Adjudicators

Chief Adjudicator, Brass Bands - Richard Evans



Richard Evans is one of the most colourful and flamboyant characters on the British brass band scene today. With a unique ability to instill pride and passion into every player, he is ultimately the driving force behind each band he conducts.

Born in Aldershot, the son of a regular soldier, he spent his first two years of life in India. On return to England, the family moved to Preston, Lancashire. It was in nearby Leyland that he was introduced to the cornet with the British Legion Band. Within three years Richard was one of the founder members of the National Youth Brass Band, becoming principal cornet under the direction of the late, great Harry Mortimer, OBE, CBE.

Leaving his first band, he moved to the Leyland Motors Band (the original forerunner of the now Leyland Band) and studied under founding fathers Harold Moss and William Haydock. National Service took Richard to Berlin, and on return to civilian life, he spent two years with the Black Dyke Mills Band.

However, it was in the art of conducting that Richard was to carve a brilliant career. Upon graduation from the Royal Northern School of Music, he began full time teaching and worked as a freelance trumpet player with the BBC Northern Symphony Orchestra, the Manchester Mozart Orchestra, Syd Lawrence, and many other famous ensembles.

During this period his conducting skills were being perfected in a vast theatre of experience, including brass bands, choral societies, and the directions of opera. 1975 was to provide the milestone in Richard's career that would take him to the very top of his profession.

While conducting Wigan Cecilian Choral Society, he was asked to audition for the position of Musical Director with the Wingates Temperance Band. He accepted the position and within three months he had won the British Open Championships at his very first attempt! 1976 saw him moving to the Fairey Engineering Band, continuing to gain a reputation for flair and innovative musical direction to the highest standard. At the beginning of 1978, Richard was recruited to rebuild the Leyland Vehicles Band with the specific remit of achieving Championship status within three years. The band made history with their meteoric rise through the brass band super league and their name changes, Leyland DAF, BNFL, JJB Sports Leyland Band, and finally Leyland Band.

In 2004, after working as a freelance conductor with Fodens Band and Yorkshire Building Society Band, he accepted the position of resident musical director of Grimethorpe Colliery (UK Coal) Band, until July 2006, and in 2005 his autobiography 'Dick the Stick' was published. He now has strong connections with the world famous Brighouse & Rastrick Band as Associate Conductor but most of his work is as a freelance director. He has recently been appointed Visiting Professor of Brass to Sensoku Gakuen College of Music, Tokyo. Richard's prowess as conductor, teacher, adjudicator and movement leader was rewarded in 1986 when he was the recipient of the J. Henry Iles Medal presented by the Worshipful Company of Musicians of the City of London.



He has worked with bands all over the world, Japan, USA, New Zealand, Norway, Switzerland, Holland, Belgium and Denmark. He proudly holds the post of Musical Director of the National Youth Brass Band of Scotland. Although Richard Evans has reached the pinnacle of his success, he is not content to rest with past achievements.

His personal quest is to provide foundations for the continual growth of the British brass band culture through his BA (Hons) course in Band Studies at Accrington & Rossendale College, which sadly was closed by the college in December 2006. He remains one of the most charismatic and dynamic conductors within Britain today.

Chief Adjudicator, Concert Bands - Dr Rob McWilliams



Dr. Rob McWilliams, an internationally accomplished musician, conductor, and educator, was born and raised in Melbourne, Australia. A United States resident since 1991, Dr. McWilliams holds a Ph. D. in Music from the University of Minnesota, a Master's degree in Instrumental Conducting from Florida State University, and a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of Melbourne. While resident in Australia, Dr. McWilliams established a brand new instrumental program recognized throughout the country for its excellence at Eltham College, an independent K-12 school in Melbourne. He also served on the faculty of the University of Melbourne Institute of Education where he taught and coordinated courses in brass, jazz, and instrumental music pedagogy and conducted the Wind Symphony, Brass Choir, and Jazz Big Band.

An experienced and popular guest conductor and musician, Dr. McWilliams has travelled and worked extensively with professional and amateur student and adult groups. As a performing artist on trumpet and keyboard he has extensive performing experience with a number of domestic and international symphonic and jazz ensembles. He has served as guest conductor and clinician in Alabama, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Florida, Georgia, North Dakota, Ohio, Iowa, Kentucky, Tennessee, and Utah where he has worked with ensembles at the national, state, and regional levels.

Internationally, Dr. McWilliams has conducted and presented at major music conferences in Japan, Hong Kong, the United Kingdom, Singapore, Europe, China, and all states of Australia. Dr. McWilliams has also served as a regular conductor for the Australian Wind Orchestra from its inception in 1990 including performances at conferences of the World Association of Symphonic Bands & Ensembles and a recording issued on the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra label. He was a member of the faculties for the Bonyi International Youth Music Festival in Brisbane in 2007 and the Tutti International Festival in Beijing, China in 2011. Dr. McWilliams is currently the Artistic Director and Conductor for the Wisconsin Symphonic Winds, an advanced adult group he helped establish in 2004 comprising the best professional and semi-professional players in the greater Fox Valley region of Wisconsin.

Dr. McWilliams has presented research and workshops at state and national conferences of the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors' Association, the Australian Society of Music Educators, and in the USA at the Music Educators National Conference, the Southeastern Music Education Symposium, and the Wisconsin Music Educators Association. He has also served as an invited conducting clinician for the Singapore Ministry of Education. Dr. McWilliams has been published in a number of professional publications including the Journal of Band Research, Teaching Music Through Performance in Band and is a published composer with Alfred's Music.

Dr. McWilliams is currently a Professor of Music and Director of Bands and Instrumental Music Education at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh (USA) where he also serves as Department Chairperson. In addition to administrative responsibilities, Dr. McWilliams conducts the University Wind Ensemble and teaches courses in instrumental music education, conducting, and jazz.



Adjudicator - Mark Ford



Mark Ford is currently employed as Head of Symphonic Bands at Wesley College Melbourne, a position he has held since 2006. He has been a music teacher in Victorian Schools for over 25 years. His previous teaching appointments include; Head of Brass and Band Studies at Westbourne Grammar School and Head of Brass at Bendigo Senior Secondary, Eaglehawk and Golden Square Secondary Colleges prior to joining the Royal Australian Navy Band as a full-time professional musician in 2001. He was commissioned as an officer in 2004.

Mark is one of Australia's most senior and sought after wind & brass adjudicators. He is in high demand in all states of Australia. Over the years, Mark has been Chief Adjudicator in the Queensland, New South Wales, Victorian, South Australian and Tasmanian State Championships. He has also officiated at the prestigious Melbourne Schools Band Festival and Australian

National Eisteddfod in Canberra as well as officiating at many local and interstate Eisteddfods. He has officiated at the Australian National Band Championships on a number of occasions as adjudicator of brass and concert bands as well as Solo & Party events.

Mark is an internationally renowned conductor of bands. Since 1996, he has been Principal Conductor with Kew Band Melbourne, one of Australasia's premier bands and with that band won three Australian National A Grade Championship titles in 1998, 2000 and 2011. In 2009, Mark directed Kew Band Melbourne to its first FABB Australasian Open Championship title. He has been used as a guest professional conductor with a number of bands in Australia and in 2011, he directed North Shore Brass Auckland in the New Zealand National Championships.

He was associate Musical Director of the Victorian State Youth Band from 1987-1993 and was Director of Music and Musical Advisor to the Queensland State Youth Band for its 1998 and 1999 seasons.

In 2008, Mark was awarded Life Membership of the Victorian Bands League for his services to brass bands and as an 18 year member of its Adjudication Panel & Musical Advisory Board.

In 1999, Mark directed Kew Band Melbourne on a ground-breaking tour of Japan as guests of the All Japan Brass Band Festival. In 2001, Mark accepted an invitation to travel to the Netherlands to conduct Brass Band de Waldsang in the Survento contest. Brass Band de Waldsang won the Championship Section of this prestigious contest under his baton. His reputation as one of Australia's finest directors of bands was acknowledged in 2001, when he was appointed Principal Conductor of the National Band of Australia for its 2001 season.

Mark is a well-regarded educationalist and many schools and students have benefitted from his services. In addition to his regular teaching, managerial and administrative duties, he has assisted a large number of students to prepare for examinations and musical competitions. A number of school music directors have sought his counsel (through workshops) in preparations for major festival, eisteddfod and competition performances. He is regarded as a senior teacher who regularly mentors new teachers in Victorian schools.



He has also taught and educated in tertiary institutions. In 1997 he was lecturer/conductor of Brass Band Studies at The Victorian College of the Arts. He was lecturer in Brass at The University of Melbourne in 1999. He is teacher of euphonium at the Australian Defence Force School of Music.

He is also a renowned soloist who has won many Local, State and National Championship titles. His skills as a multi-instrumentalist have seen him win major solo titles on a number of brass instruments. He was principal trumpet/cornet in The University of Melbourne Wind Ensemble from 1994-1999.

Mark Ford is widely known as an energetic, innovative and passionate musician with vision and flair, who has considerable experience at a high level as a conductor, adjudicator, administrator, motivator and educator.

Chief Drill Adjudicator - David Peters



David Peters commenced his banding with City of Launceston RSL Brass (then called the Invermay Silver Band) in 1965 and remained a member until moving to Hobart in 2003. He was actively involved with the band, both as a player and Drum Major, and holds life membership.

Drill was always an important part of the Launceston RSL Brass programme and one where David took a keen interest. He was a member of the highly successful marching unit of the 1970s which won the National D Grade title in 1975 and 1976, followed by the National C & D Grade title in 1977.

In addition to a number of successes at the Tasmanian State Championships, David led the band to the National B Grade Marching Championship in Launceston in 1993 and Newcastle in 1997. On both occasions, and again in 2000, he won the prestigious Jim Brill Memorial trophy for the Champion Drum Major.

David was appointed Drum Major of Glenorchy City Concert Brass in 2004. Since that time, the band has been placed in three National and four State Marching Championships, with David winning the Bill Welling Shield for Champion Tasmanian Drum Major in 2008 and 2009. In 2012, David was awarded best drum major in A Grade at the Nationals and Glenorchy won the Tasmanian Marching Championship.

David is a past President of the Tasmanian Bands League and of the National Band Council of Australia, and a Life Member of both bodies. He is currently chair of the TBL Drill Advisory Board. He has judged at Tasmanian State titles, Tanunda, and the National Championships on several occasions, and at regional contests at Nambour and Mount Gambier.

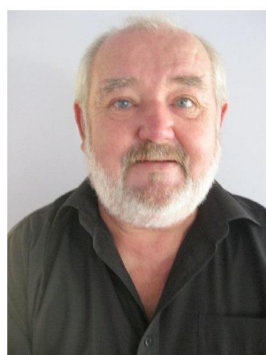


Adjudicator, solos and ensembles - Louise Devenish



Louise Devenish is a Western Australian percussionist who is dedicated to the development of the percussive arts through the performance, commissioning and teaching of contemporary percussion music. A lecturer at the WA Academy of Performing Arts and percussion tutor at UWA, Louise performs regularly with contemporary, classical and chamber ensembles including the WA Symphony Orchestra, Malaysian Philharmonic Orchestra, *Synergy Percussion* (NSW) and *Speak Percussion* (VIC). Performance engagements have taken Louise around Australia and to the United States, United Kingdom, Western Europe, Japan, China, Singapore, Vietnam, Malaysia and South Korea with professional colleagues from Australia, Europe and America.

Adjudicator, solos and ensembles - Ed Martin



Ed Martin was born into a brass band family and started playing cornet around 7 years old. He eventually became principal cornet in the Kingdom Brass Band from 1963-1973. Ed also played in big-bands and jazz bands prior to migrating to Perth in 1973. Arriving in Perth in 1973, he was very busy recording for TV shows, backing international artists at the Concert Hall and Entertainment centre. He was lead trumpet with the Will Upson Big Band from 1973 to 1983. In 1978 Ed was appointed 3rd trumpet in the West Australian Symphony Orchestra and remained with the orchestra for 22 years and was also a member of the orchestra's brass quintet, performing regularly around the State and recording for National broadcast. In 1979, Ed was appointed MD of Stirling City Brass Band (now RASWA Brass). He held the position through various name changes for 22 years and is the only

conductor to win the State championship 22 years in a row - an Australian record. Ed was also WA Cornet Champion and Champion Of Champions in the early 1980s.

Adjudicator, solos and ensembles - Bruce Thompson



Bruce Thompson is one of Western Australia's most sought after brass performers and educators. He held the position of Associate Principal Trombone with the West Australian Symphony Orchestra for sixteen years and has appeared as a soloist with many ensembles including the West Australian and Tasmanian Symphony Orchestras, the Perth Pops Orchestra, the Midland Brick Brass Band, the combined UWA/ECU Wind Ensemble and the Perth Fortress Salvation Army Band. Bruce has also performed with artists and ensembles such as the Australian Chamber Orchestra, Shirley Bassey, Ray Charles, Natalie Cole, Tom Burlinson, Jamie Oehlers, the Singapore Symphony Orchestra, the Virtuosi of Prague, Tina Arena and the Perth Symphony Orchestra. He has taught trombone at both the University of Western Australia and the WA Academy of Performing Arts for many years, and has

previously directed the brass ensemble at both institutions. Bruce is currently teaching music at Perth College, whilst also maintaining a busy performing schedule.

Beginner's Guide to Banding

Playing in festivals and contests is a huge part of the brass and concert band world. You are witnessing a National Band Championships - most of the bands performing for you here have already excelled in their home state. Doing well - or winning - a 'Nationals' is the ultimate aim for any committed band member.

Brass Bands

All brass bands competing in the Nationals have to perform three times over the weekend. On Friday, they play the test piece for their grade and a hymn of their choosing. On Saturday, they take part in the street parade in Northbridge. And, finally, on Sunday they perform a large-scale work ('Own Choice') and a march - both of their own choosing. The Friday sessions are very interesting because each band in a grade plays the same test piece.

Concert Bands

Concert bands - which include woodwind as well as brass instruments - play at least once during the weekend. On Saturday, they perform an on-stage program which consists on a mandated test piece (as in the case of brass bands) plus a hymn, march and large-scale piece of their choosing ('own choice'). Concert bands are welcome to take part in Saturday morning's street parade, although this is not compulsory.

Solos and Ensembles

Soloists and groups of musicians perform in their sections on Monday. All performers have to be an active member of a registered brass or concert band. The winner of each solo section has the option to perform yet again - for the coveted title of Champion of Champions.

Judging

All music performed is given a mark by an adjudicator, for accuracy and interpretation. The adjudicator can't see the performers - this is a tradition from the early days of band championships in England, to avoid corruption! The results are announced soon after each section or, in the case of brass bands, after the March and Own Choice session on Sunday afternoon. There is space in this programme for you to make a note of the results.
