservatorium of Music in Adelaide with Richard Smith and completed postgraduate studies at the Victorian College of the Arts and the Sweelinck Conservatorium of Music in Amsterdam. During her diverse career she has been a featured artist on ABC FM's 'Young Australia', toured Europe with AYO and been a regular augmenting musician with the Adelaide, Melbourne and Tasmanian Symphony Orchestras, the State Orchestra of Victoria, and taught at the University of Melbourne and the Victorian College of the Arts. Now residing in Hobart, she performs regularly with the TSO, and teaches for the Tasmanian Education Department at various schools around Hobart. Tracey is a past member of the Elizabeth City and Kew Brass Bands.



Launceston Railway Silver Band

Established 1904 – celebrating a century of band music.

Launceston's own Railway Silver Band was formed after a meeting of management and employees at the Railway workshops on Friday 7th March 1904. In the beginning, the band's main function was to provide music at the Annual Railway Picnic, official Railway functions and other events associated with the Railway and its staff.

The original intentions did not last long and soon the band was providing the citizens of Launceston and surrounding districts with the services of a fine Brass Band. Members of the band contributed to the social fabric of Launceston in a varied number of ways. When the call was made for volunteers for the First and Second World Wars, the band had a significant representation.

The band has enjoyed considerable success during its history competing in 'B', 'C' and 'D' Grade Brass Band Championships both in Tasmania and interstate. At various times it was Tasmania's champion band. It still enjoys a sound reputation in both music and marching championships.

The band continues to be active one hundred years on. It has developed a wide repertoire covering classics to the pops. A feature is its readiness to perform at all types of engagements be they street marches, concerts, weddings or any number of other functions. The ages of the members range from 10 to 80 years with a number of older members being with the band in excess of fifty years.

The aim of the band remains to play music and perform for the public while creating an atmosphere of friendship and enjoyment. The band is always ready to welcome new members, experienced players or beginners in both instrumental and percussion areas. Rehearsals are held on Monday and Thursday evenings at the Band Room in Maitland Street commencing at 7.30pm. Learners class for adults and juniors are also conducted.

Drill Adjudicators

DAVID PETERS
Chief Drill Adjudicator
Tasmania



David Peters commenced his banding with Launceston RSL Brass (then called the Invermay Silver Band) in 1965. Until moving to Hobart in 2003, he was actively involved with the band, both as player and Drum Major, and holds life membership.

Drill has always been an important part of the Launceston RSL Brass programme and one where David has taken a keen interest. He was a member of the highly successful marching unit of the 1970's which won the National D Grade title in 1975 and 1976, followed by the National C & D Grade title in 1977.

In addition to a number of successes at the Tasmanian State Championships, David led the band to win the National B Grade Marching Championship in Launceston in 1993 and Newcastle in 1997. On both occasions, and again in 2000, he also won the prestigious Jim Brill Memorial trophy for the Champion Drum Major.

David is currently President of the Tasmanian Bands League and a member of the Drill Advisory Board. He has judged at Tasmanian State titles, Tanunda, and the National Championships on several occasions.

Geoff joined the Latrobe Federal Band in 1952. During those 52 years he has played cornet and tenor horn. He has been Drum Major for the past 22 years.

Geoff's interest in drill and marching started in the school cadets in 1953 which lead to being bass drummer of the National Service drum band in 1959. He has been a member of the DAB for the past two years and was awarded Life Membership of the Latrobe Federal Band in 1972.

The band contests regularly in the State Championships with considerable success. Latrobe Federal has also attended the National Championships in Adelaide, Melbourne, Sydney, Launceston and Hobart with a number of placings. South Street in Ballarat was an annual contest for the band from 1974-1978, again with their share of placings.

In 2003, Geoff led the Latrobe Federal Band to win the Tasmanian Marching Championship and was awarded the Bill Welling Trophy for Champion Drum Major.

Associate Drill Adjudicator
New South Wales

After completing a Bachelor of Arts (Music) at the University of Southern Queensland in Toowoomba in 1995, Ben was employed as an Instrumental Music Instructor in Central Queensland for 4 years. He attained his Licentiate Diploma (Performer) on trumpet and a Bachelor of Education, after which he chose to pursue a career in the Australian Defence Force. Having recently moved from Sydney, Ben is currently serving in the Royal Military College Band at Duntroon. Along with four years' experience in military bands, Ben has been an active member of brass bands since 1985. During this time he has performed duties as a Drill Adjudicator at local and state competitions, and boasts successes as a performer, Musical Director and Drum Major. In October 2003 Ben was awarded the Champion Drum Major award at the Nambour contest in Queensland, where he fronted both Sunnybank bands.

IVAN JOHNSTON
Associate Drill Adjudicator
Tasmania

Ivan has been a bandsman for over 50 years, with all that time served in Tasmania. He is currently Drum Major and a musician with the Ulverstone Municipal Band, and is a Life Member of that band.

Ivan is also Vice-President (North West) of the Tasmanian Bands League, Chairman of their Drill Advisory Board and a Life Member of the League.

Ivan's success with marching and drill include Champion Drum Major at National level on five occasions, and on twelve occasions at Tasmanian Championships since starting as a Drum Major in 1968. He also served 13 years with the Army Band Tasmania (Army Reserve Band) both as a player and drum major.

Ivan has adjudicated at many Tasmanian Championships and at National Championships held in Adelaide, Canberra, Sydney, Melbourne and Launceston. He continues his interest in marching with training of young and not so young players of the Ulverstone Band and the success enjoyed by Ulverstone over many years can be attributed to the keen members of the Band.

Keith has had over 40 years experience as a drum major, which has included training and leading bands and marching girls to success at every level of competition. In doing so, he has won several best drum major prizes. Keith has been an adjudicator for many years, judging and organising local, interstate, State and National Championships.

Other related activities have included organising the three VBL massed bands for the Centenary of Federation parade, adjudicating the Melbourne ANZAC Day parade on multiple occasions and last year he took the first Victorian band to Alice Springs to take part in their ANZAC parade. A keen bands' person, Keith has also been a member on numerous band committees and the VBL Executive which has led him to be honoured with life memberships of the VBL and the Heidelberg band.
