Welcome to the first ever Australian National Online Festival of Bands.

The Band Association of NSW along with our event partners, Besson Buffet Group, Brassbanned.com, OneMusic Australia, Yamaha Music Australia and with the support of CreateNSW are pleased to be hosting this inaugural event.

Born out of extraordinary circumstances, I am truly humbled by the response from our Banding community across Australia to this re-styled National festival.

With the cancellation of the traditional In-Venue Nationals, which were to be held in Newcastle, the BANSW Management Committee were acutely aware of the importance of maintaining a Banding presence over the Easter weekend. Tradition combined with the need to adapt, meant "outside the box" thinking. This resulted in significant simplification of the rules and the creation of a National Online event which would be inclusive and accessible for all

Recognising the inability of many bands to have had complete rehearsals while others had few limits on rehearsals, we created a flexible Festival style event. With few registration and membership requirements bands could participate in whichever events and musical items they were able to present. A reduced minimum member number allow bands with reduced membership to still have a reason to rehearse, and attract players back to band.

To this end, with 74 bands from all states and territories, including, the Arafura Wind Ensemble from the Northern Territory, appearing for their first ever National event, and the St Louis Brass Band from the USA, I believe we have absolutely achieved what we set out to.

Being online has presented challenges for both Bands and organisers. Pre recording performances has enabled new experiences experimenting with different camera angles and learning new media tools.

As Organisers, planning and putting together such an event has not been without its challenges, the largest of which has been the issue of Synchronisation rights. It is unfortunate that this issue meant several bands decided that they could not perform. The combined challenges of obtaining approval and the obstacles and cost put in place by certain publishers made participation prohibitive.



Some of the conditions placed on Bands performing works in the festival and the costs which have been charged raises the question of whether those publishers actually want their works to be performed. However, these are in the minority, as we have found that most publishers have been supportive with minimal fees charged. Many, especially local Australian and New Zealand composers allowed their works to be performed free and with no conditions.

I wholeheartedly thank those local Australasian composers and publishers for their continued ongoing support and I encourage all Bands to seek out these composer's works, purchase them, and play them and encourage them to write more. Let's all support this vibrant and exciting sector of our movement.

I thank the BANSW Secretary, Kristen Moodie, our Website and Social Media manager, Justin Screen and each member of the Management Committee for their tireless work in putting this festival together. It is astonishing the amount of work which goes in to making this happen.

I thank our adjudicators Steven Stanke, Howard Taylor and Ron Prussing for their contribution to the success of the event and I know the Bands will truly benefit from your knowledge and experience.

We all thank our event partners for your generous support and Tim at Brassbanned, our Broadcasting partner. Without your support we would not be able to host such an event at all.

And, finally, we thank our Bands and supporters. You are the reason we hold such events and your participation and support is very much appreciated by us all.

I sincerely hope that you all enjoy a wonderful weekend of great music making.

It won't be the same as an "In-Venue" Nationals, but I do hope you enjoy what we have all created and have a great Easter . I look forward to seeing you all on line, and again next year in venue in Adelaide.



Meet our Adjudicators



STEVEN STANKE

Steven Stanke began musical studies on trombone and later string bass at the University of Southern Queensland (then, Darling Downs Institute of Advanced Education) in 1980. He studied conducting with Peter Rorke, trombone with John Redfern and bass with Walter Noller. He later studied composition at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music with Mary Mageau and Gerard Brophy, music theory and analysis with Shirley Trembath and Alan Lane and conducting with Alan Cumberland. Further studies included conducting with Mats Nilsson (Sydney Conservatorium of Music) and conducting with John Hopkins and PhD research with Elliot Gyger (University of Melbourne). He has conducted The Queensland Orchestra, Bucharest Sinfonia (Romania), United States Marine Band (on the steps of the Capitol, Washington, DC), ADF Bands and numerous community orchestras.



Steven has taught music at primary, secondary and tertiary levels both in Australia and the United States and has performed with numerous community orchestras and bands and, professionally, with the Royal Australian Air Force Band and the Royal Australian Navy Band. He is active in community opera and orchestras, holding Artistic Director positions with Sydney Independent Opera, Symphony Central Coast and Lyric Opera Central Coast. Steven was also director and conductor of the University of Newcastle Conservatorium Orchestra and, from 2015 to 2019, Director of Music – Navy, which included managing all six Royal Australian Navy bands and supervising national and international music events.

Steven has written for many ensembles including military band performances at the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo (Melbourne), Nanchang International Military Tattoo (China), Invictus Games (Sydney), Waterford Massed Bands Festival and recordings by the Royal Australian Navy Band. His PhD research included the editing and performance of an unperformed three act opera by former Director of Melba Conservatorium, Fritz Hart and Steven has also transcribed many full-length operas for performance by small companies with limited resources. His orchestral transcriptions for wind band are published by Baton Music, Netherlands. His original composition, Rumbalara Rising, will be recorded by the Brno Philharmonic Orchestra in June 2021.

Through more than three decades in musical training and performance, Steven has maintained a determined and passionate commitment to the arts and is particularly interested in developing sustainable strategies for orchestral and operatic performance and participation in changing and challenging artistic environments. His intent is to provide community and visiting artists with the courage and resources to design and present musical performances that are reflective of their abilities and potential.



RONALD PRUSSING Dip. Mus Ed. A Mus. A

Ronald Prussing (Ron) is one of Australia's most distinguished brass players, teachers and conductors.

His professional trombone career started in 1970 when he was engaged as an extra by the Sydney Symphony Orchestra whilst still a student at the Sydney Conservatorium High School.

In 1978, he was appointed Principal Trombone of the then Elizabethan Trust Orchestra (now the Australian Opera and Ballet Orchestra), and then in 1980, he was appointed Associate Principal Trombone of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra





Over these years, Ron has held the positions of Trombone Tutor at the Canberra School of Music, Lecturer in Trombone at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, and Adjunct Professor of Trombone at the Newcastle Conservatorium of Music.

During all of this time, Ron has been heavily involved with brass bands. He started conducting bands at the age of 19 when he became the Musical Director of the Petersham Band of the Salvation Army. In 1983, he became the Musical Director of the Sydney Congress Hall Band of the Salvation Army, one of Australia's premier SA bands. Ron held this position for 17 years. During this time, Ron led the SCH band on numerous tours within Australia and three International tours to Canada and the USA, England and New Zealand.

In 2001, Ron was appointed the Musical Director of one of Australia's premier community bands - Waratah Brass. During his time as their MD, they won the NSW State A grade championship several times, placed 2nd three time in the National Band Championships, and won the prestigious Earn Keller entertainment concert 6 years in a row. They were rated the premier band of Australia by Four Bars Rest during this period. In 1986, Ron was appointed the Musical Director and Chief Conductor of the Sydney Youth Orchestras. He led them on a very successful tour of Spain that same year.

More recently, Ron has conducted Pacific Brass (a brass band of invited players) in numerous special concerts involving many outstanding guest soloists including Rodger Webster (past Principal Cornet of the Black Dyke Mills Band) and Philip Cobb (then Principal Trumpet of the London Symphony Orchestra.



HOWARD TAYLOR M.Mus.

Howard Taylor's musical career began as a cornet player in the Salvation Army in the South West of England. He conducted the Plymouth SA Youth Band at 17 until securing the Musical Directors job at the Plymouth British Legion at just 21 years of age.

In 1993 Howard was appointed Musical Director of Championship section Bodmin Band subsequently leading them to three successive South-West and Cornish Championships.

In 1997 Howard left the UK to become Musical Director of the TVNZ Auckland (Waitakere) Band in, New Zealand, leading the Auckland Band to NZ National Champions in 1999



After five successful years in Auckland, NZ, the Brisbane Excelsior Band (XLCR) appointed Howard as Musical Director in 2002. Since then, he has led XLCR to remarkable contest successes including 8 State Championships, 8 Australian A-Grade Championships and 3 New Zealand Championships. Howard also led XLCR to the British Open and the All-England Masters, two prestigious events in the United Kingdom.

Howard has won 13 National A Grade Championship titles in Australia and New Zealand with three different bands and 12 State titles with four bands.

He was Musical Director of the National Band of New Zealand for three years, touring NZ with James Morrison in 2007 and Europe in 2009 until leaving for the UK in 2010 to work as a conductor with the world-famous Fairey Band. Howard returned to Brisbane Excelsior as Musical Director in 2013.

His ground-breaking work with bands includes regular trips to Tonga to work with school bands and conductors (starting the first National Youth Band of Tonga in 2016) and mentoring and adjudicating opportunities throughout Australasia. Howard has been employed as Musical Director with Brisbane Festival and Qld Music Festival, most recently working with the aboriginal community in Yarrabah, North Qld, accompanying singers Paul Kelly and Katie Noonan.

He holds a Master of Music from the Queensland Conservatorium, Griffith University, and is now the Conservatorium Brass Band Director.

Howard runs his own company, Taylormade Music Australia, national distributors for a range of quality musical instruments.


