ABOUT THE NATIONALS

The 2019 Yamaha Australian National Band Championships ("The Nationals") brings together musicians of all skill levels from diverse backgrounds across Australia and around the world to compete in a friendly and constructive environment to be crowned Champions of Australia. The Nationals is made up of three distinct events, the On-stage Championship, Marching Championship and Solo and Party Championship.

ON STAGE CHAMPIONSHIP

The On-Stage Championship is open to brass and concert bands from across Australia and around the world. Bands are classified as Open or Junior. Each classification is comprised of multiple grades. Open sections have four grades A, B, C and D Grade (with A being the most difficult) while Junior sections have three grades (A, B and C Grade).

MUSIC REQUIREMENTS

Bands are required to perform four items when competing at the National Band Championships, these are as follows:

HYMN (100 POINTS)

A tune from a recognised Church Hymnal or an arrangement based thereon.

TEST PIECE (200 POINTS)

This major work must be performed by every band in that grade. For example all bands competing in Open A Grade Concert band section will perform the set test piece announced on September 1st 2018.

OWN CHOICE (200 POINTS)

This is a major work chosen by each band which highlights the strengths of the band.

STAGE MARCH (100 POINTS)

This march is chosen from the 'National Band Council of Australia Prescribed March List'.

SCORING

These four pieces are scored by an adjudicator and give a result out of 600 points.

The band gaining the highest number of points shall be awarded the Australian National Champion for their grade. In the event of a tie in aggregate points the winner shall be the band gaining the highest number of points in the Test Piece.

MARCHING CHAMPIONSHIP

All Open Grade Brass Bands entered in the On-Stage Championship are required to also participate in the Parade of Bands. Concert Bands and Junior Brass Bands may also

compete in the Parade of Bands but this is not compulsory. Bands may choose a different march from their On-Stage Championship piece.

There are four elements to the Parade of Bands competition.

INSPECTION (20 POINTS)

Bands are inspected prior to the march. Points are deducted for a range of errors including incorrect spacing in ranks and files, unsteadiness and other irregularities.

MUSIC (40 POINTS)

Points are awarded for musical interpretation and execution whilst the band is marching.

CHANGE OF DIRECTION (20 POINTS)

Points are awarded based on the execution and entertainment value of the change of direction. Prizes are awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd highest points gained in this section.

DRILL (100 POINTS)

Points are deducted for marching indiscretions. The band in each grade gaining the highest aggregate points will be declared the Champion Marching Band. An award is also given to the Champion Drum Major in each grade.

SOLO AND PARTY CHAMPIONSHIP

All soloists perform a test piece that has been chosen specifically for their instrument and age group - Open or Junior (Under 19 as of the 1st January 2019). Soloists generally perform their piece with piano accompaniment and are scored out of 100 points.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

Competitors who win their respective solo event are invited to compete in the Champion of Champions event. This event showcases the best of the best and allows competitors to perform an own choice piece.

THE CHAMPION PERCUSSIONIST

The Champion Percussionist is determined by allocating 5, 3 and 2 points to competitors who come 1st, 2nd and 3rd and 1 point to competitors who don't place in each of the four Open and Junior percussion sections. Those points are aggregated to determine the Open and Junior Champion Percussionist.

QUARTETS AND QUINTETS

Quartets and Quintets perform an own choice work and receive a score out of 100. There are Open and Junior Quartet and Quintet events at the National Championships.

CONTEST OFFICE

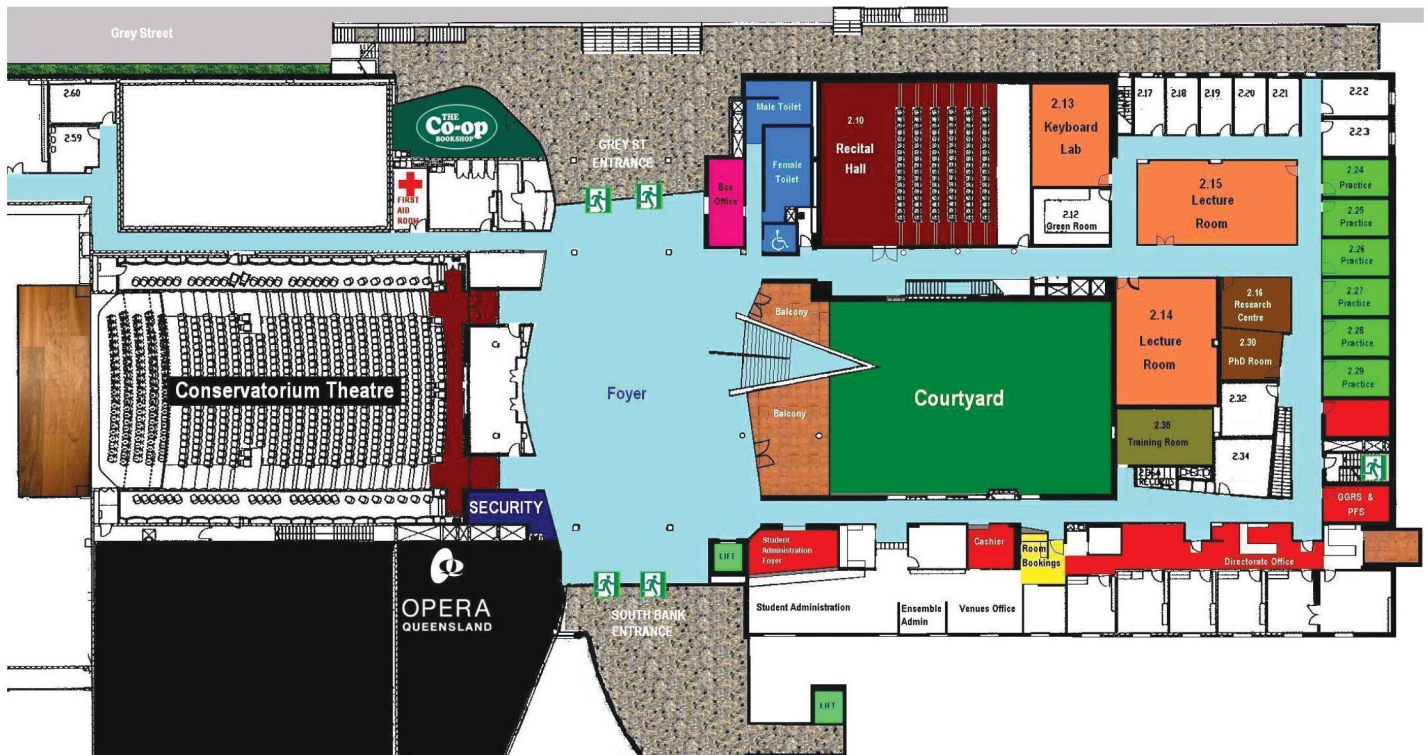

VENUE MAPS – QUEENSLAND CONSERVATORIUM OF MUSIC

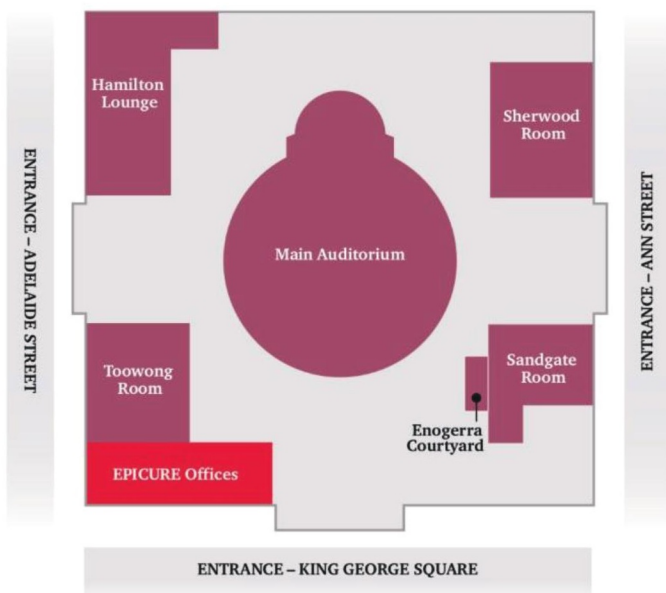

MEET THE ADJUDICATORS

CHIEF BRASS ADJUDICATOR

STEVEN MEAD



Englishman Steven Mead (B.1962) needs no introduction to brass enthusiasts around the world as his playing and teaching have become known to virtually all who have a love for the instrument known as the euphonium.

As a soloist his career as a professional solo performer continues to break new ground. With over 75 solo performances a year his relentless schedule sees him touring almost constantly.

This remarkable solo career followed on from the successes he achieved as a member of several of the UK's leading brass bands. Nowadays he travels constantly and performs regularly with some of the finest brass, wind and symphonic ensembles in the world.

CHIEF CONCERT ADJUDICATOR

PATRICK PICKETT, CSM

M Mus, B Mus, FTCL, LRAM, ARCM, LTCL, ALCM



Patrick Pickett has been a leader, performer, conductor, artistic director, educator, fundraiser and business advisor within the arts in Australia and overseas for more than 40 years. His unique career sees him as a regular guest speaker within the arts community as well as a broad range of community organisations including Probus, Rotary, View Clubs and The Association of Australian Decorative and Fine Arts Societies.

In 2013 Patrick Pickett launched a new and innovative arts company in Queensland. The Australian Musicians and Orchestral Services (AMOS) has as its mission: to provide outstanding performance opportunities for Queensland's growing body of high level professional musicians.

Alongside this new business Patrick has become the new owner, Artistic Director/Conductor of the Queensland Pops Orchestra. This iconic orchestra has been renowned for quality entertainment since it was formed by Colin Harper in the mid 80's. Patrick is delighted to lead the Pops on the next phase of its artistic evolution.

Patrick was appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Queensland Symphony Orchestra in January 2009 and retired in July 2012. Prior to that appointment Patrick completed a 37 year career in the Australian Defence Force.

At 16 years of age Patrick left his home town of Tamworth and embarked on a career with the Australian Army, joining as an Apprentice Musician and leaving as Lieutenant Colonel, Director of Music Army, Head of Corps of the Australian Army Band Corps and Commandant of the Defence Force School of Music - a position he held for five years.

Following his promotion to Lieutenant Colonel and appointment to Director of Music Army in January 2004, Patrick was further honoured with the position of Adjunct Professor to the University of Queensland (UQ), where he lectured in Multi Instrumental Pedagogy, Instrumental Conducting and Group Music Skills. He is the founding Director of the UQ Wind Symphony and reappointed as the conductor of this ensemble on his return to Brisbane in 2008.

In recognition of his ongoing commitment to the development of formal relationships with the Australian Music Examination Board (AMEB) and Defence Music, Patrick was appointed as a Federal Examiner for the AMEB in 2008. He has since been appointed to the AMEB (QLD) Panel of Examiners and Advisor (Instrumental).

In 1985 Patrick was selected to attend the famed Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall in London where he completed the Bandmasters course. Whilst in London he completed Licentiate and Associate Diplomas in music at the Royal College of Music, the Royal Academy of Music and Trinity College of Music London where he was admitted as Fellow in Conducting in 1988. He completed his Bachelor of Music at the University of Melbourne and a Master of Music from the Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University. He is currently a Board Member of the Lev Vlassenko Piano Competition.

In 1997 Major Pickett was awarded Conspicuous Service Medal in the Australia Day Honours List for services as Officer Commanding and Music Director of the Australian Army Band Kapooka. In 1999 the title of "Citizen of the Year" was bestowed upon him by the Mayor of Wagga Wagga. He saw active service in East Timor and operational service in Bougainville.

In January 2005, Lieutenant Colonel Pickett commanded and conducted the Australian Defence Force Band, Pipes and Drums and Ceremonial element at the Edinburgh Military Tattoo, "A Salute to Australia". Lieutenant Colonel Pickett commanded the Tri-Service Band element of the Commonwealth Games in Melbourne, Australia, in March 2006.

On an international level, Lieutenant Colonel Pickett contributed as the Senior Music Director and technical advisor to the Brunei International Military Tattoo 2006.

A major highlight of his career was being appointed as Music Director for the 90th Anniversary Celebrations at Anzac Cove, Gallipoli 2005.

Patrick has made his home in Brisbane where he has an active social life within the arts and on the odd occasion tries to hit a golf ball straight. Whilst far from an expert Patrick enjoys a glass of Shiraz and follows cricket much to the distraction of all those around him.

Geoff celebrates 63 years of banding in Queensland after joining the Cairns Combined School Band (Cairns Combined Schools and Citizens Band/ Cairns Brass) as a learner in June 1956.

Geoff was appointed Drum Major of the Cairns band in 1963 after attending a Drum Majors school with the Cairns High School Cadet Corp at Selheim Army Barracks near Charters Towers. Following his appointment as a Drum Major he went on to win many Street and Diagram marching competitions with the Cairns band at District, State and National competitions. Barrie Gott (b.1947), M.Mus. LTCL A.Mus.A, began his music career as a professional musician, studying trumpet with John Robertson and Harry Larsen at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. He subsequently joined the National Training Orchestra and was a regular casual player with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

Barrie holds performance diplomas from the Australian Music Examinations Board (AMEB), Trinity College of Music, London and a Masters degree in conducting from Azusa Pacific University in California where he studied with Dr. Gary Bonner. He has also studied composition and arranging at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music with Ross Edwards and Don Banks.

Barrie has taught at all levels of education in private and government sectors and was Director of Instrumental Music at Azusa Pacific University.

As a conductor Barrie has served as music director for Salvation Army bands in Sydney and Brisbane as well the Pasadena Tabernacle Band in California. MR BRIAN HURDLEY



In 1987 Brian was awarded a scholarship from the Birmingham Conservatorium where he studied trombone and euphonium with the legendary Denis Wick and conducting with Adrian Leaper.

He was the recipient of many performance prizes and was the first brass player to be awarded distinction in teaching, performance and recital diplomas.

As a performer, Brian has played with many of the Britain's leading professional orchestras and held the position of Principal Euphonium with the Desford Band and the City of Coventry Band and was a founding member of the British Tuba Consort. In 1989 he was appointed Music Director of the Sunlife Band which was the beginning of a successful and distinguished conducting career which included the famous Fodens Band and Williams Fairey Band. As a guest conductor he has worked regularly with almost every leading band in the United Kingdom and Europe.

Brian has won almost every major band championship, either as a player or conductor and has been adjudicator at all leading British, European and Australian band championships. In 2004 Brian emigrated to Cairns, Queensland to become instrumental coordinator at St Andrew's Catholic College and is regularly in demand as an adjudicator and clinician. DR HEATHER MCWILLIAMS

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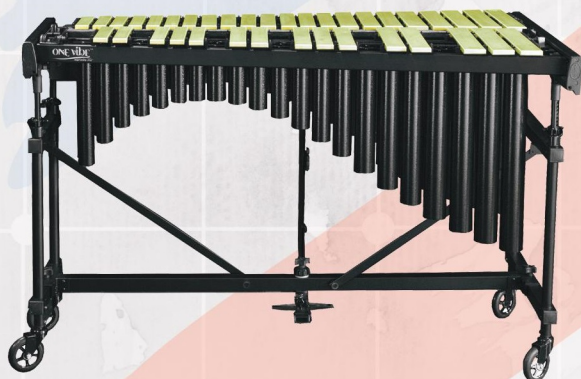
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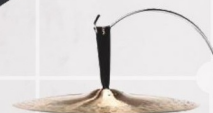

BENJAMIN TUBB-HEARNE – OPEN B GRADE BRASS TEST

**‘THE LEGEND OF PANDORA’**

‘The Legend of Pandora’ was commissioned for the B Grade Brass section of the 2019 Nationals in Australia, being held in the composer’s adopted home city of Brisbane. The piece is a through-composed tone poem based upon the legendary mythical story of Pandora’s Box and is split into nine movements showcasing both soloists and the band as a whole. The nine movements are Mount Olympus; Daybreak, The Pledge, The Titan Brothers, The Fire’s Curse, Punishment, The Creation, Pandora, The Box....and finallyOpens.

Ben Tubb-Hearne originally hails from London, UK and started playing in secondary school, starting on trumpet before ending up on tenor horn. He studied his undergraduate degree at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester, where he majored in Composition and Tenor Horn. As a composer, Ben’s works have been played extensively in the US, Europe and Australia as well as on the BBC radio network. Most recently, he has had pieces chosen for the Queensland State Championships in 2016. In 2011, Ben moved to live in New York City as a music teacher, but after three years of living in the big apple, he (un)luckily fell in love and this brought him to Brisbane, Australia in 2014. He currently performs with Brisbane Excelsior Band and is a proud member of the National Australian Brass Band.

KERRY THOMAS – OPEN C GRADE BRASS TEST

‘A SUMMER RHAPSODY’

Inspired by the youthful vigour and enthusiasm of the young musicians of the Queensland Youth Band at their Sunday afternoon culminating performance, ‘A Summer Rhapsody’ is a combination of themes that ‘popped’ into Kerry’s head on his drive home that day.

Being rhapsodic, this piece moves through several different ideas, trying to never linger for too long on any one particular theme. It opens with a sorrowful and majestic fanfare, which recedes to present short solos for euphonium, cornet, flugelhorn and tenor horn. The next section starts off energetically but mysterious, quickly becoming quirky and brash (while still light-hearted and comical), before finishing with another fanfare. The slow section that follows provides a central chorale that is surrounded by

musical fragments that weave in and out of each other. The final section is a fast dance, driving ever onwards, before the initial fanfare from the beginning of the work appears again one last time. There is one last burst of energy to finish.

Kerry Thomas is a horn player, accompanist, arranger/composer and teacher, living in Brisbane. Originally from Maryborough, Kerry moved to Brisbane after school to study French horn at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music, graduating in 2005 with a Bachelor of Music in Performance and in 2007, with a Master of Music Studies. Kerry currently plays solo horn for Brisbane Brass, joining the ensemble in 2005. He teaches brass at Grace Lutheran College in Rothwell, and performs regularly on french horn and tenor horn.

JARED MCCUNNIE – OPEN D GRADE BRASS TEST

‘VENGEANCE’



‘Vengeance’ is a through composed test work, exploring the inevitable destructive nature of acts of revenge. The work is loosely inspired by the tale of the Trung sisters in Vietnam around 40AD who raised a rebellion army to fight the invading Chinese forces. They were successful and ruled Vietnam peacefully for several years. However, acts of revenge are never quite so simple and the Chinese General Ma Yuan returned to Vietnam with a full strength army several years later and overran the Trung sisters

who were ultimately killed.

Jared McCunnie is an award winning, large ensemble composer from Melbourne, Australia. Jared’s music has been performed internationally by leading ensemble such as the Fairey Band (UK), Fountain City Brass Band (USA) and Scapegoat (France) to name but a few. Jared’s brass band works have received numerous accolades, including winning the Nock Deighton Challenge at the 2017 Ironbridge Gorge Band Festival, Best Arrangement at the 2018 Kirklees Composition Competition and the South Brisbane Federal Band Composition Competition.

Jared has also established himself as a successful composer for concert band, big band, chamber ensembles and short films. In 2018, Jared was awarded runner-up in the A4 Quartet Composition Competition and won the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra Pizzicato Effect Composition prize.

Jared is currently studying at Monash University, undertaking a double degree in Music Composition and Law (Honours).
