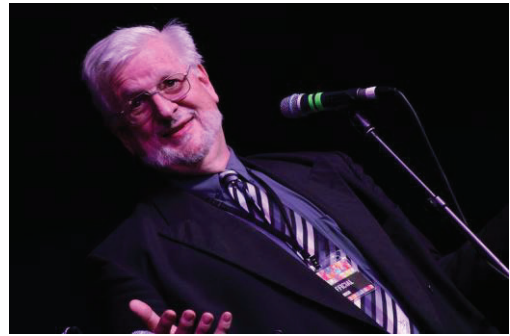

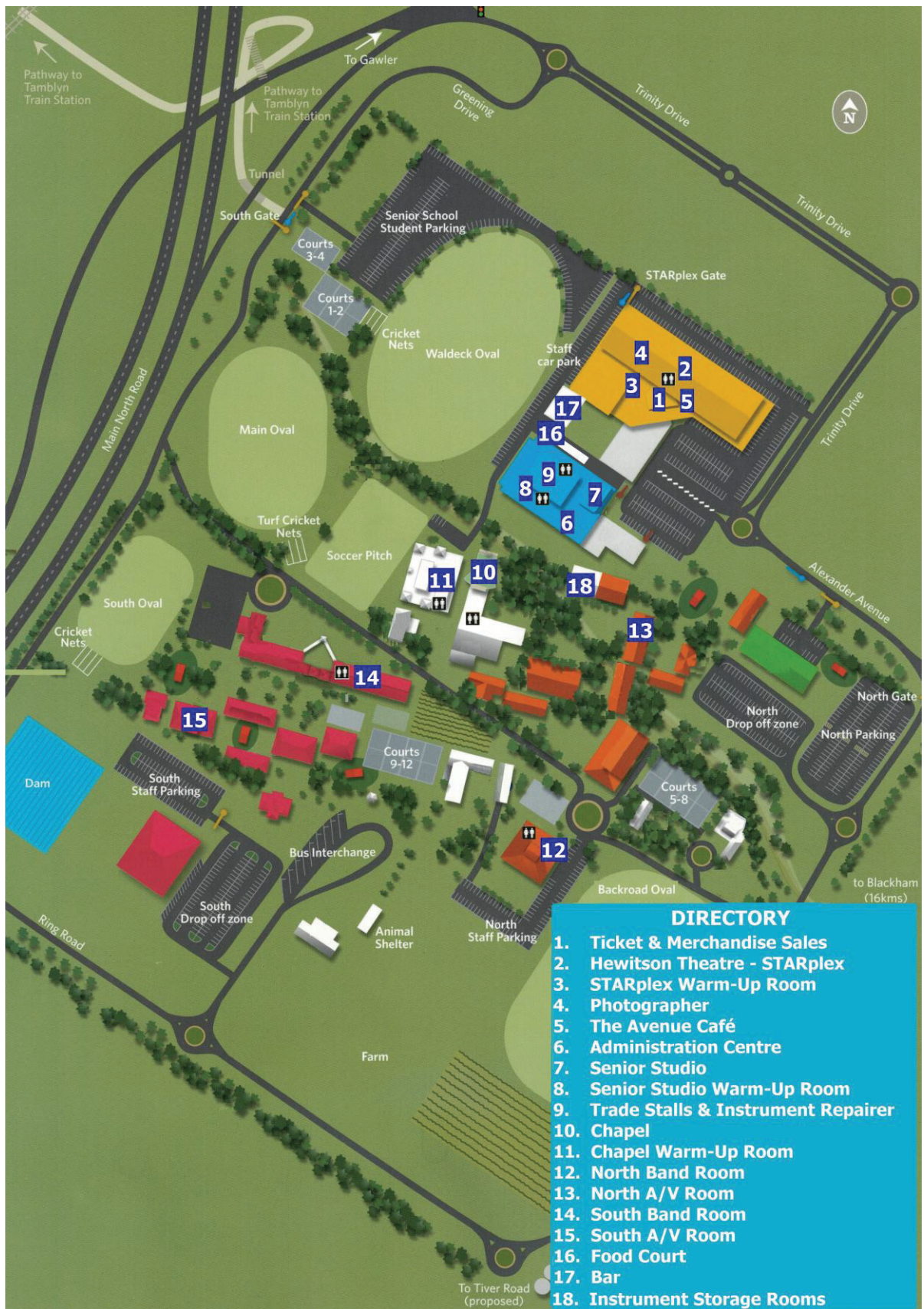

MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

CHIEF ADJUDICATOR (BRASS)

DWAYNE BLOOMFIELD
New Zealand



Dwayne Bloomfield was born and raised in Timaru where he started learning the Euphonium at 10 years of age with the Timaru Municipal Band. He then went on to join the New Zealand Army Band in 1987.

There have been many highlights with his time in the NZ Army Band including the 1988 Bicentennial Tattoo in Australia, trips to Greece and Crete, Washington DC, Vanuatu, Edinburgh, Gallipoli, Italy and Switzerland.

Dwayne took up conducting the Alpine Energy Timaru Band in 1998, a position he held for 15 years. In this time Timaru was successful at Nationals Competitions with several wins under their belt, promoting them from the C Grade to the B Grade which on their first year promoted won the title of Australian B Grade Champions in Tasmania. For the last 2 years Dwayne successfully took up the role of musical director of the Ascot Invercargill Brass Band.

Dwayne was with the NZ Army Band for 26 years, holding many positions including Bandmaster from 2005 to 2010. Dwayne also developed an interest in arranging and composing and is now internationally known. An interest in New Zealand's military history inspired him to compose the works, "Behold the Narrows from the Hill" based on the battle of Chunuk Bair in Gallipoli, "Passchendaele October 12th 1917" "Lone Pine" for the National Australian Band and recently the "Battle of Gate Pa". Dwayne's recent composition "7.1" is in remembrance of the Christchurch Earthquakes. This thought provoking work includes the use of many bass drums placed around the audience to give a very real effect of the sound and a small vibrating sensation as close as can be replicated to an earthquake.

He also composed the march which was played by the New Zealand Army Band during a procession through the streets of Wellington. Other works include "To the Sky" for the 100th anniversary of Richard Pearce's first flight, "Fernleaf Headstones" a slow march for the New Zealand Unknown Warrior, and "Epiphany" commissioned by the 2007 New Zealand National Band.

Dwayne successfully passed his LRSM in Directing and LTCL in Performance (Euphonium). Since leaving the NZ Army Band he has taken on a career in real estate with Ray White Rolleston.

Dwayne looks forward to taking up the role of Musical Director of Leopards Coachlines Canterbury Brass, and working with the band to great success.

CHIEF ADJUDICATOR (CONCERT)

DR ROB MCWILLIAMS
Wisconsin, USA



Associate Professor of Music and Director of Bands and Instrumental Music Education at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh. Dr. Rob McWilliams, an internationally accomplished musician, conductor, and educator, was born and raised in Melbourne, Australia. A United States resident since 1991, Rob holds a PhD. in Music from the University of Minnesota, a Master's degree in Instrumental Conducting from Florida State University, and a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of Melbourne. While resident in Australia, he established at Eltham College, an independent K-12 school in Melbourne, a brand new instrumental program recognized throughout the country for its excellence. He also served on the faculty of the University Of Melbourne Institute Of Education where he taught and coordinated courses in brass, jazz, and instrumental music pedagogy and conducted the Wind Symphony, Brass Choir, and Jazz Big Band.

An experienced and popular guest conductor and musician, he has travelled and worked extensively with professional and amateur student and adult groups. As a performing artist on trumpet and keyboard, he has extensive performing experience with a number of domestic and international symphonic and jazz ensembles. He has also served as guest conductor and clinician in all states of Australia and in Alabama, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Florida, Georgia, North Dakota, Ohio, Iowa, Kentucky, Tennessee, and Utah in the US, where he has worked with ensembles at the national, state, and regional levels. While resident in Minnesota, Rob served as Musical Director for the Roseville Community Band and Associate Conductor of the Grand Symphonic Winds, two civic adult performance groups based in the Minneapolis/Saint Paul area. Internationally, he has conducted and presented at major music conferences in Japan, Hong Kong, the United Kingdom, Singapore, and Europe and has recorded for the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra label. Rob has also served as a regular conductor for the Australian Wind Orchestra from its inception in 1990, including performances at conferences of the World Association of Symphonic Bands & Ensembles. In 2007, he was a member of the faculty of the Bonyi International Youth Music Festival held in Brisbane. He is currently the Artistic Director and Conductor for the Wisconsin Symphonic Winds, an advanced adult group he helped establish in 2004, comprising the best professional and semi-professional players in the greater Fox Valley region of Wisconsin.

He has presented research and workshops at state and national conferences of the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors' Association, and the Australian Society of Music Educators. He has also served as an invited conducting clinician for the Singapore Ministry of Education. In the United States he has presented papers and workshops at the Music Educators National Conference, the South-Eastern Music Education Symposium, and the Wisconsin Music Educators Association. Rob has been published in a number of professional publications, including the Journal of Band Research and Teaching Music Through Performance in Band.

As an Associate Professor of Music and Director of Bands and Instrumental Music Education at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, he conducted the Wind Ensemble and taught courses in instrumental music education, conducting, and jazz.

MICHAEL DOWRICK *BA(HONS) MA MMus(DIST) PPRNCM GCGI LRSM*

Michael Dowrick is a well established conductor, adjudicator and music clinician. He began his brass band career in Cornwall as a member of the then UK Champion Youth Band, *St Dennis* and the *Cornwall Youth Brass Band*. In 2009, after 30 years as a member of the Royal Marines Band Service, he retired as a Director of Music and moved to New Zealand, working for five years as music director to Nelson City Brass, the Nelson Symphony Orchestra and the Nelson City Jazz Club Big Band, along with teaching and adjudicating, and was a board member of the Nelson School of Music.

He travels extensively as a professional musician and has been a member of many different music panels, including the British Academy Awards, and has sat on exam boards for the University of Salford, University of Portsmouth and the London College of Music & Media. He holds degrees from the Open University, University of Salford, the Royal Northern College of Music (Manchester University) and diplomas from the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music and the Royal Northern College of Music.

He has conducted many brass bands, including the world famous, Besses o' th' Barn and tutored at Summer Schools throughout the UK and New Zealand. He was awarded the Michael Brierly Conducting Prize from the Royal Northern College of Music and is a Silver Medal Holder of the Worshipful Company of Musicians. As well as conducting, adjudicating and tutoring, he is regularly called upon as a music editor and arranger for music projects in the UK, Scandinavia, Europe, New Zealand and Australia. He is a writer member of APRA.

Michael is currently the music director of the Band of the South Australia Police, a position he has held since 2014, and currently lives in Adelaide.

DARRYL POPE

Darryl was born into a musical family and educated in Adelaide. Soon after finishing school he was playing professionally with the “Our Thing Big Band”, as well as playing with theatre orchestras for amateur and professional productions. His first ensemble experience was in a junior brass band, and he went on to play in brass bands, concert bands, orchestras, big bands and pop and rock ensembles.

Commencing a teaching career in the SA Education Department teaching brass instruments, he then went on to become a well-established classroom music teacher. Currently employed as Director of Music at Pembroke School where he directs the Senior and Junior Concert Bands as well as the Symphony Orchestra, String Orchestra and Big Band, he was previously employed at Wilderness School as Director of Music where he established and developed a thriving band program whilst also directing the String Orchestra and Choir.

A well-established assessor of senior secondary music students undertaking SACE courses in South Australia, Darryl regularly presents at conferences and professional development workshops run by a variety of professional associations in solo and ensemble assessment. He is the current and founding President of the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors' Association in South Australia and has been called upon as a guest clinician and conductor for schools interstate. He is one of the convenors of the SA School Band and Orchestra Festival held each August in SA that attracts over 100 school bands and orchestras. Darryl is a trumpet and trombone player and enjoys rehearsing and performing with a local Big Band for fun when time allows.

DRILL ADJUDICATORS

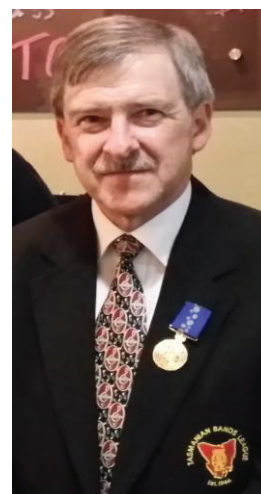
CHIEF DRILL ADJUDICATOR

DAVID PETERS OAM

Tasmania

David Peters commenced his banding with City of Launceston RSL Brass (then called the Invermay Silver Band) in 1965 at the age of 10. He was actively involved with that band, both as a player and drum major, until his move to Hobart in 2003, and holds life membership.

On moving to Hobart in 2003, David joined Glenorchy City Concert Brass as a player and drum major.



In addition to a number of successes at the Tasmanian State Championships, David led City of Launceston Brass to win the National Marching Championships in Launceston in 1993 and Newcastle in 1997. On both occasions, and again in 2000, he also won the prestigious Jim Brill Memorial trophy for Champion Drum Major. He won the Bill Welling Shield for Champion Tasmanian Drum Major in 1995, 1996, 2008, 2009, 2013 and 2015. In 2012, he won the National A Grade Champion Drum Major trophy and in 2013, the A Grade Champion Drum Major trophy at the Queensland State Championships.

He has been a drill adjudicator at numerous Tasmanian State titles as well as Tanunda (SA), Nambour (Qld), Mt Gambier (SA), Brisbane (Qld) and the National Championships on several occasions.

David has been involved in the administrative side of banding movement at State level since 1978 and National level since 1991. He was President of the Tasmanian Bands League from 1996 to 2011 and President of the National Band Council of Australia from 2000 to 2003.

He was awarded Life Membership of the Tasmanian Bands League in 2004, and of the National Band Council of Australia in 2008, and was presented with the TBL Jubilee Certificate, for 50 years service, in 2015.

He was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in the 2014 Queens Birthday Honours for services to music through the brass band movement.

ASSISTANT DRILL ADJUDICATORS

ROSS HEINZE AM (South Australia)

Ross has a long and successful involvement with the band movement generally. He has been involved with various aspects of band administration nationally over many years and is well regarded and highly respected as a drill coach, leader and adjudicator. SABA considers it a great encouragement to have Ross officiating today.

ADAM BUCKLEY (South Australia)

A Graduate of the Elder Conservatorium of Music in Adelaide, Adam joined the Band of the South Australia Police in 1996 as the band's solo clarinetist. In 2000, Adam was promoted to Senior Constable First Class, and in 2009 was promoted to Sergeant and Drum Major where he leads the Parade Band at all Ceremonial and State events.

To critical acclaim he has designed marching displays for the 2010 and 2013 Basel Tattoo in Switzerland, and the February 2016 Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo in Melbourne and Wellington NZ. In May 2016, he will once again lead the band in their performances at Her Majesty the Queen's 90th Birthday Celebrations at Windsor Castle.

BRIAN DODDS (Western Australia)

Brian Dodds completed his Drum Major and Conductor training as a member of the Australian Army Band Corps, at the Army School of Music, Balcombe, Victoria and later at the Defence Force School of Music, Watsonia, Victoria. He is currently a member and solo cornet player with the City of Perth Brass Band and has many years of experience as a performer, Music Director and Drum Major.

Previous appointments include Music Director, Melville Air Force Association Band (Feb 2011 to Dec 2015); Solo Cornet, Town of Victoria Park Brass (2006 - 2012); Assistant Band Leader and occasional Drum Major, Australian Army Band Perth (1994 - 2005); Bandmaster, Army Reserve Band Perth (1991 – 1994); member, Canning City Brass Band (1975 – 1984 & 1990 – 2006); Music Director, City of Belmont Band (1979 – 1980); Founder and Music Director of the Scarborough YMCA Band (1974 – 1976) and Founder and Music Director of the Bentley YMCA Band (1968 – 1975).

He is also a former Councillor and Executive Officer of the NBCA (2000 – 2006), and Secretary and President of the Western Australian Band Association (1997 – 2006). Brian has been attending the National Band Championships regularly since 2004 and has participated as either a Marshal or Drill Adjudicator.

NIGEL OAKLANDS (South Australia)

Nigel Oaklands has a thirty year career as a musician in both the Band of the South Australia Police and Australian Army Band Adelaide. He is a qualified Drum Major and Drill Instructor and was promoted to Deputy Drum Major in the South Australian Police Band in 2002.

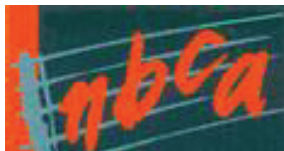
Nigel is also a qualified NBCA drill adjudicator. Highlights of his career include performing on the world stage in six European Tattoos including two Edinburgh Tattoos.

Last year David was also the recipient of the Australian Army Band Corps Association Award.
