



CHIEF ADJUDICATOR - BRASS BANDS

Professor Nicholas J. Childs DMA, MA, FLCM, ARCM (Hons).

A Grade, C Grade Brass Bands

Hailing from Wales, Professor Nicholas Childs is heralded as the leading figure in the world wide brass community and has achieved the highest international reputation as a performer, teacher, clinician, conductor, adjudicator, interpreter and advocate of new music and producer of pace setting recordings. Representative honours which have been given to Nicholas include an Honorary Doctorate from Leeds University where he served as Professor in Music and Recording, the Iles Medal from the Worshipful Company of Musicians, in recognition of services to brass bands, and the Freedom of the City of London.



Barrie Gott - B Grade, D Grade, Junior Brass Bands

Barrie Gott has been a professional musician for over 59 years. His work as a composer, arranger, conductor, educator and adjudicator has taken him all over the world.

He has adjudicated in Norway (Siddis), New Zealand National Championships in Rotorua and Dunedin, State Championships in South Australia, Victoria, Queensland and New South Wales and Australian National Band Championships in Melbourne, Adelaide, Brisbane and Sydney.

He has taught at all levels of education in private and government sectors and was Director of Instrumental Music at Azusa Pacific University in California.



Barrie's compositions for concert and brass bands are well known and in 2004 he was awarded the Frank Wright medal for services to banding.

He is the former owner and musical director of the Queensland Pops Orchestra, working with Australian and international artists. In 2015 he retired from the Queensland Department of Education and Training as a Senior Instrumental Teacher but continues to provide relief teaching and consultancy.

Barrie has served as bandmaster for Salvation Army bands in Sydney, Brisbane and Pasadena California. He is also a former musical director for the Brisbane Excelsior Brass Band.

CHIEF ADJUDICATOR CONCERT BANDS

Bryan Griffiths

Bryan Griffiths is a conductor with extensive experience across professional, educational and community music spheres. Specialising in wind ensembles, he is also proficient in orchestral and chamber music, having conducted the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, the Band of the South Australian Police, the Sydney Conservatorium of Music Wind Symphony, the Adelaide Hills Chamber Players and the Adelaide Summer Orchestra of which he was cofounder. In 2019, he was appointed Music Director of the Adelaide Wind Orchestra, who record for Brolga Music Australia and are scheduled to release their debut album in April 2024. Under his direction, the Adelaide Wind Orchestra has been invited to perform at the 2024 International Conference of the World Association for



Symphonic Bands and Ensembles in Gwangju-Gyeonggi, South Korea.

Beginning in January of this year, Bryan was appointed Director of Music Performance at Pembroke School, where he leads in all aspects of the school's ensemble and instrumental programs. Prior to this appointment, Bryan worked extensively as a casual lecturer in classical performance at the University of Adelaide, which included the directorship of the Elder Conservatorium Wind Orchestra and Brass Ensemble. He continues his long-standing relationship with the University as a part-time member of the conducting faculty and as PhD candidate in music performance. Under the supervision of Prof. Charles Bodman Rae and Dr. Luke Dollman, his doctoral research focuses on Australian wind ensemble repertoire. Extending his passion for this genre's artistic advancement and recognition also led Bryan to found the Adelaide Wind Band Festival, successfully launched in June 2023 and presented in partnership with ABODA SA and the Elder Conservatorium of Music.

Bryan's emergence as a versatile conductor and educator began in 2012 through what would become a decade-long professional relationship with the Adelaide Youth Orchestras; there, he has held various positions, often concurrently, including those of Associate Conductor, director of the Adelaide Youth Wind Orchestra and mentor of chamber ensembles. During this time, he received regular invitations to conduct for the South Australian Music Camp and has returned there to conduct as recently as 2021. In 2015, Bryan was invited to conduct, teach and perform at the Federal University of Santa Maria's Festival Internacional de Inverno held in Southern Brazil.

His reputation as a passionate and well-rounded instructor has further been consolidated through his presentation of workshops and masterclasses, developed at the request of such bodies as the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors' Association (ABODA). In addition to regularly adjudicating for ABODA's SA School and Band Festival, Bryan has adjudicated the annual state band championships for the South Australian and New South Wales Band Associations.

Before focusing on conducting, Bryan performed as a horn player with the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra, Sydney Sinfonia, the Adelaide Art Orchestra and the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, where he served in a full-time position from 2010 until 2015. As a soloist, he performed with the Elder Conservatorium Chamber Orchestra, the Adelaide Youth Orchestra and Unley Symphony Orchestra. His principal horn teachers were Philip Hall, Philip Paine and Nelson Green.

ADJUDICATOR CONCERT BANDS

Dr Jemima Bunn

Dr Jemima Bunn completed a Bachelor of Education from The University of Melbourne (1996) and a Masters in Music Education at University of Wisconsin – Madison (2001-2002). More recently, Jemima completed her PhD study in music education from The University of Melbourne – Melbourne Graduate School of Education (2019).

Throughout her studies, she presented at several academic and scholarly conferences for the American Educational Research Association (AERA), Australia and New Zealand Research Association of Music Education (ANZARME), Australian Society of Music Educators (ASME), as well as the European Association of Music in Schools Conference (EAS) and Visions of Research in Music Education (VRME).




CHIEF ADJUDICATOR, PARADE OF BANDS Jeff Hale

Jeff is the current Chairperson of the South Australian Band Association Drill Advisory Board.

He obtained his love for marching bands when he was a young boy, watching his Father parade with the Central Command Army Band as Drum Major, especially on the Torrens Parade Ground.

In 1971, Jeff joined South Australian Police as a cadet and during his training period at the Academy, was taught

Parade Ground drill by a very experienced drill instructor who was an ex British Guardsman.



A highlight for Jeff was when the Unley Concert Band toured the Western Front in France in 2009 and also performed at the Anzac Day Dawn service at Villers-Bretonneux.

The Band was then given the honour of marching up the Champs Elysées to the Arc de Triomphe, leading a large contingent of retired Military personnel, an honour never before given to any Australian Community Band.

Jeff and the Drill Advisory Board continue to encourage marching in South Australia.







100TH ANNIVERSARY OF NEWCASTLE STEELWORKS BAND, NSW COURTESY OF BRIAN DODDS

This year celebrates the 100th year after the attendance of the Newcastle Steel Work Band from New South Wales at the 'British Empire Contests' in the United Kingdom in 1924.

Albert Baile (1882 – 1961) was the Bandmaster, who was born in Battersea London. He emigrated to Queensland with his family in 1887. He was later attracted to the goldfields in WA. A cornet player originally, in 1913 he took over as Bandmaster of the Perth City Band from his mentor Bill Partington, to win several State titles while Bandmaster from 1913 to 1920.


In March 1920 he was appointed Bandmaster of the Newcastle Steel Works Band in New South Wales. Soon afterwards, they won the Queensland Championship and became rivals to the Malvern Tramways Band, which was the pre-eminent band of the day.

International fame came with the epic tour to Great Britain in 1924 as part of what was to be a visit to represent Australia at the British Trade Exhibition held at the Wembley Stadium. Imagine the amount of time it took to travel by ship from Australia. Just the journey from Fremantle in WA to England took a month.

In June 1924 at Bell Vue, Manchester, the band won first prize at what was officially called the 'British Empire Contests' in Halifax. They beat Foden's, Irwell Springs and Black Dyke, each of which were considered English banding giants.

One of the band's lasting and more curious legacies is that it was the first to perform in the now traditional seating formation. As the members of the band walked onto the stage in 1924, they each carried a chair and set them out in concert formation. They then sat down to wait for the arrival of their conductor. From that day onwards, contesting bands have always been seated to play the contest piece. However, the legacy remains today with bands now sitting for their entire performance whenever on stage.

Sadly, the band almost closed on its return to New South Wales, but managed to keep going until 1932, when the remaining players amalgamated with another local group to become the Newcastle City Band.
